TWELFTH ANNUAL SESSION

OF THE

SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF MONTREAL.

FIRST DAY.

The 12th Annual Meeting of the Synod was held on Tuesday, the 20th June, 1871.

Divine Service was celebrated on the morning of the 20th in the Cathedral.

Morning Prayer was said by the Rev. Canon Ellegood; the first lesson was read by the Rev. Geo. C. Pennell, of the Diocese of Albany, U.S.; the second lesson, by the Rev. J. N. T. Goss, of the same Diocese; the Ante-Communion service, by the Metropolitan and the Venerable the Archdeacon of Assiniboine, Manitoba; the sermon was preached by the Rev. David Lindsay; the Holy Communion was administered by the Metropolitan, assisted by Archdeacon McLean, the Rev. Canon Baldwin and the Rev. J. Philip DuMoulin.

At half-past 2 o'clock the Synod assembled for business in the Synod Hall, the Metropolitan presiding. After prayer the roll of the Clergy was called by the Clerical Secret ary, and that of the Laity by the Lay Secretary.

The Rev. R. W. Norman and Dr. Smallwood were appointed Scrutineers to examine the list of Lay delegates.

The Ven. Archdeacon McLean, of the Diocese of Rupert's Land, being present, was invited by his Lordship the Metropolitan to take a seat on the platform; the Rev. Geo. C. Pennell, Secretary of the Diocese of Albany, and the Rev. J. N. T. Goss, Assistant-Secretary of the same Diocese, being present, were also invited to take seats in the House.

The Metropolitan delivered the following address:-

MY BRETHREN OF THE CLERGY AND LAITY:

I meet you to-day, no longer with the feeling of a stranger, with which I addressed you on the last occasion; for nearly two years have now elapsed since I first entered upon my office as the Presiding Pastor of this important Dioceses I have learnt much during that time, as to the difficulties of my position, as to the wants of the diocese, and as to the peculiar characteristics both of the field of labour and of those whom God has called to work in it. I trust that you have also learnt to give me credit, amidst all my short-comings, for a single desire to serve my Heavenly Master, and you for His sake. And I doubt not that you have found out that, in accordance with the principle which I laid down at starting, my desire is to act not as the Bishop of a section, but of the whole Church; and that whereever I see real earnestness and devotedness of heart, I am disposed to overlook little differences, in order that I may help forward the great work of Christ. I was quite prepared to expect that this policy of moderation would not be entirely acceptable to those who are inclined to extreme views on either side, and consequently would render my course somewhat difficult; but being convinced that such a course is the right one, I hope, by God's help, never to swerve from it. The recent appeal case in England of Hebbert vs. Purchas, has, I conceive, settled some points before uncertain; and unless that judgment be overruled, which is not likely, the law of the Church, as to the questions at issue, is decided. There are a few points of minor importance, ruled by that judgment, which have long caused much discussion and bitterness of feeling, on which we might, I think, with great advantage come together-such points on the one hand as the position of Celebrant in the Holy Communion, and on the other hand the vesture o the clergy in the pulpit. Here, then, is a basis for some approach to uniformity. Let those who belong to one school of thought consent to give up the practice of turning from the congregation in the administration of the Holy Communion; and let those who belong to the other fall in with the practice which now prevails in almost every church of wearing the surplice in preaching. I shall be extremely thankful if, in such matters, more of a spirit of mutual conciliation might be shown, and that our clergy might be disposed so to modify their practice as to be more in harmony one with the other. May I not hope that, as we realize more and more the great and blessed work to be done by us in this rough field of Canada, we at

least shall see the unwisdom of stopping to dispute about matters which are, in themselves, the veriest trifles, when compared with the eternal salvation of souls? Let us rather at once buckle on our armour, and go forth to our warfare, feeling that no time must be wasted, but that "the King's business requireth haste." Above all, may we not hope that this present Synod may be specially marked by an entire absence of anything that savours of party strife; that all combinations to strengthen the interest of this or that section will be studiously avoided; and that we shall vie with one another to forward the real welfare of the Church, rather than to win a party triumph.

During the last year it has pleased God to remove from among us two of our Fathers in the Ministry—one, the Rev. Canon Townshend, who fifty years ago patiently bore the burden and heat of the day, when there was little to cheer the heart, and much to endure for Christ's sake—the other, the Rev. J. Braithwaite, an accomplished scholar, as well as a faithful minister, to whom more than one in this assembly owes the blessing of his early Christian training.

The number of Clergy now labouring in the diocese amounts to seventy-six. There are also eleven candidates for holy orders; and as the number of the latter has greatly increased in the last three months, I am thankful that my anxiety on the score of a supply for the sacred ministry is, to a certain extent, abated. We have an additional band of nine Lay Readers, employed under Episcopal license in our missions: two of these are in sole charge, and the remainder are working under the superintendence of the clergy, and aiding them in their ministrations. Their valuable services are in most cases given gratuitously. The training of candidates for holy orders is still a matter which weighs heavily and anxiously on my mind. You are aware that, in conjunction with some leading clergymen and laymen of the diocese, I initiated a movement in this direction a few months ago. I did so, not from any indifference to the interests and welfare of the existing college at Lennoxville, for that college has had, and always will have, my cordial support; nor on account of the teaching in that institution, for I believe it to have been as good as under existing circumstances could have been given; but simply and solely because I felt that it would be for the welfare of this Diocese if we had an institution of our own, and if the training of our young clergy were nearer to the centre of their future work. Finding, however, that a decided majority of the clergy, and many also of our laity, viewed the matter in a different light from myself and those who acted with me, and at the reasonable suggestion of the Corporation of Lennoxville, we consented to stay our hands and leave the matter for a while in abeyance. However strong my own convictions may be, I would never desire to carry them out, if known to be at variance with the feelings of my clergy, whose interests in such a matter are deeply concerned. At the same time I wish it clearly to be understood that no act of mine for the improvement of Bishop's College, either in the past Synod or in the present, is of a nature to fetter me as to my future freedom of action in this respect. Whilst on this subject, I would remind you that a measure for

bringing Bishop's College into closer connection with the two Synods of Montreal and Quebec was passed at our last session. Certain resolutions were then agreed to, but v. e were somewhat premature in proceeding forthwith to the election of those trustees and members of Council who were to represent our Synod in the newly constituted body, since the Act empowering us to do so had not yet passed the Legislature. It has since become law; and I have named to-morrow as the most convenient day for us to make that election. A deputation consisting of the Chancellors of the University, and three other members of the Corporation, have kindly offered to wait upon us during our present session, in order to give any information which we may require. I need scarcely ask you to receive them with all respect, and to admit them to the body of this house.

As to the mission work of the diocese, I may truly say that God has not withheld His blessing. Notwithstanding certain difficulties, of which I shall presently speak, the work has prospered, is prospering, and I believe will prosper. Two new churches have been built within the cary limits, and there is room for more, especially in the lower parts of the town. A regular service is now held at Côte des Neiges, after a suspension of two years. Six churches in other parts of the diocese have been opened, four of which have been consecrated. Others also are now in progress. I have ordained five Priests and two Deacons. But we still need more labourers, and increased funds for their support. In addition to the signs of life which I have mentioned, I would add that I have held during the past year forty-four confirmations, and admitted eight hundred and fifty-seven persons to the privilege of that holy Rite. And truly I may say, with regard to these confirmations, that no part of my episcopal duties gives me truer satisfaction than this, or calls forth more abundantly the zeal, energy and devotedness of the clergy. Never since my entrance upon my work here have I observed a single instance of lightness on the part of any candidate who has been presented to me. And the warm interest evidently taken by the various congregations shews me that this ordinance is increasingly appreciated by the Church at large.

I have, on more than one occasion, been requested by clergymen who have several congregations to whom they minister on the same Sunday, to authorize some curtailment of the morning service. I feel that the length of that service in such cases is a little burdensome to an overtaxed Missionary, and I propose to bring the subject before my Right Reverend Brethren at the next meeting of the Provincial Synod, with a view to some united action in regard to it. Meanwhile any clergyman, who ministers to more than two congregations in the day, has my authority to use a portion only of the morning service at each, so that it be an integral and complete portion. That is to say, of the three services now used in their blended form, he is at liberty to omit one office on the Sunday morning.

