REPORT.

THE Board of Management of the Toronto Home for Incurables have now the pleasure of presenting their Fourth Annual Report. It is gratifying to them to be able to say that this Institution, which aims at the relief of those who are in circumstances powerfully appealing to the charitable feelings of all, and which was commenced only four years ago, has progressed as favourably as its best friends could have expected. Everything has gone on satisfactorily in the management of its affairs, in the conduct of the house, and with regard to the comfort and well-being of the patients. It has, hitherto, been adequately maintained by the liberality of the citizens of Toronto. It appears to have taken a deep hold of the sympathies of the community, as one of the most deserving of the public charities of the city, so that its friends are encouraged to go forward with the prospect in the future of rendering it more widely and extensively useful in ameliorating the condition of the class of persons for whom it is designed.

It is to be borne in mind that the house used for the purposes of the Home is a rented building, with grounds attached, and has accommodation for only a limited number of inmates. Motives of economy, a prudent caution, and uncertainty as to the success or not of the Institution, led to this arrangement. In consequence, the Board have, on several occasions, been reluctantly compelled to decline applications, on the ground of want of suitable room in the house. Other applications were, in some instances, declined, because the parties were not deemed to be in such a state as would render them fit objects for admission!

There have been admitted during the year, eight males and five females—in all thirteen. In the same period three have died. There are at this present time nineteen, viz., nine males and ten females. Of these, five have paralysis, three have rheumatism, one has a bad leg, one has spine disease, four have palsy, one is blind with severe rheumatism, one has asthma, one has dropsy, one has heart disease, and one has dislocated hip joint.

The Board would take this opportunity of inviting friends and strangers who may be in Toronto to visit the Home, and become acquainted with it. They would thus be able to ascertain how, in such an institution as this, the heavy burden of destitution and suffering may be considerably lightened; and how, by the kindly attention and conversation of Christian ladies seeing the inmates day by day, and by the regular religious services held with them on Lord's day, life may be rendered more enjoyable, even in the case of those who are under the depressing influence of a feeling of hopelessness as to the recovery of health and strength.

As has been already remarked, a desire to avoid difficulties in the working of the Institution, and an unwillingness to incur liabilities, which they might not be able to meet, led the Board to be satisfied with the renting of a private house for the purposes of the Home. The experience, however, which they have gained during these few years, the benefits which many suffering ones have derived from its establishment, and the necessity of providing larger accommodation, have compelled the Board

to seriously consider the desirableness of having "a permanent home." The success which they have met with, by the generous support of the public, has encouraged them to look in this direction.

It will be remembered that in last year's report, it was stated that such a proposal was contemplated; and in the resolutions passed at the annual meeting, the same was unanimously approved and sanctioned. Accordingly the Board resolved to look out for some suitable locality, with sufficient ground to allow enlargement when necessary, and to provide for healthful exercise and recreation on the part of any of the patients, who might be able to take and enjoy such. After much consideration, and the examination of several sites and houses, it was decided last summer to purchase a lot of land, which could be had at a reasonable rate, consisting of four and a-half acres, a little beyond the western limits of the city, beautifully situated on rising ground, and overlooking the Humber bay. The price paid was \$4,500. It could not now be obtained for that sum. The whole has also been fenced round, and the land is prepared for building operations.

It is proposed to seek a plan for a large Institution, in the event of such being required in the future, as, no doubt, it will be very soon. But only a portion of the whole would now be built, leaving the erection of the rest to the growing demands which may be made for it. The benefit of this arrangement will be that there will be no difficulty in adding to the part already built, without any disfigurement, and that, when afterwards, completed, it will be a uniform whole, according to the original plan.

The Board are of opinion, and in this they hope that they will be borne out by the general sentiment, that accommodation should be provided at once for a larger number of inmates than at present. This could not be secured at a less expense than about \$20,000. And for a great portion of that amount, they have to appeal to the generous sympathy and aid of those who are, in the Providence of God, blessed with the means, and at the same time desire to manifest the spirit of our blessed Lord, who sympathized with human woe in every form, and did good continually to the distressed and helpless.

