## CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE <br> United Farmers of Alberta



OUR MOTTO: "EQUITY"

## CONSTITUTION

## NAME

1-This Association shall be called the United Farniers of Alberta.

## OBJECTE

2-The objects of the Association shall be:-
(a) To further the interesis of farmers and rancliers in all branches of agriculture; to promote the best methoils of farm business; to seek to cularge and inerense our markets; to gather market information; to obtain by united efforts profitable and equitable prices for firm produce, and to secure the best and cheapest trunsportation.
(b) To study and teach the principles of co-operation, and to nromote the establishment of co-operative societies.
(c) To raich, influence and promote legislation relative to the objects specified in the precening sub-sections a and $b$, and to any othe: natter affecting the farmers' basiness, and $\ldots$ talic any legitimate action necessary for this purpose.
(d) To promote social intercourse and tho study of economic and soci:ll questions bearing on our interests as farmers.
(c) To settle disputes between members without recourse to law whesever possible.
(f) To take into consideration any member's case of grievance, hardship or litigation,
and to defend our members as far as it may be possible and just.

## THE A8SOCIATION

3-The Association shall consist of all duly almitted aud fully paid up mombers of Uniuns.

4-The Associntion shall be governerl by the a!numil convention, to be helil in the last lualf of January of each yerr, composed of delegates from cach Union not in arrears to the Assoriation, elected in the ratio of one delegate fur every tent, aud inajor portion of ten, firid up members.

5-The busiuess of the annual convention shall be:-
(a) To elect $n$ Chairman of the conrention.
(b) To appoint a committec on credentials, whose duty it shall be to look into the standing of all candidates for office. No candi. date for office shall bo a member of this committe.
(c) To receive and diseuss the reports of the Faccutive Officers anil the livaril of Directors, allid to lecide on any question arising out of such reports. All reports shall be printed and distributed to the delegates at the opening of the couvention.
(d) To elert by ballot from iluly areredited delegates [.. eent at the convention the Buard of Directors, consisting of president and four viee-presidents, elected ly the while rourention, and one director for cach federal con-
stituency in the Province, such dircetor to be elected by the delegntes from his own constituency; and to clect two nulitors. All officors shall holl their offico till their successors aro elected, and slall bo pledged to tho Initiative, tho Referendum and tho Recall.
(e) To decide on any new turiness brouglit before tho convention by the 5 ard of Diroctors, or by any Union in goou Ttanding. No resolution shall be submitted to tho consontion unless it has been sent to the General Secretary in writing on or before the lijth of December provious, proporly signed by the President and Sceretary of the Union. Tho date stamp on the enrelope shall bo final ovidenco as to when mailed.
(f) To decide on tho placo for the next annual mectiug.

O-(a) The railway faro of all duly qualifiod delegates to the annual or special collvention shall be borne equally by all ihe delegates, and for this purpose th- Central "xecutivo shall prepare a statement ai cach $n$, ual convention, and shall divile the rai ly faro Letween all the delegates, cullecting or paying the difference in the farc irom or to the delegates beforo sur-rudering the standard certificate.
(b) In the erent of any delegate to the annual or special convention failing to comply with Sertion 6 (a) of this Constitution, his Union shall be hedr responsible. The General Secritary shall be required to notify the Uniou sending such delegate, by regis-
tered mail, of their indebtedness to the Central Office, and if within a reasonable period a satisfactory settlement has not been made, such Union shall be suspended and disqualified from representation at future conventions, unless a satisfactory explanation of such failure to comply with the Constitution is submitted in writing to the Board of Directors.

7-Special conventions may be called by the Board of Directors through the secretary by giving at least thirty days' notice to each Union; such notice to state the business for which the convention is called, and no other business to be allowed to be introduced. The ratio of representation to be the same as in the annual convention.

8-No voting by proxy shall be allowed in any convention.

9-The Board of Directors shall hold such meetings during each year as the president or any three of the directors may consider necessary; they shall appoint a secretary-treasurer and shall fix the amount of his salary and the terms of his appointment.

It shall be the duty of the Board of Directors to give effect to the resolutions of the convention and enlarge the organization cither by their own action or through the executive, or through sub-committees appointed by the directors.

Any vacancy on the Board of Directors during the year slall be filled by the directors at the next meeting of the boa:d.

