1867.

## SPECIAL MEETING.

The Council met at the Court House, on Thursday, the fourth day of April, according to notice given by order of the Warden; for the purpose of selecting a site for an Industrial Farm and House of Refuge.

The Warden in the Chair.

The proceedings the last day of the previous session were read, and authorised to be signed.

The Warden addressed the Council.

The Warden read the award of the Arbitrators, in matter of the Currie Road Bridge, and a communication from the Council of Middlesex, relating to appropriation on County Lines. The Warden also read presentment of Grand Jury, Spring Assizes.

After which it was

Moved by Mr. McDougald, seconded by Mr. Suffel: that the costs of the arbitration between this County and the County of Middlesex, amounting to \$214, respecting the bridge to be built across the River Thames, at the Currie Road, be referred to the proper officer, to be taxed.

Moved by Mr. Suffel, seconded by Mr. Stratton : that the report of the Committee appointed to make the necessary arrangements for the purchase of Lands, for an Industrial Farm be received and read. Carried.

The report of the special Committee, on House of Industry, and the report of the Deputation appointed to visit the House of Industry, in the County of Wayne, Michigan, were severally read by the Warden.

After which it was

Moved by Mr. Suffel, seconded by Mr. Harvey: that this Council tender a vote of thanks to Messrs. Dobbie & Campbell, members of the Committee, who were appointed a special committee to visit Wayne County Poor House, in Michigan, for the very able and satisfactory report submitted to the Council. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Campbell, seconded by Mr. Dobbie : that the Council go into committee of the whole, on the Report of the committee on the House of Refuge and House of Industry. Carried.

The Council went into committee of the whole.

Mr. Clunas in the Chair.

The committee of the whole rose, reported progress, and asked leave to sit again.

The Warden took the Chair, when on motion of Mr. Black, seconded by Mr. Hegler : the Council adjourned till nine o'clock the following morning.

#### SPECIAL MEETING.—SECOND DAY.

Friday, the 5th of April, 1887.

The Council met at nine o'clock, forenoon.

The proceedings of the previous day were read and signed, after which it was

Moved by Mr. Clunas, seconded by Mr. Hegler : that Andrew N. Cline, be paid the sum of four dollars, advanced by him, to Warren Cartwright, a Constable, of the County of Norfolk, for travelling fees from Port Rowan to Vienna, in surrendering one Benjamin Smith to the Magistrates of this County, on a charge of Larceny. Motion lost.

Moved by Mr. Suffel, seconded by Mr. Stratton : that the Auditors Report be received and read. The Clerk read the Auditors' Statement and Report.

When Mr. Suffel moved, seconded by Mr. Stratton : that the Auditors Report be adopted and finally allowed by the Council. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Suffel, seconded by Mr. McCausland, that the resolution passed at the January session of the Council, appointing Samuel Price, Esq., of Port Stanley, as Arbitrator, between this County and the Town of St. Thomas, as to the amount that the said Town shall pay to this County yearly, for the use of the Gaol, and administering of Justice be rescinded, and that this Council do now accept the offer made by the Town of St. Thomas, to pay the sum of six hundred Dollars per annum, for the next five years, say \$320 for the Municipal Loan Fund, and \$280 for the Administration of Justice, and that the Warden be authorized to carry the same into effect on the part of the County. Carried.

Moved by P. C. Campbell, seconded by Mr. McDou-

gald: that the Warden be authorized to make on behalf of the Council an application to the Governor, in conformity with the provisions of the Act 22nd Victoria, Chap 93, to authorise and appoint William G. McGeorge, of Rondeau, in the County of Kent, to survey and ascertain the the true boundaries and courses of the side lines, in the Township of Aldborough, and to authorise him to place permanent stone or other durable Monuments, at the several corners, governing points, and that a special rate be levied on the Township of Aldborough, to defray the expenses thereof. Carried.

After which it was

Moved by Mr. Campbell, seconded by Mr. McDougald: that in consideration of the fact that the Committee appointed to take action, in regard to the selection of a site for the location of a House of Industry, and Industrial Farm, have not yet been able to agree upon any suitable plot of ground for the said farm, that this Council do not now go into committee of the whole, upon the selection of said site, for an industrial Farm; but that the Warden, Messrs. Dobbie, and Clark, be appointed a special Committee, with power to examine and secure until the next meeting of the Council, a suitable site for the erection of said buildings, and for the Industrial Farm, and that they be guided in that selection, by the adaptability, convenience and economy of said selection. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Suffel, seconded by Mr. Mandeville: that the Young Men's Christian Association, of the Town of St. Thomas, be allowed the use of the Court House for Lectures, on conditions that the consent of the several Insurance Companies be had, in which the Court House is insured. Carried.

On motion the Council adjourned till the 3rd Tuesday in June next.

The proceedings of the last day of the previous session were read and signed.

Moved by Mr. Suffel, seconded by Mr. Dobbie : that the Rev. Dr. Shultee, be appointed a Trustee of the Vienna Grammar School, in place of the Rev. J. B. Jessup, who has removed from the County. Carried.

The Warden read a communication from the Council of Ontario, regarding the erection of Houses of Refuge and Industry, and also a communication from the County of Welland, relative to the Usury Laws, and rate of Interest.

