REPORT.

THE GENERAL MISSIONARY COMMITTEE TO THE FRIENDS AND SUPPORTERS OF THE CANADIAN PRIMITIVE M. MISSIONS.

CHRISTIAN FRIENDS,—In presenting you with another Annual Report of our operations, we take occasion to express our hearty thanks to God, for the success of these operations, and also to our many friends, for the liberal support afforded them during the year. After filling up the vacancies which have been occasioned by removals and deaths, (and which this year number 370,) the Stations under our care have added 91 to their number; and though this increase is small, when viewed in connection with the number of agents and the amount of influence at our disposal, yet it will no doubt awake grateful feelings in the hearts of all Christ's true followers, for it tells of that number more rescued from the thraldom of sin, and blessed with the liberty of the Spirit. The total number of Stations at the Conference was 31, but as two more were made then, the number at present is 33; Missionaries 40; Local Preachers 118; Class Leaders 360; Connexional Churches 76; other Preaching Places 123; and Members 2,820. There is one department of our work to which we direct special attention, namely, our Sabbath Schools. Of these nurseries of the Church we now number 55, being an increase of 7; Teachers 372, increase 74; Scholars 2,548, increase 573. This speaks well for the interest taken in the religious education of our youth on the Missions, and proves that the membership is alive to the importance of such education; and this is as it should be, for the character and destiny of our youth will be greatly moulded and shaped by the training they receive *now*. While we must not relax our efforts to win the adult population to Christ, we must be more anxious, than we have in the past, to lead our youth to the cross, for they are more impressionable and receptive *now* than they will be in the future. It would be very gratifying to know how many of the 2,820 youths reported as scholars were converted, and members of the Church.

It affords us great satisfaction to know that the Parent Society is energetically labouring to reach, with the blessings of the gospel, the dense population of our fatherland. Though the Connexion at home is striving to raise the mental status of its ministry, so as to meet the requirements of its advanced position, it is not unmindful of its great mission of preaching the gospel to the poor and the outcasts. As proof of these statements we gather from their Annual Missionary Report that their 115 Missionaries, in connection with their 1,102 Local Preachers and Exhorters, have during the past year preached 72,693 sermons; held 6,840 open air services; and paid 224,842 family visits! Who can conceive aright of the mighty influence for good exerted by these efforts? But the Connexion does not confine its operations to the home population; they extend to the Colonies; and now, we are glad to find, they are to reach the heathen, for the last Conference decided to establish a Mission in Africa.

With joy we recognize the abounding labours of other benevolent Societies to conquer the world for Christ. The British and Foreign Bible Society is circulating the Word of God in languages spoken by six hundred millions of people. The Religious Tract Society is issuing, in 117 different languages, tracts amounting to nearly 30,000,000 annually. There are 51 Missionary Societies, belonging to the different Religious Denominations, in Great Britain, the Continent of Europe, and in the Northern part of our own Continent, who employ 2,000 ordained Missionaries, and about 10,000 Teachers, Catechists, and other Agents. These occupy 1,200 Stations, and have under their care many thousands who have been rescued from heathenism, and who are believers in Christ. And yet, with all the encouragement inspired by these facts, how painful the thought that the greater portion of the world's population is yet in darkness. The population of the earth at present is estimated at more than 1,283,000,000, of whom 385,000,000 are professedly Christian; all the rest are either Jews, Mohammedans, or Pagans. And of the 385,000,000 who are commonly called Christians, how large a portion hold the gospel in a perverted form! and how small the number of those, who boasting of their purer form of faith, know Christ only in name! When the moral state of the world forces itself on our attention, we are almost appalled, and were we not firm believers in the Word of God and the omnipotence of truth, very faint indeed would be our hope of Christianity ever overtaking the great work before it, of leavening the world with her pure and benign spirit. But the recollection of her past triumphs, and the knowledge of her present exploits, prevent us from fearing, for a moment, that she is unequal to the task, and encourages us to believe that the kingdoms of this world *shall* become the kingdoms of our God and of His Christ.

The financial state of our Society is as follows: Balance in hand on 12th July, 1867, \$1,595 22. The income for the year, including the English Grant and allowance from the Relief Fund for sick Missionaries, \$9,967 91, making a total of \$11,563 14. The expenditure for the year is \$8,976 60, leaving a balance of \$2,589 89. But a word of explanation respecting this balance is necessary here. The English grant of \$2,068 32 is made from the profits of the English Book Room, and is paid chiefly in books, such as the Magazines, Hymn Books, &c.; now all these have to be turned into cash, before the grant becomes actually available. The balance is therefore chiefly in the Stock of our own Book Room, and before it can be available the Treasurer has frequently to advance sufficient to pay the grants voted by Conference. The income of the last year from our own Circuits and Missions is not equal to that of the year previous by \$352 49, and yet the expenditure has been largely increased, and necessarily so, to enable us to satisfy the demands made from different parts of our work for assistance. At the last Conference a part of London Circuit was made into a Mission, and a Preacher stationed thereto. Rosemont, in the township of Mulmer, has also been made a Mission, and a Preacher sent to it. An additional Preacher has been sent to Barrie, and in a short time another will be sent to Kingston, according to Conferential appointment. A part of the Peel Circuit, embracing several

