The successful trapper always has all arrangements completed and ready to devote all his time and at tention to his trans-by the first o October for it is during that month that nearly all the marten are taken marten are caught after the snow becomes deep. The other ani mals sought after for their fur are beaver, bear and fox.

With ordinary success the average hunter and trapper can take \$3000 worth of fur in one season and \$4000 worth is not an unusual winter