The Managers have been enabled, by funds in hand, to pay the cost of the ground, and also the outlay in fencing and preparing the same. They hope, also, by the remaining sum in hand, increased by the spontaneous donation of \$1,000, by the Hon. G. W. Allan, from the Burnside Estate, and the legacy of the late Mr. George Michie, of \$2,000, and some other large donations, which will be acknowledged in the published documents along with the report, to have about \$5,000 to commence the building fund. This is so far well. But considerably more will be required to erect a building adequate to the necessities of the case. And the Board would take the liberty of urging the claims of this Institution upon such as may be in circumstances of abundance, and upon all who may be able to help in this benevolent work, to come to its aid, believing that there is no way in which they will feel more satisfaction in giving of their means, than to alleviate the sorrows and to promote the welfare of those needy and helpless persons, who, with bodily disease, humanly speaking, incurable, and destitute of the means of subsistence and comfort, either of themselves, or friends, would be compelled to drag out a miserable existence, only to contemplate relief in the cessation of life on this earth. For the care of life, no Institution has more of the spirit which Christianity infuses, than a Home for Incurables. "Blessed is he that considereth the poor; the Lord will deliver him in time of

trouble." "The poor shall never cease out of the land. Therefore, I command thee saying, 'Thou shalt open thine hand wide unto thy brethren, to thy poor, and to the needy in thy land.'"

The Treasurer's report showed that the income for the year amounted to \$3, 643.25, while the expenditure was \$2,766.54, leaving a balance on hand of \$876.71. It was also shown that a balance of \$2,194.78 was placed to the credit of the Building Fund.

The Board of Management express their grateful acknowledgment to the citizens of Toronto, and other friends, for the generous support which they have given, also to the City Council and the Ontario Government for their liberal grants in aid of the Institution—the former of \$300, and the latter of \$346.15. It is gratifying, too, that the Home for Incurables has not been forgotten by the Warden of the County of York, amongst the charitable institutions of the city, the present Warden, Mr. N. Clarke Wallace, having sent a donation of \$20.

The Board would reiterate the principle on which inmates are received into the Home, viz., that it is for such as in the Providence of God have been afflicted with incurable disease, preventing them from doing anything to earn a livelihood for themselves, and who are destitute of all means of support; and further, that the Home is open to all such without distinction of nationality or creed.

The Board very gratefully recognize the important services which the members of the Medical Staff have so kindly and ungrudgingly rendered to the Institution. They have frequently put themselves to much trouble and inconvenience to further the interests of the Home. Without their aid, so cheerfully given, the Home could not have attained its present position.

To the clergymen and others who have held religious services on Sabbaths and other days, the Board offer their sincere thanks. The inmates are always glad to have such services, deprived, as they are, of the ordinary means of grace in the sanctuary.

The Board cannot but acknowledge the benefit which the Institution derives from the weekly attendance of the ladies at the Home, in regular order. Such an arrangement has tended greatly to keep all things in a satisfactory state, both by kindly Christian conversation with the inmates, and by paying attention to whatever, between the periods of the monthly meetings, may require notice.

The Board have also to report their satisfaction with the Matron and Superintendent in the discharge of their duties. The instructions of the Board, the comfort of the patients, and the general oversight of the affairs of the Home, are carefully attended to by them.

All which is respectfully reported by authority of the Board.

MEDICAL REPORT.

Dr. Richardson sent the following report regarding the state of the inmates of the Home for Incurables, till 28th February, 1878 :—

At the date of the last report there were inmates of the House, 16 ; admitted since, heart disease, 1 ; dropsy, 1 ; blindness, 1 ; spinal disease, 1 ; head affections, 2 ; ulcers, 2 ; Paralysis, 6 ; total, 30.

Of these, left of their own accord, 7 ; sent to hospital, 1 ; sent to lunatic asylum, 2 ; died, 2 ; total, 12.

Remaining in the House, 18.

Of these, there are 1 dropsy ; 1 spinal disease ; 1 heart disease ; 1 ulcer ; 1 paralysis agitans ; 1 softening of brain ; 1 asthma ; 1 injury to hip ; 1 blindness ; 3 rheumatism ; 6 paralysis ; total, 18.

Of these two who died, one was a blind paralytic, who had been an inmate of the House ever since it was opened in May, 1874 ; and the other was a paralytic, admitted in October, 1876.
