THINK "WILD MAN"

WAS SLAYER OF SIX Police on Track of Maniac on Colorado Hills.

Colorado Springs, Col., Sept. 23 .-If the Modern Woodmen's Sanato officers establish the alibi they are preparing for A. J. Burnham, the sheriff and police will try to prove that a wild man, who has been roaming the hills near here for weeks, killed the Burnham and Wayne families, six persons, last Sunday night.

For two weeks Sheriff Birdsall's men have been trying to capture this wild man, who has been hiding in the hills. In tattered garments and with a heavily bearded face, long, unkempt hair and barehead d he has been seen skulking in the hills by a number of persons. It is thought he may be Andrew James, who disappeared mysteriously about two months ago.

The lost man was last seen in Red Rock Canon, a short distance south of Colorado Springs. The theory on which the police are working is that he is mentally deranged. They think ha may have been endeavoring to get food from the ranch when the wholesale murders were committed.

"While I am not convinced beyond a doubt that Burnham knows nothing about the wholesale murders," said the district attorney. Mr. Purcell, "it hardly seems possible to me that he could have done away with six persons. The man who did kill those killed the Burnham and Wayne fam-
