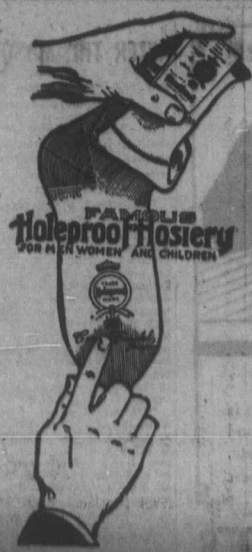

At the old Bailey Sessions held recently in London, Mrs. Elizabeth Pankhurst, the militant suffragette leader, and Mrs. M. P. K. Pethwick Lawrence, joint editors of 'Votes for Women' were all found guilty. Each was sentenced to nine months imprisonment, on the charge of conspiracy, and inciting their followers to malicious damage of property.

The London despatches describe the scene in the court as 'pathetic when the verdict of 'guilty' was pronounced. The sentence does not involve 'hard labor.'

AFTER THE MOSQUITOES

Kill Them Before They Grow Their Wings, Says Dr. Higgins
Dr. Chas. H. Higgins, pathologist of the Experimental Farm, has been a crusade against mosquitoes, and in a letter giving advice for the abatement of the nuisance, says:
"Mosquitoes are pesky little creatures which annoy the quiet man grown-up during the summer months. They are always present when a breeding ground is handy. For your hatching of their eggs and their development before becoming winged, the mosquito needs a quiet pool of water. This pool may be in a bottle, an old tin can, or an ordinary roadside mud hole. When to break pool they are known as wigglers and these little black wigglers can be seen to the bottom when the surface is disturbed."
"Grown-ups either like or dislike mosquitoes. Children cannot express an opinion as they have to take what is given them by their parents. If you like mosquitoes you allow them to breed and multiply to serve their purpose. If you dislike mosquitoes you prevent their breeding in their favorite haunts close to your place of abode."
"Kill the mosquitoes while they are wigglers and they will never grow up to annoy you and your family. To kill the wigglers never allow hot sun or the cause to be known. Cover all mudholes or quiet pools of water with coal oil. A quart of coal oil will cover a pool ten feet square. The oil forms a thin film on the surface and smothers the wigglers. Wigglers come to the surface every few minutes to breathe and with the film of oil on the surface they cannot get their nose or breathing pore out to the air. Be wise! Kill the mosquitoes before they grow wings."

A HIDDEN RADIATOR

A Canadian Who Has Patented an Interesting Invention
Canadian inventors while not numerous are attracting increasing attention throughout the world. The latest Canadian who has worked out an invention successfully is Dr. G. M. Aylesworth, Collingwood, whose hidden radiator for heating dwellings is being recognized as a step toward perfection. The radiator through which the hot air from the furnace passes, though hidden in the partition operates on the scientific principle used with hot water heating. Whatever such figures may show, and the chances are that only approximate statistics can be obtained, the Canadian figures have been compiled. There were on the Titanic when she sailed 35 adult Canadians. These were divided as follows:
Men 21
Women 14
Total 35

There were, of the Canadians, 21 drowned, and 14 saved. The saved consisted of:
Men 3
Women 11
Total 14

The Canadians who went down with the ship were divided as follows:
Men 18
Women 3
Total 21

Of the two Canadian women drowned, one at least—Mrs. Allison—was given an opportunity to go in the lifeboats, but preferred to remain with her husband.

Two Canadian men were saved. One was ordered into a lifeboat which was insufficiently manned; the other Canadian was given a place in the boat only after the women on his part of the ship had embarked.

About a record such as this Canada may well be proud. Her men died like men after doing their best to save the women and children.
