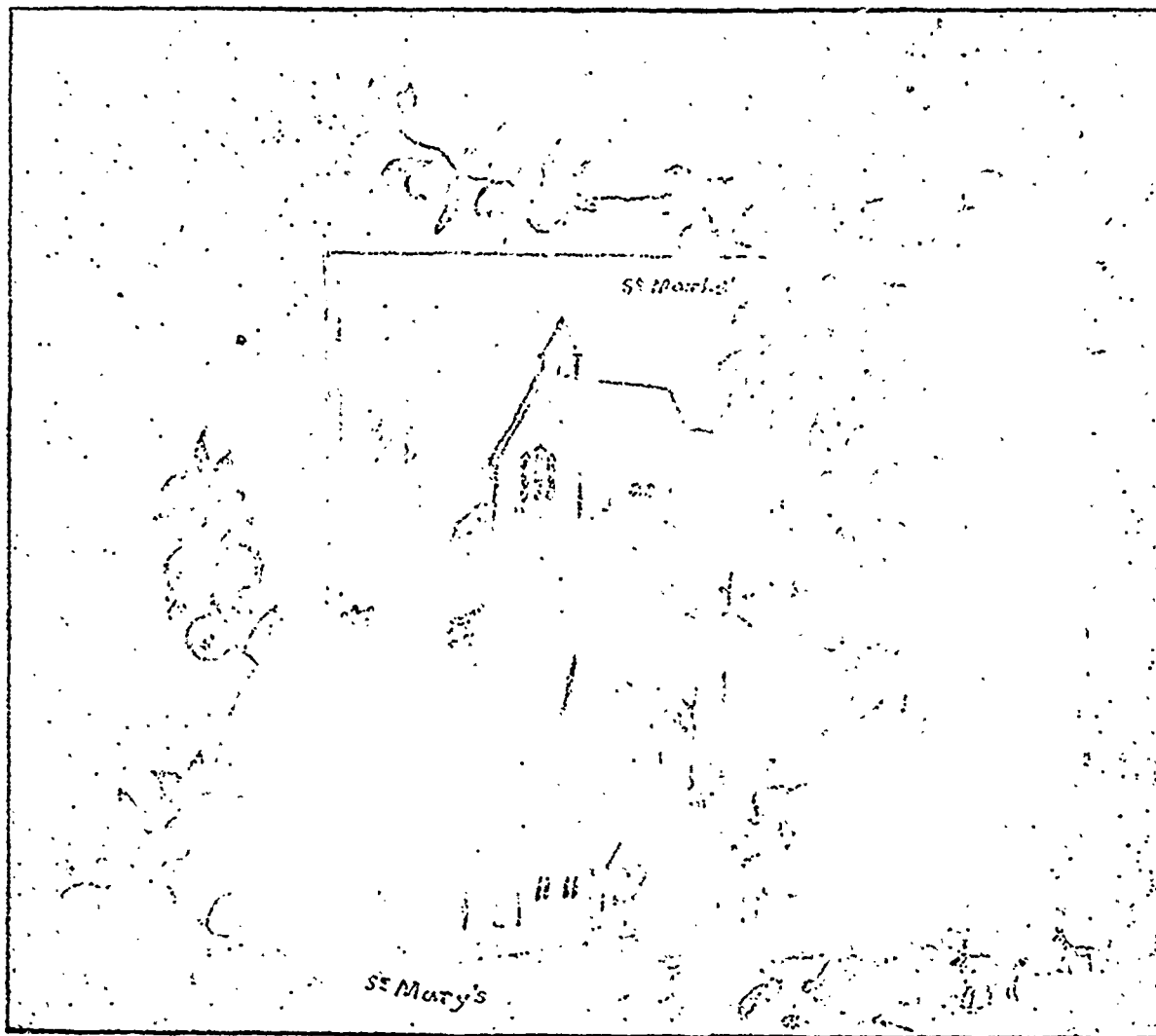

Church Services:

St. Mark's Church, Vesuvius—Morning service 11 a.m., and Holy Communion the first Sunday in each month. Afternoon service 3:30 p.m. On all other Sundays, except when a fifth Sunday in the month occurs—evening service 7:30 p.m. Choir practice, St. Mark's, every Friday evening.

North End School—Service 11 a.m., the third Sunday in each month.

Beaver Point School—Service 11 a.m. the fifth Sunday in the month, whenever there are five Sundays.

St. Mary's Church, Fulford—Morning service 10:30 a.m. second and fourth Sundays in each month. Holy Communion on the fourth Sunday of every month. Evening service the first Sunday of the month 7:30 p.m.

Home Sunday School—Children prepare Sunday School lessons in their own homes. Bible questions are given in *Parish and Home*. Instruction and catechism at their homes every month.

Ladies Church Guild—Meets once a month.

Salt Spring Island Parish and Home

JUNE, 1901.

Mr. S. Conery has the largest dairy on the Island, 21 cows, and all good milkers.

There seems to be again some prospect of a copper mine being started at Falford Harbor.

Mrs. Akerman, after spending some months in Vancouver and Victoria, has returned again to the Island.

There being five Sundays this month, there will be service at the Beaver Point school house Sunday, June 30th.

Henry W. Robinson, an old and respected resident of the Island, died of pneumonia the last day of April aged 73, and was buried in the public cemetery, May the 3rd.

A surveyor was on the Island last month, doing work for Messrs. Croften, Borradaile and others, as well as marking out the site for the new Agricultural Hall at Ganges Harbor.

Mr. Nightingale's son George was very ill for a few days, through getting a chill while recovering from chicken pox, and a doctor had to be sent for from Maple Bay, Dr. Baker being absent from home.

Dr. Baker left the Island on the 13th ult. on a hunting expedition up to the Cascade Range. He had Messrs. McFadden and C. told with him, and they expected to interview cinnamon bears, grizzlies and wild goats, and to be away about three weeks. Dr. Baker well deserves the holiday, and we hope he will "come out on top" with the grizzly.

Very sad and unexpected was the death of Mr. Nightingale's little son Jimmy, who a few years ago was adopted by Mr. and Mrs. J. J. Akerman, and lived with them as their child. The little boy was only eight years old, and was at school eight days before his death. By Dr. Baker's orders, he was sent to the Jubilee and was operated on for psoas abscess Sunday, May 12; the following Wednesday he died. The funeral was at St. Mary's Church, Monday, May 20th, and was very largely attended. Six little school-fellows were the bearers, and both coffin and chancel step were covered with wreaths and crosses of white flowers.

There are 15 children now attending the Divide school.

The Diocesan Synod meets in Nanaimo the first week in July.

Mr. Chalmers has invested in some thoroughbred Belgian hares, and has young ones for sale.

It is reported that the expected telephone connection with Victoria will shortly become an established fact.

The missionary boxes are to be gathered in now, and their contents will be sent to the C. M. S. branch in Toronto.

Mr. W. Bryan has been joined by a friend from England, Mr. Skinner, and they are living together on the Robertson farm at North End.

A Mr. Hollis, bricklayer and mason, has taken up his abode in Mr. A. R. Birtacourt's cottage, Ganges Harbor. He intends, we believe, to make brick on the Island, and his wife will open a laundry.
