GOTHIC ARCHITECTURE.—First among modern moves is the new-fangled veneration for the Gothic, or the species of Teutonic pointed architecture; to this as a resuscitation of one of the good labours of our forefathers there can be no objection. But to a bigotted, fanatical devotion to this old pointed style as "Christian architecture" par excellence, there is an objection. Like every historic style it has its merits, but also its demerits; for if it were given to select a style which should produce the least effect by the greatest possible amount of labour, the choice must fail on the decorated or perpendicular Gothic. DEATH FROM A BEE STING.—An intelligent lad, about 5 years of age, the son of D. P. Williams, died during the past week near Vincentown, Burlington Co., from the effect of a sting by a bee. On Saturday, his leg became very much swollen, and the pain extended throughout his whole body. The swelling perceptibly increased during Monday, and on Tuesday morning he endured the most excruciating agoiny.
