EXPLANATION OF HOLY DAYS.

Circumcision, the name of the feast celebrated on 1st of January, in commemoration of the circumcision of our Saviour.

Epiphany, otherwise called the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles, a festival observed on the 6th of January, in honor of the appearance of our Saviour to the three Magi, or wise men, who came to adore him and bring presents.

Lent, is a solemn time of fasting, observed as a time of humiliation before Easter.

Passion Week, the last week in Lent, wherein the church celebrates the mysteries of our Saviour's death and passion.

Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, so called, from the ancient custom of sprinkling ashes on the head.

Palm Sunday, the 6th Sunday after Lent, and the next before Easter, so called, in memory of our Saviour's triumphal entry into Jerusalem, when the multitude strewed palm branches in his way.

Good Friday, the next before Easter, in memory of the sufferings and death of Jesus Christ, and called *good* by way of eminence, because of the blessed effects of our Saviour's sufferings, which were a propitiatory and expiating sacrifice for the sins of the world.

Easter Sunday, observed in memory of our Saviour's resurrection; the observation of this festival is as ancient as the very time of the apostles.

Ascension Day, a festival had ten days before Whitsunday, in memory of our Saviour's ascension into heaven after his resurrection, commonly called *Holy Thursday*.

Whitsunday, or Pentecost, a solemn festival observed on the 50th day after Easter, in memory of the descent of the Holy Ghost upon the apostles, and of those miraculous powers which were then conferred on them.

Trinity Sunday, a festival observed on the Sunday next after Whitsunday, in honour of the holy and undivided Trinity.

Advent Sunday: they are in number four; the first of which, if it fall not on St. Andrew's day, Nov. 30th, is the next Sunday after it. It signifies the approach or coming on of the feast of the nativity.

The Year 5610 of the Jewish Era commences Sept. 17, 1849. Ramadan (Month of Abstinence observed by the Turks) commences July 22, 1849.

The Year 1266 of Mohammedan Era commences Nov. 17, 1849.

REMARKS ON THE CALENDAR.

The Sun naturally regulates the beginnings, durations, and ends of the seasons; and the Calendar is constructed to arrange the smaller portions of the year.

The Calendar divides the year into 12 months, containing 365 days. It is desirable that the same parts of the same seasons should be always denoted by the same days of the same months. This would be the case if the civil year of 365 days were equal to the Astronomical year, but the latter is greater: and if the Calendar should invariably distribute the year into 365 days, each part of the year, (the vernal equinox for instance), would in progress of time happen on every day of the civil year.

Julius Cæsar adopted the mode of correcting the Calendar by making every fourth civil year to consist of 366 days. But this Julian correction itself was found to need correction, as the length of the year became known to greater precision. This correction at the time of Pope Gregory, in 1582, had amounted to 10 days, the vernal equinox falling on the 11th instead of the 21st of March, at which period it fell correctly at the time of the Council of Nice in the year 325. To obviate this inconvenience, Gregory ordered that the day succeeding the 4th of October 1582, instead of being called the 5th should be called the 15th; thus suppressing 10 days. This act reformed the Calendar; in order to correct it in future ages, it was prescribed that the intercalary day of the Julian correction should be omitted at convenient periods.

The adoption of this change, which is called the Gregorian, or new style, did not take place in England till 1752. It was then enacted that the year should commence on the first of January, instead of the 25th March; and that in the year 1752, the days should be numbered as usual till September 2, when the day following should be accounted the 14th of September, thus omitting 11 days. —

ECLIPSES IN 1848.

In this Year there will be two Eclipses of the Sun, and two of the Moon.

I. Feb'y. 22.—An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, invisible in British North America, and the United States, but will be seen in Siberia and Russian America.

II. March 8.—A partial Eclipse of the Moon.

III. August 18.—A total Eclipse of the Sun, invisible in British America and the United States, but will be visible in South Africa and at the Island of Madagascar.

IV. September 2.—A partial Eclipse of the Moon, invisible in British America and the United States, but will be seen by most of the Eastern Continent.

EXPLANATION OF THE CALENDAR PAGES.

LEFT HAND PAGE.

COLUMN 1st and 2d, contain the days of the month and of the week.

3d and 4th. The rising and setting in mean time, of the highest point, or of the *upper limb* of the sun, corrected for refraction.

5th. Days length in hours and minutes.

6th. The Equation of Time (or quantity by which the Sun is slow or fast of the clock) at noon, apparent time (not mean) at Greenwich, or at a quarter before eight in the morning at Halifax.

7th. The Sun's declination, for the same as the Equation, 6th col.

8th. The rising or setting of the Moon. The setting being given from the New Moon to Full, and the rising from Full to New Moon.