And now I come to a matter which must needs be one of considerable anxiety both to myself and to you all—the financial condition of our Mission Fund. This has been for years past anything but satisfactory. There

has ordinarily been a small deficit at the close of each year; and this difficulty has been tided over as best it could, either by borrowing money to meet the existing debt, and repaying it when the exchequer has been replenished, or by making a special collection at once to pay it off. This year, however, it was felt by the Executive Committee that the time had come when, although the balance could easily have been dealt with as heretofore, it was desirable to look the difficulty fairly in the face, and provide against its recurrence. At recent meetings of the Committee, two decided steps were adopted: 1st, The Treasurer was directed to pay on the next quarter day, July 1st, one-half of the salaries then due, being such an instalment only as could be met by the funds in hand, leaving the remainder to be paid when fresh funds shall have been received. This was a measure calculated to produce serious inconvenience; but it was considered necessary under the existing circumstances. 2nd, It was agreed by the Committee to withdraw the Church's grant from certain older missions which were considered capable of self-support, and to date such withdrawal from July 1st. Whilst I concur in the principle of its being desirable that as many as possible of our long established missions should depend upon their own resources, I strongly objected, and do still object, to the mode of carrying that principle out. My objection lay against the arbitrary selection of certain missions, from which it was decided to remove the grant, without sufficient information as to their ability to depend upon their own internal strength. And I further objected to the short-the needlessly shortnotice which was given to these missions to adapt themselves to their altered condition. I therefore felt it right to record my objection by entering a formal protest on the minutes against the particular resolution which was passed. My decided counsel is that the details of so important a measure should be carefully reconsidered, especially as regards the parishes from which the grant is to be removed, and the extension of the time from which such removal shall date. But however much I may have objected to the details of the measure, this I feel bound to say, that those who were forward in recommending it were impelled by the necessity of the case, and wil' yield, I am very sure, to none in their sincere desire to advance the interests of the Church. I hope that, if this subject is discussed during our present session, it will be considered with the gravity and forbearance which it demands; and that the result will be the putting our Mission Fund on a better and more vigorous footing. Let our clergy exercise a little faith and patience; and let our laity cheerfully accept whatever increased responsibility forces itself upon them. Of this I am sure, that we may confidently rely upon the true-hearted liberality of our Church members to meet with an open hand any reasonable demands which are made upon them, and not suffer the work of God to flag for lack of support. I believe there are not only abundant means at our disposal, but also a willingness to furnish those means. There are two points which must claim our immediate attention in any future arrangement. The first is the paramount necessity of augmenting the stipends of the clergy. We owe it to

them as a matter of justice; we owe it still more to ourselves as a matter of elf-respect. The other point is the commencing without delay to lay the oundation of a sustentation or endowment fund for the future exigencies of the Church. Our diocese stands alone, of the ave which form this ecclesiastical province, in never having made a real effort in this direction. We have improvidently trusted to the annual generosity of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, well knowing, however, that their liberal grant will shortly be altogether withdrawn. Indeed, in a letter which I received from the Society on Wednesday last, it is announced that the amount of assistance voted to us for the year 1872 is £1800, being a reduction of £200 upon the present grant. I would also state that, in a letter which I received from the Secretary some months since, he complains of the fact that a considerable portion of the Society's aid has been given to missions of more than ten years' standing. To this he calls my attention, and intimates that the Society expects its money to be in future expended, not on established and fairly rooted missions, but upon those which have been more recently opened, and therefore require their aid. In conformity with this latter intimation, I shall, at the next meeting of the Executive Committee, recommend the transfer of the Society's grant to the more decided missionary work of the diocese, and the placing of the older missions, which still require extraneous support, upon the list of grants from the General Church Fund. As to the urgent necessity of raising a Sustentation Fund, I hope that our leading churchmen will feel that they cannot do better than consecrate their wealth to so blessed a purpose, thus placing on a firm footing the future support of the Church in this land. The zeal shewn by our brethren of the Irish Church in this respect, may serve as a worthy stimulus to us here, whose necessities, in many respects, are precisely similar.

There now remain a few miscellaneous subjects, which I shall group together, touching upon each of them very briefly before I close. In my last address I expressed my opinion that we ought no longer to depart from the established rule of our Church regarding the celebration of marriages in the House of God, and there only. I requested the clergy to bear in mind that it was my wish, if possible, to carry out this rule. I will take this opportunity of thanking them for their readiness in doing so; and I desire also to express my gratification that the laity have so cheerfully fallen in with the request of their bishop. There is a growing custom which has of lare prevailed in the churches of this city, which, I confess, a little grates against my idea of what is consistent with the dignity and decorum of the Christian Sanctuary. I refer to the plan of advertising the preacher for the coming Sunday. Even if it were unobjectionable in itself, I cannot but think that it fails to produce the effect that is looked for; for, if a few migratory hearers are attracted to one church by the announcement of a particular preacher, they would most likely be drawn away from that same church on the following Sunday to listen to another. But I must regard the practice as somewhat subversive of the solemnity of Public Worship, as giving an undue prominence to the words of man, and as fostering that taste for

excitement which is not altogether healthy. There are, of course, occasions when it is not only permissive, but also desirable, to announce both the preacher and his subject; as, for instance, when a special sermon is preached, and for a special object, or when a stranger of mark comes among shall be quite content if the clergy and their churchwardens will give this subject their thoughtful consideration; and I feel sure that they will not mistake my motive in alluding to it. I am anxious to know the mind of the Synod regarding a General Harvest Thanksgiving Daywhether a Sunday or week-day should be chosen, whether it would be well to make an effort to unite all sections of the Church in the observance of the same day, and whether a day could not be fixed upon to be observed in common by our brethren in the neighboring dioceses. I am very glad that notice of a motion on this subject has been given, and this will probably draw out the opinion of the Synod on the subject. I may add that an application which I made to the Government last year was kindly and courteously received; but it was felt that there would be a difficulty in carrying out officially the suggestion.

I cannot conclude without expressing my thankfulness for the blessings of the past year, for the peace which the Church has enjoyed, for the harmony which for the most part exists among our clergy and their several flocks, and for the apparent success which has attended our endeavours. I hope that we shall all, in our respective positions, labour with increased energy, for there is a great work still before us, and the time is short. Let me reiterate the earnest request which I made at the last Synod, and which you so entirely carried out, to bear in mind wherefore we are come together, namely, to consult, to deliberate, to give and receive brotherly council, to strengthen one another's hands, to cheer one another's hearts, to draw closer together. May we be guided and influenced by that Holy Spirit who presided in the Councils of the Apostles, and whose presence we have solemnly asked! May we, each one of us, so speak and so act that we may have nothing to regret, and that this meeting of our Synod may greatly help forward the Church's work and the cause of our common Master in this

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.

The following Report of the Executive Committee was read by the Secretary :-

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

In pursuance of the Clause in the Constitution, in that behalf contained, the Executive Committee beg to report to the Synod, as follows:-

MEETINGS.

Regular meetings of the Executive Committee have been held during the past year on the 10th August, 9th November, 8th February, and 10th May. Special meetings were held on 23rd June, 1st April, and 19th April.

TREASURER.

At the regular meeting of the Executive Committee on 9th November last, Mr. Jas. Hutton, Diocesan Treasurer, having intimated that he was

about to leave this country for six months, Mr. Geo. Moffatt was appointed in his room; and at a regular meeting of this Committee on 10th May last. Mr Moffatt having stated that he was about to sail for England, Mr. M. H. Sanborn was appointed Treasurer pro tem.

COMMITTEES.

At a special meeting on 23rd June last the following Committees were appointed:—

A Committee on the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, "to enquire into the working of the Fund, and to prepare a list of the Clergy entitled to its privileges, and to report generally with respect to said Fund;" a Committee "to examine and report upon the subject of Endowments in the Diocese;" a Committee on Investments; a Lay Committee on Missions; a Committee on Superannuation Fund. At a regular meeting of the Executive Committee, held on 10th Aug. last, a Book and Tract Committee was appointed. The appointment and action of the foregoing Committees have been attended by the following results:—

The Committees on Investments, on Endowments, and on Widows' and Orphans' Fund, have not yet reported, but have obtained permission to continue their labours. The Book and Tract Committee obtained a grant of \$100 for the purchase of tracts, to be paid whenever the Treasurer should have funds available for that purpose.

