CAP. I.

AN ACT further to Amend an Act passed in the Seventeenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, entitled "An Act to Incorporate a Company under the Style and Title of the New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company."

[Passed 3rd March, 1857.]

WHEREAS the New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company have applied to the Legislature of this Colony to Amend the Act passed in the Seventeenth Year of Her present Majesty's Reign, entitled "An Act to Incorporate a Company under the Style and Title of the New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company;" and it is deemed advisable to grant the application :

Preamble.

Be it therefore Enacted, by the Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, of Newfoundland, in Legislative Session Convened, as follows :—

I.—The said New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company may, by Resolutions of their Board of Directors, Certified under their Corporate Seal, give to the Atlantic Telegraph Company Limited, constituted in England under the Provisions of an Act of the Imperial Parliament, entitled "the Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1856," the consent of the New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company, that the said Atlantic Telegraph Company Limited, may extend their Sub-Marine Cable to, and touch and enter upon, this Island, with such Restrictions, and upon such Terms and Conditions, as may be agreed on between the said two Companies,

Power to join Transatlantic Sub-marine Electric Telegraph Cable to the Electric Telegraph line passing through this Island to the Continent of America..

and upon such Consent, and subject to such Restrictions, Terms and Conditions, the Submarine Cable of the said Atlantic Telegraph Company Limited may be extended to this Island, and brought into the Joint Station of the said Two Companies ; and when so extended shall be deemed in Law to have been made in compliance with the Provisions of the said Act Incorporating the New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company, and to be an Extension of their Telegraph Line to Europe, to the same extent, and with the same effect, as if such Submarine Cable were Established, Constructed and Worked by the said New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company ; which said Company shall thereupon be deemed to have actually established a Connection across the Atlantic Ocean, by means of a Submarine Cable, or Wire, from this Island ; and all Rights, Privileges, Benefits, and Advantages which the said New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company would have had if they had Established, Constructed and Worked a Line of Telegraph between this Island and Ireland, they shall be entitled to have and enjoy upon the laying down of the Submarine Cable of the said Atlantic Telegraph Company Limited, between this Island and Ireland or England.

Consolidation of the New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company with the Atlantic Telegraph Company Limited.

II. It shall be lawful for the New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company, by resolution of the Stockholders, or a Majority of them in interest, to effect a Consolidation of the said Company with the said Atlantic Telegraph Company Limited, upon such Terms and Conditions, and under such Corporate Name, as may be agreed upon between the said Companies ; and upon such Consolidation being effected, there shall be thenceforward one Consolidated Company, into which the said New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company shall be merged ; and such Consolidated Company shall have all the Rights, Powers and Privileges, which the said New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company now have, or can have, under its Charter or Act of Incorporation, and the Acts Amending the same, together with such other Powers, Rights and Privileges, as may be given to it by or under any Act of the Imperial Parliament.

Powers and Privileges of Consolidated Company.

Application of this Act to Atlantic Telegraph Company incorporated—or to any other such Company.

III. In case the said Atlantic Telegraph Company Limited shall procure their Incorporation in that or any other name, by an Act of the Imperial Parliament, (or in case any other Company shall hereafter be formed, with which the said New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company shall enter into an Agreement similar in terms to that above mentioned,) such other Corporation or Company shall stand in the place of the said Atlantic Telegraph Company Limited, in respect to every Power or Authority hereby given ; and this Act shall be deemed to apply thereto in the place and stead of the said Atlantic Telegraph Company Limited.

Reservation of rights secured by law to the Imperial, Colonial, and American Governments.

IV. Nothing in this Act contained shall effect any lien, claim, right, title, interest, or privilege, secured to the Imperial Government, or to the Governments of Newfoundland and of the other North American Colonies, and of the United States, respectively, under the provisions of the said first recited Act, or of any Act in amendment of the same ; and such lien, claim, right, title, interest, and privilege, shall exist and be in force with respect to any New Lines or Cables that may be established by the said Companies, or either of them, in this Island, and between this Island and the Continent of America.

V. The Shares and Estates, Stock and Interest, of the said New York, Newfoundland, and London Telegraph Company, in the Stock and Property of any Company with which said Company shall unite, or into which it shall merge, and the Property of the said Consolidated Company in this Colony, and between this Colony and the Continent of America, shall be, in all respects, subject and liable to the Debts, Obligations and Liabilities of the said New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company, in like manner as the Property of the last-mentioned Company is now liable to such Debts, Liabilities and Obligations aforesaid.

