GERMAN PERSIAN CONSOLS

The principal assets are the construction account amounting to \$357,801, and the value of lands and right of way, amounting to \$232,235. The liabilities consist of notes, bonds, mortgages and smaller accounts.

William St. John Broderick, in the House of Commons to-day, replying to a question on the subject, said that on certain questions the Anglo-American Joint Commission has made progress towards settlement, and he added that Her Majesty's Government hoped further negotiations would solve the question in which the dispute. The Parliamentary Secretary said that the papers could not be laid on the table, as the commissioners had requested that the proceedings be kept confidential.

Vatican Servant is 101.

Rome, Feb. 24.—On next Monday the Pope will grant a special audience to the oldest servant of the Vatican. It is Commander Pirelli of the Papal Body Guard, who on that day will be 101 years old.

THE BIGGEST ON RECORD.

More Deaths From Consumption for January Than Ever Before in Ontario.

There are two significant items noticeable in connection with the last monthly report issued by the Provincial Board of Health, for January, 1899.

The first is, that by dint of much hard work and continued application the total returns equal 98 per cent, or 2,232,053 out of a population of 2,284,182, which exhibits the perfection of the system.

The other item is the alarming increase in deaths from consumption, reaching the total of 184 during January, which is larger than any month since records were established. This in itself seems to point the moral for a citizens' sanitarium. The figures for the preceding three months are as follows:

Oct. '98	158 deaths
Nov. '98	149 deaths
Dec. '98	131 deaths
Jan. '99	184 deaths

The figure for January, 1898, is 149 deaths. The report for last month includes deaths from all causes, the total being 2154, in January, 1898, this being from contagious diseases only, 228 deaths.

Other diseases as follows:

Scarlatina 23 deaths, same month '98, 16
diphtheria 48, in '98, 31; measles 5, in '98, 4; whooping cough 9, in '98, 8; typhoid fever 21, in '98, 12.

In January, 1898, the total population reported was 1,659,771, or 70 per cent. In December, 1898, it was 2,173,000, or 93 per cent.
