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REPORT

OF THE

Managing-Committee of the St. George's Society of Toronto,

FOR THE YEAR 1873.

The Committee beg leave to present their Thirty-ninth Annual Report of the Proceedings of the Society for the year 1873, to which are appended the Treasurer's Statement which may be referred to for full particulars of the financial matters hereinafter briefly mentioned; also, the Auditors' Report in which is shown the state of the Society's investments.

The total amount of Receipts from all sources, including the balance of \$281.81 in the hands of the Treasurer at the date of last report, is \$1,926.29.

The total Disbursements amount to \$1638.51, leaving a balance in the Treasurer's hands of \$287.78.

APPLICATIONS FOR RELIEF.

The number of applications for relief recorded during the past year was 581, of which 536 families, representing 2,400 persons, at the rate of about 4½ persons to a family, were relieved with provisions, or money, or both, as follows, viz.: 312 families with bread and meat, at a cost of \$178.77; 214 families with money, to the amount of \$313.34; and 10 families

with money, bread, and meat to the extent of \$12; 28 passes over the various railways were granted, at the cost of \$38.21.

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The Society was called upon during the past year to bury 3 English people in the Society's plot in St. James's Cemetery, at a cost of \$3, being the amount of the usual burial fee of \$1, payable to the Cemetery authorities for each interment.

And 14 recorded applications for relief were refused.

MEMBERSHIP.

The total number of Members on the books of the Society is 429, classified as follows: 16 honorary, 97 life, and 316 ordinary members, shewing an increase of 57 members in 1873.

The Committee deeply regret to have to record the loss by death of two old and respected past officers of the Society in the persons of William Wakefield, Esquire, who most worthily filled the office of President during the years 1842, 1843, and 1844, and George Percival Ridout, Esquire, who also very ably filled the office of President of the Society during the years 1845, 1846, and 1847, and who always manifested a warm interest in its prosperity. In obedience to resolutions passed at the Society's meetings, letters of condolence were sent to the deceased gentlemens' friends, expressive of the members' sincere sympathy with their families in their bereavement, and of the great respect in which they were held. The Committee also have to regret the loss by death of another esteemed member of the Society, John Worthington, Esquire.

ANNUAL CATHEDRAL SERVICE.

On the Sunday previous to St. George's Day, the usual annual service was held in St. James's Cathedral. On that occasion the Officers and past Officers, and members of the Society walked in procession from St. James's School to the Cathedral. The sermon was preached by the Rev. Septimus Jones, M.A., and the musical part of the service was conducted

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by John Carter, Esq., Organist, The collection realized to the Society \$152.78.

CELEBRATION OF ST. GEORGE'S DAY.

The social observance of St. George's Day took the form of a supper at the American Hotel, at which about eighty sat down, on the evening of Wednesday, the 23rd day of April last, and which, enlivened as it was with festive song and stirring speeches, passed off pleasantly enough, though slightly deficient in pecuniary results.

OFFICE BEARERS.

A change in the personel of the Committee has taken place during the past year, Messrs. Joseph Gearing, J. R. Dunn, Charles Ruse, and Samuel Trees, having resigned their positions as Committeemen; and Messrs. Alexander Stretton, T. H. Marsh, J. T. Culverwell, and Samuel Scarlett, were elected at the monthly meeting of the Society, on the 4th day of July last, to supply their places.

SOCIETY'S OFFICES.

In the early part of the past year the state of the Society's office caused a desire for better office accommodation, more central in location and of sufficient capacity to furnish a general meeting room for the Society, a Secretary's office, and a waiting room for applicants for relief, &c., if the same could be obtained at a moderate rental.

The efforts made to obtain such a suite of central offices proving unsuccessful, and the Secretary having removed to offices in the Toronto Exchange Buildings, as being more convenient and suitable for his professional requirements than the office accommodation afforded him by the Society, it was decided to improve the Society's office, which was done by its being painted, papered, and lighted with gas, and entirely new

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furnished. The cost for the improvement of offices and furniture amount to \$175.16, as shewn by the Treasurer's statement.

