I have the honor to present a communication to this Grand Lodge from Right Worshipful Bro. G. W. Fowler, Grand Master of New Brunswick, which exhaustively reviews the operation of the Public School law of that Province and the now celebrated Bathurst School case, all the facts connected with which are clearly stated by our esteemed brother. Bro. Fowler's communication deals with the question dear to the principles of our Order. I have therefore, pleasure in commending to the serious consideration of this Most Worshipful Grand Lodge, Bro. Fowler's exhaustive report, and his petition based thereon.

Since our last meeting affairs in the Mother Land have assumed a serious form. Mr. Gladstone's Home Rule Bill, virtually conceding the independence of Ireland and disrupting the Empire, is being rapidly rushed through the British House of Commons by sheer force of numbers. For the first time in the history of responsible Government the people's representatives in Parliament are denied the right of free discussion on a measure whose principles—or rather want of principles—threaten the very foundation, the integrity of this grand Empire. The patriotic conduct of the loyalists of Ireland, England, Scotland and Wales in vigorously opposing by every constitutional means the passage of such a measure, meets with our earnest approval. I have pleasure in laying before this Grand Lodge communications and petitions from the Ulster Loyalists' Union, and I warmly commend them to you for your sympathy and co-operation. It is our bounden duty to give to the brethren in Ulster and the other Provinces our active aid in their glorious struggle for faith and fatherland.

In conclusion, I congratulate the Grand Lodge on the marvellous prosperity which has characterized our efforts as an Association throughout the year. Orangeism is now firmly established from the rock-bound shores of Newfoundland on the east, to the placid waters of the Pacific on the west, and away to the great McKenzie River on the north. Orange Halls dot the surface of the land, ever found with the pioneers of civilization, serving as rallying centres for the spread of the principles of civil and religious liberty, and also for the dissemination of Protestantism; they being in many places placed at the disposal of the clergy of the various Protestant bodies as places of public worship.

The officers of the Grand Lodge have been faithful and courteous in the discharge of their duties. Their various reports, which no doubt will be very interesting, will be placed before you for consideration.

I trust that the deliberations of this Grand Lodge may be characterized by its customary spirit of zeal, earnestness and harmony, and that great good may follow.

GRAND SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The M. W. the Grand Secretary presented and read his annual report as follows:

To the Most Worshipful the Grand Master and Members of the Grand Orange Lodge of British America:

MOST WORSHIPFUL SIR AND BRETHREN—In accordance with constitutional practice, I have great pleasure in presenting herewith my third annual report as Secretary of the Grand Orange Lodge of British America, which contains a brief resume of the work transacted during the past year.

PLACE OF MEETING.

We assemble to-day in the beautiful town of Sault Ste. Marie, in the far-famed District of Algoma, standing as it were, half-way between the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans, at the gateway of the great chain of lakes through which the commerce of half this continent passes, and easily reached by magnificent steamers from all parts of our great lakes, and that well equipped road, the Canadian Pacific Railway, reminding us of the vastness of this great British North-American continent, with its 2,000 miles of fertile land on either side of where we now assemble.

GRAND LODGE RETURNS.

Every Provincial Grand Orange Lodge under our jurisdiction has made its annual returns, and from these interesting reports, conclusive evidence is furnished that the year just closed has been one of the most successful in the history of our Association. And although returns from the Grand Lodges are not quite complete, the figures show as follows: by initiation, 4,341; by depositing their certificate of membership, 1,638, and by being reinstated to membership, 520. While our absolute loss has been as follows: by expulsion, 159, and by death, 315. The nett increase being 6,025. It must be a matter of pride and congratulation to all concerned that the veterans of years gone by are still to be found in our ranks, some of whom have served faithfully and true for more than half a century, and also that the young men of to-day are crowding our ranks and emulating each other in their efforts to maintain the glorious principles of civil and religious liberty which were handed down to us after much trial and tribulation.

