

8/68/ PREFACE TO THE FIRST EDITION.

The difficulty of ascertaining the law from the network of original and amended statutes, both of the Dominion and the Ontario Legislatures, and from the various Orders in Council suspended and re-enacted, is the reason for the issue of this Digest.

With regard to game, the Dominion Parliament has not, nor does it claim, jurisdiction, but with regard to fish both governments now lay claim over all waters within this Province; at the time, however, of the passing of many of the Acts referred to herein, the Legislature of Ontario claimed jurisdiction over non-navigable and inland waters only, and the Dominion Parliament similarly over navigable streams and the greater lakes.

This Digest is a synopsis of the whole law, so far as it relates to the various animals, birds and fish protected by it, and is intended both as a hand-book for the guidance and protection of sportsmen, and also as a book of reference for those whose duty or privilege it is to enforce the laws for the protection of the stock of game in this Province already so much depleted.

PREFACE TO THE SECOND EDITION.

The numerous alterations, in both the game and fishing laws, made since the publication of the first edition, have necessitated a complete revision of this Digest, and the number of headings, as well as the cross references, have been largely increased.

The respective rights of the Dominion and Provincial authorities to make laws regulating fishing are, at the date of writing, still unsettled, but there is now standing for argument in the Supreme Court of Canada a case stated for the opinion of the judges, which will define the jurisdiction to be exercised by each legislature in both navigable and non-navigable waters.

EXPLANATIONS AND ABBREVIATIONS.

"D." following a reference, denotes an Act of the Dominion Parliament.

"O." following a reference, denotes an Act of the Legislature of Ontario.

"C.O.C."=Consolidated Orders in Council (Dominion) 1889.

"D.O.C." followed by the month and day, refers to a Dominion Order in Council.

"D.O.C." followed by a year date, refers to an Order in Council bound with the Statutes of Canada of that year.

"O.O.C." refers to an Ontario Order in Council of May 26th, 1887.

"G.P.A."="The Ontario Game Protection Act, 1893," being 56 Vict. c. 49, O.

"R.S.C."=Revised Statutes of Canada, (1886.)

"R.S.O." = Revised Statutes of Ontario, (1887.)

The words "hunt," "take," and "kill," with regard to game, and "fish for," "catch," and "kill" with regard to fish, are usually interchangeable.

All vessels, vehicles, fishing implements, etc., used in violating the Fisheries Act, and also all fish so caught are liable to be confiscated. (57 Vict. c. 51, s. 8, D.)

Under the Fisheries Act, (R.S.C., c. 95), each day during which an infraction of the Act continues, constitutes a separate offence. (ib. s. 9.)

When no reference is given to any particular animal, bird or fish, there is no law relating to it; but see title "Insectiverous Birds."

3 hooks may be used. Only 12 bass, pike or perch (pickerel), 20 trout and 4 maskinouge may be taken in a day. No bass, pike, or perch (pickerel), must be under 10 inches, or trout under 6 inches, or if such be caught must be returned to the water, alive if possible. Under such permit no fish may be exported or sold.

Persons holding leases of fishing rights are not affected by the above regulations.

Foreigners temporarily domiciled in Canada who employ Canadian boats and boatmen do not require the above permit. ("Temporarily domiciled"—stopping at Canadian hotels or boarding houses.) (D.O.C., June 30, and Aug. 1, 1894.)

Non-resident must obtain a fishing permit from Commissioner. (O.O.C.)

Commissioner may issue fishery leases and fishing licenses, subject to Orders in Council, to fish in any waters belonging to the Province. (R.S.O., c. 32, s. 3, s-s. 5.) Such leases shall be for not more than 5 years and shall be made to the highest bidder, who shall pay an annual rental therefor in advance. (ib. s-s. 5, 6.)

Leases may not be transferred without consent of Commissioner. (ib. s. 7.)

Fishing lease extends 66 feet inland from water. (O.O.C.)

Non-residents of Ontario or Quebec may not hunt any bird or animal without a license signed by the Chief Fish and Game Warden, and countersigned by the Provine Secretary or his deputy, and such license must have endorsed on it the signature of the person to whom it is granted. The license fee is \$25 and such license is for one season only. (G.P.A., s. 14, s-s. 1.)

The license may be required to be produced by any person at any time. (ib. s-s. 2.)

- A non-resident may take 50 ducks out of the Province if killed by him, provided he has the above license and also obtain a permit from a warden. (ib. s-s. 3.)
- Permit to hunt may be granted free to a guest of a resident for a term not exceeding one week, by the Provincial Secretary. (ib. s. 14, s-s. 4.)

LORD'S DAY - See SUNDAY.

LUNGE - See MASKINONGE.

MAGISTRATE may convict on view for an offence under Game Protection Act. (G.P.A., s. 17.)