The Lay Committee on Missions has been constant in its labours since last Synod. A review of its operations will shew how a long impending crisis in the condition of the Mission Fund has at last arrived, and must be dealt with by the Synod. In the Report of the Executive Committee submitted to the last Synod (p. 25), it was stated, as follows: "At a meeting of the Committee, August 12, 1868, the Secretary read a paper shewing that the Diocese, for years, in consequence of anticipating revenue, has really been in debt to the amount of \$5,000." It has been customary to meet this want in past years by special effort in the city, or by borrowing from other funds at the disposal of the Synod. Your Committee are of opinion that this state should no longer exist, and that this chronic deficiency in the Mission Fund should be dealt with in the way of permanent remedy; they, therefore, proceed to state the labours and recommendations of the Lay Committee.

The Lay Committee on Missions presented to the regular meeting of this Committee, held on 9th November last, their report, stating that, in accordance with the Report of the Committee on Missions, adopted at the last Synod of the Diocese of Montreal, the Metropolitan had appointed a Board of Missions in each of the Rural Deaneries, and that the Lay Committee had forwarded to each Rural Dean a schedule of questions framed so as to ascertain the circumstances and capabilities of the several parishes and Missions.

The said Report was received and permission given to the Committee to continue its labours and report at the next regular meeting of the Executive Committee.

At the same meeting his Lordship the Bishop was respectfully requested by resolution to write a Pastoral to the Clergy, requesting them at once, and with earnestness, to proceed with the parochial collections in aid of the Mission Fund, which his Lordship accordingly did.

Meetings of the Mission Boards in the several Deaneries having been held, and information returned to the Lay Committee, in answer to their questions, that Committee, after a careful consideration of the condition and circumstances of each Parish and Mission within the Diocese, conducted in the light of the information supplied by the Mission Boards, presented its full report to the Executive Committee at a regular meeting on the 8th November last, whereupon it was resolved that the Report of the Lay Committee on Missions be printed and circulated throughout the Diocese, and be considered at the next regular meeting of the Executive Committee. The said Report was accordingly printed and transmitted to the Clergy and Churchwardens of the several Parishes and Missions in this Diocese.

Pending the consideration of that Report, a special meeting of the Executive Committee was called for the 1st April last by circular from the Metropolitan. At this meeting the Treasurer, having read his statement shewing a deficiency of \$779 to meet the payments due that day, the following resolutions were unanimously carried:—

"That the position of the Mission Fund in the hands of the Treasurer renders it impossible for the salaries due this day to be paid without special individual assistance.

"That such assistance has been promised to meet this day's payments, but that the same difficulty, only in a greater degree, will arise on the 1st of July next.

"That the Treasurer be requested, in transmitting the April payments, to state these facts to the Clergy, urging them to forward the collections now due, and stating that the funds in his hands will not allow of the payment of the full salaries due 1st July next.

"That each Clergyman be requested to read the circular on the next Sunday, and to bring it before the vestry at Easter.

"That the Bishop be respectfully requested to call a special meeting of the Executive Committee to consider the state of the Mission Fund, and to be held on Wednesday, the 19th April instant."

In compliance with the foregoing resolutions the Treasurer caused such a circular to be sent to the Clergy, but it was not attended with any success, nor followed by any appreciable increase in the amount of the parochial collections paid in.

In further compliance with the foregoing resolutions the adjourned meeting of the Committee was held on the 19th April, but the Treasurer, so far from being in any better position, was obliged to state that the Mission Fund was on that day \$2,000 in debt After a long and careful discussion of the whole matter the following resolution was carried unanimously:—

Resolved .—" That, looking at the position of the Mission Fund, its present

indebtedness of upwards of \$2,000, and the probable receipts to 30th June, not more than one half of the salaries can be paid to each Clergyman on 1st July next, as an instalment of what is due on that day."—A copy of this resolution was sent to the Clergy.

Within three weeks after this resolution had been passed and sent, viz., on 10th May, the next regular meeting of this Committee was held, at which the Treasurer reported that a sum of \$4,188.41 would be required, over and above the sum then in his hands, to meet the payments due on 1st July next.

At this meeting the Report of the Lay Committee on Missions, previously printed and circulated, should in course have been considered; but, in consequence of the condition of the Mission Fund, the Lay Committee had prepared an amended Report, which was submitted to the meeting, and, having been received and considered clause by clause, was adopted in form, as follows:—

Resolved.—That since the Report of this Committee, printed for consideration on the 10th May, 1871, the state of the accounts of the Mission Fundhas proved that it is impossible to find the money recommended to be paid in the Report referred to.

That, considering the present indebtedness of the Mission Fund, and the announced yearly diminution of the grant from the S. P. G., no further aid can be given to the following Missions, and that, from the 1st July next, they must support themselves amongst their own congregations, the sums hitherto paid, both from the Mission Fund and from the S. P. G. grant, being finally withdrawn from the date named, viz.:

Aylmer, Hemmingford, Huntingdon, Knowlton and Brome, Milton, Potton, Phillipsburgh, Sutton, West Farnham, West Shefford. The consideration of the case of Cowansville to be deferred for three months. Granby to be self-supporting from 1st April, 1872.

That the grant hitherto made to the Mission at Coteau du Lac be withdrawn, and that it be attached to the Parish of Vaudreuil.

That the following reductions be made in the present grants, viz.:

Onslow.—The present grant of \$400 to be reduced to \$300.

North Wakefield to be reduced from \$300 to \$250.

Aylwin .- Grant reduced to \$300.

Rawdon.—The present grant of \$50 for a Catechist to be withdrawn.

It being considered of great importance that the funds at the disposal of the Executive Committee should be as soon as possible placed upon a thoroughly sound basis, it was further unanimously resolved:

That the authority for making special annual grants from the S. P. G. Fund, as shewnin the printed list, be enquired into, and the facts laid before the next quarterly meeting of the Executive Committee; and

That the Chancellor be requested to advise as to the legal position of the parties now being paid from the Clergy Trust Fund of the Diocese of Montreal.

The Committee believe that these measures are absolutely necessary, and that, by at once meeting the present very serious financial crisis in the man-

ner proposed, the question of Missions in this Diocese will be placed in a sounder position, and that the foundation can then be laid for the adoption of a system which will carry out true missionary principles, viz., the affording of temporary aid to districts and communities to obtain church accommodation and religious teaching until they have grown sufficiently numerous to support them by their own unaided resources.

The Chancellor, having examined the question of the Clergy Trust Fund, made his Report, bearing date of the 18th May, 1871, in which he advised

"Those who have presently a right to rank on the Fund are the following: Rev. Canon Anderson for £60 16s. 8d. per annum; Rev. Isaac Constantine for £73 per annum; Rev. David Lindsay for £91 5s. per annum; Rev. James Fulton for £121 13s. 4d. per annum; Rev. Fred. Robinson for £97 6s. 8d. per annum; and Rev. Jacob Ellegood for £121 13s. 4d. per annum. By reference to the Treasurer's Reports it will be seen that the amount he pays annually to each of the said Incumbents corresponds with the above figures, except in the case of the Rev. Isaac Constantine, who has been paid annually for some years past the sum of £121 13s. 4d. instead of £73."

At a meeting of the Lay Committee, held on the 3rd May last, the Report of the Chancellor was read, and the following resolution passed:

"That inasmuch as it appears by the Report of the Chancellor, that the annual stipends payable to the several Clergymen enumerated in that Report out of the Clergy Trust Fund are beyond the control of the Executive Committee, so long as those Clergymen continue to do duty in the Diocese, or are disabled from so doing, that no action can be taken with regard to

At the same meeting the authority for making special annual grants from the S. P. G. Fund, as those in the printed list, was enquired into, and it was

"That, in the opinion of the Lay Board, the following places should be self-supporting, viz., Sorel, Hull, Bedford, and St. Andrews, and they therefore recommend that the Bishop should endeavour to arrange with the Incumbents of those places, either to surrender their claims to be paid the amounts they presently receive out of the S. P. G. Fund, or, to consent to do missionary work in such other places in the Diocese as his Lordship may determine." It was further resolved "That the grant to Portage du Fort be reduced from \$400 to \$300."

At an adjourned meeting of the Executive Committee, held on the 19th June instant, it was resolved :

"That the resolutions of the Lay Committee passed on the 3rd June, now

read, be adopted by this Committee." It was further resolved, "That, in view of the explanation contained in the letter of the Rev. I. Constantine, with reference to the amount annually paid to him out of the Clergy Trust Fund, the amount so paid to him be continued to be paid as heretofore."