Six new Orange Young Britons' Lodges have been brought into existence during the past year, largely signed requisitions being forwarded in each instance to the M.W. the Grand Master. The officers of the Grand Lodge of O.Y.B. are men of energy and ability, and from present indications it would appear as if they were about to enjoy a season of the old-time prosperity which made their Order once so famous all over Canada.

LADIES' LODGES.

Four Ladies' Lodges have also been formed at the following places: Hamilton, Brockville, Addison and Athens, making in all ten Lodges of the Ladies' Loyal Orange Benevolent Association now in working order,

It is understood that the Executive of the Ladies' Association will be present at this session of Grand Lodge, and will ask for the formation of a Grand Lodge with full powers to carry on their own work subject to the approbation and approval of this Grand Lodge.

ROYAL SCARLET DISPENSATIONS.

Eight Royal Scarlet Dispensations for the formation of Chapters have also been issued to the following places: County of Cape Breton, N.S.; Districts of No. 1, North Hastings; East Gwillimbury; Vaughan, and West Nipissing; and to three Isolated Lodges, No. 1093, Fort William; No. 1608, Regina, and No. 1617, Prince Albert, N.W.T.

INCORPORATION WARRANTS.

Perhaps no better evidence could be given of the extensive operations of our Association and the vigor with which the work is being prosecuted throughout our jurisdiction than in the above immense list of Warrants issued during the past year, notwithstanding the fact the ground was considered almost fully occupied, so that scarcely a town, village or hamlet in the country had not an Orange Lodge in good working order.

CORRESPONDENCE.

The correspondence for the year just past has been large and more than double in volume that of former years. It has, however, been of a very pleasant and satisfactory character; and the very limited number of appeals that have been entered against the various decisions, must be regarded as evidence that the Association is at peace within its borders, and that good fellowship and a desire to live and act up to the Constitution appears to exist throughout our entire membership.

THE TRIENNIAL COUNCIL.

There are now twenty-five Grand Lodges working under the jurisdiction of the Triennial Council, and from nearly all these Lodges, recent annual reports have been received, a careful perusal of which elicits the fact that the Orange Association has included under its banner a vast army of men who are faithfully and nobly working for the relief of the sick and distressed, caring for the fatherless and widow, and standing forward for the principles of our Protestant faith.

prepared by the Grand Council, and therefore we may congratulate our-
selves that at least the two principle degrees of our Association are now
uniform. I have personally to thank the brethren of the Grand Lodge
of the United States for the many courtesies and attention shown to me,
and I must congratulate them on the splendid staff of officers they have
elected—brethren of known and recognized ability and intelligence being
at the helm.

ROYAL ARCH CERTIFICATES.

The Grand Orange Lodges of Ontario West and Newfoundland have passed unanimous resolutions favoring the preparation of a Royal Arch Certificate to be given to a member on his exaltation. If a handsomely designed certificate similar to that of the Royal Scarlet should be prepared, I have no doubt but that a vast majority of the brethren would be pleased to obtain these certificates, would prize them highly, and place them in a prominent place in their homes to remind them of that beautiful degree.

LODGE SUPPLIES.

In the organization of new Lodges, considerable difficulty is felt because of the fact that we furnish only a limited supply of the necessities for carrying on the work of the Lodge. This matter has been before the Grand Lodge on more than one occasion, and it appears to me that we should consider this question, which is one of importance, and deal with it if possible during this session of Grand Lodge. A Primary Lodge badly equipped at its organization is only half prepared for duty; and in some cases may never recover from the effect of doing its work haphazardly or in a slovenly manner. I am of the opinion that for a sum not exceeding double that for which we charge at present for Warrants, we could practically equip a new Lodge with all the necessities for carrying on its work for the first two or three years of its history. This is certainly a very important matter and should receive the attention of the members of Grand Lodge at its present session.

REGALIA.

The question of supplying a uniform regalia is one which must be dealt with sooner or later, and if it is considered at the present session of Grand Lodge, some of the brethren might afterwards put their thoughts into shape in the form of a notice of motion which could be discussed at the next annual meeting of this Grand Lodge, and no doubt would form the basis of a solution of this vexed and troublesome question being arrived at.

THE ORANGE SENTINEL.

