THE BISHOP'S ADDRESS.

His Lordship then delivered his Annual Address, as follows:

Rev. Brethren, and Brethren of the Laity :

Gathered together again after the lapse of another year; our first duty is to give thanks to God, the Author and Giver of all Good, for all the mercies we have received at His hands. With this I am sure you will agree when I say, that in fifteen years this is only the second instance in which there has been no one to record as having been taken from our midst.

THE LATE BISHOP SULLIVAN.

While, however, there has been no gap made in the ranks of the Clergy of this Diocese. a great and irreparable loss has been experienced by the whole Church in Canada in the death of the late Rt. Rev. Edward Sullivan, D.D., for some years Lord Bishop of Algoma, and more recently Rector of St. James' Cathedral, Toronto. Fragrant as undoubtedly his memory ever will be to the Church at large, especially so must it be to this Diocese which not unnaturally regards him as one of its ablest and most distinguished sons. Admitted to the Diaconate by the first Bishop of Huron, Dr. Cronyn, in A. D. 1858, he began his ministry as curate to the Ven. Archdeacon Brough, thus serving under him the churches of St. George, Carlisle and Birr. Remaining here a little over three years he removed in A.D. 1862 to Montreal to fill the position there of Assistant in St. George's Church, the rector of which was Canon Bond, the now Lord Bishop of Montreal. Six years after this date he accepted the Rectory of Holy Trinity Church, Chicago. This position he held for over ten years; at the expiration of which time his old church of St. George, Montreal, having become vacant by the elevation of Dean Bond to the See of Montreal, Dr. Sullivan

was unanimously chosen Rector. So great was the regard in which he was held that in A. D. 1882 he was chosen by the Provincial Synod of Canada Bishop of Algoma. His consecration took place in St. George's Church on the 29th of June. In October A.D. 1883 he was elected to the vacant See of Huron.

No one among the ranks of our Clergy in Canada has been more widely and deservedly honored than the revered prelate of whom I speak. The profound and affectionate regard in which he was held by all classes arose, first, from the strong conviction which the public had in the deep piety and sterling worth of the man; they felt that however eloquently he might preach, and he did preach eloquently, that his own daily private and public life afforded always a competent and attractive illustration of that Gospel he urged with so much vehemence and resistless logic on the attention and acceptance of others; they appreciated also his loyalty to the great Head of the Church, and the unswerving fidelity he ever evinced to those principles of eternal truth, which the Gospel unfolds, and which it is the glory of our Church to iterate and maintain. The closeness of his reasoning, the aptness of his illustrations, and the diversity of his reading, have charmed and edified the Church for now full forty years. Minds different, and even opposite, congregations learned and unlearned, young and old, rich and poor, have felt the cogency of truth as coming from his lips. And now that he has gone, abundant cause has the Church to mourn that this persuasive advocate has ceased to plead—this second Chrysostom to witness for the truth.

I shall not speak of his self-denying labor in Algoma, nor of his tireless devotion to her cause; they are too well known to need rehearsal by me, I shall only say that a cedar of Lebanon has fallen, and a saint has passed from our midst, but the cedar had fulfilled its work, and the saint has gone to be forever with the Lord.

THE CHURCH IN THIS DIOCESE.

In addition to the blessings of preservation we have to notice the growing prosperity of our country, the increase of public confidence, and the general signs of advance throughout all departments of human industry. I think, too, it will be found that the Church in this Diocese, notwithstanding all the depression of the past and present, has made, in various departments of her life, at least measurable progress, and justifies the hope that ere long, with the blessing of God, she will resume her former financial independence, and be enabled, with renewed energy, to prosecute the work entrusted to

This increase is divided as follows: For Diocesan objects the increase has been \$625.66; for objects external to the Diocese. \$731.24. It is gratifying to see that the increase in the Mission Fund has been \$1,115.75. I am thankful to say that as this is a test fund it is a fair index of a deepening interest in the financial affairs of the Diocese.

In consideration of the ample discussion which is sure to be given to the various subjects brought before us in the Convening Circular, I shall say no more than that I sincerely trust we may all be guided by God's unerring wisdom to a right judgment in those matters which concern His glory and affect the real and permanent welfare of this Diocese. One remark, however, I wish to make, and it is this: That if the inability of the Executive Committee to make grants has the effect of developing local support, and leading supine congregations to arouse themselves from the apathy of the past, and maintain themselves as independent parishes the reduction which we all deeply regret will not be unattended with real and permanent good. No one acquainted with this Diocese will deny that local support is far below what it should be, and that if our people only made an exertion which is fairly within their power many parishes would at once arise to independence and to power, which to-day are weak and struggling. Independence in churches is a great incentive to internal growth and external development. So long as the impression lasts that there is a vast and almost immeasurable supply of gold laid up in the vaults of London, from which all the wants of the Diocese can be freely supplied, needy parishes will naturally believe they are entitled to their share. What our financial depression has taught or, at least, should teach all, is this: That no such reserve wealth exists, and that the Mission Fund only exists on the good will and hearty sympathy of the Diocese at large Let us all hope and pray that a proper adjustment may now be arrived at for the strengthening of the weak and the development of the strong.

THE PRESENT CHURCH CONTROVERSY IN ENGLAND.

On such an occasion as the assembling of Synod, when all our Clergy and Lay Representatives are present, it seems only right that I should say a few words on the great Ritualistic war which is now agitating all classes of the Church in England, and threatening to disturb her peace for many years to come. Not only is the subject one of absorbing interest to us all, but on its proper—and, I may say, its Divine adjustment hangs the whole future of the Church. That in a Church which is strictly national, there must be a reasonable latitude given for diversity of thought and temperament must be admitted by all reasonable and fair minded men. No one will deny the reasonableness and absolute necessity for allowing a certain amount of play for divergency of opinion and practice where the unity of the organic whole is the great object sought. Uniformity

is one thing, unity another. Nature abhors uniformity, but she writes unity on every page of her manifold volume. No two faces, we are told, in the 1,500,000,000 people who comprise the population of the earth are absolutely identical yet the race is one; no two leaves of the forest, naturalists tell us, are exactly the same, yet in their origin, development and design they are all one. So also is it with the grand old historic Church of England; if we cannot have-and we do not expect to have-absolute uniformity among its widely divergent members, yet there is one priceless and indefeasible inheritance which we may not, and, by the grace of God, we never will give up, and that is, her unity with the Catholic Church: by which we mean her essential unity with the Ancient Apostolic and Universal Church. It has been said, and I do not challenge the assertion, that the final settlement of the Book of Common Prayer in A.D. 1662 was the result of compromise. Be it so, yet this we may positively assert, that that compromise was not the surrender of even one article of those which embody our faith, onor the evacuation of one principle, dear and hallowed to us all, as coming from the Primitive Church.

After stating so much, it is essentially necessary that we should demonstrate as clearly as possible what the catholic unity of the Church of England is, in order that we may fully know what that grand central truth is which we are bound at all hazards to conserve.

In the great controversy which is now raging in England there is no word which is more freely used than that of "Catholic." It is made to cover every excess of doctrine and of ritual, and by some its fancied possession is supposed to be the peculiar glory and dignity of one party and its absence the shame and confusion of the other. I propose, therefore, that we should examine the meaning of this most important but much abused word "Catholic."

It has been remarked that every time a member of the Church of England attends morning or evening Prayer he affirms that he believes in the "Holy Catholic Church." He does so when he rehearses the "Apostles' Creed." Every time he partakes of the Holy Communion he affirms that he believes in one Catholic and Apostolic Church. He does so when he rehearses the Nicene Creed, and I will add that on certain festival occasions he makes the following statement: "Whosoever will be saved: before all things it is necessary that he hold the Catholic Faith, which Faith except every one do keep whole and undefiled: without doubt he shall perish everlastingly." He does so when he rehearses the Athanasian Creed. The question now arises, Where does this word Catholic come from? What is its origin and what its meaning? It is not a Scriptural word. It does not occur either in the LXX.—the Greek version of the old Testament-or in the new. It is, we admit, a very ancient word, a very powerful and most expressive word, but not a word found once in the whole range of our admitted Canon.

