Important Bridge Legislation. WASHINGTON, May 26.—In the senate today a bill providing for the removal of obstructions to the navigation of the navigable waters of the United States. It requires bridge corporations to erect abutments, etc., to aid in striking the bridge pier. An amendment was adopted providing that no more than \$15,000 need be expended upon any one bridge in a single year. The secretary of war shall enforce the law wherever the public interest requires. The bill passed.