To the brethren of British America it seems almost unnecessary to say a word on behalf of *The Orange Sentinel* now so well known throughout every portion of our jurisdiction, or of the splendid premium pictures which from year to year has been given to its subscribers in addition to the valuable reading matter which from week to week appears in its columns, and which ought to make *The Sentinel* a welcome visitor in the homes of every Orangeman and loyalist. During the past year, Bro. R. R. Clarke, who was its chief editorial writer from its inception, has been called away to his reward; but the work which he carried out so ably has fallen into worthy hands and is continued with much vigor.

SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The M.W. the Grand Secretary presented and read the first report of the Grand Orange Lodge of British America Benefit Fund, as follows:

To the Most Worshipful the Grand Master and Members of the Grand Orange Lodge of British America:

MOST WORSHIPFUL SIR AND BRETHREN,—I have the honor to submit for your consideration my first report as Secretary of the Grand Orange Lodge of British America Benefit Fund, and would most heartily congratulate the members of this Grand Lodge upon the steady progress which has attended the work of this department during the first six months of the present year.

Up to the first of July 242 new members have been added to the membership list, and 108 applications are now in hand awaiting the Local Medical Examiner's report.

Six assessments were made up to the first of July, and the sum of nine thousand dollars paid to the widows and orphans, or representatives of the deceased brethren.

DEATH PAYMENTS.

Since the commencement of the Insurance Department, and up to the first of last month, the handsome sum of \$87,700 has been paid to the

representatives of deceased brethren, and since that date a further sum of \$5,000 has been paid, making in all the very substantial amount of \$92,700, and the whole of this money has been paid out without any litigation or costs except in one special case.

TRANSFER.

In accordance with resolutions adopted by the Provincial Grand Orange Lodge of Ontario West at its meetings held at St. Thomas and Owen Sound, and approved of by this Grand Lodge, a transfer of the Insurance Department was made from the Provincial Grand Orange Lodge of Ontario West to the Grand Orange Lodge of British America, and which transfer was carried into effect the first week in February last. The Executive of the Grand Orange Lodge of Ontario West were requested, and very kindly have continued, to give their valuable services free in connection with the Executive departmental work; and to them we are greatly indebted for the excellent rules and by-laws that have been adopted and afterwards confirmed by the Inspector of Insurance, and are now in operation, and under which we are carrying on the work of the Insurance Department.

AGENTS.

The Executive having decided upon dividing up the territory into District and County agencies, this part of the work is now being carried out, and many active and reliable brethren have been selected and appointed in various parts of our jurisdiction. It will be gratifying to the brethren to learn that the prospects of a large addition to the membership list during the coming fall and winter months may be looked forward to as a certainty.

ASSESSMENTS.

The monthly assessment system that has been brought into operation has also been found working satisfactorily thus far, and many of the brethren are taking advantage of the provision made by the Executive, and are paying a number of assessments in advance. We may therefore look forward to being able to dispense with the monthly notices in the near future, and thereby effect a very considerable saving in the matter of sending out postal card notices every month.

AUDIT.

The membership, assessment, Secretary's and Treasurer's books have been carefully audited, and a report will be submitted to this Grand Lodge by the Auditors in due course, and by said report it will be seen that all claims have been duly met, and that there is a surplus to the credit of the Benefit Fund.

GRAND TREASURER'S REPORT.

M. W. the Grand Treasurer then presented and read his annual
report as follows:

*To the Most Worshipful the Grand Master, Officers and Brethren of the
Grand Lodge of British America:*

MOST WORSHIPFUL SIR AND BRETHREN,—I have much pleasure in
submitting for your consideration the annual financial statement for the
year ending April 30th, 1893, being my first statement as Grand
Treasurer of this Grand Lodge.

Included therein you will find statements of receipts and expenditure,
all moneys coming into my hands during the year in connection with
this Grand Lodge, and also moneys received from the Grand Secretary,
Bro. Robert Birmingham, in connection with the Grand Orange Lodge
Benefit Fund for the five months ending June 30th, 1893.