9th. The place of the Moon in the Ecliptic.

10th. The time of the Moon's southing, or passing the meridian.

11th. Days increase or decrease in hours and minutes.

The top of the columns of each month show's the moon's phases, or the times of new and full moon, and of the first and last quarters, or two quadratures with the sun.

The FARMER'S CALENDAR is placed at the foot of the columns of each month.

RIGHT HAND PAGE.

1. Contains the days of the month.

2. Sundays, Phenomena, Anniversaries, &c.

3. Time of High Water at Halifax, Nova Scotia.

4. Annapolis, Nova Scotia.

5. Charlotte Town, P. E. Island.

6. Windsor, N. S. and St. John, N. B.

of that tide which immediately preceded the southing of the moon. These four columns being computed on the supposition, that the time of High Water on the days of New and Full Moon (*L'établissement du port*) is at Halifax 7h. 15m.—at Annapolis, 10h. 45m.—at Charlotte Town, 10h. 15m.—and at Windsor, and St. John, N. B. 11h. 45m. All the calculations in this Calendar are made to *mean* solar time, a mode of computation now in general use, and which will very soon supersede the old mode of reckoning. *Mean* time can be converted into *apparent* time, by subtracting the quantity in the sixth column of the left hand calendar pages, when the Sun is slow of clock, and adding it when fast.

able useful pursuit; agriculture is the Art upon which man depends, not only for his daily bread, but also mainly for the comforts and luxuries of life. For, if we look deeply into the matter, we shall find that the most elaborate process of manufacturers are, for the most part, manipulations of agricultural products. Look, for instance, to that greatest of all manufacturing interests, the cotton manufacturing interest of Great Britain, see how dependent that interest is upon agriculture, which furnishes it with the raw material. Look, also at the woolen manufactures, (and it gave me much gratification to see some excellent specimens of native industry in that department, which were examined at the show to-day,) see how dependent that interest also is upon agriculture, which rears the sheep and improves his condition so as to secure a fine and valuable fleece. Or, to take a higher view of this subject, agriculture is the art, by the cultivation of which, a gracious and merciful God enables his fallen creatures to extract a blessing out of the primeval curse."

Every field on the farm should be entered by a good self-shutting and self-fastening gate. Farmers who are too busy in summer to make them, or get them made, should see to it now. How long does it require to take down and put up a set of bars? At least two minutes; which if repeated three times a day for a year, amounts to 30 hours or three days of working time—which would yearly pay for a good gate. Or, examine it in another point of view—three times a day, is 1800 times a year; now, is there any man who would take down and replace a set of bars 1800 times in succession, in payment for a farm gate? Hardly—yet this is the price paid by those who use bars that are constantly passed, and the gate is not obtained by it. Again—how much better is a well hung gate, than one half hung?—or one with a good self-fastening latch, than one with a pin crowded

into an auger hole ! Try it by dragging a badly hung gate over the ground, 1800 times in constant succession, securing it each time with a pin, and see if you do not think this labour would pay for good hinges and a latch. Good management causes a man to take time by the forelock—or, to speak more strongly and roughly, to take him by the snout. Many err by attempting to do a great deal with a little help; the consequence is, everything is hurried, and every thing behind-hand, and then, more help must be ultimately hired, or the work neglected at still greater loss. Would it not be cheaper to hoe an acre with three days' work, while the weeds are yet young, than to hoe them with ten days' work, when the weeds have attained a growth of two tons to the acre ? It would be cheaper to hire a man in time, at double price, and pay him with borrowed money at eighty per cent interest, than to permit the delay, though neither are necessary.

Look to the Orchard Caterpillars early and their destruction is easy; let them flourish for a while, and the labour is greatly increased. Early in April their eggs will be found in nests or belts encircling the young shoots, and near their extremities; and at a few feet distance appear like small knobs on the branches—they are now quickly clipped off and burned; every one thus removed preventing a large nest of caterpillars—as soon as the buds begin to open, they hatch; and remaining for a few days on their small nests, give them a conspicuous downy ap-

pearance—at this period they may be easily destroyed, but soon after, if left, they increase rapidly in size and in their depredations. Those intending to set out new orchards or fruit gardens, should have the ground well prepared in season, by digging ample holes, and in preparing the soil in the best manner. Let the holes be 6 or 7 feet across, and all the outer portions, or those not to be in immediate contact with the roots, filled beforehand, if convenient, with old rotted manure thoroughly mixed with the soil—this will give the young trees a vigorous start, until they come into bearing; and in the meantime the whole ground should be gradually enriched by manuring the crops. It would be still better, if the ground for the young orchard could be well prepared for two years previously.

