RULES AND REGULATIONS.

"The Members of the Agricultural Societies of the several Townships within the County or United Counties wherein the Annual Exhibition may be held, and the members of the said county or United Counties, shall be also members of the Association for that year, and have badges accordingly: provided the Agricultural Societies of the said Townships, or the Societies of the said County or United Counties, shall devote their whole funds for the year including the Government Grant, in the aid of the Association. The Office-bearers of all County Societies shall have have badges of free entrance during the Show."—*By-Law.*

1. The payment of 5s. and upwards constitutes a person a member of the Agricultural Association of Upper Canada for one year; and £2 10s for life, when given for that specific object, and not as a contribution to the local funds.

2. No one but a member will be allowed to compete for prizes except in classes 31, 33, 35 and 36.

3. All Entries must be made on printed forms, which may be obtained of the Secretaries of Agricultural Societies, free of charge. These forms are to be filled up and signed by the exhibitor, enclosing a dollar for membership, and sent to the Secretary of the Association, Board of Agriculture, Toronto, ON OR BEFORE SATURDAY, SEPT. 6., after which time a charge of 5s. will be imposed on each article.

Exhibitors in the Horticultural and Ladies' Departments may enter articles up to Tuesday Evening, Sept. 23., when the Books will be finally closed.

Blood Horses and Thorough-bred Cattle must be entered, and have their full Pedigrees properly attested and sent to the Secretary in Toronto, not later than Saturday, Sept. 6th. No animals will be allowed to compete as pure bred, unless they possess regular Stud and Herd Book pedigrees, or satisfactory evidence be produced that they are directly descended from such stock. All animals entered in the Stock Register, kept by the Board, will be allowed to compete without further enquiry.

4. Cards from the Treasurer's Office will be furnished each member, which will admit himself only, free to every department of the Exhibition, during the Show. Life members admitted free.

5. Tickets of admission to those who are not members, 1s 3d each time of admission. Children under 14 years of age, half price. Carriages, including drivers, 5s; passengers to pay 1s 3d each. Horsemen to pay 2s 6d each admission.

6. Every article exhibited for competition must be the growth, produce, or manufacture of Canada, except Classes 35 and 36. Live Stock for breeding must be the property of persons residing in Canada. All premiums for articles, except Stock, are to be awarded to the manufacturers or producers only.

7. Discretionary Premiums will be awarded for such articles as may be considered worthy by the Judges, although not enumerated in the List, and the Directors will determine the amount of premium.

8. In the absence of competition in any of the Classes, or if the Stock or articles exhibited be of inferior quality, the Judges will exercise their discretion as to the value of the premiums they recommend.

9. The Judges, Competitors, and Officers of the Association only will be permitted to enter the Show Grounds, until 12 o'clock, on Wednesday, at which hour Members will be admitted. Non Members will be admitted on Thursday and Friday mornings after 8 o'clock.

10. No articles or Stock exhibited will be allowed to be removed from the grounds, till the awards are made, without the permission of the President, under the penalty of losing the premiums. An Auctioneer will be on the ground after the premiums are announced and every facility afforded for the transaction of business.

11. Delegates, Judges and Members of the Press, are requested and expected to report themselves at the Secretary's Office immediately on their arrival.

12. The Judges are to meet at the Secretary's Office on the Grounds, on Wednesday morning, at 9 o'clock precisely, to make arrangements for entering upon their duties.

13. Arrangements will be made for Agricultural Lectures or Discussions during the evenings of Wednesday and Thursday of the Show week.

14. While the Directors will take every possible precaution, under the circumstances, to ensure the safety of articles sent to the exhibition, yet they wish it to be distinctly understood that the owners of the articles must themselves take the risk of exhibiting them; and that should any article be accidentally injured, lost or stolen, the Directors will give all the assistance in their power towards the recovery of the same, but will not make any payment for the value thereof.

15. The Treasurer will be prepared to commence paying the premiums immediately after the successful competitors have been declared, and parties who shall have prizes awarded them are particularly requested to apply for them before leaving Kingston, or leave a written order with some person to receive them, stating the articles for which prizes are claimed.

The Local Committee will make arrangements with Steamboat and Railroad proprietors for carrying articles and passengers at reduced rates: also with the Hotel and Boarding-house keepers, for accommodating visitors at their ordinary fixed charges. Full particulars will be published hereafter in Show Bills.

N.B.—The President of the Association has kindly promised to supply Hay gratuitously to horses, cattle, and sheep during the Exhibition.

DIPLOMAS will be awarded to the *Breeders* or *Importers* of bulls and stallions which take *first prizes*, when their names and residences are given.

The Judges shall ascertain, in deciding on bull calves in any of the foregoing classes, whether the animal has been suckled or raised by pail, and make allowances accordingly.

A certificate to be produced to show the breeding of animals in class viii.

Young cattle may compete, if the exhibitor thinks fit, in an older class than that to which they properly belong, but no animal will be allowed to compete in more than one of the foregoing sections.

COUNTY AGRICULTURAL REPORTS

A Premium of £15 will be given for the best Report on each of the following Counties: viz., ADDINGTON, HALDIMAND, and HUNON. If the successful Report be written by the Secretary of the County Agricultural Society, the premium will be increased to £20.

These Reports, in addition to the usual information required respecting the condition of Agricultural Societies within their range, should describe the various soils of the county, modes of farming, value of land, amount of tillage and average of crops, breeds of live stock, implements and machines in use, manures and their mode of application, sketch of past progress, with suggestions for further improvement.

All statistical information should be condensed, and, when practicable, put in a tabulated form. The main object of the Report should be to afford any intelligent stranger who may read it, a concise, yet an adequately truthful view of the agricultural condition and industrial pursuits of the County. It is desirable that each Report should not be less than 25 or 30 octavo pages, when printed.

The Reports are to be sent in to the Secretary of the Board of Agriculture, Toronto, on or before the 1st day of September next; accompanied by a sealed note containing the name and address of the writer. Such as obtain premiums will become the property of the Board; but no premium will be awarded to any Report unless it possesses sufficient merit, although it may be the best sent in.
