Board of Trade Deputation Off for Ottawa Bearing Resolutions of Recent Conference.

DAWSON TRADE IN YANKEE HANDS

E. E. Oster, M.P., Sounds a Note of Warning to Canadian Manufacturers.

A deputation of the Board of Trade left last night for Ottawa to present to Sir Wilfrid Laurier the resolutions passed at the recent conference of Boards of Trade of the Dominion.

D. R. Wilkie, vice-president of the Imperial Bank, received the following telegram from E. E. Oster, M.P., with his co-directors of the C.P.R., in making a tour of the west:

"An informed and reliable authority that Canadian merchants and manufacturers are making no effort to secure Dawson and Klondike, and that there are no Canadian advertisements in Dawson papers, and no commercial travelers.

The telegram was handed to Secretary Jarvis of the Board of Trade, and the matter will be dealt with at the next meeting of the Council.
