RAILROAD STORIES AT WASHINGTON

Alleged Details of Scheme Ex-Premier Macdonald Had on Hand.

 Winnipeg, Feb. 7.—(Special.)—Railway matters seem somewhat mixed in Manitoba. The full details of the railway negotiations with ex-Premier Macdonald during his term of office were learned today from what is given as unimpeachable authority. In brief, the deal was with New York capitalists, including P. T. McDonald, a wealthy railway constructor, Carnegie and Rockefeller. The capitalists were backed by \$60,000,000, and they agreed to construct a road to Duluth and across the N.P.R. in Manitoba, giving a 10-cent rate on grain to Duluth, and making other concessions. The Government was to control the company's property in the United States.

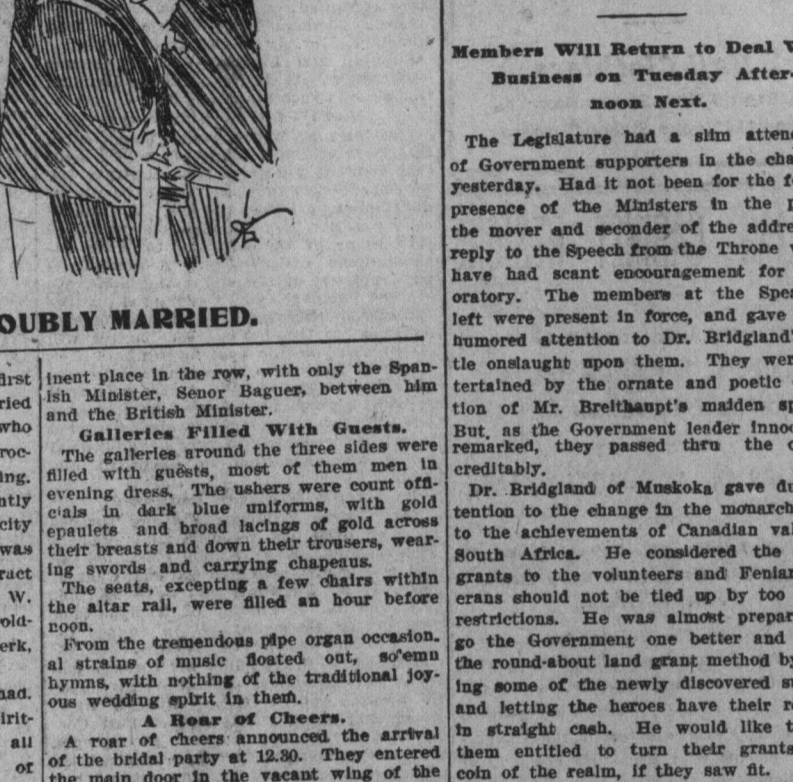
MOVES FOR A COMMITTEE.

ITALIAN CABINET RESIGNS

A Temporary Combination of Right, Left and Socialist Members Brought About Its Defeat.

AFFAIRS IN A CHAOTIC STATE.

Home, Feb. 7.—The Ministry has resigned, King Victor Emmanuel is confronted with a task of great difficulty, owing to the chaotic state of the parliamentary parties.

The majority which defeated the Government consisted of a transitory coalition of the members of the right and of the left, only the Radical group supporting the Government, the Socialists opposing the Government, the latter considered it not sufficiently liberal, while the Rightists accused it of lacking a coherent policy and of yielding to the Socialists.

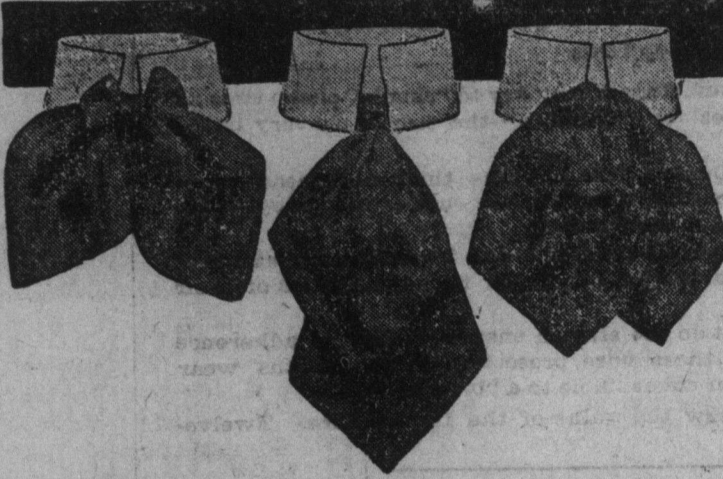

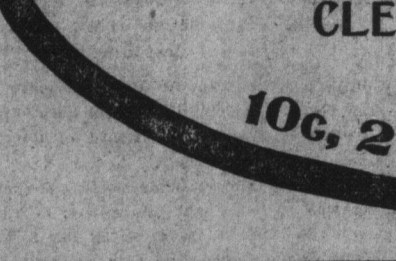

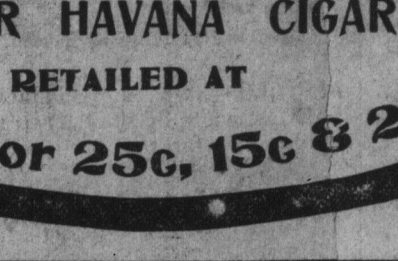
