An Act for the Protection of Growing Timber in Lower Canada.

WHEREAS it is expedient to make provision for the protection and Preamble.

preservation of growing timber in Lower Canada: Therefore Her
Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council
and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

- 5 1. Such by law or every material provision thereof shall, for at least formalities to one month before the final passing thereof, be published for the infor-obtain appro25 mation of the ratepayers in some newspaper published weekly or oftener valof by-law. within the territorial jurisdiction of the municipality, or if there be no such newspaper, then in some newspaper published in the place nearest to such jurisdiction; and also by posting the same up in at least four
- public places in the municipality, with a notice-signed by the clerk of 30 the municipality in the council of which the by-law originated, specifying in such notice the date of the first publication of the by-law, and signifying that it is a true copy of a by-law which will be taken into consideration by the council of the municipality after the expiration of one month from the first publication thereof in such newspaper; and
- 35 that on some day, and at some hour and place named in the notice, and which shall be previously fixed by the said council, such day not being less than three weeks nor more than four weeks after such first publication, a general meeting of the qualified municipal electors of the municipality will be held for the purpose of considering such by-law, and 40 approving or disapproving of the same.
  - 5. On the day and at the hour and place (or places) appointed by Meeting of such notice, the qualified municipal electors, or such of them as choose Mucicipal to attend the meeting, shall take the said by-law into consideration, and Electors. shall approve or disapprove of the same.

6. At such meeting the mayor of the municipality in which it is held Mayor to preside. shall preside, or in his absence some other member of the council of such municipality, to be chosen by the meeting.

Onestion to be decided.

7. The clerk of such municipality shall have with him the assessment 5 rolls of the municipality then in force, or certified copies thereof, and shall act as secretary; and the only question to be determined at such meeting shall be, whether the majority of the municipal electors present thereat do or do not approve of the by-law.

Duty of person presiding.

8. When the question has been put, the person presiding shall de-10 clare whether in his opinion the majority is for the approval or disapproval of the by-law; and his decision, if not forthwith appealed from, shall be final, and shall forthwith be communicated to the council of the municipality which originated the by-law, by a certificate under the hand of the secretary of the anceting. 15

Poll may be demanded.

• 9. Any six duly qualified municipal electors present at any such meeting may appeal from the decision of the person presiding, and demand a poll; and such poll shall be granted by the person presiding at the meeting, and shall be immediately taken by him, the clerk of the municipality acting as pull clerk.

How votes sl-all be taken

10. Each elector shall then present himself in turn to the person presiding, and shall give his vote, "Yea" or "Nay '-the word "yea" meaning that he approves the proposed by-law, and the word "nay" that he disapproves the same; but no person's vote shall be received. unless he appears by the assessment rolls to be a duly qualified muni- 25 cipal elector.

Adjournment of oll.

18. The person presiding may, if necessary, adjourn the poll at sunset on the day of incoring until ten o'clock in the foreneon of the following day, not being a Sunday or statutory holiday, when the poll shall be continued as on the first day, but shall be closed at sunset of such 30 second day.

Closing of poll.

12. If at any time on the first, or second day one-half hour clapses without a vote being offered, the poll shall be closed.

Certificate of

13. At the close of the poll, the person presiding shall count the result of poll. "yeas" and the "nays," and ascertain and certify, for the information 35. of the council which originated the by-law, whether the majority is for the approval or disapproval of the said by-law; and such certificate shall be counter-signed by the clerk of the municipality acting as secretary of the meeting, and kept by him, with the poll list, among the records of his office, and if the by-law originated with a county council, 40 a duplicate thereof shall be transmitted to the county clerk.

Publication of by-law.

14. After the hy-law shall have been approved, it shall be published in the same manner as all other municipal by-laws, together with the resolutions of the meeting before being put into force.
