

"The city can practically close its eyes and accept this proposition. It strikes one thruout as being very reasonable," said Assessment Commissioner Fleming last night, discussing the terms under which the Toronto Steel Works are willing to locate in Toronto. Ald. Foster, Richardson and Burns, who were present, seemed to share the commissioner's satisfaction. James Bicknell, the legal representative of the company, had announced in writing what his clients were prepared to acpression of the Property Committee met Tuesday afternoon to consider the proposal to light the City Hall tower clock with acetylene gas. 