The principal objects of ploughing are, 1st, to loosen the soil for the purpose of forming a proper bed for plants; 2d, incorporating manures with the soil; 3d, destroying the sward or sod, and so placing or arranging the soil and its ingredients that the matters which contribute to the growth of plants may be converted to a soluble state, and rendered available to their support when needed. The advantages of incorporating manures with the soil, are in some degree obvious, though these advantages are somewhat various under different circumstances. It is evident that the most favourable action of manure upon soil cannot be obtained without some degree of mixture. On tenacious or

compact soils, it is desirable to produce a mechanical effect by the use of manures; that is, to render the soil more open and friable, and hence, in such cases, a thorough mixture of manure, or materials of a fibrous nature, such as straw or long stable dung, becomes necessary. The advantages of a mellow bed for plants, are that they more readily extend their roots, and are thus enabled to appropriate to their use the vegetable food contained in the soil, and at the same time obtain a firm hold by which they are better secured against injury by wind or other accidents. In performing the operation of ploughing, these principles should be borne in mind, as they may furnish a valuable guide in regulating the depth and width of the furrow-slice, and the situation in which it should be left by the plough. It may be observed however, that the proper width of the furrow-slice, must depend somewhat on the nature of the soil.

It is well to be in readiness for the commencement of gardening operations at the earliest period at which the state of the weather and the condition of the soil will admit. Some articles can hardly be put in the ground too soon after the frost has left it. This is the case with peas, lettuces, radishes, early cabbages, parsnips, spinach, parsley, &c. It is seldom these plants are killed by frosts that occur after the season has so far advanced that the ground has once become fairly settled. A deep mellow soil is all-important for gardens. For most garden purposes, rotted manure is preferable. It is a great advantage to give

some plants a start in a hot bed, particularly lettuces, cabbages, cucumbers, tomatoes, and egg-plants—by forcing in this way, several weeks may be gained over plants grown in the open air. The chief advantage of raising plants by this mode of artificial heat, is to have them in an advanced state by the time it will do to transfer them to the open grounds; but cucumbers and early radishes may remain in the beds till they are so far matured as to be fit for use. Hot beds should be sank in the ground to the depth of 18 inches or 2 feet. They require a large supply of moisture, and if made wholly on the surface, they dry up so rapidly that they must be watered a great deal. If, however, it becomes necessary to make the bed on wet ground, no excavation need be made, as the coldness of such a situation might prevent the manure from fermenting, if deeply placed in the earth.

Whoever would be highly successful in growing Indian Corn, must give it such soil, and situation, as will induce a vigorous and rapid growth from the time of planting until the grain is perfected. Young plants, like young animals, in order to grow rapidly, should not only have an abundant supply of food, but food suited to their age; hence the practice of applying a portion of well rotted manure or compost directly to the hill at the time of planting, having previously ploughed under a quantity of long or unfermented manure spread broad cast. The amount of manure needed for an acre depends in a great measure upon the state of the soil, but it is always desirable to have the land in such a state as not to require more than 25 cart-loads to the

acre, exclusive of that applied to the hill. Much judgment is requisite in preparing the land for planting—some of the poorest as well as some of the best crops that have ever been raised have been grown on green sward ploughed but once. The seed is prepared for planting by being soaked about 12 hours; the steep for soaking the corn is made wholly with reference to forwarding its growth, and not for keeping off the crows, the boys are allowed the pleasure of doing that. As soon as the corn is up so that the rows may be plainly discerned, let a well constructed harrow; with fine sharp teeth, be passed through, taking care to rectify any hills that may be disturbed; after this use such implements as the nature of the soil may demand, the object being to keep the earth loose and free from weeds. Sow ruta bagas from the first to the middle of the month, in clean, rich, mellow soil.

Let no farmer neglect at the proper season to sow a plentiful supply of Corn for fodder, double the amount of the best fodder may thus be obtained from an acre, over any other known mode, and very often triple the amount. The management of the crop must be of the proper kind or complete success cannot result—never sow broad-cast, for this requires four or five bushels of seed per acre to succeed well, is less productive, and does not leave the ground clean. Invariably sow in drills, as follows: Furrow the land (after it is ploughed and harrowed,) three feet apart, with a single horse plough; scatter the seed thickly along these furrows from a hand-basket, so that there may be at least forty

or fifty grains to the foot—cover the seed by a two-horse harrow, run lengthwise or crosswise with the furrows, and the crop is in. The only after culture consists in running the Cultivator once or twice between the rows—all weeds will be shaded and destroyed by the crop; and the ground will be left early in autumn when the fodder is cut, as clean as a travelled road. The seed may be sown any time during the early part of June, two bushels will be required to the acre, and it may be harvested early in autumn, in time for a crop of wheat—the stalks should be stacked as dry as possible, in small stacks, and well salted, or injury by heating and mouldiness may follow. Meadow lands ploughed and planted in this way, will hardly fail to yield four tons of the best and finest feed, and many will yield five or six tons.