At the same meeting the Bishop read the following to the Committee from the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, which was directed to be embodied in this Report and printed for circulation:—

Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts.
20 Duke Street, Westminster, London, S.W.,
23rd May, 1871.

MY DEAR LORD,

I have the pleasure of announcing the amount of assistance which the Society can promise for the year 1872. The terms of the Society's Resolution are—

(1.) That the sum of £1,800 be granted for the Diocese of Montreal in the year ending 31 December, 1872, to be administered by the Bishop and Committee, in accordance with the Society's Bye-laws and Regulations; that this grant be also charged with any claims for pensions which may arise in the year and be admitted, by the Society, and with any expense for the passage of missionaries from this country to Montreal, which may be incurred here, in accordance with the regulations, and with any other expense strictly appropriate to the Diocese, and sanctioned by the Society.

Also, that the pension (£50) of Mrs. A. Baldwin be paid in 1872, as usual.

2. The Society has to regret a decline in the amount of its income last year. Fresh fields for Missionary work have been providentially opened, but the pecuniary means of entering on them have been withheld from the Society. While making new efforts to stir up the missionary zeal of Church men at home, and to direct it to such openings, the Society feels that the time is now come when our fellow-Churchmen abroad who were formerly, or are now, aided in supporting the ministrations of the Church, should be entreated to make a united effort in the common cause. I am, therefore, instructed by the Society "to propose to the Bishops and Diocesan Synods, or Committees, who administer the Society's grants, to cause in every Christian congregation which derives help from the Society an annual collection to be made to assist the Society in its missionary work among the heathen in India." The Society hopes that it may receive at least some small token of sympathy with it in its Missionary work from every such congregation in your Diocese. And I am desired to ask you to have the kindness to let us hear before the end of the year what reception the Society's proposal meets with, and to assure you that the collections thus made will be taken into consideration by the Society on the next occasion of the renewal of its grants to the several Dioceses which it assists. A manifestation of the sympathy of the Colonial Church with us in our common work for the extension of the Kingdom of our Lord cannot fail to stir up the zeal of Churchmen here in the same cause, and the progress of our Missions throughout the world may thus, with God's blessing, be accelerated.

3. It may be convenient to you to be reminded of the Society's regulations as to the conditions, administrations, &c., of its grants, and I enclose herewith a copy of the principal regulations on that subject.

The Lord Bishop of Montreal.

At the same meeting the Superannuation Fund Committee presented their Report, recommending that no time should be lost in making active exertion to place the Superannuation Fund upon a respectable footing; that, in order to do this, in addition to the Clerical subscription and the proceeds of collections after the Annual Sermon directed by the Bishop to be preached the first Sunday in December, there should be an earnest appeal made to the Lay members of the Church in the Diocese to come forward with special donations for this object, and that his Lordship the Bishop be requested to address to them a Pastoral letter on this subject. The said Report also recommended the following Bye-laws for the management of

1. That this fund be styled "The Superannuation Fund for the relief of aged and infirm Clergymen in the Diocese of Montreal."

2. That every duly licensed Clergyman of the Diocese of Montreal, as a condition of receiving any assistance from this Fund, shall be required to pay annually, on or before the 20th day of May, the sum of five dollars to

3. That, to entitle a Clergyman to receive relief from this Fund, it is required that he shall have been resident and doing duty under license from the Bishop for a term of not less than five years.

4. That all such cases as may present themselves as proper objects for the application of this Fund shall be recommended by the Bishop to the Executive Committee, and decided upon by the vote of a two-thirds majority of that Committee.

5. That the control of this Fund shall be placed in the hands of the Executive Committee.

The said Report of the Superannuation Fund Committee was received and adopted by the Executive Committee.

Your Committee have, in Schedules hereto annexed, set forth the particulars of all monies received and grants made for missionary purposes, and also the present condition of the several Funds, with the management of which this Committee is intrusted by the Synod.

All which is respectfully submitted.

Montreal, 19th June, 1871.

Moved by Mr. L. H. DAVIDSON, seconded BETHUNE:

"That the order of the day be suspended, in order to admit of immediate consideration of the Report of the Executive Committee." Carried.

Moved by Mr. L. H. DAVIDSON, seconded by Mr. CRAW-FORD:

"That the Report of the Executive Committee be received, printed, and circulated amongst the Members of this House for consideration, and that it be the first order of business on Thursday morning next."

Moved, in amendment, by the Rev. H. F. DARNELL, seconded by the Rev. J. Fulton:

"That the Report of the Lay Committee on Missions be forthwith considered." Carried.

The Report of the Lay Committee on Missions was read by the Secretary at the request of the Synod.

Moved by Rev. H. F. DARNELL, seconded by Rev. DAVID LINDSAY:

"That this Synod, whilst thanking the Lay Committee for the care and attention they have given to this subject, yet, in view of the wealth and increasing prosperity of this Diocese, cannot accept their Report with reference to the Missions of the Church, in its present form, inasmuch as they consider it tantamount to an admission that it is incapable of sustaining the Missions of the Church in their present extent and efficiency, which, it is the belief of this Synod, is not actually the case; further, that this Report be submitted to the Deaneries to take action thereon."

It being 6 o'clock, the Synod adjourned to 10 o'clock the following day.

The Metropolitan pronounced the Benediction.

SECOND DAY.

21st June, 1871.

The proceedings of the second day commenced with the reading of Morning Prayer in the Cathedral at 9 a.m., after which the members of Synod assembled at ten o'clock for the transaction of business. After prayer by the Metropolitan, the rolls of Clerical and Lay Delegates were called by the Secretaries, and the minutes of the previous day's proceedings were read by the Clerical Secretary, and confirmed.

APPOINTMENT OF COMMITTEES.

Moved by the Rev. DAVID LINDSAY, seconded by Rev. W. Jones:

That a Committee be appointed to prepare a Canon for the division of Missions. (Carried.)

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.

The Rural Dean of Bedford read his Report. appendix A.)

The Rural Dean of St. Andrews read his Report. (See appendix A.)

The Rural Dean of Iberville explained that his Report had not been adopted at a Ruri-Decanal meeting.

The Rural Dean of Hochelaga being absent in Europe, no Report from that Deanery was read.

The Treasurer read his Report. (See appendix B.)

Dr. SMALLWOOD, on behalf of the Education Committee, read the following Report:

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION.

At the Annual Meeting of the Synod for the Diocese of Montreal, held in June, 1870, your Committee were re-appointed, with the Rev. Canon Balch as Convener, but owing to the absence from Montreal of several members of the Committee, no meeting was held until the 9th of November, when the Rev. Canon Balch and Mr. T. R. Johnson were appointed a Sub-committee to canvass for subscriptions.

Shortly after the Rev. Canon Balch left for the United States, and, on his return, resigned, when the undersigned was named by the Bishop as Con-

The labours of your Committee have been exclusively devoted to organizing a scheme for the establishment of a Boarding School, or College, for the Education of Young Ladies, the training of which would compare favorably with the education furnished by the Roman Catholic Institutions, and by these means remove Protestant children from those influences which it is known to have resulted, in many instances, in their perversion to the

Elaborate and satisfactory plans were brought forward, shewing that, to establish an institution of the kind, on a broad and liberal basis, the sum of from \$30,000 to \$50,000 would be required; with less than this sum the undertaking could not be proceeded with, with any prospect of success. This plan would furnish to each pupil board, tuition, and all necessaries of the

Your Committee did not meet with that encouragement they deemed equivalent to the end desired, and, consequently, it was determined to abandon the attempt for the present. Humbly submitted.

Dr. SMALLWOOD gave notice that he would move the adoption of the said Report.

The Rev. Canon BANCROFT read the Report of Committee on Division of Parishes, as follows:

REPORT ON DIVISION OF PARISHES.

The Committee on Division of Parishes beg leave to Report:

That it was agreed that it would be advisable to apply to the Legislature of the Province of Quebec for an Act to vest in the Synod the power of dividing existing Parishes under Letters Patent into two or more Parishes, and for that purpose authorise the Synod to confer upon each Parish thus separated, all the powers conveyed by the said Letters Patent.

Secondly. To confer upon the said Synod all necessary power and authority to establish, from time to time, the limits of each Parish so constituted and to subdivide the same if necessary, and to create new Parishes in any new settlement, or as the Synod may deem necessary.

Provided that such division or distribution of the said powers of the Letters Patent shall not take effect without the consent of the Rector in office at the time the Act shall come into force, or until after his death.