Shares, &c., of Consolidated or Incorporated Company to be liable for debts of New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company.

VI. If any Person shall wilfully and maliciously throw down, destroy, damage, or injure, any Post, Wire, Insulator, Cable, Line, Building, Erection, Apparatus, Machinery, or other Works, or obstruct the operation of any Line of the said New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company, or of the said Atlantic Telegraph Company Limited, after such consolidation and merger, as aforesaid, or of any other Company with or into which the said New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company shall at any time unite or merge, under the Provisions of their Act, such Person shall be guilty of a Misdemeanor, and shall, upon conviction before any Court of Record, be punished with Fine or Imprisonment, or both, at the discretion of the Court; and upon conviction in a summary manner before one or more Justices of the Peace, shall be punished by Fine, not exceeding Five Pounds, or by Imprisonment not exceeding one Calendar Month, at the discretion of such Justice or Justices.

Penalty for injury to property of the Company.

Conviction before a Justice or Justices.

VII. It shall be lawful for any Servant or Officer of the said New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Company, or for any other Person who may witness the commission of any such offence aforesaid, forthwith to apprehend the Offender, and take him before a Justice of the Peace, to be by him held to bail to answer for such offence, either before a Court of Record, or before one or more Justices, as the said Justice may determine.

Power to apprehend offender.

VIII. All such Fines as aforesaid shall be paid, one half to the party who shall prosecute for the same, and the other half to the Receiver General, for the use of the Colony; and no conviction that may be had before one or more Justices shall be quashed for want of form, provided sufficient shall appear in such conviction to warrant the same upon the merits.

Appropriation of fines.

IX. If any Action shall be instituted against any Person on account of any such apprehension as aforesaid, the Defendant therein may plead the general issue, and give the special matter in evidence.

Protection of party arresting offender.

CAP. II.

*AN ACT to provide for the Erection of a
Light House on the Island of Baccalieu, on
the Coast of this Island.*

[Passed 3rd March, 1857.]

WHEREAS it is considered necessary that a Light House should Preamble.
be erected on the Island of Baccalieu, on the North Eastern
Coast of this Island :

Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Legislative Council and
Assembly, in Legislative Session convened, as follows :—

It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to expend, out of
such Light Dues as shall remain in the hands of the Receiver General,
from time to time unappropriated, such Sums of Money as shall be
necessary and available towards the Erection and Support of a Light
House on the said Island of Baccalieu, according to the Provisions of
an Act of the Legislature, passed in the Nineteenth Year of the Reign
of Her Majesty, entitled "An Act to Authorize the Governor in
Council to Erect Light Houses on the Coast of this Colony, and for
other purposes." Governor authorized to erect
Light House on Baccalieu
Island, out of Light Duties
Fund.

CAP. III.

AN ACT to provide for the Support and Maintenance of Cape Race Light-House.

[Passed 17th March, 1857.]

WHEREAS, under and by virtue of an Act passed by the Imperial Preamble.
Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, in the Nineteenth
and Twentieth Years of Her Majesty's Reign, entitled "An Act to
Facilitate the Erection and Maintenance of Colonial Light-Houses,
and otherwise to Amend the Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," it is pro-
vided, that in any case in which any Light House, Buoy, or Beacon,
has been or is hereafter erected, or placed on or near the Coasts of any
British Possession, by or with the consent of the Legislative Authority
of such Possession, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, fix such
Dues, in respect thereof, to be paid by the Owner or Master of every
Ship which passes the same, or derives benefit therefrom, as Her Ma-
jesty may deem reasonable: And whereas it is further provided by
the said Act, that no such Dues shall be levied in any Colony unless,
and until, the Legislative Authority in such Colony has, either by
Address to the Crown, or by an Act or Ordinance duly passed, signified
its opinion that the same ought to be levied in such Colony: And
Section enacting

whereas it is also provided by the said Act, that the said Duties shall,
in each British Possession abroad, be collected by such Persons as the
By whom collected.
Governor of such Possession abroad may appoint for the purpose, and
shall be collected by the same means, in the same manner, and subject
to the same conditions, so far as circumstances permit, by, in, and sub-
ject to which the Light Dues levied under the Merchant Shipping Act,
1854, are paid and collected, or by such other means, in such other
The means of collect-
ing.
manner, and subject to such other conditions, as the Legislative
Authority in such Possession may direct: And whereas it is also

