
The report of the registrar of loan orporations, Dr. Howard Hunter, for 1902, shows that the loan companies had a prosperous year in spite of the fact that two of such companies are now in liquidation.


The total capital stock is \$77,564,588, permanent capital subscribed, while in 1901, it stood \$76,534,373, showing about \$1,000,000 increase. The value of terminating stock fell from \$18,-865,585 to \$16,214,025, showing that this line of investment is not a favor-ite. The total liabilities to depositors increased from \$19,892,496 to \$20,214,-080. The total assets increased from \$155,612,165 to \$159,370,887.

The largest gain, however, was in the amount of principal and interest received from borrowers, which in-creased from \$40,127,253 to \$51,242,211. Creased from \$40,127,253 to \$51,242,211. The average rate of interest on de-posits decreased from 4.02 to 3.84 per cent., and on mortgages of realty from 6.12 to 6.10 per cent. The large decrease in the value of mortgages foreclosed is very gratify-ing, being \$760,029 in 1501, and \$537,-982 in 1902.

The defunct Atlas Loan Co.'s state-ment for year ending Dec. 31, 1902, showed total liabilities to the public \$822,628, while their assets were put at \$1,410,847.

The Loan and Savings Co., Limited, of Montreal, has been refused regis-tration in Ontario by a judgment just issued by Dr. Hunter. The company was incorporated under letters patent from the Province of Quebec, Feb. 23, 1901. A financial statement and other information, which the law requires, were lacking in their applica-tion for registry. On request, how-ever, the following statement was forwarded : Capital stock, \$250,000; sub-scribed, \$125,000; paid up capital, \$12,500. It was stated also that authority was given in the charter for the issue of \$1,000,000 in bonds, and that \$500,000 of these had already been issued.