appointments in the township of Arthur, has been connected with Minto Mission, and as soon as a suitable person can be obtained he will be sent to it. At present the Peel friends, at considerable sacrifice to themselves, are supplying it. Napanee requires a second Preacher, in order to be properly worked, and the Conference has directed that one shall be sent there. These arrangements will add greatly to the expenditure of the Society, and we therefore ask for a largely increased income this year. The religion, and denominational loyalty of our many supporters will not permit us, we hope, to ask in vain. Our work, and our progress must be sustained. Let every converted man, woman, and child come up to our help; and this they can do, if they will: God, the Church, and the world requires this of them. Prayer, influence, and money can all be employed in our behalf, and we ask for the liberal use of each. Is it too much to ask that those who have been greatly blessed by God, should manifest their gratitude by returning to Him a portion of that which He has so richly bestowed upon them? The promise He has made should encourage them to do this: "Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it."—Malachi iii. 10. Your duty in this respect, dear friends, is plain, and the reward equally so. Live up to your duty, and enjoy the reward. Not only pray "Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven," but do what you can, both by your life and purse, to secure the answer of your prayer; and then, by and bye, you will rejoice in the kingdom of our Lord Jesus Christ. That you may do this, is our prayer concerning you.

BARRIE MISSION.

During the past year we have preached about 250 times; led about 200 prayer-meetings; led class 150 times; and held special meetings for twenty-five weeks. To accomplish this, we have driven and walked about 4000 miles. With respect to visiting, I have not kept any direct account, but weeks have been spent in this work: I think I have come up to the standard of 15 families per week. The state of the Station at present is prosperous: there is much zeal manifested by our members, in seeking after a deeper baptism of the Spirit, that they may be more useful. Their aim is to make our cause prosper, and give it a lasting name and place in this part of the country. From present prospects we hope to have in this part one of our strongest fortresses; but to accomplish this there must be more labour. There are fields of usefulness open to us: one congregation, of nearly 200 people, is now waiting till Conference, expecting then to receive more help: other places are also open to us. There are a number of our old members from other Stations up beyond us, who are anxiously wishing for our Missionaries. There is room for three or four additional preachers here, and it would well repay the labour after a little time. At present it is almost impossible to get a house in Barrie: all are full: if two single men could be sent, it would be more convenient. The people here will do all they can for the prosperity of the cause in this part of the country.

ANNUAL REPORT.

COLLINSBY MISSION.

In reviewing the labours of the past year on this field, your Missionary has cause to be deeply grateful to God. Some souls have been saved : a growing interest in spiritual things manifests itself on the part of the people. We are sorry we cannot report larger accessions in members for the year; yet we are happy to state that our work here was never in a more satisfactory and prosperous state than at present. Notwithstanding the very severe pressure felt here in money matters, this Mission reports a creditable increase in all its contributions. During the year quite an amount of Church debt has been paid, and a Parsonage purchased, and one hundred dollars of the money paid. I have no doubt, with the blessing of God on patient and earnest effort, the cause here will ultimately triumph and prevail. In reference to the future, our prospects are cheering.

NAPANEE MISSION.

This Mission is very extensive, embracing the townships of Richmond, North Fredericksburg, and a part of the townships of Camden, Hungerford and Sheffield. The distance from one extremity to the other is 28 miles, and a part of it is exceedingly rough. There are ten appointments and one Congregational Church, which is a good one; and it is free of debt. Generally speaking, the people on this Mission are comparatively poor, yet willing to do all they can for the cause of God. Last season was very hard on the people in this part of the country. The crops were almost a total failure, caused by drought and a hail storm in harvest time : some who sowed 20 bushels of wheat only reaped 22 bushels, and many cut only half the grain they had sowed. During the past year the writer has preached three times every Sabbath, when storms or impassable roads did not prevent ; also twice and three times through the week, during the summer season ; held three protracted meetings during the winter, and visited 450 families ; besides attending to many other duties attendant upon a Missionary's life. I am well, hearty, and in good spirits. May God continue to make his humble servant the honoured instrument of bringing many from the power of sin and satan unto Him, the only true and living God.

COLLINGWOOD MISSION.

For years past our people have had to labour under unfavorable circumstances on this Station, for lack of suitable accommodations for preaching. Many of the services are held in private houses, and those very small. During the past year we have tried to remove this hindrance, and have succeeded in erecting a church on the 7th concession of Euphrasia. We have also a shed in course of erection at our Ebenezer church. Our prospects are encouraging. Hitherto the Lord has helped us, and by His help we intend to labour on. During the past year I have travelled 3,564 miles, have made 500 pastoral visits, preached 164 sermons, in addition to those at the protracted meetings, and have delivered 12 addresses. We have a small increase. J. WALKER.