provided by the like Authority, that all such Dues levied under the said Act shall be paid over to Her Majesty's Paymaster, at such times and in such manner as the Board of Trade may direct, and shall, after deducting any expenses incurred in collecting the same, be applied, paid and dealt with, by him, for the purpose of paying the Expenses incurred in erecting and maintaining such Light House, Buoy or Beacon, and for no other purpose whatsoever :

And whereas by and with the consent of the Legislative Authority of this Colony, which is hereby signified, a Light House has recently been erected, and is now lighted, on Cape Race :—And whereas Her Majesty, in the exercise of the Powers vested in Her by the said Act, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, has directed, that upon and after the lighting of the said Light upon Cape Race, as aforesaid, there shall be paid for every such Ship as hereinafter mentioned (except Ships belonging to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors) the Toll of One-Sixteenth of a Penny, Sterling, per Ton, of the burthen of every such Ship for every such Voyage as hereinafter mentioned ; that is to say :—

For all Ships, whether Sailing Ships or Steam Ships, navigating from any Port or Ports in the British Colonies in North America, to any Port or Ports in the United Kingdom :

For all Ships, whether Sailing Ships or Steam Ships, navigating from any Port or Ports in the United Kingdom to any Port or Ports in the British Colonies in North America :

For all Ships, whether Sailing Ships or Steam Ships, bound from any Port or Ports in the British Colonies in North America upon any Transatlantic voyage :

For all Ships, whether Sailing Ships or Steam Ships, arriving at any Port or Ports in the British Colonies in North America after any Transatlantic voyage :

For all Ships, whether Sailing Ships or Steam Ships, arriving at any Port or Ports in the United Kingdom from New York, or any Port in the United States North of New York :

And for all Steam Ships leaving any Port or Ports in the United Kingdom for New York, or any Ports in the United States North of New York, passing the said Light House, when the Light is exhibited therein, and consequently deriving benefit therefrom.

And whereas it is necessary that provision should be made for the imposition and collection of the said Dues on and from all such of said Ships or Vessels as shall from time to time enter or clear at and sail from any of the respective Ports of this Colony :

Be it therefore Enacted, by the Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, in Legislative Session convened, as follows :—

Duty of 1-16th of a Penny per ton on every ship arriving at or leaving any Port in this Colony from or on a Transatlantic voyage, for the support of Cape Race Light.

I. That from and out of the amount of Light Dues, to which the Ships or Vessels hereinafter referred to are liable, by the Laws of this Colony, to pay upon entering or clearing at any Port therein, there be appropriated and paid to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, in this Colony, for the support and maintenance of the said Light House on Cape Race, in this Island, and for the other purposes referred to in the said recited Act, and according to the provisions of the Laws now in force in this Colony for the erection and maintenance of Light Houses, a Toll or Duty of One-Sixteenth of a Penny Sterling, per Ton,

upon the tonnage burthen of every such Ship as is hereinafter mentioned, on and for every voyage of such Ship navigating between the following places, that is to say :—

Upon the Tonnage Burthen of all Ships or Vessels navigating on any voyage from any Port in this Colony to any Port in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland :

Upon the Tonnage Burthen of all Ships or Vessels bound from any Port in this Colony upon any Transatlantic voyage :

Upon the Tonnage Burthen of all Ships or Vessels arriving at any Port in this Colony immediately after any Transatlantic voyage :

II. The Receiver General of this Colony shall, Quarterly, render an account to the Office of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade, of the said Duties or Tolls that shall be taken and received in this Colony ; and also an account of the particulars of the Vessels which have paid such Duties or Tolls, giving the names of such Vessels and the Ports to which they belong, their Tonnage, rate of Toll, and the amount paid by each Ship or Vessel.

Receiver General to furnish to the Office of Privy Council for Trade, quarterly accounts of the receipts of such Duty, &c.

III. All Dues or Tolls to be levied and appropriated as aforesaid, under this Act, shall be paid over by the Receiver General to Her Majesty's Paymaster General, at such times and in such manner as the Board of Trade in the United Kingdom may direct, and shall be applied, paid and dealt with by him, for the purposes aforesaid, and in such manner, as such Board may direct.

