

At the GENERAL - ASSEMBLY, of the Province of Nova - Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Wednesday the First Day of July, 1761, in the First Year of His Majesty's Reign, and there continued by feveral Prorogations until Friday the 20th Day of October, 1764, in the Fourth Year 1th yes of His Majesty's Reign.



## ANACT

For Reformation of Jeofails and Milpleadings, and to prevent Arrests and Reversals of Judgments, and for the better Advancement of Justice.

E It enacted by the Governor, Council and Assembly, That if any liftie be tried by the Oath of twelve or word in-different Men for the Perty, Plaintiff or Demidant, or for-the Party, Tenant of Demindant, in any Courts of Lecord, the Justice or Justices, by whom justicent thereof ought to be given, inall-

proceed and give Judgment in the fame; Any Milpleading, want of Colour, insufficient pleading or Jeofail, any Miscontinuance or Discontinuance or misconveying of Process, misjoining of the Issue, want of Warrant of Attorney for the Party, against whom the same Islue shall happen to be tried, or any other Default or Negligence of any of the Parties, their Councellors or Attornies had or made to the contrary notwithstanding, and the said Judgment shall stand according to the said Verdis, without Rever |al by Writ of Error or falle Judgment; Provided, that in avoiding of Errors through the Negligence of Attornies, every Person named as Attorney in Actions and Suits pleaded to iffue, shall from Time to Time deliver, or cause to be delivered his or their sufficient and lawful Warrant of Attorney, to be entered of Record, for every of the iail Actions or Suits wherein they be named Attornies, to the Clerk of the Court; That is to say, The Attorney for the Plaintiff or Demandant, shall file bis Warrant of Attorney as aforesaid, the same Term be deciares, and the Attorney for the Defendant or Tenant, Shall file bis Warrant, the Jume Term be appears, upon pain of ferfeiting unto our Sovereign Lord the KING. the Sum of Five Pounds, for not delivering the faid Warrant of Attorney, to be recovered by Action of Debt, Bill, Plaint or Information.

And be it further enacted, That after Verdict as aforesaid, the Judgment thereupon shall not be stayed or reversed, for any Desect in Form in any Writ Original Judicial, Count declaration Bill, Plaint, Suit or Demand, or any Variance in Form only between the Original or Bill, and the Declaration or Plaint or for want of any Writ, Assimal or Judicial, or for any impersect or insufficient Return of any Sheriff or other Officer.

And be it further enacted, That fiter Verdiet, Judgment thereupon shall not be stayed or reversed for want of an Avertment of any Life or Lives, so as the said Person be proved to be alive, or forawarding the Venire facias to a wrong Officer upon any insufficient Suggestion, or because the Visne is in some Part misowarded or sued out of more or fewer Places than it ought to be, ie as some one Place be right named, or for milnaming any of the Jurers in Signame or Addition in any of the Wrsts or Returns thereof, io as it be proved to be the same Man that was meant to be returned, or by reason that there is no Return upon any of the said Write, so as a Panel of the Names of Jurers be returned and annexed to the faid Writ, or for that the Sheriffs or other Officers Name having the Return thereof, is not fet to the Return of any such Writ to as it be proved that the faid Writ was returned by fuch Officer, or by reasen that the Plaintiff in any Ejecione firma, or in any personal Actien or Suit being an Infant under the Age of One and Twenty Years, did appear by Attorney therein, and the Verdict passed for him.

And he it sureher enacted, That Judgment shall not be stayed or reversed after Verdis. for want of Pledges, or but one Pledge to protecute, returned upon the original Writ, or because the Name of the Sherif is not returned on the Original Writ, or for trant of enter-

ing Pledges upon any Bill or Declaration, or for not alledging the bringing into Court any Bond, Bill, Indenture, or other Deed mentioned in the Declaration or other Pleading, or for want of Allegation of bring. ing into Court any Letters Testamentary, or Letters of Asministration, or for Omission of by Force and Arms, and against the Peace, or for mistaking the Christian Name or Sirname of the Plaintiff or Defendant, Demendant or Tenant. Sum or Sums of Money, Day, Month or Year, by the Clerk in any Bill, Declaration or Pleading, where the right Name, Sirname, Sum, Day, Month or Year in any Writ, Plaint, Rell or Record proceeding, or in the same Roll or Record, where the Mistake is committed, is, or are once truly and rightly alledged, whereunto the Plaintiff might have demurred, and shown the same for Cause, nor for want of Averment of This be is ready to verify, or for, This he is ready to verify by Record, or for not Alledging, As it appears by Records or for, That there is no right Venue, so as the Cause were tried by a Jury of the proper County or Place, where the Assion is laid ner for that the Increase of Coffs after a Verdick in an Action, or upon a Non Suit in Replevin, are not entered to be at the request of the Party, for whom the Judgesens i given, nor by reason that the Costs in any fudgment whatsoever, are not entered to be by consent of the Plaintiff, but that all such Omissions, Variances, Dejects and all other Matters of the like nature, not being against the Right of the Matter of the Suit, nor whereby the Isue of Trial are altered, shall be amended by the Justices or other Juages of the Courts where such Judgments are or shall be given, or whereunte the Record, is, or shall be removed by Writ of Error, or by Appeal in any Actionreal, personal or mixt, according to the Usuage and Course of proceedings in this Province.