Moved by Mr. Suffel, seconded by Mr. Stratton : that no action be taken with reference to a certain communication, from the County of Ontario, requesting the co-operation of other County Councils, to procure the 413th clause of the Municipal act of 1866, amended so as to make it optional with County Councils, whether to establish Houses of Industry, and Industrial Farms. Carried.

The Clerk read a communication from the Educational Department, with statement of School apportionment for the current year.

The Warden read a communication from the Crown Lands Department, relative to the application for the survey of boundary lines in Aldborough.

The Clerk submitted a communication received from the Provincial Secretary, in reference to the Ownership of the Statutes furnished yearly to the Reeves of the Municipalities.

The Warden laid before the Council, a communication from the County Solicitor, concerning the Benjamin Suit.

The Clerk read report of the County Treasurer, on County Finances and estimates.

The Warden laid before the Council, Agreement between the Town of St. Thomas, and the County of Elgin, respecting the amount to be paid by the Town of St. Thomas, to the County, for the administration of Justice and use of Gaol.

After which it was

Moved by Mr. McDougald, seconded by Mr. Campbell: that the communication of the Treasurer be referred to the Finance Committee. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Suffel, seconded by Mr. Stratton: that no action be taken regarding a communication received from the Council of Welland, respecting a Petition to Parliament of Canada, to fix the legal rate of Interest at six per cent per annum. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Campbell, seconded by Mr. Harvey: that By-Law number 158 to appoint J. Mann, County Solicitor, be received and read a first time. Carried.

Moved by Mr. McDougald, seconded by Mr. Campbell: that By-Law No. 158, be read a second time. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Clunas, seconded by Mr. Hegler: that

By-Law No. 158, be read a third time, and finally passed. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Ferguson, seconded by Mr. Black : that By-Law No. 159, to confirm By-Law No. 136, of the Township of Southwold, to convey an old Road Allowance to James Foot, be received and read a first time. Carried.

Moved by W. H. Mandeville, seconded by Mr. Harvey : that By-Law No. 159 be read a second time. Carried.

Moved by P. C. Campbell, seconded by Mr. McDougald : that By-Law No. 159, to confirm By-Law No. 136, of the Township of Southwold, be read a third time, and finally passed. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Sutfel, seconded by Mr. McDougald : that the Reeves of the several Municipalities, in the County, be a committee for the purpose of equalization of the Assessment Rolls, for the present year.

In amendment :

Moved by Mr. Mandeville, seconded by Mr. Campbell : that the Deputy Reeves, Messrs. Black, Hegler, Harvey, McDougald, Ferguson, Scott, Stratton and Sutfel, be a committee to equalize the Assessment Rolls. Amendment lost and original Motion carried.

Moved by A. R. McDougald, seconded by P. C. Campbell : that John McKillop be re-appointed a commissioner to expend the balance of appropriation made by this Council last year, for the County line, between Elgin and Kent. Carried.

P. C. Campbell presented petition of Duncan McColl, J. P., and 73 other ratepayers of the County of Elgin, for the erection of a Bridge across the river Thames, at a point between the Counties of Elgin, Kent, and Middlesex.

The Petition was read, after which it was

Moved by P. C. Campbell, seconded by A. R. McDougald : that the Petition of Duncan McColl, and others, in reference to a Bridge across the river Thames, be referred to the committee on Public Improvements. Carried.

On motion, the Council adjourned till nine o'clock to-morrow morning.

that the Warden sign orders for payment of accounts therein. Carried.

Moved by J. McCausland, seconded by W. Harvey : that in view of the increased expenditure of the County, for the present year, consequent on the extra amount to be provided to pay County Registrar's fees, under new Registry Act, and appropriations for Drill Sheds ; it is not expedient to proceed at present with the purchase of Land for an Industrial Farm, and House of Refuge, and that the matter be deferred until the next meeting of this Council. Carried.

Mr. Suffel, Chairman of committee on equalization, submitted Report, when it was

Moved by A. R. McDougald, seconded by H. Stratton : that the report of the committee on the equalization of the Assessment Rolls, be received and read.

The equalization report was read by the Clerk, when it was

Moved by J. Clumas, seconded by E. Hegler : that the Council go into committee of the whole on the report of the Assessment Equalization Committee. Carried.

The Council went into committee of the whole.

After being some time in session, the committee of the whole, reported progress.

Thompson, Esq., President of the Erie and Niagara Railway Company, relative to procuring a charter for the extension of that Road to the Detroit River, do co-operate with him in assisting to procure said charter, and that this Council authorize the Warden to sign and attach the seal of the corporation of the County to a petition to the Parliament of Ontario, for the said charter. Carried.

In ammendment it was moved by P. C. Campbell, seconded by A. R. McDougald: that this Council do not authorise the Warden, and Clerk to sign a petition to the Local Legislature in favor of granting a charter to the Erie & Niagara Railway Company, for the building of what is called the Southern Railway, as this Council is not satisfied that such a charter would be the most satisfactory mode of obtaining the building of said Railroad; but that the Warden be authorised to press the application already advertized by this Council to obtain a free and untrammelled charter without being connected with the Erie & Niagara, or any other encumbered Railway; and that the Warden communicate with the other Municipalities through which the proposed Southern Railway passes, for their co-operation in obtaining an independent charter.