Canon BANCROFT gave notice that he would move the adoption of said Report.

The Ven. Archdeacon Leach read the Report of the Committee on Canons, as follows:

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CANONS.

1. That, as it is expedient to determine what shall be in future the designation of the Church, the Committee recommend that, instead of the words "of the United Church of England and Ireland," the designation be—

2. The Committee recommend that the terms in the second sentence of the "Declaration," viz., "Continue, as it has been, an integral portion of the United Church of England and Ireland," be deleted and the following substituted, viz., "Continue to maintain, as far as possible, the same relation to the Churches of England and Ireland that it has hitherto done."

3. Between Articles 6th and 7th of the section entitled Constitution, that there be inserted the following resolution, passed in Synod, (4th Syn. 21.): That, where it appears that any parish or mission shall not have made or transmitted to the Treasurer a collection to defray the expenses of the Synod, no delegate from that parish or mission shall be allowed to take his seat in the Synod next ensuing, until the deficiency is supplied.

4.—That, instead of the title (page 124 of 11th Synod) of "Rules and By-laws respecting the administration of the property, missions and trusts of the Synod" the title for sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, be

The Executive Committee, its constitution, powers, &c.

5.—That between the first and second section there be introduced the following resolution of Synod (11 Syn. p. 50.)

"That no Layman may be a member of the Executive Committee who has not paid in as a subscription to Diocesan Missions for the year preceding at least five dollars." Carried.

6.—That between Articles 5th and 6th (page 124 of 11th Synod) there be introduced under the title of Board of Missions, the following, contained in the report of the Lay Committee on Diocesan Missions and subsequently adopted by the Synod, viz. (11 S. p. 31 and 11 S. p. 40).

1.-That a Board of Missions shall be appointed annually in each Deanery, to be composed of four Clerical and four Lay members, who shall annually report upon each Mission in the Deanery, and their recommendation with regard to it, to the Executive Committee; the Bishop to appoint the members of the Board in each Deanery.

2.—That, excepting in any special case which may be directly recommended by the Bishop, each fresh application for a Mission grant shall emanate from the Ruri-decanal Meeting, who shall forward it for considera-

7. That, instead of Article 6, page 126, of 11th Synod, there be substituted the title "Widows" and Orphans' Fund."

8. That, instead of the clause in Article 5, page 127, of the 11th Synod, beginning "the first of such," and ending "death of her husband," there be substituted the following, as passed by resolution of Synod:-

"One quarter's salary shall be granted to the family of a deceased Clergyman from any funds controlled by the Synod, dating from the expiration of the quarter in which the decease occurs, and the Widows' pension to begin from the expiration of such quarterly payment."

9. That, instead of the clause in Section 3, beginning "Shall remit to the General Fund the sum of \$7.50," the following be introduced-"Shall remit to the Treasurer of the W. and O. Fund the sum of five dollars."

10. The Committee notice an incongruity of function in the Canon de re Rural Dean, in which Canon Rural Deans are to report to the Bishop through the Archdeacon; when the Rural Dean is an Archdeacon he is to report through himself. Again, no provision is made for supplying the place of a Rural Dean when he happens to be absent.

The Committee recommend that special Meetings of Deaneries may be held on the requisition of three Clerical and three Lay members of a Deanery.

11. That the following resolution, passed by the ninth Synod (Report, page 24th), be confirmed, viz. :-

That whenever, in any Parish or Mission, an Endowment Fund, to the amount of \$4,000, shall have been raised and invested to the satisfaction of the Bishop, and the balance of the salary pledged by the Vestry, such Parish or Mission shall, in case of a vacancy in the Ministry thereof, enjoy the same privilege in the choice of a Clergyman, as if it were a Patent Rectory.

- 12. As a Special Committee has been appointed on the Division of Parishes erected by Letters Patent, the Committee on Canons consider it premature to take up the subject till that Committee have reported upon it.
- 13. As a Committee has been appointed on the Sustentation or Endowment Fund, the Committee on Canons consider it premature to take up the subject till that Committee has further reported thereon.
- 14. That the resolution following, entitled "Of the Journal of Synod," passed in 1864, be confirmed. (9 S. p. 18.)
- "The Journal of Synod shall be printed under the direction of the Secretaries, immediately after the Annual Meeting. It shall contain all the acts and proceedings of the Synod, all reports of Committees, unless otherwise ordered, the list of Clergy and Lay Delegates entitled to sit in the Synod; the Committees appointed to sit during the recess, with the names of the respective members; the Constitution and Car as of the Diocese, with the Rules of Order; the Reports of the Rural Deans, and such other matter as may be specially ordered by the Synod. A copy of each Journal shall be transmitted by the Secretaries to the several Bishops of the Province, (Dominion); to the Secretaries of the Provincial Synod, and of the other Diocesan Synods; to the Diocesan Library, and to the Library of Bishop's College, Lennoxville, and to every Clergyman and Lay Delegate within the Diocese."
- 15. That, in the article entitled "Communicants," lines 1st and 2nd, the words "this body" be deleted, and the words "this Synod" be substituted.
- 16. That, in the article entitled "Notice of Ordination," between the words "transmitted" and "to" the words "by the Bishop" be inserted.
- 17. That the proposed Canon on discipline be taken up by the Synod for further consideration.—(6 Syn. p. 15.)
- 18. That, to complete the Canon on Representation to The Provincial Synod, the following clause be added, to the said Canon: "And six other Clerical and Lay representatives, whose names shall be next on the ballot, having the next highest number of votes, shall be substitute delegates to attend the Provincial Synod whenever from sickness, or other cause, the delegates shall be unable to attend the Provincial Synod."
- 19. That the following be adopted as a Canon, (taken from the collection of Canons of the Huron Diocese):—

STATISTICS OF THE CHURCH.

Every Clergyman, having a separate cure of souls within a Parish or Mission, shall annually submit, after a form to be prepared by the Executive Committee, a correct statement of the number of Baptisms, Confirmations, Marriages and Burials within the same, during the year; of the number of ctual Communicants within the said year; of the number of times that the Holy Communion has been publicly celebrated during the said year: of the number of Churches within the said Parish or Mission; the number of public services performed within the same; the number of Sunday and Parochial Schools, with the number of children and teachers attending the same respectively; the amounts collected at the general offertory, the offertory on Communion Sundays and at the special collections; also the amounts expended on Parochial objects, as for the Church, Parsonage, &c.; all sums contributed to Church objects external to, or beyond the Parish, and generally any items of annual interest, all which shall be as briefly condensed as possible, and inserted as an Appendix to the Journal of this Synod.

PROPOSED CANON OF DISCIPLINE.

ARTICLE I.

Who shall be amenable.

Every Priest and Deacon, duly licensed by the Bishop, is amenable for offences committed by him to the Ecclesiastical authority of the Diocese in which he resides, in the manner and under the provisions set forth in the Canon of Discipline hereinafter enacted.

What shall be punishable offences.

δ 1.

For any crime, or immorality, for drun enness, profane swearing, disorderly conduct, frequenting places most liable to be abused to licentiousness; for a violation of the Constitution or the Canons of the Church, or of the Diocese to which he belongs: for the discontinuing all exercise of the ministerial office, without lawful cause; or exercising any lay profession, or occupation inconsistent with his sacred calling; for the habitual disuse of public worship, or of the Holy Eucharist, according to the offices of the Church; for the infringement of the rubric, or for schism or the separating himself from the communion of the Church.

And also for heresy, or teaching, or maintaining heretical doctrines; or for teaching or inculcating doctrines, contrary to those of the Church; such teaching or maintaining, being by way of writing, or printing, or preaching, or public teaching, or circulating books containing unsound doctrines.

§ 2.

If there is reason for supposing, from public rumour or otherwise, that a Clergyman has been guilty of any of the foregoing ecclesiastical offences, the

Bishop of the Diocese, within which the offence is alleged or reported to have been committed, on the application of any party complaining thereof, or of his own mere motion, may summon the party to appear before him, in private, and, upon confession of the offence alleged, may pronounce such sentence as may be proper.

If the Bishop should consider the matter to be of such a character or magnitude as to require it to be placed on record, in such case the accusation shall be reduced to a definite form: there shall be added the confession signed by the party, and the same with the sentence pronounced, shall be recorded in like manner as other sentences are hereinafter directed to be recorded.

