London, July 16.—p. m. Gold 116; Sight Exchange 101; Money 4 per cent. Two deaths from yellow fever occurred on board a Havana steamer at quarantine yesterday.

Paris, July 16. The Carlists claim some recent success. President Margall refused to negotiate with the Carlists for the exchange of prisoners, but he has authorized the Republican Commanders to come to an understanding unofficially with the Carlist Chief to secure the proper treatment for Spanish troops falling into the hands of the insurgents.

Government has instructed the Prefect of occupied departments to instruct public rejoicings on the evacuation of the territory by the German troops. The French Assembly expects to adjourn on the 25th.

Don Carlos re-entered Spain Tuesday night. He issued a proclamation invoking the help of his army, declaring that in listening to the voice of suffering Spain he comes to fight for God and his country, and concluding with the exhortation, "Volunteers forward and save Spain." There was great enthusiasm among his followers when Don Carlos joined Valdespina and Lizama on Spanish soil.

Several Ministers have resigned to form a homogeneous Cabinet. An unsuccessful attempt to cause an outbreak at Barcelona was made Tuesday.

New York, July 17. Serious mortality from cholera is reported at Mount Vernon in the South-west corner of Indiana.

The Cuban blockade runner, Virginius, has been escorted to sea by U.S. steamer Albatross.

At Springfield, Mass., yesterday, between College boys, was won by E. M. Swift, of Yale, time 14.40.

Accident.

There occurred at the ferry boats, this morning, what came near being a fatal accident. Mr. Wm. Hollis, a young man employed in Mr. T. B. Buxton's store, was going to Carleton. When at the top of the boats the bell rang. It rang a second time when he was about half-way down. He increased his speed, and at the end of the boat, he could not stop himself, and was obliged to jump. The boat was too far away for him, and he went into the water. He struck out to save himself, and was trying to swim ashore, while the boat went on not stopping to see whether he was drowned or not. When nearly out of the boats some one on board threw a life preserver to the young man. It was thrown so near the boat that it was nearly sucked under, and he had again to strike out to reach the preserver, which he was enabled to do, thoroughly exhausted. The ferry boat did not stop at all to render him any assistance, and there was no one on the wharf at the time except a small boy. A boat came to his assistance from a neighboring slip, and he was rescued.

Drowning of a Boy. The sympathy of this community has been unrealistically extended to Mr. Jonathan Weir, who lost a son, James, by drowning on Saturday last. The lad, aged about 9 years, was bathing in a creek between Foundry street and the river, and through some accident or misadventure slipped into a ditch containing seven or eight feet of water, and not being a swimmer sunk to the bottom, and before his young companion could obtain assistance was drowned—and within eight or ten minutes the body was afloat, and was brought to the shore, and was almost instantly in the family circle, the blow consequently falls all the heavier on his relatives. The funeral on Monday was very largely attended.—Kingston Times.
