Germain Steamship With Valuable Cargo For Boston Seized at Gibraltar

Boston, Aug. 17—The Hansa Line steamship Schneefels, bound from Cal-cutta and Colombo for Boston, with a cargo of tea, gunnies and other merchan-dise, valued at over \$1,000,000, has been seized by the British at Gilraltar. Vague rumors of the seizure of the rich prize were received here yesterday, and the confirmation came today. The Schneefels, a brand-new freighter on her first trip across the Atlantic, left Calcutta July 3, and Colombo July 13, for this port. She was last report-ed passing through the Suez Canal, July 28, and the consignees of the cargo and the underwriters had hoped that she had eluded the British warships and passed out of the Mediterranean in safe-ty. It appears she was captured by the British war vessels on August 6, and was taken to Gibraltar, where she ar-rived the same day.