Receiver General to pay over all such Dues to the Paymaster Gene.al.

IV. Nothing in this Act shall in any way apply to any of the Ships of Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors.

Exemption of Her Majesty's Ships from the provisions of this Act.

V. The Board of Works of this Island, established under and by virtue of an Act of the Legislature of this Colony, in the Eighteenth and Nineteenth Years of the Reign of Her Majesty, entitled "An Act for the Establishment of a Board of Works," shall have the control and management of the said Light House on Cape Race, subject to the provisions of the said Act.

The Board of Works to have control over Cape Race Light-House.

VI. As soon as Her Majesty shall issue an Order in Council for the purpose, or otherwise authorise the extension of the provisions of "The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1855," for the support of the Light House erected at Cape Pine, on the Western Coast of this Island, it shall be lawful for the Receiver General to pay over to the Paymaster General aforesaid, a further sum equal to One-Sixteenth of a Penny, Sterling, per Ton, out of the Light Dues payable under the Laws of this Colony in respect of all Vessels arriving at or departing from any of the Ports or Places mentioned in the First Section of this Act, or such other Vessels, or such other Ports or Places, as shall be stated in any such Order or Authority as aforesaid ; which sum shall be applied, in manner aforesaid, towards the support of the said Light House at Cape Pine, subject to all the Regulations aforesaid.

Imperial Light-House Act of 1855, to apply to Cape Pine Light-House, towards its support, when so directed by Queen in Council.



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CAP. IV.

AN ACT to continue the Act for granting to Her Majesty certain Duties on Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, imported into this Colony and its Dependencies.

[Passed 17th March, 1857.]

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the Nineteenth Year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, entitled "An Act for granting to Her Majesty certain Duties on Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, imported into this Colony and its Dependencies," which, as was therein declared, was to continue and be in force for One Year from the passing thereof, and which Act will expire on the Twelfth day of May next; and it is expedient to continue the said Act for the period of One Year therefrom :

Preamble.

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, in Legislative Session convened, that the said recited Act, passed in the Nineteenth Year of the Reign of Her Majesty, entitled "An Act for granting to Her Majesty certain Duties on Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, imported into this Colony and its Dependencies," and every clause, matter, and thing therein contained, shall be and the same are hereby continued in full force and effect, for One Year from the said Twelfth day of May next, anything in the said recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding.

II. The Certified Products of the Channel Islands be admitted into this Colony on the same terms as similar Products are admitted from the United Kingdom.

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CAP. V.

AN ACT for Granting to Her Majesty a Sum of Money for Constructing and Repairing Roads, Streets, and Bridges, within this Colony.

[Passed 17th March, 1857.]

WHEREAS it is necessary to provide for the Internal Improvement Preamble.
of this Colony, by Constructing, Repairing, and Improving
Main and other Roads, Streets, and Bridges, therein :—

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor, Legislative Council, and
Assembly, in Legislative Session convened, as follows :—

I. From and out of such Monies as may from time to time remain £10,575 granted for purposes of this Act ; to be distributed as follows :
in the hands of the Receiver General, and unappropriated, there be
granted to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, the Sum of Ten
Thousand Five Hundred and Seventy-five Pounds, to be expended in
the Constructing, Repairing, and Improving of Main and other Roads,
Streets, and Bridges, in this Colony, and for defraying all expenses
attendant thereon ; which said Sum shall be distributed and appropriated
as follows, that is to say :

On the Main Road from Holyrood to New Perlican, Two Thou- Main Roads.
sand Five Hundred pounds, to be expended under the direction of the Holyrood to New Perlican, 2,500l.
Board of Works.

On the Main Road from Trinity to Bonavista, via Catalina, Nine Trinity to Bonavista, 900l.
Hundred pounds.

