A WARNING FOR EACH COLONY

Beresford Says "Insane Advertising of Dreadnoughts" Causes Needless Offence.

LONDON, May 21.—Addressing a gathering of Australasians here tonight on the naval question, Admiral Lord Charles Beresford urged that the colonies instead of contributing toward the building of a Dreadnought, should build cruisers to protect their trade and commerce, and to form the nucleus of a navy of their own.

He considered that "our insane advertising of Dreadnoughts" in other nations served Europe in a terribly expensive naval competition. "The only way the colonies can help us is by protecting their own trade routes. The idea of having destroyers and submarines in their home water would not carry out the object at all. If the Dominions eventually go in for a larger growth, but to meet the difficulty and gain the object they have in view, namely, to help the mother country, the investment of money in cruisers will most likely meet the object desired."

C.M.A. AND NAVAL DEFENCE

SIR WILFRID REQUESTED PERMISSION TO RETIRE 7 DROWNINGS REPORTED SEASON BEGINS EARLY

OTTAWA, May 21.—(Special).—About a month ago, it is learned, Sir Wilfrid Laurier intimated to his colleagues in the cabinet his desire to retire from political life, on account of advancing years and the fact that the health of both Laurier and himself is not so robust of late.

However, the prominent men of the party refused to listen to his request, and put the matter so strongly before him that it is hardly likely he will retire before the next election. That he will remove from the political sphere immediately after the next general election is certain.

One of the Liberal leaders, talking to the World correspondent to-day, said that after sixteen years of power, and even while the chief in the field, he had then have only a fighting chance of victory, but with a change of leadership defeat would be certain.

OTTAWA RIVER FLOODS ARE BECOMING SERIOUS

Factories Close Down at Chaudiere and Houses at Gatineau Are Surrounded by Water.

OTTAWA, May 21.—(Special).—Fifteen hundred men are thrown out of employment as a result of some of the mills and factories at the Chaudiere being closed down because of unprecedented high water.

The high water situation is as grave as in 1893, with the river 25 feet deep at Rideau Locks, and it is feared that the record of 29 feet 8 inches made 23 years ago may be reached.

NEGRO NOT AS SENSITIVE

And Car Porter Loses Verdict of \$2500 For False Arrest.

NEW YORK, May 21.—(Special).—The appellate division of the supreme court to-day set aside a verdict of \$2500 secured by George W. Griffin, a colored man, against a white man, Daniel M. Brady of this city for alleged false arrest and imprisonment at Montreal.

Griffin was charged with theft of \$20 and a card case. The court did not believe a colored man has the same amount of injury from false arrest as a white.

Weds Sister-in-Law With 11 Children. RICHMOND, Va., May 21.—Wm. Bredin, jr., and Mrs. Nicholas Bredin, his sister-in-law, of Prince William County, were married at Manassas, Mrs. Bredin has eleven living children, whom there were two sets of twins and one set of triplets in succession.

FIND \$16,000 NUGGET

Sensational Discovery on the Gem Property at Cobalt.

COBALT, May 21.—(Special).—A sensational find was made to-day at South Coleman on the Cobalt Gem property near the Lawson.

A nugget 5 feet 6 inches long, 2 feet 7 inches in width, 18 inches thick, and weighing 3000 lbs., 75 per cent. pure silver, valued at \$16,000, was found buried in the surface at the foot of a cliff 60 feet high.
