

"Silver black fox is the most desirable, the most precious of all furs, worth many times its weight in gold, the noblest peltry known to man," says Ergest Thompson Seton in an article recently, "There are many degrees among these patricians. They range in quality even as diamonds range. The exquisite robe is so mellow and rich, so wondrous in style, with its glossy black and delicate frosting. It is the proper robe of kings, the perquisite of great imperial thrones, as was the Tyrian purple in the days of Rome."

Thompson Seton is an expert in al matters pertaining to wild animals and furs. His statement shows that there are great possibilities in the fur ranching business. Fur men all agree that there are many grades of silver black fox furs and it is only by carefur selection that the best are obtained. The price of silver black fox furs has always ranged high and trappers have had no trouble in disposing of any skins at from \$500 to \$2,500 each. Recently it was aid that furs had sold or

During the last lew years the rur of good specimens of foxes have not been available. Owners of fur ranches have been clamorous in their demands for all classes of fur bearing animals and the prices of animals has advanced. For this reason very few have been killed. Practically the only skins put on the market in the last few years have been from animals that met death accidently or died from disease. These pelts were naturally not of the highest quality. High grade sliver black fox furs command high prices and the amounts paid for the skins in the last ten years have ranged from \$100 to \$2,500. Last year high grade furs were quoted at fifty per cent. higher than in the previous year and this year the prices were twenty-five per cent, in excess of prevailing prices

last year.

The total offering of silver black for pelts in 1912 by the Hudson Bay Fu Co. was 605.

PRICES ADVANCED AT STEADY PAG

The price of all kinds of furs has steadily advanced during the last few oars. Even the pelt of the ordinary red fox has more than doubled in value and where in 1904 it sold (or \$6.81, in 1910 it sold for \$16.55 and the price of these pelts at the present time is \$23.00.

far superior to that of any other an mal, chiefly on account of its fin sheen and the impossibility of producing anything like the real article be artificial coloring. It is believed the fur experts will never be able to produce an imitation of the silver blac fox that will ever cause that fur to define in popularity. It is not probable that they will approach the silver for as closely as dyed muskrat approches seal. At the present time the closest imitation of the silver blac fox is the so called pointed fox, which has been manufactured in German. The pointed fox is a red fox dye black, with white hairs from the baser or some other animal sewed or fastened with adhesives. However the imitation would never deceive an one who had ever touched or set the real silver black fox skin.

SABLE AND ERMIN

LOSING GROUND

It would seem that the furs of the silver black foxes are to oust the Royal sable and ermine from popular favor. The ermine is said to be declining, primarily for the reason that a substitute has been found that is a more useful fur. This is the pelt of the little Canadian weasel. In the north the weasel changes color in winter and becomes snow white, with only a black tip on its tail. The fur is to be distinguished from ermine by its better wearing qualities. It has not the downy texture of the royal ermine but only experts could distinguish the difference and for all practical purposes it is said to be quite as good. The sable is also dying out. Probably in time the sable too will be protected by law but they have been hunted and trapped so persistently by trappers- and their number has greatly decreased. At the last great fur said in London something less than 1,000 skins were offered for sale. Moreover substitutes have bene found in the perwitsky, which is practically a new fur on the market and the fitch. The popularity of these two last named furs is rapidly increasing and throughts proposed the popularity of these two last named furs is rapidly increasing and throughts.

With all competitors practically eliminated the fur of the aliver black fox stands at the head of the list as the most desirable and the most valuable. Modern methods of, fox ranching and the introduction of up-to-date ranches have done much to produce better furs. The animals reared in captivity are constantly watched and no opportunity is given them to it any way injure their fur. In the ranches the underbrush is cut away and fighting among the animals is to tally eliminated. Then too the prope foods are supplied. Thus the best fur and the healthlest animals are per duced on the ranches.

en a matter of good or bad season whether the skins were first class or not. The trapper could not discriminate until after he had captured the fox and then it was too late to improve it any. Lean seasons of food caused poor pelts and the underbrush often destroyed an otherwise perfect fur.

NEW BRUNSWICK FUR

Formerly it was the trappers' cut tom to dispose of their furs as soo after capture as possible and any an mal that was captured alive was in mediately despatched. Silver blac pelts were considered almost with adoration for they meant something in the vicinity of \$500 at least and the trapper took the earliest opportunity of disposing of any captured.

During the last few years very few fox pelts from foxes in captivity have been placed on the market. Only the pelts of foxes that have died or met with accident have been sold by New Brunswick fur ranchers. The animals have been considered too valuable to kill for their pelts. Experts, however, have examined many of the foxes in the New Brunswick ranches and they have expressed the opinion that the pelts are of the highest grade

obtainable.

There is scarcely any likelihood of New Brunswick fox fur being placed on the market for at least ten years. It has been figured out by experts that foxes for breeding purposes will keep market prices up to the present standard for at least ten years yet and then there will be handsome profits in selling the pelts until they reach as low a price as \$5.00.

Recent reports from Prince Edward Island indicate that twelve litters of silver black foxes, valued at \$300,000, had disappeared from a Prince Edward Island ranch. It was not known whether they had been stolen or disposed of by the mother fox. The fact that twelve litters or about 48 foxes had disappeared at once indicates that the market for siver black foxes

had disappeared at once indicates that the market for siver black foxes producing young up to the natural limits it was figured out by experts that ten years at least would have to elapse before the present market price and the demand for breeders materially lessened. With several more losses such as that recorded last week there can be no doubt that the time set by the experts will be materially lengthened.

Losses of this kind to the fur ranchers of New Brunswick would be practically impossible on account of the high grade of the supervision and the high class men engaged as caretakers. In almost every case the caretakers in the fox ranches of this province have had years of experience with wild anmals and their methods have produced the best results.

A prominent financial man in Boston, who has made a careful study of the fox business, said recently that the silver black fox industry was just as permanent as the jewelry business. "The man." said he, who can afford to buy \$1,000 rings and \$100,000 necklaces can certainly afford to buy a \$1,500 or \$2,000 fur for his wife. It is the men of this sort that will keep the industry alive."

Another writer in the Boston Transcript recently pointed out that the fur ranching business has arrived because fur trapping has falled and the demand for fine furs must be supplied. Fur farming in his opinion had come in as a permanent business.