Accompanying these statements will be found reports of your
Auditors, certifying to the correctness of the accounts.

It is gratifying to me to be able to report an increase in the receipts
of the Grand Lodge, and more particularly of the Grand Secretary's
office for the past year, being the handsome sum of \$2,852.36, as com-
pared with \$2,445.50 last year, being an increase of \$406.86.

The expenditure for the past year is much larger than the previous year, being mainly due to the large amount of printing required for supplies for the Grand Secretary's office, and also because of the change of the Insurance Department from the Grand Lodge of Ontario West, necessitating a fresh supply of printed matter in compliance with the "Insurance Act," both of the Dominion and Local Legislatures.

Leaving a balance on hand of \$2,022.56; expenditure of the Orange Mutual Benefit Fund is \$9,899.27, leaving a balance on hand of \$3,321.22 on the 30th June, 1893.

I am sorry to say that all the Provincial Grand Lodges had not paid their Grand Lodge dues at the time the books were closed on the 30th of April, and therefore do not appear in this report, but I have prepared a statement as Table 3, showing all Provincial Grand Lodges that have paid, and the date the money was received by me, and the number of Primary Lodges under the jurisdiction of each Provincial Grand Lodge. I trust that in future all Provincial Grand Lodges will pay their Grand Lodge dues before the first of May in every year.

I would now most respectfully invite your attention to the tables I have prepared, giving a clear statement of all accounts and receipts, as well as disbursements for the past year.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON CORRESPONDENCE.

This report was presented and read by R. W. Bro. Major Sam Hughes, M.P., C.M., Victoria, as follows:

MOST WORSHIPFUL GRAND MASTER AND MEMBERS,—Your Committee on Correspondence, to whom have been submitted the addresses of Grand Master Wallace and Grand Secretary, R. Birmingham, and the correspondence and petitions from Lord Rosebery, representing the Ulster Loyalists' Union of Great Britain and Ireland, and also the long and carefully prepared letter of R. W. Bro. George W. Fowler, of Sussex, N.B., and other documents, respectfully present the following:

The clause in the address of the M. W. the Grand Master relating to Manitoba schools meets with the earnest approval of your Committee. It is generally conceded that the State should educate the youth of the land (1) intellectually in subjects such as reading, writing, arithmetic, geography, history, etc., that each may be in as advantageous a position as possible to earn an honest living and become a good citizen; (2) physically, that there may be sound bodies for sound minds; (3) politically, not in the narrow sense, but in the broad understanding of the educational, municipal, provincial and national forms of government through which the country is ruled; (4) ethically or morally, that each may readily comprehend right from wrong, and be taught man's duty to his fellow man. But the teaching of theologies or creeds, involving as they do differences of opinion on questions concerning man's duty, not only towards his fellow man, but to his God, should not be promulgated at the public expense. There should be but one system of public schools, and these should be thoroughly non-sectarian. Your Committee therefore recommends that this Grand Lodge pledge itself as far as in its power to assist the people of Manitoba in maintaining and perpetuating the principle of public schools.

The communication from R. W. Bro. Fowler, of New Brunswick, indicates a most serious condition of affairs in connection with the school question in that Province. Your Committee can only recommend the brethren of that Province to stand firmly and fearlessly to the broad principles underlying our noble Order. Junius says: "The subject who is truly loyal will neither advise nor submit to arbitrary measures." We would therefore recommend that the truth, the greatest of all educators, be intelligently placed before the Canadian public, and that

such direct encouragement as this Grand Lodge can give, be extended to our brethren in New Brunswick.

This Committee congratulates the M. W. Grand Master Wallace on the noble stand taken by him both at Kingston at the banquet in honor of our worthy brother, Capt. John Gaskin, and in the National Parliament at Ottawa on the question of Home Rule for Ireland. His fearless conduct when assailed in Parliament reminds one of the heroic firmness of the "Men of Derry" two hundred years ago, and recalls the lines:

Behold the crimson banner floats
O'er yonder turret hoary;
It tells of days of mighty note,
And Derry's deathless glory,
When her brave sons undaunted stood,
Embattled to defend her;
Indignant stemmed oppression's flood,
And sang out "NO SURRENDER."