The first occurrence of the word is in the Epistle which St. Ignatius, Bishop of Antioch, sent to the Church of Smyrna, in the early part of the second century. He employs the term to express the universal Church as opposed to any individual portion of it. The word also occurs no less than three times in the celebrated encyclical letter which the Church at Smyrna sent to the churches of the world concerning the martyrdom of Polycarp. The preface to this epistle is as follows: "The Church of God which sojourns at Smyrna to the Church of God in Philomelium, and to all the congregations of the Holy and Catholic Church in every place; mercy, peace, and love from God the Father, and our Lord Jesus Christ, be multiplied." The date of this epistle is after the year of our Lord 166, at least according to Clinton Justin Martyr, who was born in the beginning of the second century, speaks of the Catholic Resurrection, meaning thereby the General Resurrection as opposed to the resurrection of the saints. The word was brought into constant use through the rise of two great schisms which troubled the Church in the third and fourth centuries of our era. The first of these was the Noration and the second the Donatist. Their contention was not so much a matter of doctrine, as a question of how the lapsed should be treated on their sincere repentance. The word "Catholic" came then to be applied in four different ways: First, as meaning the Universal Church as distinguished from any portion thereof. Secondly, as meaning the Church as distinguished from those who were heretical. Thirdly, the teaching of this Church as including the whole scope of Divine revelation instead of only dealing with a portion of it; and Fourthly, as being not only the Church militant on earth, but also the Church triumphant above. This is the fourfold sense in which the word is used by St. Cyril, of Jerusalem, and by Augustine of Hippo.

There is extant a famous book, written by Vincent de Lerins, a distinguished Presbyter of Gaul, and published in the year A.D. 434, entitled "A Commonitory Against Heresy." The object of the work was to give a clear rule by which the Catholic faith might be distinguished from all erroneous doctrine. Quoting from the late Dr. Littledale, the rule he laid down was this: "We are to hold that which has been believed everywhere, always and by all men, and that we shall do if we follow Universality, Antiquity and Consent." What, therefore, has not been held by the Universal Church in her primitive days; what has not the merit of antiquity as coming from the only source of Divine truth, the word of God, and therefore an article of faith from the very foundation of the Church; what has not had the general consent of the Church of God, is not to be received as an article of faith.

This, then, is the position of the Church of England: she holds up the great Creeds of the Ancient and Primitive Church: the Apostle's, the Nicene and the Athanasian, and says, These are

the evidences of our being in harmony with the Ancient Church throughout the world, with antiquity and with the consent of its first and purest members. When, therefore, we say that the glory of the Church of England is her *Catholicity*, we by no means declare that she for one moment holds all the creeds and dogmas of the present great Greek or Latin Communions, but this we do mean: That taking her articles and formularies of belief, and placing them by the side of the creeds of the great Councils of Nicea, Constantinople, Ephesus and Chalcedon, she challenges the whole Christian world to say what dogma she has added to, or what awful mystery she has subtracted from the faith once delivered to the saints.

Applying the above principles to the present controversy we may observe that the whole future and prosperity of the Church of England lies in her loyalty to three great laws of her spiritual being.

First. She must be true to the great Head of the Church, the Lord Jesus Christ. By this I mean that she must not for one moment allow the worship of any other being than the Triune and one only God; she must iterate and reiterate the great doctrine that there is one Mediator between God and Man, the Man Christ Jesus, and that we are accounted righteous before God, only for the merit of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ by faith, and not for our own works or deservings; she must maintain the dignity of His word as the sole ground of faith, and sole Arbiter in the disputes of Christendom, and teach with increasing zeal all the grand doctrines of His past, coming and future glory.

Secondly. The Church must be true to the thousands who sit at her feet. She must give them the pure and unadulterated word of God—pure bread and not chaff. She must give them the Holy Sacraments, Baptism and the Lord's Supper. The Lord's Supper I say—not the Greek or Roman mass. She must conserve the right of the laity, and allow them freedom of access with all the other indefeasible privileges accorded them by the Word of God. The sacredness of their homes must not be violated by the imposition of an enforced confessional, nor burthens laid upon them which neither we nor they can bear.

Thirdly. She must be true to her mission in the world, and that is to carry the Gospel of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ to all the lost and dying nations of the earth.

As long as this venerable Church is true to these three great principles of truth, as the mountains are round about Jerusalem so the Lord will be round about her. She will be fair as the lily; she will cast forth her roots at Lebanon; her branches shall spread and her beauty be as the olive tree.

An eminent lawyer in England, writing on the subject, says: "The three great pillars on which the reformed Church of England was built were the Act of the Submission of the Clergy (25 H. VIII), the Act of the Supremacy of the Crown, and the successive Acts of Uniformity of Public Worship and Doctrine. The first removed the government of the Church from ecclesiastical authority, except so far as it was permitted and defined by the Crown and Parliament. The second established the rights of the laity as represented by the national authority to control the National Church. The third, defined in the Liturgy and the Articles, the practice, the ritual, and the doctrines to which the Bishops and the Clergy of the Establishment were obliged by law to conform. No ecclesiastic, whether Bishop or parson, has any authority to depart from the terms of this charter. Convocation has no power, the Bishops have no power, the Clergy have no power, to alter in one tittle the conditions on which alone they hold their rights, their dignities and their preferments. It is fundamental that the constitution and practice of the National Church can only be dealt with by national authority, and the ecclesiastical hierarchy are not a national authority." From all that is stated above we may gather three truths: First, That no change whatever can be possibly made by the Church in England in her Prayer Book, except by the authority of Parliament. Now, no one can seriously believe that that Body would commit itself to such a revolutionary policy as the above would necessarily imply. It follows, therefore, that if these changes are to be pressed, and the doctrines and usages of the Church assimilated to those of another Communion, it can only be at the disastrous price of disendowment and disestablishment—a result we would all most grievously deplore. On the contrary, we all hope that our noble Church will continue to hold the high and honored position she at present occupies in the motherland as the guide and instructress of the nation-the Church whose duty it is, not only to teach kings how to rule and princes to decree justice, but to be the great missionary power in the world, and to be the first in meeting all the spiritual wants of that great host included in the fourth part of the entire population of the globe, now sitting in peace and security under the shadow of the British throne. Secondly, We pre-eminently need at this juncture Bishops, Clergy and laity who will be true to the great Reformation settlement. After listening to all that has been said, and weighing the evidence of many witnesses, we can find no solution for the tremendous issues of the hour except by a loyal adherence to those principles on which the Church was established at the Reformation. As has been well said: "It is not a mere question of dressing up in tawdry vestments, tinkling of bells, genuflections, incense, lights and images. It is the question whether the 'High Celebration,' the equivalent of the Roman Mass, is to take the place of the simple but sublime service appointed by our

Church for the office of the Holy Communion." Lastly, We ought all to earnestly pray that the great Head of the Church will, by His most Holy Spirit, guide those in authority in England to a right judgment in all things.

As these views, concerning the position of the Church of England in relation to the State, have been strongly controverted I have thought a few words on the history of Church and State might not be out of place.

Beginning, therefore, with the Norman conquest of A.D. 1066, we find that William I., however strict a member of the Church of Rome himself, refused to take any steps which would make England politically subservient to the Pope. He declared that the English Church must obey him in preference to any other power. In pursuance of this he laid down three rules: 1st. "That neither the Pope, the Pope's representative, nor letters from the Pope should be received in England without his leave." 2nd. "That no meeting of Church authorities should be called, or take any action without his leave." 3rd, "That no baron or servant of his should be expelled from the Church without his leave. Passing by William II. who, with all his faults, at least insisted on keeping the Church of England independent of the evergrowing power of the Church of Rome, we come to Henry I., one of our greatest Kings, and called the "Lion of Justice." The earliest written and formal guarantee of good government ever given by the Crown to the nation was issued by this monarch. Henry's charter guaranteed: 1. The rights of the Church. 2. The rights of the nobles and landholders against extortion. 3. The rights of all classes to be governed by the old English laws with William the Conqueror's improvements. The appointment of Bishops was settled by the following compromise: The Pope was to invest the Bishop with the ring and crozier as emblems of the spiritual power; while the King, on the other hand, was to grant the lands from which the Bishop drew his revenue, and in return was to receive his homage or oath of allegiance.