If the accused party shall not admit or confess the offence alleged, and the Bishop be of opinion that there are grounds for further inquiry, the Bishop may issue a commission under his hand and seal to *five* presbyters, of whom the Archdeacon

shall form three, who shall make inquiry into the truth of the accusations, and report the facts, as well as the evidence taken, and whether, in their opinion, there be sufficient *primâ facie* evidence for instituting further proceedings.

In such case, the accusation shall be reduced to form in writing, and notice of the time when, and place where, every such meeting of the commission shall be holden, shall be given in writing, to the party accused, at least twenty days before the first meeting; and it shall be lawful for the party accused, or his agent, to attend the proceedings of the commission, and to examine or cross-examine any witnesses; and such preliminary proceedings shall be in private, unless the party accused shall desire otherwise.

Should the party accused neglect or refuse to appear before the said commission, his default, after good and sufficient service, shall be placed on record, and the commissioners shall proceed with their inquiry ex parte.

Upon the receipt of the report of the commissioners, the Bishop shall take such further proceedings therein, as the case may, in his judgment, require.

ARTICLE II.

Presentment or charge, and form of.

A charge may be preferred against any clergyman for any of the ecclesiastical offences above enumerated, in the manner and under the provisions following.

It may be made by the Bishop of the Diocese, ex officio, by any two presbyters, by the churchwardens, or any three communicants, of any parish or mission, wherein the offence is alleged to have been committed.

The charge shall be in writing, signed by the parties making it, and shall specify the offence or offences with reasonable certainty, as to time, place, and circumstances.

There shall be annexed to it the names and residences of the material witnesses, and a copy of any documentary evidence relied on. It may be in the following form :-

"The subscribers, (titles and additions,) allege and charge, that the Rev. "A. B., a minister of this Church, of the order of

of the church or parish of "been guilty of certain ecclesiastical offences, for which he is subject to

"To establish which allegations and charge, we refer to the accompany-"ing affidavits, certificates, documents, and to the witnesses whose names

"and places of residence are hereunto annexed.

"Which charge (or charges) we know to be true in substance, (or) "which charges, on information satisfactory to us, we believe to be true."

Whenever a charge or charges against any priest or deacon shall have been reduced to writing and delivered to the Bishop, or, in his absence or incapacity, to his commissary, it shall then be the duty of such Bishop or commissary to transmit to the accused a certified copy thereof, together with notices of the time and place of trial, both of which the Bishop or commissary shall prescribe or fix.

The charges and notice shall be delivered to the accused, or left at his place of abode, at least thirty days before the time appointed for the trial.

ARTICLE III.

Board, or Court of Triers.

There shall be an Ecclesiastical Court, or Board of Triers, for the Diocese of Montreal to try such charges as may be preferred against any priest or deacon of the said diocese.

It shall be composed of fifteen priests, who shall be annually elected by a majority of the clerical order of the diocesan synod at its annual meeting, and who shall continue in office until others shall have been chosen in their

The Bishop shall have power to fill all vacancies which may occur by removal from the diocese, by death, by election to the episcopate, until the

The Court of Triers shall name from among their body a secretary, whose duty it shall be to keep a record of all the proceedings had before the

The Church Advocate (as hereinafter appointed), shall give notice in writing at least days before the day fixed for the trial, to the party accused, to attend before the clerical secretary of the Synod, time and place being mentioned in the notice, when and where the party accused, shall strike from the list of triers, elected as aforesaid, one of the names, and the Church Advocate shall strike off another, and so alternately until the number shall be reduced to five, which five shall form the Court for the

If the accused shall neglect to attend in person, or by an agent, the clerical secretary of the Synod shall strike the list with the Church Advocate, in place of the accused so absent.

The accused and Church Advocate may, by a written consent, fyled with the clerical secretary of the Synod, agree upon any five or three of the Board of Triers, to form the Court.

The Bishop shall issue a precept, addressed to the members of the Court of Triers, so struck or agreed upon, requiring them, or any three or more of them, to proceed to the trial of the accused at the appointed time and place; which precept, together with a certified copy of the charges, shall be transmitted by the Bishop to the president of the Court (to be named by him), whose duty it shall be, on receipt thereof, to cause all the members of the Court, or Board of Triers, to be summoned to meet at the prescribed time and place, any three or more of whom, who shall attend in pursuance of such summons, shall constitute the Court.

The Bishop shall, at the annual meeting of Synod, nominate a Church Advocate to conduct all prosecutions; he shall be a priest belonging to the diocese or a layman who has been a member of some church within the diocese, at least two years before such nomination.

If on the day fixed for the trial, the accused shall appear, he shall, before proceeding to trial, be called upon by the Court to say whether he is guilty or not of the offence or offences charged against him; and on his neglect or refusal, the plea of not guilty shall be entered for him, and his trial shall proceed.

Exceptions to the form or substance, or any part thereof, or legal sufficiency of the charge or presentment, or any part thereof, or of the allegations or specifications therein, or to the jurisdiction of the Board of Triers or any member thereof may be taken by the accusers, and shall be determined by the Board.

Such exceptions shall be made in writing, at the time of pleading.

If no such exceptions are taken, or having been taken, are overruled, the accused shall be called upon to plead guilty or not guilty, as aforesaid, and the trial shall proceed.

If the clergyman accused neglect or refuse to appear, according to his summons, due notice having been served upon him as aforesaid, except for some sufficient or reasonable cause, the Court shall certify such default to the Bishop, whereupon the Bishop, or, in his absence, shall pronounce him to be in contumacy: and sentence of suspension from the ministry shall be forthwith pronounced against him, for such contumacy, by the Bishop; but this sentence may be revoked if, within three calendar months, he shall tender himself ready, and accordingly appear and take his trial on the presentment; but if the clergyman accused shall not so tender himself before the expiration of the said three months, the sentence of deposition from the ministry shall be pronounced against him by the Bishop; and the Bishop shall cause such sentence to be publicly read to the several congregations of the diocese by the respective ministers thereof.

No proceeding shall be instituted against any priest or deacon, unless the same be commenced within two years after the commission of the offence

But when proceedings are brought in respect of an offence for which a conviction has been obtained in a civil or criminal tribunal, the suit in the Ecclesiastical Court may be commenced against the clergyman so convicted, within two years from the date of such conviction.

The accused party may have the privilege of appearing by counsel if he shall see fit.

All evidence shall be taken in writing.

When the Court proceeds to trial, some officer authorized by law to administer oaths in this Province of Lower Canada, shall be requested to administer the required oath to the witnesses called on to testify to the truth in the matters at issue before the Court.

If the accused be resident within the diocese, at the time of presentment made against him, all notices, service and citations, shall be made on him personally, or at his usual domicile or residence, within the delays before

If on, or during any trial, the accused shall confess the truth of the charges contained in the presentment, the Board of Triers may dispense with hearing further evidence, and will proceed at once to report the same to the Bishop, whose duty it shall then be to proceed and pass sentence.

The proceedings upon a trial shall be private, unless the accused party shall request the same to be public, or unless public decency would be likely to be outraged by such publicity, in which latter case the Court may direct it

No charge shall be considered as substantiated or proven by the testimony of less than two witnesses.

If any member of the Church shall be summoned to attend as a witness before any Board of Triers, Board of Inquiry, Court, Commissioners, constituted under any provision of this Canon, or being present before either of the same, shall refuse to testify, or to be sworn or affirm, such persons may be declared guilty of contumacy, and punished accordingly.

A certificate or record of such contumacy shall be signed by the president of the Board, Court, or Commissioners, as the case may be, and transmitted to the Bishop or his Commissary.

Whereupon the Bishop, or Commissary, shall cause reasonable notice to be given to the party of the proceedings intended against him, and after due citation, and the hearing of the party in defence or extenuation, or in default of his appearing to answer, the Bishop or Commissary, may proceed, if the party be a layman, to admonish or suspend him from communion with the Church, and if a priest or deacon, to admonish or suspend him from his office, until such contumacy be purged.

The Court, having deliberately considered the evidence, shall declare in writing, signed by the members thereof, or a majority of them, their decision on the charges contained in the presentment, whether in their opinion the accused is guilty or not guilty on each particular charge.

If the accused, after trial, shall be found guilty, the finding of the Court, together with all their proceedings, including the evidence taken in the case, shall be transmitted to the Bishop, or in his absence or incapacity to act, to his Commissary, before its transmittal to the accused, or in any way made public, and should he concur in opinion with the Court, he, or his Commissary, may proceed to pass such sentence, as in his judgment may deserve, not repugnant to the provision of the 19 & 20 Vict. c. 121. s. 2.

