# IX. STANDING COMMITTEE ON STANDING ORDERS.

DETAILED ACCOUNT of the MONEYS appropriated during the FIRST Session of the SIXTH Provincial Parliament of Canada; specifying whether the appropriation was made by Act of Parliament, or by Warrant upon an Address of the Legislative Assembly.

(The Numbers subjound to the undermentioned Bills, have reference to the preceding Schedule of Bills, by turning to which the Titles of the several Acts will be found at length.)

# I.—SUPPLY BILL FOR 1858. (See Bill No. 274.) (Act 22 Vic., cap. 83.)

This Act authorizes the payment, out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, of the sum of \$2,283,073 51 cents, for defraying the expenses of the Civil Government of the Province, and other purposes, for the year 1858.

It further authorizes the issue of Debentures to the extent of \$1,000,000, for expenses connected with the Public Works.

#### II.—THE FISHERY ACT. (See Bill No. 125.) (Act 22 Vie., cap. 86.)

This Act authorizes the appointment of four Overseers of Fisheries, by the Commissioner of Crown Lands, at such places and in such divisions of territory, as he may consider necessary; the salary of such Overseers not to exceed the sum of \$400 per annum.

It also authorizes the appropriation of the sum of \$600 per annum (for three years), to be applied for the formation of Oyster beds in the various Bays and Waters of this Province, that may be found best adapted for that purpose.

# III.—JURISDICTION AND PROCEDURE OF THE SEVERAL SURROGATE COURTS IN UPPER CANADA. (See Bill No. 48.) (Act 22 Vic., cap. 93.)

This Act authorizes the appointment of a Clerk, to be called the Surrogate Clerk, who shall be deemed an officer of the Court of Chancery and whose salary shall not exceed the sum of \$1600 per annum.