Coming now to the Magna Charta—the great or national Charter—extorted from the unwilling hands of King John in A.D. 1215, we find that it consisted originally of sixty-three articles, founded mainly on the first royal charter, namely, that of Henry I. in A.D. 1100. One of these was to the following effect: "That the Church should be free from royal interference, especially in the matter of the election of bishops." In the reign of Edward III. the first statute of Præmunire was enacted by which all appeals from the King's court of justice to that of the Pope were strictly forbidden.

During the Plantagenet period the Popes endeavored to introduce a body of ordinances, consisting mainly of the decisions of Church Councils, and called by the general name of "Canon Law," into England, but without effect, for the Parliament at Merton refused, saying on to the Retaken then:

Passing on to the Reformation era we observe the decisive action that was taken then: Not only were appeals to Rome again forbidden, but a Supreme Court of Appellate jurisdiction was established in England for the hearing and settlement of all causes ecclesiastical whether those of doctrine, ritual or discipline. This court was called the High Court of Delegates, and continued, with of course some interruptions, the Supreme Court of ultimate appeal in Church matters for three hundred years, namely, from A.D. 1533, in the reign of Henry VIII., to 1832, in the reign of William IV. In this latter year the High Court of Delegates was abolished by a Bill, brought in by the late Lord Brougham, which placed all the powers in the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council. This Committee, therefore, represents to-day the supreme ultimate authority of the Church of England in the motherland.

As regards the composition of the old Court of Delegates, the following from Burn's Ecclesiastical Law is interesting: "A commission shall be directed under the Great Seal, to such persons as shall be named by the King. These commissioners are usually some of the Lord's spiritual and temporal or both, and commonly one or more of the twelve judges, and one or more doctors of the civil law. And they are commonly called *delegates* on account of the special commission or delegation they receive from the King for the hearing and determining every particular cause. There lies no appeal from a sentence in a court of delegates, for they cannot have any original jurisdiction."

THE WOMEN'S AUXILIARY OF THE DIOCESE OF HURON.

It gives me much pleasure to mark the growth and development of this noble organization, as year by year it gathers up the sympathies and directs the energies of the devout women of the Diocese. Every year their annual report exhibits expanding work and increasing receipts—eloquent testimony to the Grace of God within them, and their deepening consecration to the cause of Him they love so well.

I would especially draw your attention to the very liberal contribution they have made to the funds of the Diocese in the past year. In the first place they gave \$400.00 towards the support of our missionary at Lion's Head, the Rev. T. H. McLeod, and \$600.00 more their "Thankoffering" for the year to the Mission Fund Debt. That they have paid into our treasury this year no less than \$1000.00, a token not only of their good will but of their intense desire to do all in their power to help and extend the Diocese.

That God is abundantly blessing them is conspicuously evident to all who examine the report of their past year's proceedings. Their

They have now passed a resolution that in future, God willing, they will give a contribution of \$400.00 to the funds of the Diocese without designating the object, so that the money will be at the disposal of the Executive Committee. I would earnestly urge that the heartiest support and encouragement be given to this Association in your various parishes being assured that its progress is not only for the advancement of the Redeemer's Kingdom abroad, but for the building up of the Church at home.

THE CHURCH MISSIONARY SOCIETY.

You are all aware that the above Society-now the largest Missionary Society of the world-has lately celebrated its rooth anniversary. A few words, therefore, as to its past work and present position may not be wholly out of place. Among the marvellous triumphs which, by the grace of God, have been accorded to it in the past, we see not only the thousands of heathens who have been brought out of darkness into light by its faithful ministrations, but the vast quickening of the Church at home in the lines of missionary consecration. In British North America its work has been immense, for from Rupert's Land to the litoral of the Arctic Sea, and from Moose Factory on James' Bay to Alaska in the extreme North-West they have maintained for years nearly the whole of the missionary work done among the Indians and remote settlers of the North. Until recently they have been spending over \$100,000 a year in this vast work, the value and extent of which only eternity will disclose. As regards its present position I may say that it is now withdrawing from the more southerly parts of the districts above mentioned a certain amount of its support, viz., one twentieth of its yearly grant-a fact which will necessitate on the part of the General Mission Board of Canada an increased liberality in its apportionments. I would be peak on behalf of the Society your sympathy, your support and your prayers.

HURON ANGLICAN LAY WORKERS' ASSOCIATION.

The eighth Diocesan Convention of the Huron Lay Workers' and Sunday Schools' Association was held in St. George's School House, Sarnia, on Thursday and Friday, October 27th and 28th of last year. The attendance as usual was excellent, and the interest maintained throughout.

The following papers were read:

The "Line and Scope of S. S. Work; its Aim and Limitations,' by the Rev. W. S. Sayres, B.A., of Detroit.

"Individual Work in the Sunday School," by Mr. R. E. Jamieson, of the same city.

Able and interesting papers were read by the Rev. C. W. Hedley, Mr. Principal Dymond and Rev. J. C. Farthing, on Lay Work. Mrs. Williamson, of Toronto, gave an address to the ladies on "Women's Responsibility," and Mrs. Gahan, of London, on the "Training of Child Life." On the Friday evening, when the Convention was gathered in the Town Hall, two addresses were delivered, one by the Rev. John Munday, rector of Grace Church, Port Huron, and another by the Rev. Dyson Hague, of Toronto.

Too high praise cannot be given to Mr. Principal Dymond and the Rev. John Downie for their earnest efforts to make the Convention a great and lasting success.

THE BROTHERHOOD OF ST. ANDREW.

In the face of all the good work which has undoubtedly been done by the Brotherhood of St. Andrew in the various localities in which it has been established, I desire to bring the merits of this organization before you, and to recommend that wherever a chapter can be formed that steps be taken to do so. The two principles of the Brotherhood are prayer and work. Each member pledges him self daily to offer up prayer, and daily to do some work for the advancement of the Kingdom of our Lord. The principles, rules and aims of this Society can easily be obtained by those who are desirous of forming a chapter for themselves, and therefore I would only add that as the Fraternity seems to enlist the fervor and devotion of our young men, it would be well to establish the organization, if possible, in every parish in the Diocese. By doing so we not only retain the young men in the Church, but give them ample scope for work in the suffering world about them.

QUIET DAYS.

Throughout the year I have held twelve "Quiet Days." Two of these were in Toronto; one in Trinity College, the other at Wycliffe, and ten within the Diocese. Sincerely trusting that they were not unattended with blessing I yet do not wish to make them a burthen to any Deanery, and therefore wish to say that in future, if further spared to serve the Diocese, I shall await the request of the Clergy before making any arrangements as to their recurrence. It will give me intense pleasure to comply with any such request, as I believe the reverent study of the Word of God is just that which we all most need to build us up in the true faith, and to make us all able ministers of the New Testament. Still I do not wish the Clergy to feel that there is any compulsion in the matter, but that all are free to act as they may see best in the future. THE PROVINCIAL SYNOD.