And be it further enacted, That where any Domurrer shall be joined, and entered in any Action or Suit in any Court of Record within this Province, the Judges shall proceed and give Judgment, according as the very right of the Couse and Metter in Low shall appear unto them, without regarding any Imperfection, Omission or Defeld in any Writ, Return, Plaint, Declaration or other Pleading, Presels or Course of Proceeding whatsever, except those only which the Persy Demurring shall specially and particularly set down and express together with his Demurrer, as Caules of the same, although such Imperfettics, Omission or Defest be Matter of Substance, to as sufficient Matter appear in the said Pleadings, upon which the Court may give Judgment. according to the very Right of the Caufe, and therefore no Edwantege or Exception shall be taken of, or for an immaterial Traverse, or of, or for the Default of entering Pleages upon any Bill or Declaration on of ca for the Default of Alledging the bringing into Court any Bond, Bill, Indenture or other Deed whatsover montioned in the Declaration or other Pleading, or of or for the Default of Alleaging the bringing into Crist Letters Tefamentary or Letters of Administration or of or for the Omission of, by Force and Arms, and against the Peace or either of them; or of, or for the want of sverment of This he is ready to verify, or of, This he is ready to verify by Record, or of, or for not alledging as it eppears by the Record, but the Court shall give Judgment according to the

And be it further enacted, That no fudgment entered upon Confession, Nihil dieit, or Non sum informatus, in any Course of Record shall be reversed, nor any Judgment upon any Writ of Inquiry of Damages executed thereon be staid or reversed, for, or by reason of any Imperfection, Omission, Defect, Matter or Thing whatsoever, which by force of this Act would have been aided and cured as Jestails, in case a Verdict of twelve Men had been given in the said Action or Suit, so are there be an Original Writ or Bill, and Warrants of Attorney duly sulping by this Act is directed.

Isoth be it further enacted, That this Act shall extend in all Jeotalls as atoresaid to all Saits in any Court of Record, for secovery of any Debt immediately owing, or my Revenue belonging to His Malesty His Heirs or Successors.

Provided always, and be it enacted by the Authority Morefaid; That nothing in this ACT before contained, shall extend to any Writ, Declaration or Suit of Appeal or Felony of Murder, or to any Indiament or Presentment of Ireason, Felony or Murder or other Matter, or to any Precess upon any of them; or to any Writ, Bill, Action or Information upon any Penal Statute.

And be it further enacted, That no Dilatory Plea shall be received in any Court of Record, unless the Party offering such Plea do by Affidavit prove the Truth thereof, or shew tome probable Matter to the Court to induce them to believe that the Fact of such Dilatory Plea is true.



Year of His Majesty's Reign, intitled, An Act to enable the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief, to borrow the Sum of £4,500. for paying off the Publick Debts, and to postpone the Payment of Bounties and Premiums.

Provided always, and be it enacted, That all Receipts to be issued by the Treasurer in pursuance of this Act, shall be entered with the Clerk of the Audits, before they are issued from the Treasury.

And be it also enacted, That all Receipts already issued by the Tressurer in pursuance of the former Loan Acrs, chall be entered with the Clerk of the Audits, before any further Interest is paid thereon.



Second Year of His late Mainsty's Reign, institled, an Act relating to the Affize of Broad, and for afcertaining the Standard of Weights and Measures, no Person or Persons are properly impowered to inspect into the Assize of Bread, and prosecute Offenders against the said Act, except the Clarks of the Market.

Bend Assembly. That on Complaint being made to any one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace, by any Person or quest and directed in, and by the afore-recited Act, and upon Preof thereof, or upon the View of any one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace, it shall and may be lawful for such Justice, to order all such Bread, as shall be found deficient in the Weight as aforesaid, to be seized and to be applied, and distributed in Manner as by the aforesaid Act is prescribed, and the Person offending herein. 
