TRAMP THIEVES ALL USE IT. Terrible Explosive "Pie" for Him—Some Facts About Up-to-Date Burglary.

It is nitro-glycerine that looms up now as the paramount problem in police and detective circles. True, there is nothing new in the fact that "nitro" is used by expert cracksmen. But the commonest,aggiest, dirtiest "yegg man," or tramp thief, now handles it well nigh as fearlessly as he does his pistol.

Electricity "petrol" man? The professional "petrol" man is pressing electricity into his service as illustrated by a recent robbery in St. Peterburg, which will doubtless be imitated in this country before many months.

The modern "petrol" man drills a hole in the top of the safe, inserts a funnel, pours in the nitro-glycerine, the minimum being estimated to a sheet—inserts an insulator wire properly capped at the lower end, and wraps the safe in a blanket of cotton wool, if he wraps it entirely around it.

CARDINALS LOOKED IN READY TO GO TO DAY

Sixty-Two Entered Conclave and One Requires Attendance of Physician.

Rome, July 31.—The largest conclave in the history of the Catholic Church has now assembled in the Sistine Chapel for the purpose of electing a successor to Leo XIII. Sixty-two cardinals, with over 200 clericals and lay attendants, are to attend the conclave, and the cardinals within the Vatican. One of them, Cardinal Herrera y Espinosa, Archbishop of Valencia, was prostrated immediately after entering the conclave, and lies ill in his cell.

Without Ideas. Procrastination as to who will wear the tiara is the chief obstacle to the election, as even the cardinals who this evening entered their cells seemed to have no definite ideas as to the issue. Cardinal Rampolla, Cardinal Vannutelli, Di Pietro, Gotti and Oreglia continue to be most frequently mentioned as the likeliest candidates, but the names of one or two of them is mentioned a hundred times.

Before the conclave Cardinal Gibbons requested the Associated Press to deny all interviews alleged to have been given out by him and to state that he had never seen any accounts of conversations he is alleged to have had with private individuals, referring especially to the statement of the Italian yesterday to the effect that he had criticized the policy of Rampolla.

LOAN COMPANIES GAIN BIG INCREASE IN LOANS

The report of the registrar of loan corporations, Dr. Howard Hunter, for 1902, shows that the loan companies had a prosperous year in spite of the fact that two of such companies are now in liquidation.

The total capital stock is \$77,664,588, permanent capital subscribed, while in 1901, it stood \$70,534,373, showing about \$7,130,215 increase. The value of terminating stock fell from \$18,865,980 to \$16,214,625, showing that this kind of investment is not a favorite. The total liabilities to depositors increased from \$19,842,400 to \$20,214,000. The total assets increased from \$155,612,145 to \$156,570,887.

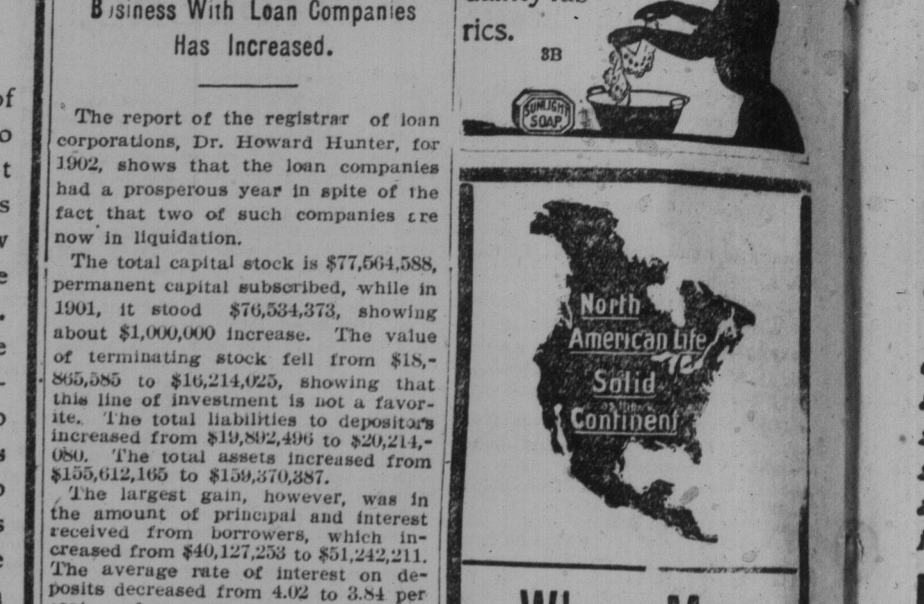

TARIFF REDUCTION HURTS ALL EXAMPLES OF FREE TRADE FOLLY

George D. Griffin Answers Argument That Not One in Twenty-Nine Would Be Adversely Affected By Sudden Removal of Whole U. S. Tariff.

The World as follows: In The Toronto Globe of the 14th inst. there is quoted from a report of Mr. Edward Atkinson, a prominent economic statistician, that of the 29,000,000 workers in the United States, it was impossible to find one million who would be adversely affected even by the sudden removal of the entire tariff, not one in every twenty-nine. In Mr. Atkinson's report there are no facts to verify his theory. It is the reverse of the industrial and financial history made by ex-President Cleveland in the lowering of the United States tariff. The reduction enabled the foreign producers to flood the United States with their stocks of surplus goods. This deprived the workers in the United States of so large a portion of their home market that millions were deprived of work and earnings—earnings which the importers gave to the workers in foreign nations. The merchants who had furnished them food and raiment were deprived of business and those who gave credit for profit had debts. Very many business men had debts which they could not meet their notes at the bank. The importers demanded gold of the banks to pay for imported goods which could have been made in the United States and been paid for by their workers with their earnings in place of with forced loans. The importers deprived their customers of work and the banks of the ability to furnish the importers with money with gold, wherewith to pay their imports.

Six Hundred Banks Failed. One of the results was that six hundred of these banks had to close their doors, which caused widespread injury to depositors. In this way the importers under Mr. Cleveland's low tariff, not only bankrupted 600 banks and crippled many more, but shut the doors of many industrial establishments and reduced the workers in hundreds of others for lack of money to pay for material and wages—money that the importers had drained out of the banks to pay the workers, the makers in other countries of the goods they imported. 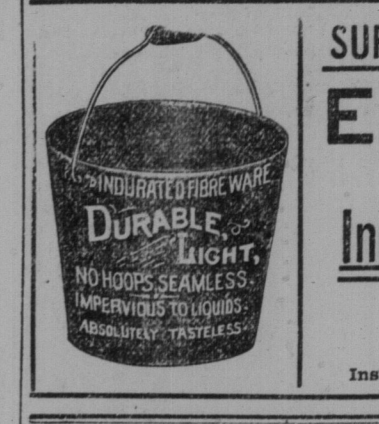
