TWENTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The annual meeting of the Lady Managers and patrons of the Boys' Home, and re-opening of the Home, took place on Tuesday the 18th March, 1884, at the Home, on George Street. Among those present were Mayor Boswell, Prof. Daniel Wilson, Col. Gzowski, the Rev. John Pearson, Rev. Dr. Castle, Rev. Dr. Thomas, Rev. Hugh Johnstone, Rev. Elmore Harris, Rev. J. C. Autliff, Rev. Geo. M. Milligan, Rev. J. Kirkpatrick, Rev. Dr. Reid, Rev. Septimus Jones, Rev. Arthur Baldwin, Rev. Mr. Green, Rev. Andrew Wilson, Rev. Samuel Hunter, Rev. Hugh Rose (Manchester, England), Dr. Thorburn, Mr. W. H. Howland, Mr. W. B. McMurrich, Mr. Wm. Gooderham, Mr. J. J. Withrow, Mr. Walker and others.

Mayor Boswell occupied the chair and the Rev. John Pearson opened the meeting with prayer (dedicatory).

Letters were then read from The Lord Bishop of Toronto, Hon. G. W. Allan, Rev. Canon Dumoulin, Rev. M. H. Parsons, Rev. W. J. Macdonell, Rev. J. F. Sweeney, and others, regretting their inability to be present.

Prof. Wilson then read the Twenty-fourth Annual Report, as follows:

It is with feelings of devout thankfulness to God that the Lady Managers welcome the friends of the institution to the new building, the necessity of which has been so long felt, and at the same time to acknowledge the generosity of those who have so liberally contributed of their means to enable the committee to complete these important improvements, free of all debt.

The work was commenced in July, and after frequent consultations with the following gentlemen, who kindly

acted as Building Committee : Messrs. Lieut.-Col. Gzowski, J. Macdonald, Wm. Gooderham, J. J. Withrow, Hon. G. W. Allan, Alex. Manning, Robert Gilmore, Hon. Edward Blake, Robert Walker, and Dr. Thorburn, it was decided to alter the old building and make a large addition to it, rather than erect a new Home. Owing to the unfortunate strike among the plasterers, the contract is not yet quite completed.

Special thanks are due to Mr. Wm. Gooderham and Mr. J. J. Withrow for the very warm interest they have taken in the re-building and furnishing of the Home.

Notwithstanding the unfortunate circumstances under which the committee had laboured in providing temporary shelter for the boys during the time the alterations were in progress, they are glad to be able to report that no death has taken place during the year.

Owing to the impossibility of warming the premises in the Queen's Park, lately occupied, several cases of croup and other ailments have occurred, which caused Mrs. Munro and Miss McKay many weary nights of watching and care, and the Managers would here express their appreciation of the manner in which they cheerfully accommodated themselves to the unfavourable circumstances in which they were placed. Our kind friend, Dr. Thorburn, has given his constant attention to all needing medical treatment and will as usual add his report.

The total number of inmates, including those on the roll 1st January, 1883, is 136, of these 27 were removed by their parents, 22 were sent out to situations, 16 received temporary shelter, and one, a deaf mute, was sent to the News Boys' Lodgings, being too old for the Institution. At present there are 70 boys in the Home ; of those sent to situations only one has been returned as unsuitable.

There is a continual demand, especially among farmers, for boys as apprentices, and at present 54 are bound out to employers, until they attain the age of 18. Letters are frequently received from them, of which the following is a very fair specimen :

"I am getting along very well, and would like to know how you are all getting along. I have been going to school. We have had two weeks' holidays. I like to go to this school very well. I am head of my class sometimes. I got two nice prizes at the school examination. I am ever so much heavier since I came here. Bertie——, the boy that came down with me from the Home, lives about two miles from here; he was over here on Christmas day, and some more little boys and girls, and we had lots of fun. Have you heard from Arthur and Willie, and is Albert in the Home yet. I wish he has as good a home as I have. When you write to me please tell me what day of the month my birthday is. No more at present, wishing you all a happy New Year.

Reports are sent as required by clergymen and others, as to the attendance at church, Sunday and day school, for example :

"I have been requested by Mr.——, to report on the welfare, &c. of James——, in church and Sunday school. I have great pleasure in speaking in the highest terms of him. He is very regular and attentive, and his teacher expresses satisfaction with his progress. He is very helpful and obliging in assisting in any little church matters within his power.

"To the Secretary, Boys' Home, Toronto. RECTOR."