MOONLIGHT EXCURSION.

In the month of June last, the Committee, with the view to carry out the usual annual pic-nic or excursion heretofore indulged in, took the matter into their serious consideration, but the numerous attractions of a similar nature presented and put forward by the various religious bodies and other associations, rendered it in their opinion unadvisable to do so at that time. Later in the season, however, the time being favorable for a Moonlight Excursion, the Committee were enabled, by the happy weather forecasting of Mr. Past President Brown, who originated and lent himself heartily to the project, to hit upon the finest night of the season for the purpose; and having secured the Steamer City of Toronto and a good band of music, the excursion came off on the evening of the 6th day of August last, and was a very successful affair and gratifying to all concerned. About 300 excursionists being on board, and \$45.95 were added to the Relief Fund as the financial result.

THE SOCIETY'S TENT.

The Committee regret to state that the tent has not, during the past year, been a source of revenue to the Society as in former years, having produced only \$55.00. The reasons for which falling off are simply that, whereas, until recently, the Society's Tent was almost the only one in the city available for the wants of excursionists, &c., but now, there are several kept especially for hire; and, moreover, several of the religious associations of the city, have one or more tents of greater capacity of their own; and when it is considered that the annual charge against it for interest, wear and tear, insurance, storage and repairs may be fairly set down at \$74.00, the Committee would therefore recommend its earliest disposal.

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CHRISTMAS CHEER.

The Annual Distribution of Christmas Cheer to deserving English poor of the City, took place in Messrs. R. A. Hoskins & Co's. premises on Scott Street, kindly lent by those gentlemen for the occasion. The provisions distributed were 6,000 pounds of beef, and 3,500 pounds of bread.

Included in these amounts are several donations in kind mentioned in the list of contributions following the Auditors' Report.

The number of the recipients of this bounty, granted for the most part on the usual recommendations, were 500 families, representing 2,500 persons.

The Committee would suggest to their successors that the present plan of giving out the Christmas Distribution, might be altered, and some plan devised by which more time for the due investigation of the circumstances of the various applicants might be afforded.

VICTORIÆ REGINÆ.

An Act to Incorporate the St. George's Society of Toronto.

WHEREAS, John Beverley Robinson, Thomas Brown, George S. Jones, Robert Dodgson, F. W. Coate, George T. Walton, George Bilton, George Thomas, Henry Godson, Julian Sale, Isaac Faulkner, B. Saunders, Frank John Joseph, and others, have, by their petition to the Legislature, represented that the Association, of which they are members, known as the St. George's Society of Toronto, has for many years been formed for the benevolent purposes of affording pecuniary, medical, and other relief to such natives of England and Wales, and their descendants, as may from sickness or other causes have fallen into distress, and have prayed that for the better attainment of the objects of the said Association, it may be invested with corporate powers, and by reason of the good effected by the Association, it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition; Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

1. The said John Beverley Robinson, M.P.P., Thomas Brown, George S. Jones, Robert Dodgson, F. W. Coate, George T. Walton, George Bilton, George Thomas, Henry Godson, Julian Sale, Isaac Faulkner, B. Saunders, Frank John Joseph, and such other persons as are now members of the said Association, or shall hereafter be, come members thereof, under the provisions of this Act, and the By-laws made under the authority thereof, and their successors, shall be, and they are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name of the St. George's Society of Toronto, and may by that name sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, answer and be answered, defend and be defended, in all Courts of Law and places whatsoever, and by that name they and their successors shall have perpetual succession, and may have a common seal, and may break change, alter, or renew the same at pleasure, and shall have power to purchase, take, receive, hold, and enjoy such real estate, as may be required for the actual occupation of the said Corporation and to alienate, sell, convey, lease, or otherwise dispose of the same, or any part thereof, from time to time, and as occasion may require, and to acquire other instead thereof; Provided always, that the said Corporation may acquire any other real estate or any interest therein, by gift, devise, or bequest, if made at least six months before the death of the party making the same, and the Corporation may hold such estate for a period for not more than three years, and the same or any part or portion thereof or interest therein which may not, within the said period have been alienated and disposed of, shall revert to the party from whom the same was acquired, his heirs or other representatives: And provided also, that the proceeds of such property as shall have been disposed of during the said period, may be invested in the public securities of the Province, stocks, or chartered banks, mortgages, or other approved securities for the use of the said Corporation.

