THE CATTLE MARKET PARK.
A Letter From Lawyers Which Will Probably
Occasion Some Talk.
McLaren, Macdonald, Morris & Shepley
have written to City Clerk Blevins that
they have been instructed by Mr. Essy
and others to draw the attention of the
Council to the title to the lands now used
for the purpose of a Western Cattle
Market, and to the question as to the right
of the Council to expend public money
thereon. The lands in question were
granted by the Dominion to the city, October
21, 1858, upon terms that they should
be dedicated to the Mayor, Aldermen and
commonalty of the city, and by them main-
tained for the purpose of a public
park for the use, benefit and recreation
of the inhabitants of Toronto, for
all time to come. Subsequently the
Provincial Parliament passed, notwith-
standing the terms mentioned, to empower
the corporation to sell, lease or otherwise
dispose of the property, the proceeds to
be applied to the improvement of the
city, and to be used only in the
acquisition and maintenance of public
parks, squares and gardens for the use
of the city. The question as to the
title of the lands as a cattle market; and
money has been expended in the erection
of the cattle market and in the proposed
expended additional money thereon. "We
are undecided," continued the letter.
The Board of Commissioners of the City
mentioned in the Provincial Act by going
into the title of the lands, and the
Committee of the Council to lease
the lands to another Commission and by
placing the money which are supposed to
be derived from this arrangement to the
credit of the Parks and Gardens Committee.
A part legislator from the consideration
of the question as to the power of the
Provincial Legislature to relieve the city from
the trusts imposed by the Dominion, we
draw attention to the fact that the city
has not invoked the power which the Provincial
Legislature has assumed to give that
the arrangement mentioned in the Provincial
Act is altogether illegal. Should the
Council see fit to disregard this limitation,
our clients will seek redress at law."
