How to prepare a good soup to eat in a few minutes.

These suggestions are based on practical experience, the aim being to secure the best and most reasonable results with the least outlay of labor and money.

Beef Soup. - Four pounds of beef, one-half peck of green peas.

Bean Soup. - Wash one quart of white dried beans, and let them soak overnight in cold water.

Broiled Fresh Cod. - When the fish is thoroughly cleaned, wipe dry and split open from head to tail.

Baked Fish. - Wash the fish clean, and place in salted water for 20 minutes.

Baking Fish. - Cod, bass, shad and bluefish are good for baking.

Wash and wipe the fish thoroughly, then scrape off all the scales.

Shoulder of Mutton Broiled. - Place the mutton over a bright fire of coals; let it broil, placing the inside to the fire.

Lamb Stewed with Peas. - Cut the scrap of broast of lamb in pieces, and put in a stewpan with water enough to cover it.

Boiled Mutton. - Wash a leg of mutton, dredge it well with flour and wrap in cloth.

Chocolate Jelly. - One cup of chocolate, one cup of sugar and one cup of milk or cream.

Strawberry Shortcake. - Three parts of flour, two teaspoonfuls of cream of tartar.