2. The affairs and business of the said Corporation shall be managed by a Committee of Management, consisting of a President, a first, second, and third Vice. Presidents, a Secretary, or Secretaries, a Treasurer, two Chaplains, three Physicians, and seven other Members, to be elected annually at a General Meeting of the members of the Corporation held in conformity to the By-laws thereof, and any five members of the said Committee shall be a quorum for the despatch of business.

3. All deeds, sealed with the Common Seal of the Corporation, and signed by the President or Vice-Presidents, and by some other member of the Committee of Management, and countersigned by the Treasurer, and none other, shall be held to be deeds of the Corporation; Provided always, that the Treasurer, for the time being, may receive all moneys payable to the Corporation and grant

valid receipts therefor.

4. It shall be lawful for the said Corporation to make By-laws for the admission and expulsion of members, and for the proper administration of the property and affairs of the Corporation, and to repeal or amend the same from time to time; and such By-laws and amendments shall be proposed and seconded at a previous Quarterly Meeting. No number of members less than one-fifth of the Corporation (including the presiding Officer) shall form a meeting for the purpose of altering such By-laws, nor shall any alteration be made therein, unless two-thirds of the members present agree to it.

5. The General Meetings of the said Corporation shall be held in such manner, after such notice, upon such requisition, and at such times in the City of Toronto, as shall be directed by the By-laws of the Corporation then in force.

6. The usual place of meeting of the said Corporation shall be held to be the legal domicile thereof, and service at such place of any notice or process of any kind, addressed to the said Corporation, shall be held to be sufficient service of such notice or process on the Corporation.

7. The By-laws of the said Association, in so far as they may not be repugnant to this Act or the laws of this Province, shall be the By-laws of the Corporation hereby constituted, until they shall be repealed or altered as aforesaid; Provided always, that no By-law shall impose a

penalty or forfeiture exceeding two dollars.

8. Until others shall be elected according to the Bylaws of the Corporation, the present officers of the Association shall be those of the said Corporation, that is to say, the said John Beverley Robinson shall be the President, the said Thomas Brown shall be the first Vice-President, the said George S. Jones shall be the second Vice-President, the said Robert Dodgson, the third Vice-President; the said F. W. Coate shall be the Treasurer, the said George T. Walton shall be the Secretary, the Reverend J. Beaven, D.D., and the Reverend H. Scaddiag, D.D., shall be the Chaplains; Edward Hodder, Francis Badgley, and William Hallowell, shall be the Physicians, and the said George Bilton, George Thomas, Henry Godson, Julian Sale, Isaac Faulkner, B. Saunders, and Frank John Joseph, the other members of the Committee of Management.

9. No person otherwise competent to be a witness in any suit, action, or prosecution in which the said Corporation may be engaged, shall be deemed incompetent to be such witness by reason of his being or having been a

member or officer of the said Corporation.

10. All subscriptions of members due to the Corporation under any By-law, all penalties incurred under any By-law by any person bound thereby, and all other sums of money due to the Corporation, shall be paid to the Treasurer thereof, and in default of payment may be recovered in any action brought by him in the name of the Corporation in any Court of competent civil jurisdiction: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent any member from withdrawing at any time from the said Corporation after payment of all arrears due to the funds thereof, including the annual subscription for the year then current.

11. The said Committee of Management shall yearly in the month of January, insert in some newspaper published in the city of Toronto a statement of the amount of the funds and property, debts and liabilities of the said Corporation, certified by the Treasurer and two Auditors elected at any General Meeting of the Corpo-

ration.

12. Nothing in this Act shall affect any right of Her Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors, or any party or person whomsoever, such rights only excepted as are herein expressly mentioned and affected.

13. This Act shall be deemed a Public Act.