The time has now undoubtedly come when the most important steps must be taken to alter the character and powers of the Synod of the Ecclesiastical Province of Canada. The point at issue is this: In September, 1893, the various delegates of all the Dioceses of British North America assembled in Toronto and formed what is now known as the General Synod of Canada. This Synod was created that it might exercise supreme powers, and be the great Appellate Court of the Church in Canada. In pursuance of this plan two Archbishops were created, one as head over this Province, the other as chief of Rupert's Land. In addition to this, Archbishop Machray was elected Primate of all Canada, thus making him the temporal head of our whole ecclesiastical system and polity. No sooner has this been accomplished than the Primate, acting most loyally with this understanding, went to work and so reduced the powers of his own Provincial Synod as to allow the full operation of the newly created General Synod, and to make it supreme throughout the North. In this ecclesiastical Province, however, nothing of the sort has been done. On the contrary, we have been asserting and reiterating our original powers so that to-day the Primate finds himself seized with a title which conveys no legal jurisdiction or power. To increase the difficulty the Provincial Synod is fully incorporated by Act of Parliament, whereas the General Synod is not; the result of all which is, that as matters stand, the General Synod has no legal or competent standing in the Church of Canada and must either expire in the near future or be established on a more sure or permanent basis.

I cannot but draw your attention to the fact that the women, as regards numbers, are out of all proportion to the men, being nearly double. The men 458, and the women 859. The question arises, "Are we keeping strong hold of our young men?" Surely the difference should not be so great as the above figures would indicate. I would earnestly call the thoughtful attention of the clergy and laity to this fact, and the lessons it is calculated to convey.

Some years ago I pointed out to the Synod that if all those who were confirmed were at once solicited to become subscribers to the funds, even if only to a limited extent, the benefit would be great both to themselves and to the Diocese at large. As this advice has not, I fear, been taken, I would now further suggest that from this date a Confirmation Fund might be established so that all those who are confirmed might subscribe at least a little, and that these sums should be sent in to the Secretary-Treasurer, to be reported by him to us at the close of the year. Receiving Report of Executive Committee.

As amended by the Synod.

The Annual Report of the Executive Committee was presented and printed copies distributed. The printed Audited Accounts were placed in the hands of the members of the Synod at the same time.

The Executive Committee beg to present herewith their annual report, together with the printed accounts which have been audited by the Synod's Auditors, and the abstract of statistical parochial reports for the year ending 30th Appil, 1899.

Your Committee are much pleased to be able to report that the accounts show a considerable improvement in the condition of each fund, and although all the overdrafts have not yet been extinguished those that remain show gratifying reductions, the Mission Fund overdraft being reduced from \$12,553.32 to \$8,691.05, the See House Debt from \$11,032.91 to \$9,828.95, the General Purpose Fund overdraft from \$4,552.84 to \$1,953.50, and the Widows' and Orphans' Fund overdraft of \$106.86 replaced by a balance of \$280.10 to the credit of the account; the total reductions amounting to \$6,152.53.

TOTAL CONTRIBUTIONS.

The total contributions received, including free will contributions, subscriptions and Synod as essments, amounted to \$26,773.85, of which \$16,565 49 was for Diocesan purposes, and \$10,208.36 for other objects. The total amount for the previous year was \$25,416.95, of which \$15,939.83 was for Diocesan, and \$9,477.12 for other objects. The past year, therefore, showing an increase of \$625.66 in Diocesan objects, and \$731.24 in other objects, a total increase for the year of \$1,356.90. The various objects and the amounts given to each will be found on the first page of the accounts.

Your Committee feel that it is but just to say that there is not in the Diocese a uniform method of calculating the number of church families, or a clear idea as to what constitutes a church family, and this may account for the apparent failure of some of the parishes above mentioned to make up the required contributions according to the basis of one dollar per family, and also for the apparently better results obtained by some others.

As the welfare of the Synod, and particularly of the missionaries laboring in the different parts of the Diocese depends on the loyal and hearty support of all members of the Church, and as many of the same congregations appear each year in the list of congregations failing to make adequate collections, your Committee felt that the reason of their default ought to be made known and remedied if possible, and for this purpose appointed a Sub-Committee to prepare a Canon dealing with the matter, which will be found printed in the Convening Circular.

THE MISSION FUND.

The subscriptions, collections and assessments received for this fund show an increase of \$526.13 over the previous year and amount to \$4374.05; collections on Bishop's visits, \$101.32; donations, \$86.42; interest from Mission Fund Investments, \$178.42; Sustentation Fund interest, \$2302.38, and surplus interest from Commutation Fund, \$3157.84. We have also to acknowledge with thanks the receipt from the Woman's Auxiliary Missionary Association of \$511.25 towards the Lion's Head Mission, \$55.00 towards the Current Account, and \$500 oo being their thankoffering made at their annual meeting towards the Mission Fund Debt, making \$1066.25 in all up to the 30th April, 1899, towards the Mission Fund Debt, making \$1066.25 in all up to the 30th April, 1899, towards the Head, with what has been previously received from them, has been sufficient to pay the present and previous incumbents at the rate of \$400 per annum for the whole time they have been in charge of the Mission. The Auxiliary have signified their intention of giving up their grant to Lion's Head and to devote all future monies raised by them for the Diocese to the Mission Fund of the Diocese.

From April 1st, 1898, no grants have been made from the Mission Fund to any clergyman, the assessment of whose parish, together with the interest on any endowment to which he is entitled exceeds \$700, and where such assessment and interest is less than \$700, only such a grant is made (not exceeding \$300 in the aggregate) as will bring his stipend up to that amount. The amount thus paid in grants during the year was therefore much less than in previous years and amounted to \$7812.08, as compared with \$1013.16 for 1898, and \$11863.09 in 1897. The sum of \$1773.66 (including the \$500 contributed by the W. A. M. A.) was transferred to this account from the subscriptions paid in to the Diocesan Debt Account and the overdraft now stands at \$8691.05, a reduction of \$3862.27 for the year.

THE GENERAL PURPOSE FUND.

The amounts credited to this account include subscriptions, assessments and parochial association collections \$3520.39, donations of \$10.00, and \$268.66 transferred from the Diocesan Debt Subscription Account. There was paid out

for Indian Missions School Teachers, etc., \$462.00; Special grants, \$572.16; Widows of Commuted Clergy, \$300.00; transferred to Widows and Orphans Fund as directed by the Canon, \$800.00; transferred to balance Synod Expense Account, \$220.28. The overdraft is now \$3953.50, a reduction of \$599.34 during the year.

CANVASS FOR DIOCESAN DEBT.

The Synod, having last year authorized the appointment of Rev. Franklin E. Roy as special agent to complete the canvass of the Diocses, such appointment to be for one year with a stipend of \$700.00 and necessary travelling expenses, he entered upon the work on the 1st of August and has been engaged upon it ever since with marked success. His labors have so far been confined to the Deaneries of Bruce and Essex. The subscriptions taken by him up to the 30th April amount to \$3519.02, of which \$1825.02 has been paid in cash. He has also taken subscriptions to the amount of \$689.50 since the close of the books, making a total of \$4248.50.

The total amount subscribed up to April 30th, 1899, was \$18729.83, of which \$13491.65 has been paid.

The amount paid in to the credit of the account during the year was \$3824.68. After deducting \$524.99, collector's salary for nine months to 1st of May, and \$52.41, travelling expenses during the same period, there remained a balance of \$3247.28, which has been divided between the different funds in the proportions directed at last Synod.

We recommend that the work be continued for another year by the Rev. Mr. Roy under the same conditions as during the past year.

CLERGY RELIEF FUND.

In consequence of the reductions made in many of the grants from the Mission Fund, a sub-committee was appointed at our meeting in September last to raise a special fund for the clergymen affected. They succeeded in raising the sum of \$692.00, which was divided pro rate, giving to each clergymen about 171/3% of the amount by which his grant had been reduced.

THE WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

The collections for this fund amounted to \$1251.14, an increase of \$126.54 over the previous year; entrance fees and subscriptions, \$760.00; donations, \$35.00; transferred from the General Purpose Fund in accordance with the Canon, \$800.00; and interest on W. and O. Fund Capital, \$3196.53.

