

PRISONERS IN PHILIPPINES

American Officers Approached by
Prominent Insurgents With a
View to Exchange.

LIEUT. GILMORE AND HIS MEN

Believed to Be Included in the List
of Those Who May Be Re-
leased if the Deal Goes.

Washington, Sept. 19.—A cablegram has been received at the War Department from General Otis relative to the American prisoners in the hands of the insurgents. General Otis says that General McArthur has been approached by a prominent Filipino, who asked if he were willing to enter into negotiations with Aguinaldo for the release of the American prisoners held by the Filipinos.

He also asked whether General McArthur would permit a Filipino army officer to pass through the American lines in order that he might confer with General Otis. While no names are mentioned in the report, it is believed that the officer in question is Lieut. Gilmore, who was captured by the insurgents on the east coast of Luzon, Major Rockwell, who was captured beyond the American lines one night shortly after his arrival in the Philippines, and about half a dozen private soldiers, who have been reported as missing.

The Cabinet meeting lasted longer than usual. The cable of General Otis informing the Secretary of War that, at Aguinaldo's request, one of his representatives would be allowed through the American lines for a conference with General Otis regarding the release of the American prisoners, was laid before the meeting by Secretary Root and discussed at some length.

Abiding to General Otis' despatch regarding a conference with the insurgents three of the Cabinet members, after the meeting, agreed in expressing their opinion that too much significance should not be attached to Aguinaldo's proposal. Secretary Root himself said that so many similar conferences in the past have come to naught that he doubted very much whether this one meant anything toward the establishment of peace and good order in the island.

The War Department has approved the action of General Otis in refusing to allow the Spanish ships to go to ports controlled by the insurgents to take away Spanish prisoners. These ships, however, will be allowed to proceed to such ports under the escort of vessels of the United States. The transfer of the Spanish prisoners to the ships will be under the supervision of the United States officers. The War Department will allow no communication between Aguinaldo and his agents and the Spaniards who may go to bring away the Spanish prisoners.

THE FRENCH CONSPIRACY TRIAL.
It is expected that it will take from four to six weeks.
Paris, Sept. 19.—It is expected that the work of the High Court's Investigating Committee, appointed to enquire into the charges of conspiracy against M. Demourant, brought against M. Demourant, and others, will take from four to six weeks. When the task is completed the High Court (Senate) will reconvene. It is expected its sessions will take up a month.

She will be sentenced on Saturday.

In the next case, Robert Laird, a young man of respectable appearance, was charged with stealing several sums of money from customers of his employer, Johnson Little, a baker. The case was not finished at adjournment.

The Grand Jury reported true bills against John Glen, thief; Harry Ward and George Toye, attempt to steal, and Nathaniel Everett, false pretences.

SUIT OVER REPAIRS.

City is Defendant in an Action for
\$157.88 Brought by an
Engine Company.

The John Inglis & Son Engine Co. sued the city of Toronto in the County Court yesterday to recover \$157.88, said to be due for some repairs to engine No. 4 at the main pumping station. The engine has a contract with the Blake Co. to do their work in this city. The defendants say the repairs were to be done for \$24 and refused to pay any more.

An adjournment was made to get some of the evidence. The case set down for trial to-day are: Chaudhry, Luman, McLaughlin, McKendry, Dwyer, Henry, Holsman. The suit of Ald. Denison against the Toronto Glass Co. was settled.

FIRES STARTED UP AGAIN.

The Adirondacks Woods Are Blazing
Seriously Again.

Albany, N.Y., Sept. 19.—The protracted dry weather spell has caused the forest fires in the Adirondacks, which have been smoldering, to start up afresh, and they are increasing rapidly in the northern part of the woods. The flames have been under control by a cordon of men under the supervision of the State Police. A threatening blaze is reported at Brant Lake, Town of Helderberg, and numerous small fires have started in the Red Horse chain of lakes.

In the southern portions of the woods the fires are somewhat beyond the control of those who are endeavoring to beat the flames back and subdue them. Tremendous fires have been burning near Hague for the last few days, burning forest land, farms and buildings. In Warren County there are large fires. Over 1200 men are now engaged fighting fires in the woods.

