SMITH'S DRAMATIC DEFENCE

His Counsel Scores the Home Critics Who Find Fault With the Samar Campaign.

NOISY PUBLIC SENTIMENT BLAMED

For the Court-Martial of a Victorious General—No Unnecessary Killing.

Manila, May 4.—Closing arguments were made yesterday in the court martial of Gen. Jacob H. Smith for his orders in regard to the killing of natives of Samar and the devastation of the island in developing the campaign there after the massacre of the Americans troops at Balangiga. The greatest latitude was allowed in the admission of evidence in order that the people at home might understand the question clearly.

Col. Woodruff, of counsel for the defence, closed his case in a dramatic manner. He said he was addressing not only the court but also the people of the United States, his review of the Samar campaign, his review of the Samar campaign on the officers, and the women in the courtroom wept when he described the sufferings of the American troops.

Orders Were Justified. Col. Woodruff asserted that under the laws and customs of the nation at war, all the orders issued by Gen. Smith and his instructions to his subordinates were justified, and that he had not obeyed the laws of war. They were savages and outside the pale of civilization.

The testimony of Major Waller and Capt. Porter, Col. Woodruff argued, proved that the orders issued by Gen. Smith did not authorize or permit any unjustifiable or unnecessary killing, or the burning of homes. It was necessary to consider the President of the United States, and the witnesses had testified to taking thousands of prisoners before they became dangerous.

Col. Woodruff scored the people in the United States, who, he said, appear to have forgotten the magnificent services and sacrifices of the army, which, to-day, is apparently disgraced, and in regard to the Samar campaign, he said that it was a similar situation after the Civil War, but it resulted in "Butcher's" Grant being elected President of the United States, and dying loved and honored.

Americans Hysterical. "Americans grow hysterical," he said, "but finally many common sense brings justice." While the campaign in Samar had been conducted in a way that did not meet with the views of sincere but misinformed and completely ignorant sentimentalists and troublesome busy-bodies in the United States, it had been carried on in a way that was fitting the flag had just ended in a successful campaign, where Spain failed for three centuries. At the close of this campaign, he was forced to face a court-martial. Col. Woodruff added:

"We feel that the government only did this in deference to an overwhelming, noisy public sentiment, based on rumors of drastic and effective action, such a man is despicable of manhood." Col. Woodruff demanded the acquittal of his client.

The counsel for the government reviewed the evidence minutely, and argued that the charges against Gen. Smith had been contradicted. He asserted that Gen. Smith had appealed to the passions of the marines to avenge bloody Balingiga.

RUSSIAN OUTBREAKS LOCAL. London, May 4.—A gloomy view of the internal situation in Russia is taken by most of the correspondents of the English newspapers, and some of those who represent the continental press. The insurrectionary movements in the various provinces do not seem, however, to be part of a general scheme. They are based chiefly on local conditions of hunger and destitution.

PENNSYLVANIA IN HURRICANE. Plymouth, May 4.—The Hamburg-American Line steamer Pennsylvania, which sailed from New York on April 22, arrived here today. Her captain reports that she encountered a hurricane on April 28. A tremendous sea carried away her motor launch and 30 feet of her deck rail and flooded the cabin.
