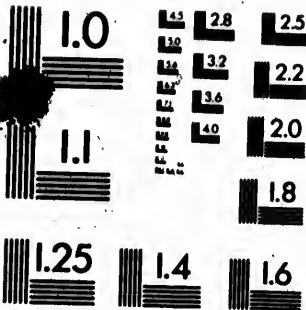

I take this early opportunity of presenting you with my Price List for 1879 for the following Goods:—Hardware, Tinware, Drugs and Medicines, Whips, Stationery and School Books, Confectionery, Pocket and Table Cutlery, Garden Seeds, Harvest Tools, Machinery Oils, Paints, all kinds. All the above Goods I keep in stock, so that your orders can be filled promptly. One very important item to be considered in my dealings with you is this, that although I may price goods by the dozen or pound, I will break bulk and give you any quantity you require. My prices in this List will be found in a great many instances much lower than any previous one for the following reasons: manufacturers and producers are selling cheaper, a general depression of trade all over the world, scarcity of money, and a variety of other causes, which have had a tendency to bring down prices.

RULE 1.—I allow freight to your nearest station on all goods in this book, unless otherwise specified, so that you know exactly what they will cost you. All I ask is to make the order not less than five or ten dollars, but as much larger as you can.

RULE 2.—Any goods ordered from me, that are not what I represent them to be, can be returned at my expense, so that you have no risk to run, but before returning, please write me stating complaint, so that I may have an opportunity to explain in case of error by packer, book-keeper, clerks, etc.

RULE 3.—If after receiving this book, prices should change in price in the general market from advanced duties or scarcity of product, the Grange must abide by the result, as all business-houses have to do. Some goods may decline, others advance; in either case you shall have the benefit. I will notify at all possible speed of change.

RULE 4.—Terms of payment not to exceed thirty days, unless other special terms are agreed upon to be sent by Post Office order, or Bank draft. All orders must bear the signature of the legally elected Secretary, and Seal of the Lodge.

RULE 5.—Original cases are never charged but the cost price, will be charged for boxes. Trunks, or better tubs for packing sundries.

RULE 6.—In Coal Oil, it is very difficult to quote a price. Every barrel of Coal Oil is marked in Imperial gallons, some dealers charge for barrels, and take it

off the oil. As a rule it is better to ship oil from Toronto, you get it quicker, especially if oil has to go north or east, the freight is less in proportion than shipping from the Refinery. I should be glad to give you quotations for Coal Oil at any time.

Remember, I never charge for Coal Oil barrels. Why? because I do not pay for them. This makes my oil at least 3 cents a gallon less than some dealers.

The oil will be shipped in good condition, free from leakage; but if on arrival, it should be deficient by leakage or shrinkage, you will have to look to the railway authorities for damages. The barrels, when they leave my place, I will guarantee to be full and free from leakage.

FOR HORSES in very low condition, caused by heavy work, sometimes from Bots, Worms, etc., and from Distemper, should have a table spoonful morning, noon and night, for at least two weeks, then once or twice a day in oats or boiled feed.

FOR FATTENING CATTLE.—Stall fed cattle should be liberally fed. Thus an animal can be more cheaply fattened by consuming ten bushels of corn in two months, than if four months were occupied in the process. Give a table spoonful three times a day for the first two weeks, afterwards twice a day.

FOR MILK CATTLE.—One very important thing to be observed is regularity of milking and feeding. Give a table spoonful in scalded feed or bran, morning and evening. After ten days feeding, the dairymaid will observe a wonderful change in the increase of cream, also a considerable saving of labour in churning, as the butter will collect much more rapidly and firmer.

FOR CALVES.—Give a teaspoonful in their regular food twice a day.

FOR SHEEP.—For a flock of twenty give six table spoonfuls every morning.

FOR PIGS.—Give a table spoonful morning and night, and one teaspoonful of sulphur two or three times a week.

FOR POULTRY.—Give about a teaspoonful for twenty hens, in chopped corn every morning, mixed with a little red pepper. It will show a large increase in eggs, especially in the winter season.
