THE ORPHANS' HOME.

THE THIRTY-SECOND ANNUAL MEETING.

The Annual Meeting of the friends of the Orphans' Home was held in the Institution, Sullivan Street, last night. There was a large attendance, Mr. W. B. McMurrich, in the absence of the Mayor, occupying the chair.

The Annual Report showed that 34 children, 15 girls and 19 boys, had been admitted during the year, there being 113 at present in the Home. Eleven children had been apprenticed, 15 removed by relatives, and 3 adopted.

The Treasurer's Report showed that the receipts for the year had been \$5,850, and after meeting current expenses there was a balance in hand. It was suggested that an annual collection be made in the Churches and Sunday-schools in aid of the Home.

The office bearers were elected, being the same as last year, with the exception of Mrs. A. Cameron, Miss Street, and Mrs. W. B. Kirkpatrick, as managers, in place of Mrs. Ogden, Mrs. S. Lett, and Miss Morrison.

In the Building Committee's Report it was stated that \$10,000 would be required to finish and furnish the new building, and that it was expected it would be completed by September next.

Votes of thanks were passed to the lady managers, and to the Orangemen for their contribution.

ORPHANS' HOME AND FEMALE AID SOCIETY.

32ND ANNUAL REPORT.

The Lady Managers of the "Orphans' Home and Female Aid Society" have much pleasure in laying before the public a Report of their work for the year just ended.

During the past twelve months 34 children have been admitted—15 girls and 19 boys; 11 have been apprenticed; 15 removed by relatives, and 3 adopted; leaving at present 113 in the "Home." The average number for the year being 112, an increase of 8 upon the previous year ending June, 1882.

From time to time very gratifying accounts have been received from those apprenticed, and in many instances, when the term of apprenticeship has expired, proposals have been made to retain their services at good wages, which in itself is a recognition of their thoroughly satisfactory behaviour.

As usual, during the summer months, the children spent many happy days in pleasure and recreation through the kindly thoughtfulness of their friend, Mrs. Worthington, and the captains of the several ferry boats.

The Managers feel they have just cause for thankfulness in the continued good health of the children, who have been singularly free from serious illnesses; a mild form of measles appeared in March, from which only 20 of their number suffered.

The Committee regretted the change of teacher made by the Public School Board, as the children were making most excellent progress under Mrs. Riche's careful and judicious training; her place has, however, been ably filled by her successor, Miss Armstrong.

It is the sad duty of the Managers again this year to record the death of another of their number, Mrs. Ogden, who for 16 years laboured faithfully among them, until compelled by failing health to resign her place as an active member of the Board. They also regret having to replace two of the retiring managers, Miss Morrison and Mrs. Lett, who is leaving the city.

The hope expressed by the Managers last year, that in taking additional burthens upon themselves they might be strengthened by the active sympathy and liberality of the charitable public, has been fully realized. Children from all parts of the Province are received into this Institution, and the Committee, after due consideration, determined upon asking the clergymen of all denominations throughout the country to devote the offertory of one Sunday to this charity. The appeal, however, as yet, has not been very successful, though the Managers are not discouraged and still look for better returns.

The Building Fund has been materially increased by a bequest of \$500 from the late W. B. S. Smith, and \$100 from the late Mrs. Greig; while the following sums have been netted from several entertainments given in aid of the fund: \$140, from strawberry festival on Dominion Day, the fruit on this occasion having been almost entirely supplied by kind friends in Oakville; \$300, from theatricals and tableaux, under the efficient management of Mrs. Morrison; \$453 from annual calico ball, and \$70.60 from a concert given by the Choral Society, making a total of \$928.60.

Mr. Graham, Secretary of the Church of England Temperance Society, paid a visit to the "Home," the only benevolent institution visited by him during his stay in the city. The Board was much pleased with the gratifying report made in the visitor's book, expressive of his approbation of the entire system of management.

The Managers gladly avail themselves of this opportunity to express their thanks to Mr. Murray, their Solicitor, to Drs. Ogden and Macdonald for their continued attention and unremitting kindness to the inmates of the "Home," and to the kind friends who have each Sunday given their services in the religious instruction of the children.

As in previous years the Committee have much pleasure in testifying to the care and attention given by the Matron, Miss Wheelwright, in her department; and also desire to cordially thank the victuallers, bakers, grocers, and other friends who have so kindly and substantially remembered the children during the past year.

The necessity for increased accommodation is every day becoming more apparent. Applications are daily increasing, and

the Managers during the year have been obliged to refuse admission to many poor children who sadly needed the protection of the "Home." This difficulty will, however, be overcome by the completion of the new building in September next.

Annexed will be found the Treasurer's Report, containing a full and satisfactory statement of the financial condition of the Institution.

MEDICAL OFFICER'S REPORT.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,—Although it has not been the custom for a Medical Report to be read at the Annual Meeting—through the wish of some of the members of the Board I now present one for your consideration, there being a few matters which it is well to bring to notice. My connection with the “Home” has been a pleasure, and the work has been rendered light by the care and intelligence with which instructions have been carried out.

Though we have not escaped without illness, we certainly have not had more than our share, and the cases, as a rule, have not been severe. I had hoped to be able to report a year without a death, but one of the little ones, a sufferer since her birth from malformation of the heart, was called quietly away yesterday by consumption. We have had a good many cases of influenza, one or two of inflammation of the lungs, and about twenty cases of measles which were brought into the “Home” by children from Gravenhurst, who were healthy upon admission, but who had taken the seeds of disease into their blood before leaving home. All these cases recovered without any complication. Ringworm has given a good deal of trouble, but we hope to have all the cases cured before admission to the new building. I have vaccinated nearly all the children, and will make it a point to do the rest before many weeks pass by.

As it is impossible to keep a stock of drugs sufficiently large and fresh for our use without great trouble and expense, I propose to arrange with a Chemist in the vicinity of the new “Home,” so that he will make up our medicines at the minimum cost. By inaugurating the same plan which I suggested, and which has given satisfaction at the “Infants’ Home,” a great deal of time and expense can be saved, and we will only require to keep a few simple remedies in the house.

It gives me pleasure to have this opportunity of testifying to the careful and unremitting attention of our matron and nurse. The cleanly and well-aired condition of this old building, accounts in no small degree for the marvellous immunity from fatal disease which we have had. I close this Report with thanks for your forbearance, and hopes for even better success in the future.
