

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APRIL 13th, 14th AND 15th, 1880.

At St. Catharines, and within Knox Church there, the thirteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty years, at half-past seven o'clock p.m., which day and place the Synod of Hamilton and London of the Presbyterian Church in Canada met, and after sermon by the retiring Moderator, the Rev. John McEwen, from Isaiah, chapter 59th, verses 20th and 21st, was duly constituted by prayer.

Hamilton, seconded by Mr. Mungo Frazer, Dr. George Bell, of Walkerton, was unanimously elected Moderator, and took the chair accordingly.

# MR. GORDON'S DISSENT AND COMPLAINT.

The Synod resumed consideration of the dissent of Mr. Gordon against the Stratford Presbytery

Mr. Wilkins asked leave of the Synod to withdraw the motion he had pro-

posed prior to adjournment, which was granted.

Mr. Wilkins then moved, seconded by Mr. McMechan, "Dismiss the dissent and complaint, and sustain the ruling of the Presbytery of Stratford, but inasmuch as it appears that the maintenance of a preaching station at Brooksdale, either alone or in connection with any other congregation than that of Harrington is likely to result in injury being done to the charge over which Mr. Gorden is at present settled, remit the matter to the Presbytery to bring about, if possible, an amalgamation between the Harrington congregation and the congregation or Mission Station of Zorra, formerly in connection with the Church of Scotland; and failing to effect such smalgamation, to devise some method whereby the financial interests of the Harrington congregation shall not be injuriously affected by the maintenance of preaching at Brooksdale.'

It was moved in amendment by Mr. J. Laing, M. A., seconded by Mr. S. C. Fraser, M.A., "Sustain the dissent and complaint, and find that there is nothing in the decision given by the commission of the General Assembly, which precludes the presentation and orderly consideration of a motion, the object of which was to prevent the maintaining of a Mission Station which would affect prejudicially the interests of the congregation at Harrington.

The motion and amendment having been put to the vote, the amendment of Mr. Laing, as against the motion of Mr. Wilkins, was carried by a large majority. Parties having been recalled to the bar, the judgment of the Synod was inti-mated to them, whereupon Mr. McPherson, in name of the Presbytery of Strat-ford, protested and appealed against the finding of the Synod, to the ensuing General Assembly, and craved extracts, Mr. Gordon acquiesced in the finding of the Court.

Mr. Wilkins craved leave to dissent from said finding.

Messrs, Laing and R. N. Grant were appointed to answer the reasons of protest and appeal and defend the finding of the Synod at the bar of the Assembly.

#### OVERTURE FROM STRATFORD PRESBYTERY ANENT THE AP-POINTMENT OF STANDING COMMITTEES BY THE ASSEMBLY.

The overture from the Stratford Presbytery anent standing committees, was then read and supported by Messrs. McLeod and Mitchell.

On motion of Mr J. Gordon, seconded by Dr. Thomson, the overture was generally approved and ordered to be transmitted to the General Assembly

# OVERTURE ANENT PAYMENT OF THE EXPENSES OF THE COM-MISSIONERS TO GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

The overture from the Paris Presbytery anent payment of commissioners to Assembly was then considered. The overture having been read, Mr W. T. Root was heard in its support.

On motion of Dr. Cochrane, seconded by Mr. P. McF. McLeod, the following motion was unanimously adopted: "That, without committing itself to all the details of the scheme proposed in the overture, the Synod approve of the object aimed at, and agree to transmit it to the General Assembly for its earnest consideration, and appoint Mr. J. Laing, M.A., and Mr. W. T. Root to support it."

#### OVERTURE ANENT THE CONFERRING OF DEGREES BY THEO-LOGICAL COLLEGES.

An overture anent the conferring of degrees by Theological Colleges, signed by nineteen members of Synod, was next read, and Mr. R. N. Grant heard in its support,

Mr. Grant moved, seconded by Mr. D. D. McLeod, that the overture be received and adopted by the Synod and transmitted to the General Assembly.

It was moved in amendment by Mr. J W. Mitchell, M.A., seconded by Mr. J. Gordon, M.A., that the overture be received and adopted, and that the last clause read as follows: "That the Boards of the two aforementioned Colleges, Knox and Montreal, be appointed a joint committee to suggest some method by which the grievance complained of may be remedied "

On the vote being taken the motion was carried by a very large majority over

the amendment, and became the judgment of the Court.

Mr J. W. Mitchell asked leave to enter his dissent from the finding of the

The Synod then adjourned to meet again at 7.30, and was closed by the Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

# REPORT FROM AUDITORS.

The Clerk read the report of the auditors, to the effect that the books were correctly kept, that there was a balance due the Treasurer of \$11.06, and upwards of \$100 unpaid by congregations within the bounds of the Synod.

On motion duly seconded, the report was received and the cordial thanks of the Synod tendered to Mr. Walker, the Treasurer, for his long and efficient services to the Synod The Treasurer was also requested to take such steps as he deemed necessary, to collect the monies due the Synod fund from congregations within the bounds.

# REPORT ON SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

Mr. R. N. Grant, as Convener of the Committee on Sabbath Observance, gave in the report

It was moved by Mr. D. D. McLeod, seconded by Mr. J. Gordon, Receive and adopt the report with its recommendations, and thank the committee, and especially the convener for their diligence; the Synod express regret that the report has still to deplore continued attempts to introduce various forms of Sabbath desecration, and approve of the efforts made by the brethren mentioned in the report on behalf of the better observance of the Lord's day.

The recommendations are as follows:

I. That ministers be enjoined to keep the duty of Sabbath observance in the community prominently before their congregations, more especially in those localities in which the sin of Sabbath desecration may have become prevalent.

II. That a Committee of Synod be appointed to confer with the Premier with a view to securing such legislation as will prevent the running of excursion

trains and boats on the Lord's day.

The Synod, in conformity with the above resolution, appointed the following as a committee to confer with the Premier: Dr. James (convener), Mr. Laing and Mr. Fletcher, Ministers, and Messrs. J. M. Gibson, M. P. P., and J. Charlton. M. P.

#### THEOLOGICAL DEGREES.

The Synod appointed Mr John Laing, M.A., and Mr. R. N. Grant to support the overture anent theological degrees before the General Assembly.

#### PETITION OF REV. D. MANN.

The Synod proceeded to consider the petition of the Rev. David Mann regarding certain action of the Presbytery of Stratford. The Clerk read the petition, which was as follows:

To the Rev. the Synod of Hamilton and London:

The petition of the undersigned humbly sheweth: That a petition was presented to the Presbytery of Stratford on the 9th day of March last from parties at and around Granton; that on certain good grounds I objected to its reception; that, notwithstanding my objections, Presbytery did receive said petition; that I dissented and protested for leave to complain to Synod against this decision for reasons to be handed in ; that said reasons having been handed in, have by the Presbytery been thrown out; and that in these premises substantial wrong has been done to me and the cause with which I am connected, in the neighborhood and congregation.

The petitioner therefore humbly requests that Synod would look inte this matter and correct the injustice done, and your petitioner will ever pray

It was moved in amendment by Mr. McMullen, seconded by Mr. John Gray "That, in view of the requisite documents not being laid on the table, the Synod resolve to take no further action at present in reference to this petition."

On the vote being taken the amendment of Mr. McMullen was carried by a majority, and became the judgment of the Synod,


Mr. Mann craved leave to enter his dissent, and craved extracts.
