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CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

OF THE

Province of Auebec Rifle Association.

CONSTITUTION.

RULE 1. That this Association be called the "Province of Quebec Rifle Association," and shall have for its object, the encouragement of Rifle shooting in the Province.

2. That the Annual Subscription for Individual Members be two dollars, and a donation of ten dollars in cash, at any one time, shall entitle the donor to be elected a life member.

3. That any regularly constituted Rifle Association or Corps in this Province, may become affiliated to this Association, by the payment of an annual subscription of not less than ten dollars, the number of memberships to be in proportion to one for every half dollar so subscribed.

4. The affairs of the Association shall be managed by a Council composed of the office-bearers, and two representatives from each affiliated Association. Five to form a quorum.

5. The Office-bearers of this Association shall consist of a President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary and Treasurer, who shall be elected primarily at the first meeting, and afterwards annually at the annual meeting.

6. A Patron and Vice-Patrons may be elected at the first meeting, and afterwards whenever a vacancy occurs.

7. The Deputy Adjutant-Generals and Brigade Majors of

the Province, being members of the Association, shall be members, ex-officio, of the Council.

- 8. The Representatives to the Council must be members of Association, either by affiliation or otherwise; they shall be chosen annually by the Association they represent, and their names sent to the Secretary, at least one month before the annual meeting.
- 9. The Council may from time to time, make such By-Laws for their proper guidance as they may deem necessary, but no by-law to be altered or new one proposed, without at least such notice being given to each member of the Council, as by the by-laws may be determined.
- 10. The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be agreed on at the annual business meeting.
- 11. The Annual Business Meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be determined on, by the by-laws.
- 12. An Annual Report shall be made by the Secretary and Treasurer and submitted to the Conneil, previous to publication.
- 13. At the Annual Meeting the Council shall appoint an Executive Committee, to carry out the Annual Prize Meeting, under such regulations as may be made by the Council from time to time.

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BY-LAWS.

- 1. That the Annual Meeting of the Association be held at Montreal on the first Thursday in May.
- 2. Extraordinary meetings may be called by the Secretary, when required by any six members of the Council; fifteen days notice of such meeting given to each member of the Council, and the requisition must state the object for which the meeting is called.
- 3. Three Auditors shall be appointed annually, whose duties shall be to examine the Treasurer's accounts previous to the Annual Meeting.
- 4. The Treasurer shall be required to deposit from time to time—all sums of money paid over to him, on behalf of the Association—in a safe bank.
- 5. The payment of sums for current expenses, must be authorized by the President, or in his absence, one of the Vice Presidents. Other payments to be made only upon the authority of the Council.

SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Province of Quebec Bifle Association.

The Report of the past year's operations shews a falling off from the previous year in the number of competitors at the Annual Matches, and an increase in the number of Affiliated Associations. The number of entries in 1873 was 1,410; in 1874, 1,117—a decrease of 293. The number of Affiliated Associations in 1873 was 19, in 1874, 22, being the largest number we have ever had. The Matches were carried on successfully, without delay, and were finished within the week in which they were commenced. The average firing was better in all the matches than in any previous year. Our friends from Ontario attended in goodly numbers, and were, as usual, successful in carrying off valuable prizes. We were favored for the first time by a visit from members of the New York Rifle Club, who expressed themselves highly pleased with their visit and with our management of the matches. Several of them proved to be first-rate shots. They promised to renew their visit at our next prize meeting. It is to be hoped they will come with a strong team, when they may be assured a warm welcome will await them. We had also some competitors from New Brunswick, who will, no doubt, return again bringing others with them. The presence of marksmen from the sister Provinces and from the neighboring Republic, is encouraging, and shews that our Association is increasing in popularity, and that our manner of working the matches meets with approval.

A new match was introduced which proved a success, the Association Match, with prizes for Clubs and Associations and individual competitors. The number of the prizes in the matches were increased by seventeen, and the value of them by \$219.50 over the preceding year. The number of prizes in 1873 were 210, value \$2,142.00; number in 1874, 227, value \$2,361.50. This increase met with the decided approval of all the members.

The placing of the *Provincial* Match first on the list was an improvement. By this being done, competitors from the other Provinces could arrive on the second day and be in time for the matches open to them.

The Treasurer's Statement shews a falling off in subscriptions. None were received from the Grand Trunk Railway, Bank of British North America and Stadacona Rifle Club, from whom liberal donations have hitherto been received; but we are glad to report a grant from the Quebec Provincial Government, similar to the grant made to the Ontario Association by the Ontario Government.

A large sum was spent in building a new butt for three first-class targets. This expense will not be incurred this year.

The new method of getting markers from the Volunteer Corps was tried, and found to be more expensive than the former mode of markers from the Regulars and B Battery. A reduction in this expense, and the expense of the Staff, is desirable. The Council Tent is another item of expense that can be curtailed without injury to the efficient working of the matches.

Our Association having affiliated with the National Rifle Association, a report of our matches is published in the Annual Report of the N. R. A., and we have again received their valuable Silver Medal, which will be added to our prize list this year.

A number of our members attended the Dominion Matches in September last, at Ottawa. The following were among the

Ensign Wright won the first prize in the Dominion Match; Captain Thomas, the Macdougall Cup; Lieut. Whitman, the Governor General's Gold Medal; and the Province of Quebec the second prize in the Affiliated Association Match.

A competition was held in October last, at Point St. Charles, for the Wimbledon Team for 1875. Twenty-four competitors entered and fired for three consecutive days, seven rounds at each range, 200, 500 and 600 yards each day. The new Wimbledon target and scoring were used. The names of those making the ten highest scores were forwarded to Ottawa; three of them—Ensign Wright, 50th Batt., Sergeant Hill, 1st Batt., and Corp. Copping, Three Rivers Batt.—were selected to represent the Province of Quebec on the Team this year.

A resolution was adopted at the last Annual Meeting of the Dominion Rifle Association, with a view to the future selection of the Team for Wimbledon, by having a series of matches set apart, and the aggregate scores in these matches to determine the membership of the Team, but some of our best marksmen may not be able to attend the Dominion Matches at Ottawa. It would be well, therefore, if our Association adopted a series of matches for the same purpose, and gave as prizes an amount, say \$5 or \$10, to each of the ten Quebec men making the highest scores, to enable them to attend the Dominion Matches.

The new Wimbledon target having been adopted by the Dominion Rifle Association, its adoption by us at all future matches has become a necessity. The old target plates can be used for the new scoring. They were tried at the competition for the Wimbledon Team last fall, and answered well.
