Recommendations attached to the report of the Synod of Hamilton and London's Committee on the State of Religion, and adopted by the Synod.

1.—That the Synod urge on Presbyteries the frequent holding of conferences on the State of Religion within their bounds.

2.—That the Synod direct each Presbytery te appoint one of its memlers to receive the reports on the State of Religion from Sessions, and prepare a report based on them for submission to Presbytery; and that he be ex-officio a member of the Synod's Committee.

3.—That the Presbyteries be enjoined to forward their reports to the Convener of the Synod's Committee at least two week's before the meeting of Synod.

At Hamilton, and within Saint Paul's Church there, the second day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six years, at half-past seven o'clock P. M., which day and place the Synod of Hamilton and London of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, met, and after sermon by the retiring Moderator, the Rev. Thomas Lowry, from Ephesians chapter fourth, verses 11th and 12th, was duly constituted by prayer.

At Hamilton, and within St. Paul's Church, there, the third day of May, eighteen hundred and seventy-six, at half-past seven o'clock p. m., the Synod of Hamilton again met pursuant to adjournment, and was constituted by praise reading of the word and prayer, conducted by the Moderator and Rev. Mr. McPherson.

#### MINUTES SUSTAINED.

The Minutes of the afternoon sederunt were read and sustained.

#### ADDRESSES BY MESSRS. RITCHIE AND CAMPBELL.

According to resolution the Synod proceeded to hear the Rev. Mr. Ritchie, of the Formosa Mission of the English Presbyterian Church, and Rev. J. Fraser Campbell, our missionary to India.

The Rev. Mr. Lowry, having introduced the missionaries, Mr. Ritchie and Mr. Campbell gave interesting addresses on missionary work in China and India.

Thereafter, on motion of Mr. D. H. Fletcher, seconded by Mr. W. T. McMullen, the Synod unanimously agreed to the following: "The Synod having heard the addresses of the Rev. Mr. Ritchie, of the English Presbyterian Mission in Formosa, and the Rev. J. F. Campbell, our own missionary to India, desire to return their thanks to the brethren for their interesting addresses. They rejoice at the great success which has attended the missions of the English Presbyterian Church in China, and desire Mr. Ritchie to convey to said church the thanks of the Synod for the great assistance given to our missionaries there. They pray that Mr. Ritchie may long be spared to labor successfully in the Island of Formosa, and that God's blessing may ever attend him.

They also rejoice in the mission of our own church to India, and commend it to the prayers and liberality of the church at large."

The Moderator, in suitable terms, tendered to Messrs. Ritchie and Campbell the thanks of the Synod.

#### OVERTURE ANENT HYMN BOOK.

. The Synod then considered the overture from members of Synod regarding the preparation of a suitable hymn book for the church. Mr. McBain was heard in support of it.

On motion of Mr. McBain, seconded by Mr. Gordon, the Synod agreed to receive and adopt the overture, and transmit it to the General Assembly indicted to meet in the City of Toronto in June next. Mr. McBain and Dr. Bell were appointed to support the overture before the assembly.

An overture was read from the Wroxeter session; transmitted by the Huron Presbytery, regarding a division of the Home Mission Funds.

On motion duly seconded, it was resolved to receive and transmit the overture *simpliciter* to the general assembly.

#### OVERTURE ANENT PRESBYTERY ROLLS.

The Committee appointed at a previous sederunt to prepare an overture to the assembly on the constituting of Presbytery rolls, reported the following through Dr. Bell, the convener, which was received, adopted, and ordered to be transmitted to the general assembly :

"The Synod of Hamilton and London hereby overture the venerable the general assembly, in order to secure uniformity in the making up of Presbytery rolls, to declare what names shall be entitled to a place on said rolls."

#### APPROPRIATION TO HOME MISSION FUNDS.

The Clerk, having intimated that the Treasurer, after paying the necessary expenses of Synod, had the sum of one hundred dollars unappropriated, it was moved by Mr. Lowry, duly seconded, that the amount be divided equally between the Home and Foreign Mission Funds of the church.

It was moved in amendment by Mr. W. Robertson, duly seconded, that the entire amount be given to the Home Mission Fund.

It was moved in further amendment by Mr. McCuaig, that seventy-five dollars be given to the Home, and twenty-five to the Foreign Mission Fund.

On the vote being taken, the amendment of Mr. Robertson, appropriating the entire amount to the Home Mission Fund, was carried by a considerable majority.

#### VOTES OF THANKS.

On motion of Mr. Laing, seconded by Mr. McMullen, votes of thanks were passed to the minister and office-bearers of St. Paul's Church for the accomodation provided; to the Christian friends in the city for their generous hospitality, and to the Grand Trunk and Great Western Railway Companies for granting reduged rates to the members.

#### ADJOURNMENT.

The Minutes of the sederunt were then read and sustained, after which the Synod engaged in praise, and the Moderator declared the Synod dissolved, and appointed the next Synod to meet at Woodstock, and within Knox Church there, on the second Tuesday of April, eighteen hundred and seventy-seven, at seven o'clock p.m., and closed the session by pronouncing the apostolic benediction.