A copy of the sentence shall be sent to the accused, and another to the vestry, or vestries of the parish, or parishes, or congregation, or congregations, with which he may be canonically connected; and such other publicity may be given to it as the Bishop or Commissary shall think expedient

Provided always, that at any time before the sentence shall be pronounced by the Bishop, or Commissary, it shall be lawful for the party convicted, to apply for a re-hearing before the Board of Triers, founded upon any affidavit showing that the party accused since his trial and conviction, has discovered new evidence, (and setting forth in full such new evidence) and which he was ignorant of at the time of his trial, and in such case the Board of Triers may grant or refuse a new trial, as in their judgment may seem just and reasonable.

Whereas, the 2nd section of Prov. Stat., 19 & 20 Vict. c. 121, declares the following sentences, or punishments to be those only that may be legally imposed upon clergymen within this diocese, being found guilty of an infraction of the ecclesiastical laws, viz.:

- 1. "Suspension."
- 2. "Removal from an office in the said Church."
- 3. "Exclusion from the meetings of the diocesan, or general synods."

It is nevertheless hereby declared to be within the power of the Bishop, ex-officio and not inconsistent with, or contrary to the above enactments, to admonish offending clergymen; which admonition of a minister for any ecclesiastical offence, not made a subject for judicial inquiry, or presentment, shall be made in private; upon a second offence it shall be public or private, at the discretion of the Bishop, or Commissary, and made in such manner as to the said Bishop or Commissary may seem proper.

Admonition when recommended or declared to be the proper sentence by the Court, or Board of Triers, may be public or private, as such Court shall determine.

When the penalty of suspension shall be inflicted by the judgment of any Court, or Board of Triers, such sentence shall specify the terms thereof and the period of its duration.

During his suspension he shall not exercise the functions of the ministry either in his own congregation or elsewhere within this diocese.

Removal from an office in the said Church shall be considered to include and mean deposition and degradation.

No degraded minister shall be restored to the ministry.

Upon such sentence being pronounced, the connection between the minister and his parish, or congregation, shall be ipso facto severed; and all other offices, rents, issues, profits, and emoluments, which he may have held by virtue of such office or ministry, from which he has been removed, shall wholly cease and determine.

ARTICLE IV.

Discipline applicable to the Laity.

The Rubric, prefixed to the order of the Holy Communion in the Book of Common Prayer, prescribes the manner of proceeding by the minister of any parish toward any layman guilty of any of the offences therein mentioned, and provides for the reporting the same to the Bishop.

If the party thus repelled shall think proper to make a complaint (in writing) to the Bishop, against the conduct of his minister, in such case it shall be the duty of the Bishop, (unless he think proper to restore him from the insufficiency of the cause assigned by the minister) to institute an inquiry into the merits of the case.

If the Bishop should not think proper of his own authority to restore the layman complaining, as above, he or his Commissary shall appoint two disinterested clergymen, and two disinterested laymen, who are communicants, to inquire into and try the case.

If they report to the Bishop that the repelled person ought to be restored, the Bishop shall so direct, and no minister of the diocese shall deny him the Holy Communion.

If they report otherwise, or make no report within three months from their appointment, the repulsion shall continue in force. If this Board of Inquiry be equally divided, they may elect an umpire, clerical or lay, and a majority may report whether the party has been rightfully repelled or not, according to the Rubric.

If the judgment direct a continuance of the repulsion, it shall still be subject to the conditions and provisions of the Rubric.

The judgment of the Board of Inquiry shall be final, unless the Bishop shall grant a re-hearing.

Archdeacon Leach gave notice that he would move the adoption of said Report.

Mr. J. B. LAY read the Report of the Committee on Marriage Licenses as follows:

MARRIAGE LICENSE COMMITTEE REPORT.

The Committee appointed upon the Resolution of last Synod in relation to the question of Marriage Licenses, beg respectfully to Report:

That, after taking into consideration the whole question in all its bearings, we are of the opinion that, for the protection of the Clergy, and society in general, the whole system of Marriage Licenses is very unsatisfactory and ought to be abolished.

That the Report be referred to the new Executive Committee appointed by this Synod, with instructions to carry its general principles into effect, availing itself of all information that may from time to time be received, and, whilst regulating the expenditure in accordance with the income, to allow as much time as possible for the complete carrying-out of the self-supporting system in those Missions where it can be accomplished.

The Synod adjourned till ten a.m., the following day. The Metropolitan pronounced the Benediction.

THIRD DAY.

The third day's proceedings commenced with Morning Prayer in the Cathedral at 9 a.m. The Synod assembled for business at 10 o'clock.

After prayer of the Metropolitan the Minutes of yester-day's proceedings were read, amended and approved.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.

Mr. J. B. LAY read the following Report of the Committee on Intemperance.

REPORT:

That in view of the growing evils of Intemperance in this Province, it is the opinion of your Committee that the immediate and vigorous action of all Christians and Christian Churches should be enlisted in the suppression of the drinking customs of Society.

That we are pleased to note that nearly all Protestant denominations in our sister Provinces in the United States and Great Britain, have in their collective capacities taken decisive action in favour of the Temperance

That your Committee would respectfully recommend that the subject of Temperance should occupy a more prominent place in the pulpit, and that it should be a direction from the Bishop of this diocese to his Clergy to preach more than one Sermon upon the subject yearly, and that this Synod do express its warm sympathy with the different Temperance Organizations in this Diocese and wish them God-speed in their good work.

The following certificate, signed by the Chairman of the meeting, be transmitted to the Lay Secretary within 15 days after such election, whose certified list of Delegates shall be considered sufficient proof of such election, and such Lay Delegate shall continue in office till his successor is

"This is to certify that, at a meeting held this day for the purpose of electing Delegates to represent this congregation or parish in Synod, being the Parish or Mission of ————, ———, a communicant of one year's standing, and of the full age of twenty-one years, was elected by the Laymen of this congregation, who have a right to vote at such election, by virtue of their having, in accordance with the 2nd clause of the Constitution of the Synod of this Diocese, declared themselves in writing, in a book kept for that purpose, to be members of the United Church of England and Ireland, and to belong to no other denomination, and being otherwise qualified under the provisions of said clause.

And that the third paragraph in the order of proceedings, p. 121, be amended by striking out all the words in such paragraph after the word "Cures." Carried.

Moved by Dr. SMALLWOOD, seconded by Mr. T. R. JCHN-SON:

That the Report of the Education Committee be adopted. Carried.

Moved by Mr. S. Bethune, seconded by Rev. J. Con-STANTINE:

That the Report of the Committee on Marriage Licenses be adopted.

Mr. J. B. LAY, Chairman of the Committee on Intemperance, who had given notice that he would move the adoption of the Report of that Committee, not being present, it was moved by Mr. BRYDGES, seconded by Rev. T. W. FYLES: That, as the Chairman of the Committee on Intemperance is not now present to move the adoption of the Report, its consideration be deferred to next Session. Carried.

Moved by Rev. J. Constantine, seconded by Mr. F. Mackenzie:

That the thanks of this Synod are due, and are hereby tendered, to the Grand Trunk, Vermont Central, and Stanstead and Chambly Railway Companies, to the Ottawa River Navigation Company, and to the Richelieu Navigation Company, for their kindness in granting half-fare tickets to the members attending Synod. Carried unanimously.

Moved by Rev. G. SLACK, seconded by Mr. W. COOPER: That the thanks of this Synod are due, and are hereby tendered, to the proprietors of the GAZETTE, WITNESS, and DAILY NEWS, for their kindness in supplying their papers to the Synod during its session. Carried unanimously.

Archdeacon McLean, of Manitoba, being present, was, on motion of the Rev. Canon Bancroff, invited by the Metro-Politan to address the Synod.

Moved by Rev. J. C. Davidson, seconded by Mr. J. Crawford:

That the warm thanks of this House are due, and are hereby tendered, to the Most Rev. the Metropolitan for the able and courteous manner in which he has presided over this Synod. Carried by acclamation.

The METROPOLITAN having pronounced the Benediction, the Synod adjourned.

APPENDIX A.

CONTAINING REPORTS OF RURAL DEANS, STATISTICS OF THE DIOCESE.

ANNUAL REPORT FROM THE DEANERY OF BEDFORD.

JUNE 17TH, 1871.

