



The Queen held a levee on the 18th, and on the 19th gave a state ball at the new Palace. Her Majesty opened the ball with the Royal Highness Prince George of Cambridge. A large number of distinguished persons were present.

It is the general opinion in and about the House of Commons that the present session will not conclude until the 29th August. It is, the two houses will have continued sitting for nearly two months.

By an official statement laid before the House of Commons, it appears that the expenses incurred, on account of the Coronation, are estimated at £70,000. It is said that the duty payable to Government on the timber used for the occasion, will amount to a sum equal to the whole of the expense.

The Queen Dowager is expected to proceed in the Hastings, about the end of August, for Malta, via Lisbon, Cadiz, Gibraltar, Genoa, and Naples.

Henry S. Chapman, it is said, has been appointed Commissioner to enquire into the state of the hand loom weavers, at a salary of £1000 or £1500 a year.
