OKLAHOMA. THE COUNTRY BEING DESERTED VERY RAPIDLY.

Okla. Has Lost About Half Its Population. Oklahoma City, May 16.—Col. Richards, land commissioner, has just returned from Guthrie. He says that Oklahoma is being deserted very rapidly and such is the expression of a number of other persons who have been over the country.

Many who then went into the country were induced to do so by the highly colored description published by the Oklahoma agitators. Many reached the land around Guthrie and seeing its true character went further south. Others who had been over the country in advance struck out from the first for Canadian valley and having thus succeeded in securing desirable lands intend to remain and prove up their claim.

Hon. Mr. Ritchie advised that a reservation was to be made and the balance returned. (My notes are rather different.) On my return in July 1889, I learned that no memorandum had been sent—that the trust money had been completely expended, and that my daughter, who was then in the hospital, had died on the 27th of June, 1889, which time no settlement had been obtained, although I have written many times and also attended personally, nothing but fair promises resulting therefrom.

At a meeting held in November last with Messrs. Crookshank and Ritchie, by appointment, more than four months after my daughter's death, I received notice of the Chief Superintendent's bill, in which was charged \$100 a year for three years, and thirty-seven days being \$10, per annum more than a neighbor of mine pays for a female patient, who has a good bed and bathroom, to herself, while my daughter had no such privileges, but appeared in her thin clothing and old shoes with cotton rags, to be, as it really is, a pauper, a pauper, a pauper. No notice or other fee was deducted from said bill, nor any interest allowed on that money now invested over three years, having less than \$100 as due which I declined to accept, thinking I ought not to be charged even as much as my neighbor instead of more, and that all payments made to me, and interest on per cent on the \$500 trust money invested, should be very kindly tried to have the matter settled for me during last session of the House of Assembly, but was put off with fair words until the session ended, having the case as it was last November. It had been positively stated at our first meeting, that right or wrong the decision of a Solicitor General and Chief Superintendent must be accepted as final, otherwise nothing to be paid to me, then a great deal of anxious worry, and a month's living at a distance most unuseful expense, would have been saved; and the last time and a half month's useless efforts to obtain a more favorable settlement.