My Lord,—In making the usual Annual Report the Rural Dean has occasion to notice very few changes in the Dean ry since the last Annual Meeting.

There are now eighteen clergymen in Prest's Orders holding distinct charges in the Deanery. One mission, that of Milton, is vacant.

One assistant minister is engaged at Knowlton, ministering at different out-stations in the townships of Brome and Sutton, and one lay assistant in the Mission of Waterloo.

The vacancy at Milton has been caused by the removal of the Rev. Thomas Godden, to the Diocese of Ontario. It becomes a question whether this Mission should be supplied with another resident minister, or attached to the mission of Abbottsford. Were the Mission Fund in a more flourishing condition than it is at present, Milton might be the centre of useful missionary work, and, having a parsonage and local endowment, be the residence of the clergyman ministering at Abbottsford. But this, at present, does not appear to be practicable. It is right to state that the people here and at South Roxton have made creditable exertions in raising a considerable sum for the support of their Mission.

MISSION OF BOLTON.

The Mission of Bolton has been for some time vacant since the removal of the Rev. E. J. Fessenden to the Diocese of Toronto. The services of that Mission have been supplied by Mr. McFarlane, lay reader, residing at Knowlton. Mr. Clayton, a candidate for orders, has since been appointed to that Mission.

DEANERY MISSION BOARD.

The Mission Board, appointed by the Bishop, held a meeting convened by me under the Bishop's direction at Waterloo on Tuesday, November 22nd, 1870.

I understand that Board as being appointed to give information to the Lay Committee in order to their framing their Report, and convened for

that purpose only. If it were to be continued as a permanent institution of the Deanery, it must be seen that it would neutralize the proper action and usefulness of the Annual Deanery Meeting.

STATISTICS.

Papers of Questions have, by direction of the Bishop, been issued to the Clergy of the Deanery and the churchwardens.

They have all been returned answered, and with the exception of three Missions from which no answer has been received, and Milton, which is vacant. I have compiled the statistical information which these answers convey, and beg leave to present it in a condensed form, comprising the returns from fifteen Parishes and Missions.

NUMBER OF STATIONS.

Forty-four Stations are returned as occupied by sixteen clergymen, including the assistant minister at Knowlton.

COMMUNICANTS.

The number of communicants returned is nine hundred and twenty.

OFFICIAL ACTS OF CLERGY.

Of these acts there are returned two hundred and thirty-two Baptisms; two hundred and three persons have been presented for Confirmation; thirty-two Marriages have been solemnized, and one hundred Burial Services have been performed.

FINANCIAL RETURNS.

The first of these, referring to the Salaries of the Clergy, gives the sum of \$8,617.89 received as salaries by the Clergy. Of this amount \$4,357.71 s contributed by the congregations, and \$4,389.36 from the different Missionary Funds, making almost exactly one-half contributed from sources external to the Missions.

ENDOWMENTS.

Return is made of Endowments amounting in the aggregate of eight separate Missions to \$21,539.25.

LOCAL CONTRIBUTIONS.

These amount under the head of Sunday collections to \$1,247.90, and of Special collections to the sum of \$835.26. This is independent of other local efforts, which will be mentioned in the closing portion of this Report.

INSURANCE OF CHURCH PROPERTY.

The Church property appears to be generally insured, as no less a sum than \$123,105.00 is returned under this head. Three Missions return their Church property as not insured.

SMALL AMOUNT OF DEBT.

One pleasing feature in the Financial Report is the freedom from debt, the amount returned under this head being trifling.

LOCAL IMPROVEMENTS.

A good deal has been effected in this way in the different Parishes and Missions of this Deanery. In Bedford a chancel has been added to the Church at a cost of \$300.00, all raised in the Mission. The woodwork on the outside of the church has been painted and new windows put in throughout at a cost of \$149.00 contributed by kind friends in Montreal. A font has been also purchased at a cost of \$20.

A Church has been commenced in North Ely, which will be completed by the ensuing autumn. Some improvements have been made in the

The Church at Granby has been thoroughly repaired and refitted at an expense of \$2,600.00. Of this sum \$2,200.00 is the generous donation of John Bradford Esq., of that place, and \$400.00 was contributed by the

At Iron Hill some improvements have been made in the fitting up of the Parsonage and completion of the churchyard fence.

At Knowlton the Church has been painted and the Parsonage repaired. The Rectory at Frelighsburgh has been re-shingled, and a Parochial school-room built.

The Rev. J. Constantine reports that important repairs and additions have been made to the Church at Stanbridge East.

At West Farnham the Church School ground has been partially fenced in.

Upon the whole the state of the Church affairs in this Deanery is satisfactory, and shows a gradual but steady growth and improvement in every

THE DEANERY OF ST. ANDREWS.

At a Ruri-Decanal meeting held in the Mission of Hull, Diocese of May 24th, 1871. Montreal, the following clergy were present:

The Rev. Canon Lonsdell, M.A., Rural Dean, Rev. Jno. Johnston, Incumbent at Hull; Rev. W. Ross Brown, mission ary at Aylwin and Alleyne; Rev. P. W. Smith, missionary at Aylmer and Eardly; Rev. R. D. Irwin, asst. missionary at Clarendon; Rev. F. Codd, missionary at Portage du Fort; Rev. G. C. Robinson, missionary at Clarendon Centre; Rev. J. Rollit, missionary at Buckingham; C. J. Kacpcke, missionary at Thorne, &c.

The meeting was opened with prayer by the Rural Dean.

The first item of business brought forward was the present state of the Mission Fund and the causes which may have led to it, together with its special bearing on this Deanery. By the late reports it seems that two of the Missionaries have had their grants withdrawn by the Executive Committee; while two others, in the remote and poorest section of the Deanery, are considerably reduced.

Mr. Irwin reports that the congregation at Bristol Corners, (at present forming part of the Mission at Clarendon) have contributed liberally towards the erection of a Church in that locality; the services, at present held in a room, are well attended.

Mr. Robinson reports that a new Church is contemplated at Clarendon Centre; the subscription list now in circulation amongst the congregation exhibits the very handsome amount of \$1350 raised in the Mission. Work is also in progress towards the completion of St. Luke's church, North Bristol.

Mr. Kaapcke, who visits the German settlements in the Townships of Derry and Bowan, 150 miles distant from his residence, reports that the new church near Otter Lake, in the Township of Thorne, is nearly completed, and will be ready for consecration when the Metropolitan shall again visit that part of the deanery. A church has been commenced in East Thorne, to which the people, who are mostly poor German settlers, have contributed a good deal in labour and materials.

Mr. Smith reports that the church in Upper Eardly will be finished and fit for Divine service by next autumn.

Mr. Seaman is preparing materials for a church at the Pache village. \$150, with timbers for the frame work, have been contributed.

In Mr. Brown's Mission on the Gatineau there are two additional churches in course of erection, one to be finished this summer, the other as means will admit. The church at Alleyne in the same Mission is to be enlarged.

Mr. Johnston, lay reader at Hull, promised to give two services once a fortnight in the Township of Templeton, which will be a great relief to Mr. Rollit, whose Mission is too extensive.

Changes in the Deanery. Mr. Neve, who has just now retired from the Mission of Grenville, had formerly been stationed at Clarendon, then a rough country, for the most part covered with the primeval forest. Some idea of the extent of Mr. Neve's duties may be inferred from the fact that there are now ten churches in that portion of this Deanery, over which his labours extended, and, that by his constant visits to the scattered hamlets on the south side of the Ottawa, extending from Arnprior Pembroke, a portion of country now comprised within the Diocese of Ontario, he was the means of keeping alive an attachment to the church of their fathers amongst a large portion of the population.

Mr. Dixon, who has been removed from the Mission of Mille Isles and

Morin to the charge of Grenville, and parts adjacent, is succeeded by Mr. Boyd, from the Diocese of New York.

It is recommended by the Ruri-decanal Chapter that Bristol Corners and parts adjacent be erected into a separate Mission, to include the whole of

Archdeacon Bond, who accompanied the Rural Dean last January, expressed himself well pleased with the general state of the Missions, and the progress that is being made throughout the Ottawa country. The annual Missionary meetings were held during the winter, which yielded a return of \$100. The largest collection, over \$20, was taken up at Hull.

Rev. Mr. Kaapcke, has made payments on the lands in Bowman, purchased by the late Metropolitan; the documents now in possession of the Rural Dean will be handed over to the Executive Committee.