The Call to Rev. A. Logan Geggis.
Rev. A. Logan Geggis, who has been called to the Presbyterian Church here, and as his pastor, is a native of Roxburgh, Scotland, and is now in his 37th year. As a student, he attended Edinburgh University, and the Glasgow College, in the same city. In 1887 he came to Nova Scotia, and was engaged in home mission work for some time. He is now in Pine Hill College, Halifax, N.S., for one session. In June, 1888, he became pastor of his present church, St. Paul's, in Truro, N.S., which has enjoyed great prosperity since his arrival. He is a strong preacher, using no manuscript, and is a noted evangelist. Christian Endeavor and Temperance work are his specialties. He is called to Zion Church, Charlottetown, P.E.I., but did not accept. Some time ago he was Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of the Maritime Provinces. Should he accept this call he will likely come to Toronto about Nov. 1, and will be a notable acquisition to Presbyterianism here.

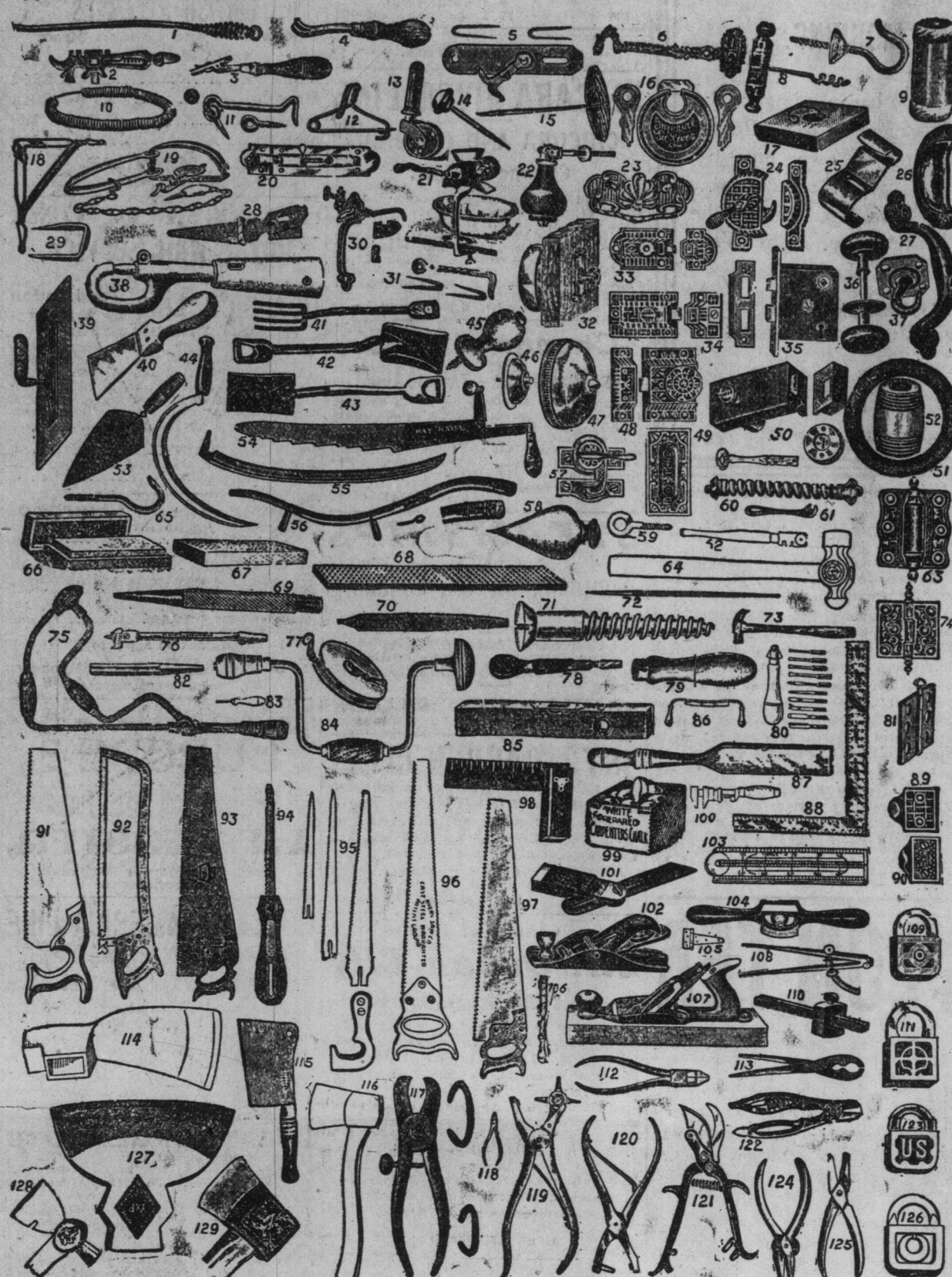

MINES AND MINING STOCKS

Considerable Development is in Progress in the Lake of the Woods District.