All presidents of the Association shall, on retiring from their office as president, be appointed Honorary Presidents of the Association.

10-The exccutive of the Association shall consist of the president, vice-presidents und secretary-treasurer. They shall attend to tho general current work of the Association and to such business as may be referred to them by the convention or the Board of Dircctors.
11-The year of the Association and the Unions shall end on December 31st.

## DISTRICT ASSOCLATIONS

12-District Associations may be formed by a number of Unions grouping themselves together on the basis either of electoral constituencies, federal or provincial, or on the basis of useful combination for marketing purposes. Such District Associations to be governed by conventions composed of delegates on the same ratio as Association con-
ventions.

## MEMEERSHIP

13-Any person directly interested in farming may join a Union by being introduced by a member and paying the annual membership fee of not less than one dollar. Each appilication shall be submitted to a regular meeting of the Union, and shall enly be accepted by ballot, by a majority vote of the members present.
14 -In every case where a married farmer becomes a member, his wife and daughters
may be admitted as full members of the Association on what shall he known as the family ticket, at a fee of 50 per cent. of the full membership fee.
(a) Sons of farmers who are members, under the age of twenty one vears, if living at home alld working on their father's farm, shall beadmitted as memhers of the Association on what shall lie khown as a family tieket, at a fee of 50 per cent. of the full membership fec.

15-A member six montlis in arrears slatl stand suspended without action of the Union, but the secretary must report the same to the Association and correct the memhership roll. A member suspended for the non-pabinent of dues may be re-instated by the layment of all arreirs.

16-The secretary of a Union shall report quarterly to the Central Offire of the Associafion, alld shall forward with suelh report onelatf the membership fees collected during that term, on the memhership basis of one dollar, allil no Union shall have status at an anmual or sperial convention of the Assoriatiun until the membership report, together with fees due has been forwarded.
(a) A Uuion six months in arrears for dues to the Ceutral Offire shall st:und suspended without action of that office, and the name of tho Union published in the official orgath of tho Association. Such Union may he re-instated on reeejpt of the proper dues, together with a satisfiactory statement, properly signed by the 1 resident and secretary of such Union.
(b) A member will be accepted as a paid up member for the current year in any union lie may designite, upon surremer of proper credentials, signed by the president and secretary of his Union, but hefore such erelential can be issued, the inember requiring same must have a receipt showing that all dues and assessinents owing by him to that Union hw, been fully paid up.

## UNIONS

17-Unions shall consist of members accepted into the Association according to sections 13, 14 and 31 of this Constitution.

18-A Union may be organi\%ed by at least ten qualified persons applying to a Union or organizer to be so organized, on receipt of Which application the Union or organi\%er shall proceed to effect such organization and inake due report thercof to the Association; or, not less than tell persons as aforesaid may assemble of their own accord and proceed to organize themselves into a Union by sulseribing to this Constitution, electing officers therein provided and making due report thereof to the Association.

10-The officers of a Union shall be President, Vice-president, Secretary and Treasurer, or Secretary lreasurer, logether with sueh officers as the Union may decide to appoint. The official term shall be one year, and regular elections shall be held in December of each jear, by ballot, excepit that in the caso of only one candidate for an office election may be had by acclamation.

All officers serve until their successors are elected and qualified, and any vacancy occurring during the year shall be filled by the members at the next regular meeting.

20-Unions shall meet monthly, if possible, and it slaall be the duty of the Presidunt, Vice-President and Secretary to see that there is an entertaining propram or subject for consideration at each meeting.
(a) Five regular members must be present for a quorum.
(b) The President on his own initiative may, or at the request of at least six mem. bers shatl, call a special meeting, and all members of the Union must be notified of the time and place of such mecting and the object for which it is called. At special meetings no business shall be transacted not mentioned in the notice.

21-Unions shall have porer to deal with their numbers for offences a ciainst the Union, and shall be governed by the rules usually applied in such cases. The President slall preside at all trials (unless himself de the defendant or the complainant, in which case the Vice-President shall preside), and the rules of evidence and methods of procedure shall be, as near as may be, the same as those observed in the courts. On conviction, to be determined by a vote of guilty or not guilty, punishment may be reprimand, suspension or expulsion, also to ke determined by a vote, voting first upon the severest prnalty. If that fails to carry; then on to the next and

 so on until a penalty be fixed. Should no penalty be voted after a consiction the prosiding officer shall administer a mild reprimand and dismiss the case. Suspensions shall not exceed six months, and the Association must be notified of expulsion.22-The executive of a Union shall consist of the officers of the said Union.

