Pastor's Address.

To the Congregation of Dominion Church:

MY DEAR FRIENDS:—Once more the opportunity is given me of addressing you a few words of greeting and counsel through the medium of our Annual Report.

The full and accurate reports of the year's work, the careful examination of which I urge upon you, will awaken a sense of gratitude in the heart of every well-wisher of the Church. The Church's finances are in a most satisfactory condition. The contributions to the T. C. T. F. have been generous, the one feature in connection therewith which pleases your Pastor being, that practically all of the \$6,500 has gone into the Committee's hands to advance the benevolent and other wise schemes of our Canadian Methodism.

It is, however, matter for regret, that our givings to the Missionary and Educational work of our Church shew a decrease when compared with the contributions of the previous year. This is not to our credit. We should do much better than we do for these funds. Lack of love for the cause of Christian missions is spiritual heart-failure. Indifference to the Educational work of our Church is a form of denominational suicide.

Though special services for the promotion of the work of grace in our congregation have been held during the year, not alone by the Pastor, but by such eminent Christian leaders as Dr. J. W. Chapman and Rev. Wm. Meikle, we report a very slight increase in our Church membership. It is evident that we must look for new members mainly to the homes of our own congregation. Parents should encourage their children early to accept the vows of Church membership. It is a grief to your Pastor that there are a goodly number in the congregation, adults and heads of households, who do not appear to appreciate their obligations in this regard.

Death has not taken many from us, but it has robbed us of some whom we shall miss for years to come. Our much beloved father, Mr. W. W. Brown, and the gifted Mr. Justice King, are amongst those whom we shall often recall, as we think of fellow-travellers who have gone on before.

Your Pastor would thank the Officials of the Church, and the Members of the congregation generally, for their active co-operation and many acts of personal kindness to his family and himself during the past year. He counts himself your debtor and prays that upon you and him the blessing of the Head of the Church may continue to abide.

SUNDAY SCHOOL-Continued.

To the Congregation of Dominion Methodist Church :

DEAR FRIENDS,—We place in your hands our reports of the Sunday School for the last year of the Old Century, at the same time offering to you our sincere greetings for the New Year and the New Century. We ask you to share our joy and join us in gratitude to Him the Giver of all Good, that death has been kept from our midst during the last year of the Nineteenth Century, and that we have been permitted to see the dawn of the Twentieth Century. Surely these are causes for united joy and thanksgiving.

We have lost through removals and other causes, some of our most valued Sunday School workers, who have during the year unavoidably severed their connections with us; and in losing Miss E. Dieke and Messrs A. G. Cole and E. C. Dingman, at the beginning of the present year, we lose three trustworthy and efficient officers and teachers.

To Mr. C. E. B. Price, our School is much indebted for services rendered in leading the singing, which shows a marked improvement under his direction.

The missionary spirit among our boys and girls is rapidly increasing. Not only were the regular missionary offerings for the year increased by \$15, but the School responded to appeals for two special offerings, for the relief of fire sufferers and famine-stricken India, to the extent of about \$90. Besides, many of our classes are doing rea! missionary work in a private way. Evidently they do not believe in letting the left hand know all that the right hand doeth.

The report of the Secretary shows a decrease in both enrollment and attendance. While these are in part actual, to a large extent they are only apparent. The decrease of enrollment is largely due to greater care in keeping the records. At the end of the year the rolls were reviewed, and the names of those who attended but one or two Sundays were struck off. In former years, the attendance covered ten months only, July and August the two months of lowest attendance, being omitted, while the attendance for last year covers the eleven months the School was opened, which accounts very largely for the decrease in attendance.

Our Treasurer's report speaks for itself. Modest indeed is the amount we ask for, viz: \$125, \$100 less than last year. Further comment here is needless.

Dear friends, we feel the great need in our Sunday School work to-day is better preparation of the lessons by the scholars in the home, and to secure this the active co-operation of the parents is essential. Show that you are interested in your School, and in the biblical instruction of your boys and girls, in associating yourselves with us, by joining the home Department and uniting with your little ones in the study of God's word, which is ever "a lamp unto our feet and a light unto our path."

There were during the year several collections less than in the previous year and the Thanksgiving collection was devoted to another worthy object, yet the average of former years has been more than maintained. The money received at the Union Services has been divided on a more liberal basis than heretofore—our proportion being about 50% of the whole. Still so far as we are aware our poor have not been neglected, though the chronic claimants may not have fared so well. The Fall of 1900 remained open late in the season causing the demand upon the Fund to last five instead of seven months. In no case could more than transient relief be afforded, still that was greatly appreciated by the recipients. Other sums were received and applied as the donors stipulated and are not included in the statement.

The Official Board, again by resolution, conveyed to Mrs. Musgrove and the members of the Ladies' Relief Committee warm thanks for the unselfish labor and time devoted to this department of Christian work. The following excerpts from the Report of that Committee are herewith presented (1) The Committee has come in contact with much suffering and poverty, caused either through the use of liquor or as in many cases by inability to obtain work. (2) Eleven Methodist families, found to be worthy, received some assistance. In . one of these, the mother and four children died within the last two years. The Church to which this family belonged was unable to give them the necessary help, so the Relief Committee supplied them occasionally with food, fuel, and at Christmas time sent a box of clothing and eatables, which brought untold blessings to the sick ones. (3) Through the winter an old lady and her deaf and dumb daughter, who are unfit for hard work, were given a whole piece of flannelette to be made into underwear. This was bought from them and given to families in need of clothing. (4) Past experiences called for some better way of distributing Christmas cheer. The Conveners of the different Church Committees sent their lists to the Secretary of the Associated Charities, and each Convener selected from these lists the number and name of the families they desired to help. Overlapping was to some extent thus provided against. (5) Time will not permit to give the names of all from whom the Committee received donations, but it is all known to Him who has said, "Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren ye have done it unto me."

As in former reports the Steward conveys to all contributors on behalf of the relieved their thanks for help afforded them in sore distress.

At the request of Rev. Dr. Rose and Mr. H. W. Chamberlain (local Treasurer), who were in charge of the Fund, we have made a thorough survey of the books of this Fund.

Subscriptions were promised to the amount of \$6,130 from members of the congregation, \$134.35 from Epworth League, \$267.95 from the Sunday School.

Of these sums the donors desired that \$295.00 should be devoted to Educational purposes, \$195.00 to Home and Foreign Missions, \$603.00 to Superannuation, and \$62 to local Church debts, leaving the balance to be allocated as the General Conference Committee should determine.

The Treasurer received \$6,036.00 from the Congregation, \$134.35 from the Epworth League, \$267.95 from the Sunday School; a total of \$6,438.30.

There was paid to the General Treasurer Rev. Dr. Potts, Toronto, \$6,382.21, to Treasurer Dominion Methodist Church \$50.44, for postage drafts, etc., \$5.65. Vouchers for these payments were furnished in every case.