GOOD REPORT FROM THE EMPRESS.

Annual Meeting of Deer Trail No. 2 is to be held at Spokane To-Morrow.

Mr. Robert Rogers reached Toronto from Portage Monday afternoon and is at the Queen's. He is deeply interested in mining in Northern Ontario and is manager of the Bullion Mining Company, which controls some fifty or sixty properties in the Lake of the Woods district.

Mr. Rogers gave The World some valuable information as to the work in general. Mining business has looked up recently in Northern Ontario, more particularly in the Lake of the Woods district, and much actual development work has gone on during the last six months.

There are many valuable mines at present in operation. Among these the Mikado, situated 30 miles from Portage and owned by an English graduate, promises to be one of the richest. They are doing excellent work on a mine at the Mikado already on a dividend-paying basis. From the best information obtainable, this mine will pay in dividends during the coming year at least \$50,000.

The Bullion Mining Company own many properties in this region. Up to the present time have centred all their energies in the developing of their claims situated on the 40 acres adjoining the Mikado. The mill test on this property gave \$17 per ton. There are also some other mines in the region which have not yet been developed.

For Eastern Capitalists. The above location the Bullion Company are selling to a syndicate of eastern capitalists, who form a company subsidiary to the Bullion Company, called Bullion Mining Company No. 2.

From present development work and from the fact that the Mikado has produced such a success, mining in the same district and under similar conditions reasonably promises to bring as successful results as have been achieved by the Mikado people.

"We are starting a new mine at this property, also adjoining the Mikado. There is one main line of contact running through all these mines and all the best values are found in close relation to the contact."

"On the other end development work is going on on the Crown Point. In the same contact. Mr. Rogers visited this location only last week and development, he says, shows excellent results. The Crown Point, he continued, "is one of a number of properties owned by the Western Ontario Company, Limited, which company was floated in Montreal this summer. The first operations at this location began on Aug. 22, 1898, when a gang of men were set to work. Now there is a large working shaft, 160 ft. in depth of 35 feet, and 100 tons of ore are ready to be treated at the mill. The shaft will be completed and the bullion obtained will be put into the shape of a gold brick. The Crown Point mine has been proved to contain a very rich ore, and will yield to a length of nearly 1½ miles. There have also been located on this property six other veins, some of which have been tested."

Development of the District. "Advancement and development continue in all districts, on the Seine River and in Manitowish. The Foley mine is again being opened up and the mineral workings are turned and is putting new life and energy in the work at this location."

"The new English company interested in the Sullivan appears to be greatly satisfied with their venture and has no doubt, about big results in the near future."

Mr. Rogers was very much impressed with one fact, the abundance of gold to be found in Northern Ontario. "All we require in this district," says he, "is more capital."

Deepest Shaft in Canada. The Le Roi mine is about to enter an era of the most extensive development work in its history. The mine is to be largely increased, and a 2,500-foot shaft started. The management of the Le Roi has notified the representatives of the various machinery manufacturers that tenders will be received forthwith for a complete new power plant, with a capacity of 250 horse power, and as soon as possible. This move on the part of the Le Roi means that the development of the mine along the lines proposed by Superintendent Carpio, and accepted by the directors, will be carried out much more rapidly. The new plan provides for a vertical shaft, 2,500 feet deep. This shaft, which will cut the main vein at a depth of about 1,000 feet, will be the largest and deepest shaft in Canada. The present air compressor on the mine provides air for 40 drills. It will be seen that, with the installation of the new plant, a large increase in the working force of the mine will be rendered necessary, and a considerable increase in the output of ore is to be looked for.—Boundary Creek Times.

Empress is All Right. Mr. Beebe, manager of the Empress, is in town, having just returned from Geneva, N.Y., where he has been receiving treatment for an injury received at the mine. The following letter from the manager of the Empress will be good news to the shareholders of this mine:

"I, C. Beebe, Esq., Queen's Hotel, Toronto: Dear Sir,—I am sorry that your hip is troubling you, and hope you will soon be well. I have written you several letters, which I presume you have received. The work is moving along rapidly. The quartz is very rich—far above anything we have previously struck. There is a great deal of zinc in the vein and some galena.