In reference to a communication from Ulster Loyalists' Union, your Committee would beg to recommend that not only the earnest sympathy and active support of this Grand Lodge be extended to our Ulster brethren in their efforts to show the disastrous effects which would result from the passage of the Home Rule Bill, but would also recommend that active aid be granted by this Grand Lodge to the Union, in order to enable them to carry on the good work.

Your Committee, after due inquiry, have learned that the person put forward to attack our M. W. Grand Master in Parliament is a man formerly an Orangeman, but for years not in active connection with the Order. Your Committee, however, recommend that prompt action be taken to inquire fully into the premises to give the offender an opportunity of explaining his unbrotherly conduct in the House of Commons, for Mr. Dawson, the member referred to, spoke as an Orangeman, and deal with him accordingly.

The reference to Orange Halls serving as places wherein Protestant clergymen conduct religious services merely shows that the brethren throughout the land are proving themselves, in practice as well as in theory, to be forward in every good cause.

The Grand Secretary's report is most exhaustive, and, like the Grand Master's, should obtain the widest circulation. The enormous growth of the Order during the past year, when the gains exceeded the losses by upwards of six thousand men, is truly wonderful and intensely gratifying. This is certainly due to the growth of that spirit of zeal, earnestness and broad, tolerant, intelligent understanding of the principles and aims of our Order. In these northern districts of Ontario is the great growth especially gratifying. North of the line of the French river, where a decade ago were but a few white settlements, there are now forty Orange Lodges in full working order. The lumbering, mining, farming and fishing industries of these parts have, as in Manitoba and the North-West, called the best and the bravest of the young men from the older provinces. The Triennial Council meets next year in London, England. The Grand Secretary's reference thereto leads us to express the hope that this Grand Lodge and the Provincial Grand Lodges will be well and truly represented, for great and important questions will doubtless be under consideration.

Your Committee recommend that the necessity for visitation of Lodges in respective jurisdictions be impressed upon the various officers of the Order. Such are of great service.

We would also recommend that the Grand Secretary's suggestions be carried out re furnishing Lodges, at reasonable cost, with full outfit of office books and other necessary material. The question of a uniform regalia also is well worthy of attention.

In conclusion, the work of this Committee has been greatly facilitated by the methodical manner in which Grand Secretary Bro. R. Birmingham and his worthy assistant, R. W. Bro. J. C. Gass, have their correspondence and papers in general arranged.

Your Committee will perhaps be pardoned for reference to the kindness and courtesy of the Reception Committee and brethren of Sault Ste. Marie. The natural beauties of this lovely and delightful place render it most appropriate for a meeting of this Grand Orange Lodge. We are pleased to observe that the great connecting link, the Canadian Sault Ste. MEDICAL REFEREE'S REPORT.

Bro. R. B. Orr, M.D., then handed in his report as Medical
Referee, as follows:

To the Most Worshipful Grand Master, Officers and Members of the Grand
Lodge of British America:

BRETHREN,—I beg herewith to submit my first report, as Medical

Referee of the Orange Mutual Benefit Society, for the first four months during which it has been under the control of your Grand Lodge.

During the period from March 1st to June 1st there have been received 258 applications for membership, of which 242 were accepted and 16 rejected. The causes for rejection were as follows: Heart affection, 1; bad family history, 1; catarrh, 1; over age, 1; consumptive history, 2; curvature of the spine, 1; non-vaccination, 9. Of these cases the old and valued Referee of the Society, Dr. Oronhyatekha, passed upon 110, while I examined 148.

The death rate has been small during the four months, and the risks taken have been good, many of them being young men under thirty.

ADDRESS FROM COUNTY LODGE OF ALGOMA.

W. Bro. Uriah McFadden, County Secretary, presented and read the following Address of Welcome from the County Lodge of Algoma :

To the Most Worshipful Sovereign Grand Master and Brethren of the Grand Orange Lodge of British America :

It affords us, the County Lodge of this District, extreme pleasure and gratification to welcome to our town the representatives of such an honored body as the Grand Lodge of the Orange Association of British America, more especially when we reflect that we are honored as few are honored in having such an influential body of men meet in our midst.

