





22.—Miscellaneous Business.

- 1. Aston's gives evidence of devotion to God, diligence in pastoral visiting and careful preparation for the pulpit. J. J. Noble's, shows diligence in his work and success in soul saving, and while it was not equal to the other journals, yet it was an improvement on any former production. Brothers Harper, and Dobson, are written out fully and give evidence, that while engaged in special studies, they have been in labours abundant.

We have therefore pleasure in recommending, Brothers J. Aston, Paul Flint and J. J. Noble, for Ordination. Brothers H Harper and J. Dobson, we leave in the hands of the Conference for decision.







3. That young men recommended for the Ministry who have not had sufficient experience to justify their being admitted to the Ministry at once, may be stationed by the Conference as Candidates for the Ministry, and shall remain in such position one or more years, as the Conference may consider best for them and the Church.

4. That the term of an ordained Minister's stay or a station shall be three years, but if he be invited by the Quarterly Meeting to remain longer, with the sanction of Conference, he may do so, but the Conference shall not give its sanction unless the station is prosperous,

6. That all superannuated preachers not claimants on any of the Connexional Funds, shall be eligible for election to District Meetings

or Conference as lay delegates.

Salaries of Ministers.—The following shall be the salaries: Ordained married ministers, in cities, \$650 a year; on country stations the minimum salary shall be \$500, and as much more as the stations are able to pay. Single ordained ministers for the first two years, \$250 and board, afterwards, \$300 and board. Widowers the same as married ministers. Probationers, \$160 and board. Candidates for the Ministry while doing the full work of a Minister, \$100 and board.

8. That on being regularly superannuated, Ministers shall be entitled to remuneration to the extent of \$25, in case they supply their stations from the May Quarterly Meeting to the Conference changing time. That a fund shall be established for the purpose contemplated by the preceding rule to be called the "Station Supply Fund."

FEES

9. That the Supply Fund shall be sustained as follows, viz: When a station has had the labours of a young man from the May Quarterly Meeting to changing time, and at Conference receives a young man who has only then been taken out, the August Quarterly Meeting shall pay him half a Quarter's salary, and in lieu of the other half quarter, shall send \$15 to the General Secretary for this Fund.



The collections from the Home Sations must be sent to the Treasurer not later than December 25; the Colonies to the several District Treasurers.

6. The Trustees of our Churches and Managers of Sunday Schools throughout the Connexion shall be asked to give a donation from their funds at their annual meetings of at least 2s. 6d. (62c.) and those in good circumstances shall be desired to give at least £1 (\$5.00). amount contributed to appear in the Yearly schedules, and to be forwarded to the Treasurer by the Superintendent Minister as soon as possible after the yearly meetings have been held.

7. The Treasurer shall be at liberty to solicit donations in support of this Fund.

8. All rules affecting this Fund which are not in harmony with the foregoing Regulations are hereby repealed.

CHILDRENS' FUND.

15. That the apportionments to the stations for the Childrens' Fund be made in future on the following principle, viz:—Fifteen cents per member, and six per cent. on the ordinary income, but that the Finance Committee and Conference shall have power to make exceptions in what they consider special cases.

SICK MINISTERS' SUPPLY, AND THE RELIEF FUND.

16. That Mission Stations be reminded that if a Missionary, through sickness becomes unable to perform the duties of his station, application must be made to the Missionary, or Executive Committee, who will as soon as possible, provide a supply, and the station, in behalf of the Missionary Comoittee must, in the usual way, apply for the allowance from the Relief Fund.

PARSONAGES.

17. That in view of the low price of property at the present time, all our stations which have not parsonages, be encouraged to purchase, or build, and whilst they are being paid for, mission stations be allowed the following proportion of rent from the Quarter Board, viz. The year the house is built or purchased, the full amount of rent, and one fourth less than the full amount for four succeeding years.

CHURCH EXTENSION FUND.

18. That Rule 189 (b) be thus amended, subscriptions shall be taken on all our Stations for this Fund annually, any person subscribing at one time the sum of \$25, shall be a member of the Managing Committee for life.

19. That Rule 189 (a) be rescinded and the following substituted. That proper notice must be given, and a collection taken at each of our preaching places, on all our Stations for the Church Extension Fund, and must be paid into the Mission Office on or before the day of the General Committee Meeting in February.

20. That no applications for grants or loans, shall be entertained by Conference which have not been recommended by the Church Extension Fund Committee.