Several changes have taken place in the Board of Managers, by the death and removal of some of its most active members, and the committee desire to record, with feelings of the deepest sorrow and regret, the loss by death, during the past year, of two of the oldest and most esteemed members of their Board—Mrs. Hodgins and Mrs. Ryerson. Both of these ladies were placed on the first Committee of Management, and worked with great energy and devotion through those early and most trying times which attended the foundation of the Boys' Home. After many years of

loving and unselfish labour, they found it necessary through failing health and more important home duties, to retire from the active work of the Institution, but the interest they had ever taken in its welfare and success, only ended with their lives. Their memory will always be affectionately cherished by those who had the privilege of working with them in this portion of the Lord's vineyard.

The Institution has also sustained a severe loss in the removal to Montreal of Mrs. W. Sutherland Taylor, who has for sixteen years so ably filled the office of Secretary, and given much time and energy to the work. As an acknowledgment of her faithful services the following resolution was passed :

"The Managers of the Boys' Home desire to express their sense of the loss sustained by the Institution in Mrs. Taylor's removal from the city, and their high appreciation of the faithful and conscientious manner in which she has discharged the important duties as Secretary, during a long term of office, uniting in earnest wishes for her future welfare and usefulness."

The Managers would also express their grateful thanks to Mr. J. P. Clark, who has kindly furnished the Gymnasium complete at a cost of \$140, thereby giving benefit as well as pleasure to the boys.

Nor would the ladies forget to express their warmest thanks to Mr. Kilgour and Mr. Brush, and their lady assistants who so indefatigably train the boys on the Sabbath, on the most important of all subjects, the "One thing needful." Eternity alone can reveal the full fruit of their labours.

The Treasurer's Report will show that all the wants of the Institution for the year, have been liberally provided for, and in closing, the committee would commend this great work to the sympathy and help of the friends of the poor and destitute, who are in this way being rescued from a life of sin and misery.

MEDICAL OFFICER'S REPORT.

I have much pleasure in presenting this my Twenty-fourth (24) annual report, and in doing so, it is gratifying to state that, notwithstanding the very inadequate accommodation that has been at the disposal of the Managers during the greater portion of the year, both prior to their removal from George street and subsequently during their residence in the Queen's Park (so ill adapted for our purposes), there were no fatal cases. In the early part of the year many of the boys suffered from the Mumps, a painful disease, which in three cases was metastatic, and in the latter part many of them were affected with diseases of the respiratory tract, viz., Croup and Pneumonia, and a still more general attack of Catarrhal Congunctivitis, from which scarcely a boy escaped. This disease is very contagious, and in the crowded condition of the building, with no means of ventilation and a sparse supply of water, it was impossible to get rid of it.; in fact it is only since we returned to our Old Home, made New, that any great improvement has taken place. This disease is one which requires the utmost cleanliness and isolation, and the only wonder is that nothing more serious occurred considering the bad conveniences, etc. I may here mention that, since the opening of the Home in 1859, there have been admitted thirteen hundred and ten (1310) boys, who have remained in the Home on an average of two (2) years each, and during the whole of this time there have been only eleven (11) deaths. Is this not a source of congratulation to the friends of the Institution? I am thankful for the result.

I will not occupy your time in discussing the additions and alterations in this building, as the report of the Secretary has fully informed you upon this subject. I may here add my testimony to that already given, especially in reference to the increased space and with it accommodation. The Gymnasium is a good addition to the Institution ; the judi-

cious use of athletic games tends to develop the body, hence the old saying, "Mens sanus in corpora sano." It is not, however, finished, and I trust that further improvements will be made.

This report would be incomplete without referring to and acknowledging the kind assistance that I have always received from the managers of the Institution, and Mrs. Munro, our excellent matron.

This resolution was adopted.

It was then moved by the Rev. Hugh Johnstone, and seconded by the Rev. J. Kirkpatrick :—

Resolved, That on this re-opening occasion, the Lady

Managers of the Boys' Home desire to record their devout and grateful thanksgivings to the Father of all Mercies, that He has put it into the hearts of generous donors to adequately provide for the pressing demands of this Institution, in a building so complete and thorough in all its appointments; they recognize His goodness in preserving the lives of the little ones committed to their care while occupying their temporary Home; in furthering the building to completion without accident, and in the glad return to this unembarrassed Home, where with enlarged facilities they enter with more hopeful and earnest efforts upon the work of rescuing little wanderers and bringing them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

It was also moved by Rev. Dr. Castle and seconded by Mr. W. B. McMurrich, "That the cordial and hearty thanks of the friends and patrons of the Boys' Home, assembled in annual meeting, are hereby tendered to the Building Committee, and especially to Wm. Gooderham, Esq., and J. J. Withrow, Esq., for their indefatigable labours, their practical tact and business experience in superintending the construction of our new building. To these gentlemen we are indebted not only for munificent contributions, but for the unceasing care and excellent judgment which have secured for the Boys' Home our commodious, complete and attractive building. It is our fervent prayer that the blessing of the God of the homeless and the Father of the orphan may attend our benefactors until they receive acknowledgment from Him who loves to say: 'Inasmuch as ye did it unto one of the least of these, ye did it unto Me.'"

