



BELGIUM The Belgian people and country are looked upon as the war champions today, and so they are in agriculture. Just think, there are 650 people to the square mile or 8 million in the whole of Belgium. Saskatchewan alone is 21 times larger than little Belgium and has a population of only one twelfth as many.

For intensified truck farming and gardening, to our mind, Belgium is the ideal. For generations they have farmed from 3 to 5 acres, and over 1,000,000 people live from the sale of their garden produce alone.

CANADA There is an ever increasing demand for farm produce, and there is no shortage of market for it. Mostly all our vegetables in the prairie provinces are imported, and the opportunities for vegetable growing are splendid, especially around the big centres, like Regina, etc.

In Winnipeg they have two pickling factories and are talking of starting three more. In a small radius around the city there are over 150 market gardens and truck farms. The amount that can be produced and the money that can be made out of it is incredible.

REGINA—the Capital City of Saskatchewan—is situated on the main line of the Canadian Pacific Railway, Grand Trunk Pacific Railway and Canadian Northern Railway. Regina also has direct connection with United States points, the Great Northern Railway having running rights over the Grand Trunk Pacific boundary line. Twelve railway lines radiate from Regina. Bonds are guaranteed for ten additional lines.

Regina leads the way as a distributing centre in Western Canada. It is the largest point of distribution of farm implements in the world, business in this line in one year having reached a total of over \$25,000,000.

Regina serves 2,255 miles of railway lines, on which are located 250 towns and villages. As a manufacturing centre, Regina has become noted, 36 factories being located in the city.

Regina encourages industrial development. Spur track sites, situated within two minutes' walk of the very heart of the city, are owned by the city, and sold to industrial concerns at a low figure. This industrial area already contains many fine large buildings, in which is invested millions of capital. This area is served by water, electric light and power, pavements, sidewalks and street cars.

The area inside the city limits is 7,850 acres, of which 257 acres are devoted to parks and 75 acres to exhibition grounds for the provincial and other fairs.

Regina being the capital city of Saskatchewan, and the seat of government, possesses a \$2,500,000 parliament building. On the north side of the lake is located Wascana Park, which contains 47 acres. Immediately adjoining the park is the residential section. To the south of the parliament buildings, a goodly number of residences have also been built.

Regina is the educational centre of the province, including among its educational buildings the Collegiate Institute, Regina College, Anglican College, Ladies' Anglican College, Normal School, fifteen public schools, three separate schools and a number of business colleges. Several denominational colleges are proposed.

Regina is a city of splendid churches and beautiful homes, as the accompanying illustrations will show.

Regina is a city of municipal ownership, the power and light plant, the street railway and waterworks all being owned by the city.

Regina's population is estimated at 50,000, having grown from 4,000 in 1904. Since 1909 the city has grown from 12,000 to its present size.