WALPOLE MISSION.

During the past year considerable labour has been expended on this Mission, in travelling, preaching, and pastoral visits, and we are happy to say not in vain. The Lord has been graciously pleased to visit us with His presence at some of our special services: eight received pardon through the precious blood of Christ: seven are now members of our Church, and one has removed to another part of the country. We have travelled 2,240 miles, visited 804 families, preached 226 sermons, and attended 12 missionary meetings. It would have afforded us great consolation could we have reported a large increase this year, but owing to causes over which we have no controul we have to report a decrease of three members for the year. We have had 4 removals, 2 left society, and 11 fallen. When I took charge of the Mission, there was a debt on the Parsonage of \$80, which has been paid. We have an acre of land given for a Church at Wren's appointment. I have got \$200 signed towards building it, but the friends could not agree as to whether they should have a brick or frame Church, consequently nothing has been done towards its erection. We have had a small increase in church funds. Our missionary income is \$121 27. Our quarterly income, for the last five quarters, is \$258 67. As regards the spiritual position of the station, with one or two exceptions it is good. Oh for united effort, and more of the mind that was in Christ. We sincerely hope that this Mission may become more prosperous, both financially and spiritually. WILLIAM NEWTON.

MINTO MISSION.

We have been trying to do something for God and His cause on this Station, and we are thankful that our labour has not been altogether in vain. A few souls have been converted, and we hope some lasting impressions made upon the minds of the people. There are eight appointments on the Station, embracing five townships: length about thirty miles, by a breadth of ten. We have two churches, and another is being erected, and we have also secured a site for one in Listowell, on the condition that it be built within two years. We have suffered a great deal by removals, &c., but still we are happy to report a small increase in members. Our Missionary Meetings were very successful, and the monies are in advance of last year. The people have done well in supporting their Minister, and Minto Station can now say it has paid all claims. The prospects of the Station are good, and in future a married man should be sent, as he would be better able to attend to the varied wants of this Mission. J. BURDGE.

ORANGEVILLE MISSION.

DEAR BRETHREN,—Finding, in September last, that there was an opening for Primitive Methodism in Caledon, and believing that the Lord had a work for us to do there, we put the place on the Plan, and immediately commenced a protracted meeting. We continued the services for nearly seven weeks, and had the satisfaction of receiving into church fellowship fifteen souls. Having also received an invitation to take an appointment at Coleridge, in the 9th

concession of Amaranth, and believing it to be a good opening, we received it on the Plan, and commenced special meetings. These meetings were continued for three weeks, when we admitted into the church eleven souls. We also held protracted services at Orangeville, which were continued for nearly seven weeks, and at which over thirty persons were forward for prayer, twenty-three of whom united with us in church fellowship. During the year we have held meetings for twenty-five weeks, and we have added to the church fifty-one souls. The influence of these meetings was so great, that even in our ordinary services we have frequently added souls to the church—on one Sabbath no less than sixteen. We have also put up a wood shed and enclosed the grave-yard at Providence, and completed the driving-shed at Salem. Laurel Church has also been pewed, lathed, and plastered, and the entire indebtedness paid off—both the old debt and the finishing, and a balance left on hand for painting it. At the same time we were carrying on the work of building our beautiful Church at Orangeville, and had the pleasure of seeing its successful completion; and in regard to membership and congregation, our anticipations have been more than realized. We propose during the coming year to erect a Parsonage in Orangeville, and if that is accomplished, and prosperity still attend us, this Station may then be made a Circuit. We also contemplate the erection of one or two Churches during the coming year. May the good Lord prosper His work on this Station more and more.

PORTLAND MISSION.

DEAR BRETHREN,—Through a kind and merciful Providence we are brought to the close of another ecclesiastical year. I am thankful to be able to say that the blessing of the Lord has accompanied our labours. After filling up vacancies by death, removals, and other causes, to the number of fifty-eight, we still report an increase of nine, so that we have added sixty-seven to our ranks during the year. Five special services have been held on this Mission during the year: at Sydenham we laboured six weeks, and forty souls were hopefully converted to God. In the ordinary services also we have rejoiced in witnessing the conversion of a few precious souls. During the five short quarters just closed we have raised as ordinary annual income \$265 64; Conference and sick preachers' fund \$15 40; children's fund \$61; and Mission Fund \$156 15; we have also raised \$200 to pay the debt on Sydenham Church, and \$30 for finishing the shed, also \$40 for the erection of a shed at Wilton, and \$40 for the erection of a shed at Storrington, besides contributing towards other objects; thus raising in all over \$700, which is very good, considering the low state of the Mission when I entered upon it. We hope a brighter day will soon dawn upon this Mission, and that it will ere long become a self-sustaining Circuit. May the Lord hasten the day.