A short address in reply to the vote of thanks by Rev. Dr. Castle was given by Mr. William Gooderham and Mr. J. J. Withrow. Short congratulatory addresses were given by Rev. Dr. Thomas, Rev. J. C. Antliff, Rev. Elmore Harris, and others.

Mayor Boswell, in bringing the proceedings to a close, expressed his gratification, and he was sure that of all present also, at the pleasing result of the work which has been accomplished during the past year.

A hearty vote of thanks was then proposed by the Rev. Septimus Jones and tendered to the Mayor for his services as chairman, after which the meeting closed by the Rev. John Pearson pronouncing the benediction.

OBJECT OF THE BOYS' HOME.

Duties of the Board of Management and Officers.

The Institution is open to the boys of the ages mentioned in second Rule of the Regulations, the claims of admission being the utter friendlessness of the applicant, or being a child of drunken and dissolute parents; the object of this Institution being the prevention of juvenile crime, by training these poor outcasts in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

The management is vested in a Committee of Ladies, chosen from the subscribers, at the Annual General Meeting in February of each year; the said committee to consist of thirty-three members, from among whom eight shall be chosen as Directresses; and among them there shall be a first and second Directress, Treasurer and Secretary.

The first Directress, or in her absence one other Directress, shall preside at the monthly meetings, audit and sign the accounts presented for that purpose by the Treasurer, propose and declare the resolutions, and sign the minutes of each preceding meeting.

The Treasurer shall receive and keep an account of all moneys belonging to the Institution, as also the earnings of all the boys, a separate account of which must be kept with each. All the accounts must be presented each month, at the meeting of the Managers, for the signature of the first Directress, or in her absence, the lady presiding.

The Secretary shall conduct all the correspondence of the Society; keep a list of the names, ages, and peculiar cir-

cumstances, as far as practicable, of all the boys, in a book provided for that purpose ; attend at each monthly meeting, take the names of those present, and minute the proceedings in a book, which must be read at each ensuing meeting, and be signed by the presiding lady.

Two members of the Committee in rotation, shall visit the "Home" daily, each week ; inspect the house ; ascertain from the Matron the conduct of the boys, and enter a report at the weekly meeting on the Monday.

The weekly or Finance Committee shall consist of the Directress, Secretary, Treasurer, and two of the Committee, who shall have been appointed to purchase or otherwise obtain the necessary clothing for the boys. Five shall form a quorum, and their order shall be sufficient authority to the Treasurer to advance the money requisite for the above purpose, or supply such things as may be considered necessary for the "Home."

The general Committee shall meet on the second Monday of the month, at eleven o'clock, a.m. Each meeting shall be opened with prayer. The minutes of the preceding meeting having been read and signed, the vouchers of the Treasurer produced and signed, the Secretary shall inform the meeting of any correspondence that has taken place during the last month, and the first Directress shall put before the meeting such resolutions as may be put into her hands, take the votes and declare the decision. Seven shall form a quorum, and when a tie arises, the presiding lady shall give the casting vote. All admissions that have taken place during the past month shall either be ratified or disallowed, at the discretion of the meeting.

As soon as the meeting is opened, all conversation not addressed to the presiding lady, shall be pronounced by her to be out of order and stopped.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BOYS' HOME.

I. The Matron shall be competent to take charge of all the boys; to conduct the household affairs generally; to admit applicants with the doctor's certificate, subject to the approval of the Weekly Committee; and she shall daily see to the personal cleanliness of each boy, and every morning and evening conduct family prayer.

II. Boys from the ages of 5 to 14 are admitted as inmates, and none shall be placed in a permanent situation until he has been one year in the Institution. This rule may be suspended under peculiar circumstances, at the discretion of the Managers.

III. The boys shall rise at 6 a.m. from 30th April to 30th September, and at 7 a. m. from 1st October to the 1st May; the time for going to rest being from 6 to 8 p.m. Their meals to be at regular hours—Breakfast at 8 a.m., Dinner at 12, and Tea at 5.30 p.m. Grace to be said before and after meals by one of the elder boys; and all hours not occupied by such meals, or by instruction, to be employed under supervision of the Matron, in bodily exercise, house cleaning or in play.

IV. All the boys shall regularly attend Sunday School, and Divine Service in a Protestant Church, every Sunday, in charge of the Matron; and in the afternoon receive such religious instruction as can be given by the Matron, or any visiting friend to the Institution.

V. The charge for each boy, of parents or friends who are able to pay, shall be \$4 per month, unless an exceptional case shall occur. If more than one boy of the same parents or friends gains admittance, a reduction shall be made, as approved of by the ladies of the Weekly Committee.

VI. Prompt and implicit obedience must be given to the orders of the Matron.