The sum of \$5450.00 (\$416.00 less than the previous year) was paid to widows and orphans of deceased clergymen, leaving a credit balance of \$280.12. The account at the end of the previous year stood overdrawn \$206.86.

The capital of the fund remains the same, \$67250.00.

The widows and orphans of 27 clergymen are at present on the fund. None were added during the year. The widow of the late Rev. E. W. Murray, died, and one orphan, whose mother also was dead, attained the age of 18 years.

For many years there was a considerable balance at the end of each year to add to the capital of this account, but the demands on the fund now require nearly the whole of its yearly income, and while we do not wish to suggest the advisability in any way of restricting its usefulness, we are, nevertheless, of opinion that it is necessary in the interests of the fund that it should be guarded with every care, and only those strictly entitled allowed to come upon it.

EPISCOPAL FUND.

The interest earned by this fund for the year, less charges for management, amounted to \$2099.12, and the interest earned and payable to the Bishop from the Award Provision for Bishop and Archdeacon Account to \$1266.68, making together \$3365.80, which is all his Lordship will agree to receive from the Synod from April 1st, 1898 (the date when his Lordship received his last cheque at rate of \$4000.00 a year), to May 1st, 1899, a period of 13 months.

We recommend that steps should be taken to augment the Episcopal Fund, or by some other means to provide for the fulfilment of the obligations of the Diocese towards His Lordship.

STATISTICS.

The statistics for the year show very little variation from the previous year. The total number of families returned this year was 11321, as against 11360 in 1898. Total number of souls 54219 this year, and 54450 in 1898. Total contributions for all purposes increased from \$204.341.72 in 1898 to \$205,575.71 in 1899. It is interesting to note the variation in the number of families returned during the past few years. In 1891 the number returned was 12772, with 2364 adults not included in families, total number of souls, 59419. In 1893 the number of families returned was 13291. In 1894 there were 13485. In 1895, 12170. In 1896, 11,605. In 1897, 11774. In 1898, 11360, and this year 11321.

Several motions to amend the Canons at last Synod were referred to this Committee for consideration, and we now beg to report as follows:

1. Canons on Mission Fund, Surplus Commutation Fund, and Widows' and Orphans' Fund.

The amendments recommended in these Canons will be found in the Convening Circular.

2. Canon XXXI.—This was referred to the Synod Sub-Committee on Amendments to the Constitution. Their report is also printed in the Convening Circular.

3. Annual Report.—With reference to the proposal to print the Annual Report of this Committee in Convening Circular we have to report that it is impossible to do so, as the report is not adopted by us until the day before the Synod meets, and the Convening Circular, by the Constitution, must be issued at least two weeks before Synod.

In order, if possible, to engage all the Sunday Schools of the Diocese in the examination to be held next Advent, questions will be set on both the Interdiocesan and International Schemes and on the Church Catechism. The International Examination papers will be on the Book of the Acts of the Apostles, and the International Examination papers will be on the Book of the Prophet Daniel and the Gospel of St. John.

The S. S. Committee earnestly ask for the co-operation of the Clergy so as to make this examination as general as possible.

The Home Department of the Sunday School, as sanctioned by the Synod last year, has worked well in parishes where it has been tried, and the S. S. Committee would urge upon the Clergy and Superintendents the claims of this means of reaching those who are outside of the Sunday School at present.

The S. S. Committee addressed a circular to the Clergy asking: "What means were being used to keep those recently confirmed in the Sunday School?" and for information concerning Bible Class work.

The answers indicate fair success in this direction, various means being used:

(a) In the majority of cases Bible classes either alone or in connection with other agencies.

(b) Weekly meetings continuing the instruction given before Confirmation, with lectures on the Prayer Book, Church History, etc.

(c) Giving work in the Sunday School as teachers and officers.

(d) The personal influence of the Clergyman and teachers.

(e) Christian Endeavor Societies, Boys' Brigades, Young Women's Guilds, c.

(f) Bible classes are generally held, and of those reported over two-thirds are taught by men.

The replies to question "What is being done to train teachers?" show:

(a) That many Clergymen take up the lesson at the week evening services.
 (b) In other cases the lesson is studied at a weekly meeting of teachers, or in Christian Endeavor Societies.

(c) Two or three report training classes for teachers, when the best methods of instruction, the qualifications and responsibilities of teachers, and general Sunday School work are discussed.

 (\emph{d}) Many, perhaps the greater number of teachers, depend on leaflets, Teachers' Helps, and S. S. literature.

(e) Some report that no effort is made in the training of teachers.

The Committee is glad to say that there is a possibility of a uniform scheme of S. S. lessons, as the Interdiocesan S. S. Committee has followed the instructions of the Provincial Synod, and having examined the claims of the International scheme, made it the basis of its scheme for next year.

Annual S. S. Conventions were held during the past year in the Deaneries of Bruce, Elgin, Grey, Huron, Kent, Lambton, Oxford and Waterloo, while in Middlesex they have been held quarterly. All are reported as having been most successful, helpful and stimulating.

The Annual Diocesan L. H. and S. S. Convention, held at Sarnia last October, was very successful and most helpful.

The Depository sales last year were \$834.25.

To the Synod of the Diocese of Huron:

The Huron Anglican Lay Workers' Association, by its Committee of Management, begs to report as follows:

The Association held its Annual Meeting for 1898 at the town of Sarnia, the usual convention of Lay Workers' and Sunday School Teachers' of the Diocese being in session at the same time and place.

The report presented to the Annual Meeting contained a very large amount of valuable information in regard to the utilization of lay work in the Diocese. Encouraging as were the facts stated in most respects it is important to note the admissions of a large number of clergymen that their work could be largely extended if they could only secure an increased amount of lay help.

This suggests two questions: (1) Are the laity as anxious to see the work of the Church extended as they ought to be? and (2) Do the clergy apply themselves zealously but discriminatingly to the encouragement of lay help in their respective parishes, or in those parishes in which the need for lay help is felt most urgently. Even where a rapidly disappearing prejudice exists to the employment of lay men in organized churches, no such objections are raised to their efforts in the purely mission field in building up congregations which, in due time, shall receive the services of an ordained clergyman.

That there are large and important areas of unoccupied territory where devout and faithful laymen might act as co-laborers and pioneers is unquestionable, and a one sense of responsibility should bring to the front those able to make these districts fruitful of future strength to the Church.

It has been particularly pleasant to your Executive to have received recently communications from two sister Dioceses—Ontario and Toronto, seeking for information as to the establishment of Lay Workers' Associations. Measures looking to this end are being taken in connection with the Synods now meeting or about to meet in those Dioceses.

The frequent holding of ruri-decanal conventions, and in one recent instance of an archidiaconal conference in our own Diocese, where papers of great value have been read and discussions of a most instructive character have followed, is also a subject for congratulation as tending to a quickening of the spiritual life and a deepened interest in the work the Church is called upon, in obedience to her Divine Head, to perform.

Owing to the proposal to hold a Church congress in October next, in which several dioceses will co-operate, it is suggested that the annual convention of Lay Workers' and Sunday School Teachers' in this Diocese should, this year, be omitted, and a hearty support be given to the congress above mentioned. This matter will be brought before the Synod and its action will determine what course it is proper for the Association to take in the premises.

The expense incurred by the Association during the past year, chargeable to Synod funds, amounts to \$66.70.

The administrative work of the Synod is done by the Executive Committee under Canon laws. The composition of the Executive Committee consisting of 30 clerical and 30 lay members, chosen annually by the Synod, is in itself a sufficient answer to the charges of misappropriations and lack of efficiency so freely and persistently made. Clause 8. Strike out clause 8 and insert the following as clause 7:

(7.) Every superannuated clergyman, being under sign-five years of age, shall forward to the Bishop and Executive Committee on or before the first day of August in each and every year a medical certificate of his continued inability to perform cleical duty, together with a statement of all emoluments, above the sum of \$100, earned or derived by him from the performance of clerical or other work, and the Executive Committee may deal with any such case by reducing or withdrawing the allowance, or otherwise, according to its discretion. In the event of such certificate and statement not being given within one month of the above date the clergyman in default shall cease to be upon the superannuation list.