23-Each Union shall hold an annual meeting during the inonth of December, at wheh all officers should be elected, the report of the executive officers received, dele ates to the Association and an auditor elected, and such other bisiness transacted as the members may decide.

## DUTIES OF OFFICERS

24-The President shall preside at all mectings, shall maintain due decorum, decide all points of orde (subject to appeal), and see that the laws and usages of the Association are observed and enforced. Hle shall neither make nor second a miction, nor shall he vote on any question except to give the casting vote in sase of a tie, but he shall not we denied the riçlht to vote in the election of officers.

2:-The Viec-President shall assist the President in his duties when called upon, and in the reesident's abseace he shall perform the duties of that station. In the absence of both President and Vice-President, a chair. man may be chosen by the menibers present. 20-The Secretaries of the Association and the Unions shall keep a correct record of all
proceedings and a completo and correct membership roll, showing the date of joining, ete., an account with carch member sliowing duen when painl, and everything necessary to keep a record of each menber's stanifing. They shall keep all books necessary io the proper discharge of their distias, and shall conduct all official correspondence. They shall collect all fees from members, keeping a correct account thereof, and payintr sai:ie over to the treasurer. They shall be the custorlions of all books, piliers, etc., and shall promptly turn same over to their successors in office. shall perform such other duties as may from time to time be required. The Generial Secretary shall also be required to submit by special circular to the Secretary of each Local Union all resolutions to come before the annual convention, in accordance with section 4, such circular to be mailed not later than the first day of January in each jear.

27-The Treasurers shall have custody of and safely keep all moneys belonging to the Association or Unions, keeping a careful account thereof, and in the case of the Unions they shall pily out no money except on order of the Union, attested by warrant signed hy the Fresident and Secretary. They shall make a complete and itemized report at tho close of their terin of office, anll at any other time when required to do so, and shall promptly turn over all money, books, etc., to their duly qualified successors in office. Any Union may require the Treasurer to give good and
sufficient bonds in such sum as may be fisod by vote of the said Union.

## NOTICE OF MEETINGS

28-At least onl: week's notice shall be given of caich minual or specina meetning of the Union, naming time and ilace of meet. ing.

2n-Four weeks' notice for all annual and special conventions of the ssociation shall be given by mailing notice thereof to the see-retary-1reasurer of cach Union.

30-At least ten days' notice shall be giren for all meetings of lic Board of Directors or excentive commitse of the Assoriation. provided that an emergency meething ming lio lield at athe time umon water of motice liceng fiven by all members of the Directors of Exccutive.

## LIFE MEMBERSHIP

31-Any menlur misy, liy scurling his name and address with the sum of twelie dollars to the Central Offiee of the Association, hecomo a life menher, hat without rouvention privileres, unless duly elerted a Nelegrate lig a Union, and surli life member whall pay nochalf the anmal membershif fee to the Union to whieh he lielongs in order to have standing in that linim. Two duilars uf this meme bership fee shall go to the general revenue of the Association, and the haisille maty he used for organization purposes or liy ilivesting same a a reserve fund, or for both, as
the annual convention may deteri ine, so that the proceeds thereof would make for the permanent establishment of the Association.

## FRAMING BY-LAWS

32-The Board of Directors shall frame such by-laws and regulations for its own and the Association's government as are in its judg. ment for the best interest of the Association, and not inconsistent with this Coustitution.

## AMENDMENTS TO CONSTITUTION

33-Any member desiring to introduce any additicn or amendment to the Constitution shall submit a draft thereof to the Secretary at least sixty days prior to the date of tho regular annual meeting, and the Secretary shall forthwith communicate the same to each Union by circular letter.
(a) Any amendment offered by a Union to such proposed addition or amendment to the, Constitution may be submitted to the convention by being sent in writing signed by the President and Secretary of such Union, to the Secretary of the Association before the opening of the convention and after being approved by the resolution committee.
(b) Any addition or amendment to the Constitution shall require a three fifths vote of the meinbers present at the annual meeting to pass.