In view of the fact that we are still in our infancy and are considered by the older parts of the Province as being so very young, we cannot feel otherwise than gratified at having the delegates meet in session here.

Although we cannot compete with the older parts of the Province in point of development, yet are we destined, by reason of our geographical position and unlimited natural resources, to become the centre of a prosperous and contented community; and as we attain that growth and advance in prosperity, we shall ever hold dear the glorious privileges and principles that are embodied in the broad creed of the Orange Association.

It affords us much pleasure, indeed, to see in our town and attending the session of this Most Worshipful Grand Lodge, men who occupy such a prominent and foremost place amongst the legislators of our country, and men so deserving of the confidence and respect of all classes, irrespective of creed and politics; and as it is our sincere hope that, as virtue and rectitude are always rewarded, to see our beloved brethren attain a still higher position among the moulders and rulers of the destinies of this fair Dominion.

In our opinion there is a great necessity for Orangeism at the present time. Not that we should interfere with the rights of any denomination, but when ecclesiasticism encroaches on the moral rights and privileges of the people, it is time that we, as a body that hold so dear the principles of our beloved Order, should endeavor to maintain our rights.

And we congratulate the Executive on the success which has attended their efforts in firmly establishing the insurance benefits in connection with this Most Worshipful Grand Lodge.

We have had before us for our consideration the notice of proposed amendments placed in the hands of the Grand Secretary by Bro. E. Floody, and after reading the same over carefully we are of the opinion that it would be unwise to make any of the amendments he proposes.

We have also had before us the notice of motion presented by M. W. Bro. E. F. Clarke, with a view to having an Actuary employed to report as to the sufficiency of the rates now being charged the members of the Benefit Fund to provide the necessary moneys that may be required from time to time to meet the claims which may be made upon said Fund, and after most careful consideration the Committee are of opinion that as similar rates charged by other benefit societies have proved sufficient for a number of years to provide for all death or endowment claims and leave a large surplus on hand, the rates now charged are sufficient, and we would not recommend the employment of an Actuary, as the same would incur large costs, Bros. Clarke and J. A. Keyes dissenting.

Your Committee recommend that the Executive take such active means as they may be able, to extend the membership and influence of the Insurance Benefit Fund.

DEAR SIR,—The attempt now being made to put the loyal and law-abiding population of Ulster under the thumb of the hierarchy by foisting on us the present Home Rule Bill, which would, if passed into law, prove the ruin of our commercial prosperity and the end of all civil and religious liberty in that country if submitted to, must prove my excuse for asking your assistance in this the hour of our trial. The so-called Nationalist party, who time after time have stated that they are the enemies of England, are supported with immense sums of money from abroad. Up till now we have not asked for much assistance, but the continual draw on our funds, despite the liberal donations received in Ulster, make us anxious to place ourselves in a sufficiently strong financial position to fight out this battle in a constitutional way, and so leave no stone unturned to avert the inevitable result of the passing of such an Act—"a bloody civil war." I need hardly go into the work we are now doing, as it would go beyond the limits of an ordinary letter, but I can briefly summarise it as follows :

1. Canvassing by Nonconformist ministers every Nonconformist minister in England and Scotland.
2. Getting up meetings and sending speakers.
3. Sending canvassers to mining districts, etc.
4. Publishing leaflets and answering mis-statements in the opposition press.
5. Working every election. (See cutting reprinted from *Daily News*, a Home Rule paper.)

May I venture to hope you will assist us, both by your sympathy and active support, in contributing to our funds and getting your friends to do the same.

I am sending this letter to you as Grand Master of British America, feeling sure you will give us your support, and believing that the separation of Ireland from England would mean the beginning of the downfall of that great Empire which we love so well.

Report of Special Meeting of Committee, held May 31st, 1893.