8. Should the income from the Commutation Fund be, at any time, insufficient to pay the grants herein provided, then a pro rata reduction shall be made of all grants, so that the annual expenditure shall not exceed the annual income.

CANON XXI.-ON SUPERANNUATION.

(AS AMENDED.)

In order to provide for the administration of the Superannuation Fund, be it enacted as follows, viz.:

1. Every clergyman of at least fifteen years and over active service in the Diocese of Huron, and not being under ecclesiastical censure, shall be entitled to share in the benefits of the Superannuation Fund, according to the provisions of this Canon.

2. Every clergyman who shall be placed on the list of superannuated clergymen shall receive an annual allowance of \$300, and an additional sum of \$12 for each and every year above fifteen years of active service in the Diocese, but in no case shall the said allowance exceed in the aggregate the sum of \$600, including the amount paid to the original commuted Clergy.

Provise.—Provided always that no clergyman who, at the date of the passing of this amended Canon, has been superannuated shall have his annual allowance reduced by the provision thereof below the sum of \$400 per annum, except as provided by clause 8.

3. Any elergyman of less than 15 years service, unable from sickness or accident to continue duty, may have his case dealt with by the Executive Committee at their discretion.

4. Every clergyman who desires to be superannuated must forward to the Secretary-Treasurer of the Synod an application in writing, setting forth the full particulars of his case. He must also procure certificates from two physicians to be named by the Executive Committee, said physicians to examine the applicant independently of each other, one fee to be paid by the Synod and the other by the clergyman, and such certificates shall state the causes which render him unfit for duty, and the Executive Committee shall, after due investigation, have power to place such clergyman upon the superannuation list of the Diocese.

5. Whenever it shall appear to the Bishop or the Executive Committee that the interests of the Church require that any clergyman of the Diocese should, from any cause, be superannuated, a committee to be appointed as hereinafter provided, shall have full power to enquire into such case, and if it shall appear to them that such clergyman ought to be superannuated, they shall report the case to the Executive Committee, and recommend what annual grant should in their opinion be paid to such clergyman; provided that no case shall be entertained by the Executive Committee unless it shall have been first brought before them in writing, signed by the Blshop, or by at least four members of the Executive Committee. The Committee shall consist of five clergymen of the Diocese of not less than ten years' standing in Priests' Orders, two of whom may be named by the clergyman in question within one month after written notice, and three shall be balloted for by the Executive Committee, unless the clergyman shall refuse to name the two, when the five shall be balloted for. Such enquiry shall be held privately, but a record of the proceedings shall be made in writing for the use, if required, of the Executive Committee, and on application in writing by the said clergyman, a copy of the proceedings shall be furnished to him.

6. Any superannuated clergyman being under sixty-five years of age shall reside within the diocese, and shall, if able, he subject to perform occasional clerical duties at the call of the Bishop on payment of ordinary travelling expenses; or he may be placed in charge of such parish as in the opinion of the Bishop he may be able to serve, and in case of non-residence, except in speciases, with the consent of the Bishop, or of refusal to act, shall cease to be on the fuld

Your Committee beg to report that they have practically no new information to lay before the Synod. The subject of the birth rate in Ontario and the grave questions connected therewith was brought before the Provincial Synod and subsequently discussed most fully in the public press, and on the whole the conclusions adopted by this Synod in 1898 were fully established.

Your Committee are glad to report that there is a general awakening to the enormous death rate from consumption, and to the tact that the disease can be largely lessened in its ravages if not altogether stamped out, and your Committee recommends that the clergy do all in their power to instruct the people in the preventibility of the disease.

6. Report of Committee on the Bishop's Address.

To His Lordship, the Bishop, and the Synod of the Diocese of Huron:

Your Committee appointed for the purpose, having considered such remarks in your Lordship's charge to the Synod as seems to require action, beg leave to report as follows:

After the formation of the General Synod of Canada, with the consent and concurrence of the various Provincial and Diocesan Synods, and after the organi-

zation of that Synod, and the election of its various officers and committees for the transaction of the general affairs of the Church in Canada, including its genthe transaction of the general affairs of the Church in Canada, including its general missionary work, your Committee deems it of the greatest importance that everything possible should be done to make the General Synod the active, working and effective body to pronounce upon and transact matters outside of the local works and pronouncements of Diocesan Synods, and your Committee considers it a source of deep regret that the Provincial Synod of Canada and the Board of Domestic and Foreign Missions did not, during the last session of the Provincial Synod, take more decided and effective steps to submit to the General Synod and to the General Board of Missions constituted by the General Synod, more complete charge and control of the many matters assigned to them respect, more complete charge and control of the many matters assigned to them respectitively in their organization; and that this Synod should express its regret and great disappointment that the Provincial Synod of Canada did not grant the prayer of the petition of the Synod of Huron relating to the triennial meetings of prayer of the petition of the Synod of Fluron relating to the triennial meetings of the Provincial Synod; and your Committee advises that unless the Provincial Synod accède to that off repeated request steps be taken to assist, by constitutional means, in forming a Provincial Synod of Ontario, with boundaries coter aninous with those of the civil Province of Ontario, and with jurisdiction which will not infringe upon the jurisdiction intended to be conferred upon the General Synod, and with such representation and meetings as will greatly reduce the cost without impairing the efficiency of Church legislation.

Your Committee presents andw the following report of a former Committee of the Synod of Huron, which report was adopted unanimously by the members of this Synod, and your Committee again repeats the statements and recommendations therein contained:

Your Committee finds that it is absolutely necessary (and your Committee desires) to maintain, and if possible improve the good management of the affairs of the Church in Canada, and at the same time to reduce the expenses thereof, of the Church in Canada, and at the same time to reduce the expenses thereo, and your Committee finds also that the most practicable and desirable means to that end is to so amend the Constitution of the Provincial Synod at the next two concurrent sessions thereof, that as far as practicable the General Synod should next the Canada and the latter should meet tif at all. supersede the Provincial Synod of Canada, and the latter should meet (if at all) supersecte the Provincial Synod or Canada, and the latter should meet (if at any only when necessity may require a session thereof; and your Committee recommends that the various Diocesan Synods in this Province be respectfully requested to unite in the endeavor to procure such amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws of the Provincial Synod as will abolish or materially reduce the number of easiens and expense of the Provincial Synod and as will conduce to the of sessions and expense of the Provincial Synod, and as will conduce to the strength, usefulness and efficiency of the General Synod.

And your Committee recommend that in the event of the adoption of this report by the Synod, a copy of the foregoing clauses of this report be sent to the Primate of Canada and to the Provincial Synod of Canada, and to the various Diocesan Synods within the civil Province of Ontario.

Your Committee feel with your Lordship the importance of developing systematic giving among the newly confirmed members of the Church, and beg to suggest that they should be encouraged to support existing local and Diocesan objects as members of the Church, and so to bear the full responsibily of church-

Other portions of your Lordship's charge have been considered, and while they do not suggest any action on the part of the Synod, yet they are of such great importance that your Committee trusts that the whole thereof will be printed and distributed for the instruction and study of members of the Church

"Every station or group of stations deemed by the Executive Committee unable to contribute \$700 per annum to the support of a clergyman shall for the purposes of this Canon be called a mission, and such places only shall be eligible

(3) The duty of maintaining the Clergyman, and providing him with a residence, shall rest primarily upon the mission receiving his services, and aid from the Mission Fund shall be regarded as temporary, and made to the Mission for the purpose of assisting it in the performance of that duty, and shall be reduced or withdrawn so soon as the circumstances of the mission will permit.

