China Calling Out Her Men.

London, Oct. 1.-Sung Kwei, the Em-peror's father-in-law, has started for Shan-Hai-Kwan on the Gulf of Liao Tong, at the head of 50,000 picked Manchurian soldiers. Shan-Hai-Kwan is of 7 great soldiers. Shan-Hai-Kwan is of / great strategic importance, it being the point at which the high road from the coast to Pekin begins. Sung is making prepar-ations to resist the landing of a force

of the enemy. Preparations for the better defence of Pekin are also being energetically push-ed. It is expected that the garrison there will be reinforced by 20,000 Kash there will be reinforced by 20,000 hash gars. Twenty-live thousand troops, drafted from a number of the provinces, who have been drilled by foreign offi-cers, are being massed at Tung-Chow, a few miles south-east of Pekin. These troops are under command of General Lin.

The foreign residents of Pekin are subjected to constant insult by the natives, and a number of them have been as-caulted on the streets. Among the per-sons who have thus been maltreated are several British subjects, including the interpreter of the British Legation and Dr. Dudgeon.






