In the last of the third inning the Dawson City team made three rund, making the score 4 to 0.

Gardner made a two-base hit to deep left and stole third. Jahnke struck to shortstop and reached first safely. Mc-Stay got his base on balls making three men on bases. Jahnke forced the pitcher to throw to second and Gardner made a score. Frew fanned out. Fee struck to short who threw home putting out Jahnke. Turner got to first on balls and stole second. Foss hit a twobagger to short center bringing in Fee and Turner. Darling struck to short and was put out at first.

The Gandolfo team got its first score in the fourth inning made by Turner who made a safe first base hit, stole second and was brought in by a two bagger by Doyle. Brown was put out at second. O'Brien fauned out. Smith hit to first and was put out by Gardner. Nelson for the Dawsons took the bat and fanned out. Gardner got to first on a dead ball. The Gandolios claimed he ran in front of the ball and while the point was being argued Gardner stole second and third, but had to return to first as the pitcher had not returned to his box.