Clause 3 amended as follows and number it 4:

(4) No mission shall receive aid from the Mission Fund whose clergyman receives a grant from the Surplus Commutation Fund, or which is assessed (inreceives a grant from the Surpus Commutation rund, or which is assessed in-cluding the net proceeds of any local endowment) to the amount of the Canonical Stipend of the clergyman serving it; no grant from the Mission Fund to any mission, except in the case of travelling missions, shall exceed \$300 per annum, and should any missions fail to pay the appearance which it is assessed it shall and should any missions fail to pay the amount for which it is assessed it shall receive from the Mission Fund only such a sum as together with the amount for which it has been assessed would have brought the stipend up to \$700 per annum.

Clauses 4, 5, 6 and 7 renumber it clauses 5, 6, 7 and 8 respectively.

Clause 8, renumber it clause 9, and amend by inserting the words "or missions" after "parish" in lines 1 and 3.

Clause 9, amend first line so that it should read as follows: "The vestry of each congregation in a mission, except in the case of a travelling mission, receiving aid from the Mission Fund," and number it 10.

CANON XXVIII. -ON THE MISSION FUND.

(AS AMENDED.)

PREAMBLE.—Whereas it is desirable to make each parish, as soon as practicable, self-supporting and to extend the ministrations of the Church to all her members within the bounds of the Diocese, it is hereby enacted:—

There shall be a fund, known as the Mission Fund, which shall consist
of the proceeds of such invested funds and general offerings of the Diocese as are
available for the purpose of this Canon.

2. Every station or group of stations deemed by the Executive Committee unable to contribute \$700 per annum to the support of a clergyman shall for the purposes of this Canon be called a mission, and such places only shall be eligible for a grant from the Mission Fund.

3. The duty of maintaining the clergyman, and providing him with a residence shall rest primarily upon the Mission receiving his services, and aid from the Mission Fund shall be regarded as temporary and made to the Mission for the purpose of assisting it in the performance of that duty, and shall be reduced or withdrawn so soon as the circumstances of the Mission will permit.

4. No mission shall receive aid from the Mission Fund whose clergyman receives a grant from the Surplus Commutation Fund, or which is assessed (including the net proceeds of any local endowment) to the amount of the Canonical Stipend of the clergyman serving it; no grant from the Mission Fund to any mission, except in the case of travelling missions, shall exceed \$300 per annum, and should any mission fail to pay the amount for which it is assessed it shall receive from the Mission Fund only such a sum as together with the amount for which it has been assessed would have brought the stipend up to \$700 per annum.

5. At the September meeting of the Executive Committee there shall be appointed annually, from the members thereof, a committee, to be called the Missions Committee, whose duty it shall be to assess all the parishes in the Diocese for such sums as, after due enquiry, they may be adjudged able to contribute towards the maintenance of their respective clergymen, and such committee shall report all assessments and other business to the Executive Committee for confirmation or amendment.

6. The Missions Committee shall consist of the Bishop, who shall be Chairman, and five Clergymen and five Laymen, of whom three of each order shall be elected by ballot by the Executive Committee, and the remainder shall be no ninated by the Bishop. Five members of the Missions Committee shall be a quorum.

The Missions Committee shall meet quarterly, in the same months as the Executive Committee, or may be called together by the Bishop at any time.

The Clergy in passehal charge in each Rural Deanery, together with the Churchwardens and Lay Delegates of the several parishes, shall meet annually, in the month of September, the Rural Dean presiding, or, in his absence, the Senior Clergyman present, to consider matters affecting the interests of the Church in the Rural Deanery. At this meeting a committee shall be appointed, consisting of the Rural Dean, who shall be Convener, and Chairman, when present, and two Clergymen and two Laymen, being communicants, of whom three, including the Rural Dean, shall be a quorum, which Committee, when requested by the Mission Committee, shall act as Assessors for the purposes of this Canon. They shall co-operate with the Clergy of the Deanery in raising and increasing the contributions to the several funds of the Diocese, and report to the Bishop any openings for extending the church within the limits of the Deanery. Nothing in this clause shall prevent the Missions Committee of Synod from ascertaing by other agences than that herein provided the amount for which any parish of parishes may properly be assessed.

- 8. Immediately after assessment the Secretary-Treasurer shall notify the Churchwardens of each parish of such assessment, who may, if not satisfied therewith, appeal against it to the next ensuing meeting of the Executive Committee whose decision thereon shall be final. All appeals shall be signed by the Churchwardens.
- 9. No Clergyman or Layman shall act as assessor of his own parish or mission, and no member of the Executive Committee or of the Missions Committee shall vote on any question affecting the assessment of his own parish or mission.
- 10. The vestry of each congregation in a mission, except in the case of a travelling mission, receiving aid from the Mission Fund, shall vote by resolution the amount for which it is assessed and record the same in the minutes of the vestry, and cause a certified copy thereof to be sent to the Secretary-Treasurer of Synod. It shall be the duty of the Churchwardens to remit the assessed amount of stipend in quarterly payments, or the clergyman's receipt therefor, to the Secretary-Treasurer, who shall pay such amount as is received from the parish, and in any case, the sum due from the Synod.
- 11. The parochial assessments shall be revised annually, at the December meeting of the Missions Committee, for the year commencing May 1st then next ensuing, or on reorganization or change of incumbency.
 - 12. The scale of grants shall be as follows:-

In each case such an amount as shall, with the local assessment, and the net proceeds of any endowment, make up the stipend per annum, as follows:

- For Deacons, such an amount as the parish to which they are appointed can provide. The Bishop to decide as to the amount.
 - b. For Priests, \$700.
- 13. That such Clergymen as are ordained in the Diocese, and who are appointed to a parish necessitating the keeping of horse, shall be entitled to \$100 as an outfit, on condition that a proof is given to render three years' service in the Diocese.

PROVISO I.—The above incomes for Priest shall be subject to the provisions in clause 3, and in the assessment of a mission the provision of a house shall be regarded as equivalent to \$100.

PROVISO 2.—If the available income of the Mission Fund be at any time insufficient to make the stipends of the clergy entitled thereto up to \$700 per annum, then such a reduction shall be made in the grants as shall leave the incomes of all clergymen entitled to \$700 per annum equal, and as may be neces-

CANON XXVII.-THE WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

(AS AMENDED.)

1. A Fund to be called and known as the Widows and Orphans' Fund (and hereinafter called the Fund), shall be established and set apart, and the interest derived trom the investments thereof shall be supplemented by the following additions thereto, namely:

(2.) The entrance fees and subscriptions payable by the Clergy under the

provisions of this Canon.

(3.) An annual payment by the Diocese from the General Purpose Fund of a sum equal to five dollars for each clerical member of the Synod in each year, and (4.) The proceeds of all collections made in the Diocese in aid of the Fund; and

The money derived from these four sources are hereinafter called the income of the Fund.

- 2. Should the account of the Fund in any one year show a debit balance, such balance shall be carried forward to the succeeding year, but should the account in any year show a credit balance, such balance shall be added to the capital of the Fund.
- 3. The income of the Fund shall (subject to the provisions of this Canon), 3. The income of the Fund shall (subject to the provisions of this Canon), be used only for the relief of the widows and children of such of the Clergy of the Diocese as shall have been placed on the "Roll of the Clergy whose widows and orphans shall be entitled to receive the benefits arising from the Fund" as hereinafter mentioned, which Roll shall be kept by the Secretary-Treasurer and is hereinafter called the Roll; and such Clergy are hereinafter in this Canon said to be placed or to have placed themselves upon the Fund.
- The Secretary-Treasurer shall enter upon the Roll the names of and the payments made by all Clergymen placed upon the Fund. The Roll shall

(a) Any Clergyman, except as hereinafter provided, licensed for service in the Diacese, may place himself upon the Fund by paying an entrance fee varying with his age at the time of such payment according to the following scale (and the payment of the entrance fee shall be considered as, and shall be hereinafter called his entrance.

(1.) If a clergyman at the time of his entrance is under thirty years of age he shall pay an entrance fee of five dollars.