A special meeting of the Executive Council of the Ulster Loyalist Union was held on the 31st ult., at the office, 1 Lombard Street. The Earl of Ranfurly, President of the Union, was in the chair, and amongst others present were—Rev. R. R. Kane, LL.D., Rev. S. D. Burnside, Captain Higginson, and W. R. Young, Honorary Treasurer. The chairman gave a brief *resumé* of the vast amount of work carried on by this association throughout England and Scotland, in attempting at the present momentous period to influence public opinion. The fact that speakers were supplied during the past two months for more than four hundred meetings in various English and Scotch centres—the fact that over one hundred Nonconformist ministers have gone out from this Union to appeal, in their hour of trial, to their brother Nonconformists—the fact that workingmen canvassers have been sent out, and are being sent out, to various divisions, and the fact that lady delegates are now taking their share in this great work, all go to show that the Ulster Loyalist Union, at least, is leaving no stone unturned in working for the great cause now in hand.

A "Press" committee, appointed some time ago, for unveiling the unprincipled and mendacious statements which from day to day appear in the Separatist newspapers, was strengthened by the addition of Dr. Kane's name and abilities. Several new pamphlets and leaflets are now in the hands of this committee, and will shortly be published.

The Chairman explained that the work in the office had recently been very much increased by the undertaking of the Ulster Loyalist Union to supply any information asked for from England in matters relating to Ireland. In cases of outrages, moreover, all inquiries are at once instituted to secure authentic details, which are forwarded to the London branch of the Ulster Loyalist Union, in Palace Chambers, Westminster; whence the information is conveyed to Unionist members to enable them to ask questions in the House of Commons.

Owing to the fine weather, the long evenings, and the Allotments Bill in England, it has been recently found impossible to secure good audiences in halls. It was therefore decided that small open-air village meetings would be the most tangible and practicable method of keeping the Home Rule Bill before the electors. It is in rural constituencies, where ignorance of the Irish question often leads to the support of the Gladstonian party, that these meetings will do most good. Several remarks having been made complimenting Lord Ranfurly on the almost superhuman personal efforts he had been, and is, making on behalf of the Union, devoting his entire time to advancing the cause. The meeting terminated with a vote of thanks to his Lordship for presiding.

ULSTER LOYALIST UNION.

A largely attended meeting of the Executive Committee of this Union was held in the head office, 1 Lombard Street, Belfast, on Tuesday last, the Earl of Ranfurly in the chair. The business of the past week having been discussed, the chairman reported that instead of diminishing, the amount of work in this office was increasing. He had now completed the organisation, and had divided the work into two branches, which could be kept entirely separate. One of these branches Captain Higginson had kindly consented to superintend, and the other he hoped to have handed over to their honorary secretary, the Rev. R. T. Simpson, but unfortunately that gentleman had this morning sent a letter stating that he had had a relapse of his illness, and would not be likely to be in the office for some weeks. Under these circumstances Mr. C. B. Irwin was asked to kindly undertake entire control of the speakers' department instead of going to London, as had been arranged, to assist in the establishment of the branch office there; and Lord Ranfurly was asked to go to London with a full staff, and thoroughly organise on behalf of the Union, in Palace Chambers, Westminster, so as to ease, if possible, the great pressure of work here. A London Committee was then appointed, and full arrangements made for that office to be open on the 14th inst., in order to render every assistance to the Albert Hall delegates.

A question arose regarding a letter which appeared in several papers to the effect that speakers and conveners received remuneration, but the chairman begged to assure them that no one has received a single penny of any kind or description for their personal services to this Union, and that no man who required payment is sent out. On the other hand, those gentlemen who went out did so entirely for the sake of the Union, and received no other reward than that of their own consciences, and

with the entire approval of the members of their congregation: knowing full well the importance and the justice of our cause.

A Press Committee was then arranged to attend daily to any letters appearing in the papers relating to their Union and its work.

The number of meetings arranged for April alone are about two hundred, while about an equal number are down on our list awaiting completion. Twenty gentlemen left for England on behalf of the Union on Monday, 10th. The out-goings for the week were something the same as before, viz., over £300.