## GENERAL PROVISIONS

1-The members of the Association are expected to extend fraternal care to one anothor in sickness, misfortune or distress, and to their families in bercavement, but it is a cardinal principle that he that won't work neither shall he eat. Industrial habits are as important qualifications as any principles of benevolence and charity; we do not require the industrious to lightly bestow their substance upon the shiftless and improvident.

2-All members of this Association are expected to cultivate harmonious relations with every other farmers' association or organization.

3-Members shall favor cach other in their business relations, and they should never go to law over their differeaces unfil all other means of agreement and settlement are cxhausted. In all such cases the Asosciation recommends arbitration.

4-Due decorum must be observed in all the meetings, and presiding officers are given ample power to enforce order. Cushing's and Robert's Manuals are held as authorities as parliamentary rules and usages.

5-Every effort should be made to encourage young persons to take part in the exercises, and all should regard the meetings as schools of progress and adrancement. The members are enjoined to faithfully attend the meetings, and to spare no pains to make them profitable and interesting.

6-Co-operation is the great means by which we are to overcome the evil effects of hurtful combimations, and members are urged to avail themselves of every opportunity for profitable co-operation with cach other, but we should never let this purpose breed a spirit of antagonism between legitimate local interests. Furming is a business, and farmers should not antagonize other legitimate and proper business interests.

7-Co-operative marketing is the means in our hauds for compelling equitable prices for our products, and members should hold it their duty to strictly adhere to that principle and urge that their neighbors do the same, even if not members. Adherence to this principle is a test of good membership, and all are expected to direct their best efforts thercto.

The following by-laws are suggested as an order of business at all meetings of the Unions, aud are given as a guidance in preparing by-laws for the govermment of the Unions, an attempt being mado to cover all points.

## BY-LAWS

1-The following shall be the order of business at the niectings of tive Unious:-
(a) Call to orice liy Presilent or Chairman. (Sec Sectious $2 \pm$ and $2 \bar{j}$ of this Constitution.)
(b) Call the roll of officers, noting thoso present. Tho Chairman will fill vacaucies.
(c) Call the roll of paid up members, noting those present.
(d) Reading and disposing of minutes of previous mecting.
(c) Reading of all official communications received by the Secretary.
(f) Call for application for membership.
(g) Reports of committec.
(h) Unfinished lusiness.
(i) Addresses and discussions.
(j) Opening of question drawer.
(k) Election of officers. (Aunual meeting.)
(1) New business.

2-Docs any member know of a case of sickness, distress or denth in the neighborhood that ueeds special attention.
(a) Appoint a special committec to tako up such cases, and devise ways and means for handling same.

3-Business of general interest to the Union.
(a. Members rishing work.
(b) Members requiring help.
(c) Members wishing to selling anything.
(d) Members wishing to purchase anything.
(c) Members wishing to report a grievance.
(f) Report on market conditions affecting the products of the neighborhood.
(g) General crop prospects of neighborhood.
(h) Any matter for insertion in official bul. letius of Association.

4-Disclission of topics for general good and welfure.
(a) Debates or addresses on specifled subjects.
(b) Social entertainment.
(c) Devising ways and means 1 rincreasing efficiency and membership. (It is to be understoud that the ladies and the young people are always welcome at the meetines, and a special effort should be made to ret them to take fart in all discussions and progranis that may lie arranged.)

5-Report to Association on work of Union so that the Alberta section of the official organ can be made interesting.

6-Has the reyular report been forwarded to the Central Office?

T-Adjournment.
The following are also suggested as rules for conduct of business.

1-Except by permission of the presiding officer no member or oller fierson shall speais except to ask a question or to introduce or speak to a motion.

2-In the discussions following the introduction of a subject no person shall speak more than twice, or for a longer time than five minutes, except by a vote of the meeting.

8-When a question is under consileration mo motion shall be in order except in the fullowing: (a) to i. jourt; (b) to postponc; (c) to amend. Thene motions take precerlence in the orier named, und the first two shall bo docided without debats.

4-Before the vote is taken on nny motion or amendment, the President siall nsk: "Is the meeting ready for the questionf" 'Ihe motion shall not be put so long as any member desires to spenk and is in order. Any membier desirous of asking a question on the sulject introduced may do so verbully; but if he dosires to ask more than two questions ho must submit them to the Secretary in writing.
