He would be surprised to find that proprietors of leading lines of steamships are so grossly ignorant with regard to its waters that at a recent conference at Montreal some of them assumed that the harbor of St. John was dry at low water, and that vessels coming to it would have to lie aground. Self-interest and mis-representation have continued to injure St. John and the Bay of Fundy ever since Mr. Donaldson's time, and probably will continue to do so for years to come. It is impossible to calculate the amount of injury which has been done St. John by the false statements that have been made with regard to the navigation of the Bay of Fundy."

The steamship companies had interests at that port, and the city of St. John found itself bitterly opposed by the transportation companies, and found also that the Bay of Fundy was misrepresented in Admiralty and other charts. For example, a chart issued by one Charles Wilson, of London, in the year 1877, contained this gross falsehood concerning the bay:

"Ships navigating the Bay of Fundy have to encounter an atmosphere almost constantly enveloped in dense fogs, the tide setting with great rapidity over the rocks and shoals with which it abounds, and a difficulty of obtaining anchorage on account of the depth, so that under these circumstances the most unremitting attention is requisite to prevent disastrous consequences which must necessarily attend a want of knowledge and caution."

Many other such statements were made, and it became necessary for the board of trade of St. John to take steps to expose the falsehoods which were sent broad-cast. In October, 1886, a special committee consisting of A. Cruikshank, Andre Cushing and W. E. Vroom was appointed to prepare a report, which was submitted to the board in February, 1887. The committee went exhaustively into the whole subject, secured the facts about duration of fogs, the percentage of loss to vessels sailing to and from St. John for a period of ten years, and the testimony of pilots and captains familiar with the bay; and af-

"2.—That the fog or cold vapor never occasions delay of steam vessels in summer or winter, and that there is never the slightest obstruction from ice.

"3—That Atlantic steamships need make but one straight course from their regular track to Portland and Boston up the Bay of Fundy to St. John.

"4.—That the south channel, opening into the bay is 18 miles in width at the harrowest part, expanding rapidly to 35 or 40 miles of unobstructed deep water pavigation, which holds good all the way