There are few farmers unwilling to admit that straw, cornstalks, and even hay, are far better food when cut, or converted into chaff, than when fed out uncut; indeed this is one of those things that are selfevident to all who understand anything of the action of the stomach on food, or what is necessary to nutrition — great, however, as is the acknowledged benefit of feeding animals in this way, the few who attempt it only serve to show how deeply rooted the habits of the farming community are, and how averse they are to all useful changes. There are many advantages in cutting hay, straw, and corn-

stalks, when used for fodder, or the food of animals. In the first place, there is little or no waste of food—every farmer is aware that of hay, clover hay in particular, when fed without cutting, a very large portion, and of cornstalks nearly one-half, and that the most nutritive part, is rejected by the animal and wasted. Secondly, it is presented to the stomach in a condition the most proper for the action of the digestive organs, an essential point in ascertaining the necessary amount of food required to keep an animal in condition to travel or to labour. Thirdly, an animal consumes much less time in making its meal, or filling its stomach with cut food, than when uncut; a most important matter to the poor animal that requires rest after labour, and not to be compelled to spend half the night in eating to satisfy hunger, when it ought to be quietly sleeping.

There are two great defects in rural improvements, so far as the beauty of the country and the comforts of home are concerned, namely, expending too much in building, and too little in planting trees—the great desire is to have a fine house, large, two-story—amply supplied with parlours and fine furniture—while outside, a single half acre can hardly be devoted to a respectable appearance or comfortable shade. The dwelling stands alone like a castle in the wilderness, with sofas and carpets within, and a hog pen, calf pasture, common rail fences, and perhaps a row of cherry trees to grace the scenery without. Or, perhaps, a picket fence is made on the side next the road, or

a length precisely equal to that of the house; and a few lilacs and rose bushes planted in the front yard. Now every farmer should devote two or three, or at the very least, one acre, to a snug little plantation of trees or shrubbery, to encircle his house, and to render it attractive and comfortable to all the members of his family. It is better to have smaller rooms or fewer of them, with rich green trees and blooming shrubs in sight from *every* window, *back as well as front*, than to occupy a big house, with bare fences, and rough grounds without. The man who does not like the trouble or expense of keeping in order beds of ornamental plants and flowering shrubs, may surround his house with large, rich, massive shade trees, distributed singly and in groups, which after, once under way, need no further attention than to keep the green grass closely shaved with the scythe beneath them.

Potatoes should be dug and housed before the ground freezes—if they are in the least touched by frost, they are more liable to rot; and even if they are not actually frozen, they may become so chilled that their quality for keeping is injured—it is generally better to dig them soon after they get ripe—if the ground is dry, the potatoes will not suffer by remaining in it till the approach of frosty weather, but if the ground is wet, they will be better off in a cool dry cellar. Another inducement for digging early, is, that after the potatoes get ripe and the vines die, the ground is very liable to be overrun by weeds, which greatly increases the

labour of taking up the crop. Turnips, beets, cabbages, &c., may remain out till the 1st of Nov.—if the weather is mild during the month of October, these articles generally continue to grow till through that month. Carrots and parsnips are sometimes left out all winter—parsnips stand the frost without injury, but carrots are generally more or less injured, and frequently spoiled. Indeed, it is better to dig the principal part of the parsnip crop in the fall. The tops or crowns should be cut off so closely that they will not sprout, and they should be covered with sand to keep them from the air—managed in this way they keep well, and may be readily obtained for use all winter; Those left in the ground till spring will keep but a short time and as soon as the tops start, the nature of the root is changed, from being sweet and nutritious, it becomes bitter and poisonous.

may be produced from the same acre of ground, with a small proportionate increase of labour and expense, and that the farmer who pursues this improved system of agriculture, can, like the merchant and mechanic, enter the market with a better production, at a cheaper price, than his less enterprising competitor. Heretofore the farmer has been content to follow in the beaten track, to pursue the course his fathers have ever pursued, and to depend on the earth, the seasons, and providence, for a crop, indulging the hope that high prices may compensate for diminished quantity and inferior quality. It has scarcely occurred to him that the study of the principles of his profession had anything to do with his success, or that what he demanded from his soils should be considered in connection with what he is to do for them, and what he is about to ask them to perform.