(2.) If a Clergyman at the time of his entrance is thirty years of age or over, but is under sixty years of age, his entrance fee shall be five dollars together with five dollars additional for each and every year by which his age at his entrance exceeds thirty years.

(b) If a clergyman is sixty years of age or over he cannot be placed upon the Fund.

(c) The said entrance fee shall be paid by one payment, nevertheless the Bishop may in special cases, and for good and sufficient reasons, allow the said fee to be paid by consecutive annual instalments, provided the number of instalments shall not in any case exceed five, and his name shall be placed upon the Roll upon the payment of the first instalment.

(d) Every Clergyman whose name has been placed upon the Roll as pre scribed in Clause 4 and sub-section (a) of this Clause shall pay into the Fund from and after the date of his name being placed upon the Roll, an annual fee of five dollars, and such annual subscriptions shall be payable on or before the first day of March next following the date of entrance on the fund, excepting always such clergymen as are life members of the former Church Society of the Diocese of Huron, who shall be exempt from all payments whatsoever to the fund.

6. If any Clergyman who has been placed on the Fund as aforesaid shall fall into arrears in the payment of his annual fee of five dollars, or of the instalments of his entrance fee, then laterest at the rate of six per cent. compounded annually shall be charged upon all such arrears; and if any such clergyman shall at his death be in arrear in respect of any er all of his annual subscriptions to the Fund, or in respect to any instalments of his entrance fee, then such an annuity shall be paid to his widow and orphans as shall be in the same proportion to the full annuity as the total sum paid by him to the amount required under the Canon.

7. If any Clergyman who has been placed upon the Fund marries while upon the Superannuation Fund, or after he has attained the age of sixty years, his widow and children, if any, by such marriage shall not be entitled to any annuity from the Fund. Provided always that this clause shall not apply to any marriages solemnized before June 18, 1891.

8. The Synod will, subject to the rules, regulations and provisions of this Canon from and after the death of any Clergyman of the Diocese who has been placed upon this Fund, pay to his widow during her natural life, or until she marries again, an annuity of \$200 payable in four equal quarterly payments on the first days of February, May, August and November in each year, the first of such payments to be made on the day above-mentioned next following the death of her husband. And if the deceased clergyman left a widow and more than two children (the latter then being under eighteen years of age) surviving him, there shall be paid to the said widow during her natural life, or until she marries again, a further annuity, payable quarterly as aforesaid, of forty dollars for three children, or eighty dollars for four children, or one hundred dollars for all children, if the number of children exceeds four, until the said children shall respectively attain the age of eighteen years, provided that no more than one hundred dollars a year be paid for orphans in one family. If the deceased Clergyman died leaving a child or children but no widow surviving him, or if he died leaving a widow and children and the widow dies or is again married, or neglects or refuses to make the application required by the provisions of Sec. 9, then from and after his decease or

Provided always that:

(1) Annuities to children shall cease upon their respectively attaining the age of eighteen years, or marrying, whichever event shall first happen.

(2) Annuities hereunder shall only be payable on the receipt by the Secretary-Treasurer of the declaration prescribed by Sec. 10.

9. On the death of any Clergman placed upon the Fund, his widow, or, if he leaves no widow, or if his widow neglects or refuses to apply, the guardian of the estate of his child or children may apply in writing to the Synod to be placed upon the list of Annuitants, Such application shall be in the form and contain the particulars from time to time prescribed and required by the Executive Committee.

10. (b) Any Clergyman who shall have been sentenced under the Canon on the Discipline of the Clergy to supension or to removal from the performance of clerical functions shall cease to be upon the Fund; but should he be restored, clerical functions shall cease to be upon the Futha; but should be be taken, and in such case, he may place himself again upon the Fund by the payment of the entrance fee prescribed for his then age, and all arrears and interest as provided by clause 6; and in the event of the death of a Clergyman while under sentence of suspension or removal the Executive Committee shall have the power to make a special yearly grant, not exceeding two hundred dollars, from the Fund to the widow and children, if any, of such Clergyman, provided said Clergyman had been upon the Fund at the time of his suspension, and that his suspension was for a period less than five years.

12. The above Canon shall take effect on 1st day of August, 1899.

An annual missionary meeting shall be held, or sermon preached in each church or other suitable place, and a collection made for the Mission fund of the Diocese."

That in addition to the annual parochial collection, six collections shall be made annually, the proceeds of two of which shall be devoted to the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, one to the Superannuation Fund, one to the General Purpose Fund, and two to the Mission Fund. The collections shall be forwarded to the Secretary-Treasurer of the Synod, within fourteen days of being made. It shall be the duty of every cloggyman to give notice of these collections, and to call the attention of his congregation to the importance of their objects, and their claims for liberal support.

Amend clause 8 by adding the following:-

If any congregation shall not, at the time of the meeting of the Synod, have paid in full all Synod assessments, or assessments for Mission Fund, and the net proceeds of all collections for Diocesan purposes, the lay representitive, or representitives representing such congregation, shall be absolutely excluded from all participation in the proceedings of the Synod.

When any proposed Canon or proposed amendment to a Canon is regularly before the Synod for discussion, in accordance with the Constitution and Rules of the Synod, any amendment to such proposed Canon or proposed amendments is in order without further notice; and this has been, and is, and shall hereafter be the true construction of the Constitution and Rules of the Synod, in that behalf.

Canon on Inadequate Collections.

The Sub-Committee of Executive Committee appointed to draft Canon on Inadequate Collections beg to recommend the adoption of the following Canon:

Whereas the collections in a number of the parishes have not been made, and in other cases have fallen far short of reasonable requirement, and thereby the work of the Diocese has suffered, be it therefore enacted.

I. Any Clergyman in charge of a parish where the collections ordered by the Synod have not been taken up, or where the collections shall appear to the Bishop and Executive Committee to be inadequate, shall be summoned to appear before them and give an explanation of such default.

2. Should any Clergyman so summoned refuse to appear to give an explanation, he shall be deemed guilty of contumacy, under Canon xxii "on the discipline of the Clergy," clause 23, par. 5.

The Executive Committee shall report fully to the Synod at its next meeting, all cases of default and the explanations offered thereof.

On motion this proposed Canon was referred to the Executive Committee.

Consideration of Notices of Motion.

The following notices of motion, as printed in Convening Circular, were taken up in order.

By the Rev. Wm. Stout:

1. To define and amend the Constitution.

To define and determine the powers of control and restriction, if any, other than those "of a legislative character," possessed by the Synod and capable of legitimate exercise relative to the actions of the Executive Committee respecting the management and administration by said Committee of all the funds, lands and property of the Synod, of what kind soever; and, if need be, to alter or amend clause 16 of the Constitution from line 17, commencing with the words, "It shall be the duty," to line 24 inclusive, concluding with the words, "as the Synod may or can do," so as to invest the Synod with controlling and restrictive powers over the acts of the Executive Committee in all matters contained in the aforesaid lines of clause 16 of the Constitution.

Whether clause 22 of the Constitution confers controlling and restrictive powers upon the Synod over the acts of the Executive Committee in the matters enumerated in lines 17 to 24, aforementioned, of clause 16 of the Constitution; and if not, whether the Executive Committee has unlimited power to employ money, contributed usually for diocesan purposes under clause 20, and use the same for all the objects, at its sole discretion, specified and enumerated in Clause 26 of the same, with immunity from all restriction by the Synod as regards such use of funds.

Omit the word "portions," and also "as may appear to them expedient," from line 29, clause 16, of the Constitution.

Be it Resolved, That His Lordship be requested to nominate a committee of six, which shall be independent of the Executive, to take into consideration the whole question of Diocesan controllable and unnecessary expenditure now in operation, and devise, in some cases, wherein such expenses could be obviated, and in others ought to be charged properly to other funds than at present, and report from time to time to the Executive Committee with a view of arriving at some solution, practical, of this important question in order to its submission to the next Synod.
