Allies Bombard The Germans At Ostend

It is evident that General Joffre, commander-in-chief of the allied armies, is determined to keep pounding away at the German left centre, without any halt. During the last three weeks of fighting, between Rheims and the Argonne, the French have gained from five to eight miles at various points, particularly north of the old road Sousin, Perthes, Mesnila and Beauseejour.

In the Vosges, in the region of St. Die, severe fighting is in progress, the Germans have been trying without success to outlink the French forces operating in the Fecht valley west of Colmar.

Boulogne, March 5—Bvery German battery in the Lombaertsyde district has been completely reduced to silence and, in addition, the enemy has lost all its batteries standing in the Grand Dune. All this ground, once a German stronghold, now lies between the two armies forming a neutral zone.

Little by little the allies are regulsing the Germans steadily. The latter have already been forced to retreat as far as the Lombaertsyde farm on the Westende roads.