- King's Cove to Trinity £250. On the Main Road from King's Cove to Trinity, Two Hundred and Fifty pounds.
- King's Cove to Newman's Cove, £175. On the Road from King's Cove to Newman's Cove, One Hundred and Seventy-five pounds.
- North Side Conception Bay, £100. On the Main Road, North Side of Conception Bay, One Hundred pounds.
- Burin to Garnish, £250. On the Main Road from Burin to Garnish, Two Hundred and Fifty pounds, to be expended at each end of the said Road by the Boards of Burin and Garnish respectively.
- New Harbor to Spaniard's Bay, £40. On the Main Road from New Harbour to Spaniard's Bay, Forty pounds.
- Heart's Content to New Harbor, £50. On the Main Road from Heart's Content to New Harbour, Fifty pounds.
- New Perlican to Hant's Harbour, £50. On the Main Road from New Perlican to Hant's Harbour, Fifty pounds.
- Hant's Harbor to Capelin Cove 15/. On the Road from Hant's Harbour to Capelin Cove, Fifteen pounds.
- Grates Cove, 20/. On the Road at Grates Cove, Twenty pounds.
- Holyrood to Placentia £1400. On the Main Road from Holyrood to Placentia, Fourteen Hundred pounds, to be expended by the Board of Works in the following manner :—
- On the Road through Holyrood, One Hundred pounds ;
 - On the Road from Holyrood to Salmonier, Five Hundred pounds ;
 - On the Road from Salmonier to Colinet, Seventy pounds ;
 - On the Road from Colinet to Placentia, Five Hundred pounds ;
- provided that out of these said sums Twenty pounds shall be appropriated in the payment of outstanding claims.
- On the Road from Salmonier, near Curtis's, leading to the road from Salmonier Bridge to St. Mary's, called the Black Duck Gulley Road, Two Hundred pounds ; and Thirty Pounds for a Temporary or Hand Bridge across Rocky River.
- District of Twillingate and Fogo, £675. Towards Constructing, Repairing, and Improving Roads, Streets and Bridges, within the District of Twillingate and Fogo, Six Hundred and Seventy Five pounds ; to be expended as follows :
- Twillingate, North Side, one half to be expended between Wild Cove and Back Harbour, Eighty pounds ;
 - Twillingate, South Side, Seventy-five pounds ; Twenty-five pounds of said sum to be expended on Bridge, if needed ;
 - On the Main Line from Twillingate towards Herring Neck and Change Islands, Thirty-five pounds ;
 - Tizzard's Harbour, Fifteen pounds ;
 - Moreton's Harbour, Twenty pounds ;
 - Moreton's Harbour towards Tizzard's Harbour, Fifteen pounds ;
 - Black Island, Fifteen pounds ;
 - Exploits Burnt Island, Twenty-five pounds ;

Fortune Harbour, (one half to be expended in Fortune Harbour Bight,) Twenty pounds ;

Fortune Harbour towards Waldron's Cove, Ten pounds ;

Moreton's Harbour towards Western Head, Ten pounds ;

Herring Neck, Thirty pounds ;

Leading Tickles, Ten pounds ;

Ward's Harbour and Cutwell's Arm, Seven pounds Ten shillings ;

Little Bay Islands, Ten pounds ;

Three Arms to Jackets Arm, Seven pounds Ten shillings ;

Nipper's Harbour, Seven pounds Ten shillings ;

Hall's Bay, Twenty pounds ;

Shoe Cove, Fifteen pounds ;

Burying Place, Five pounds ;

Round Harbour, Seven pounds Ten Shillings ;

Fogo Harbour, One Hundred pounds ; (such portion of which may be expended on the Main Line to Seldom-Come-by, as the Commissioners may think fit.)

Tilton Harbour, Twenty-five pounds ;

Joe Bats Arm, Twenty pounds ;

Barr'd Islands, Twenty pounds ;

Change Islands, Twenty-five pounds ;

Seldom-Come-by, Ten pounds ;

Muddy Hole towards Cat Harbour, Twenty pounds ;

Cat Harbour towards Greens Pond, Fifteen pounds.

Towards Constructing, Repairing, and Improving Roads, Streets and Bridges, within the District of St. John's West, Five Hundred and Eighty-two pounds, Eight shillings ; out of which amount the sum of Eighty-six pounds, Thirteen shillings and Four pence, shall be applied to remunerate Thomas Butler for ground taken for the Public Service. District of St. John's West, £582 8s.

Towards Constructing, Repairing, and Improving Roads, Streets and Bridges, within the District of St. John's, East, Five Hundred and Eighty-two pounds, Eight shillings ; a portion of which to be applied in building a Wharf at Belle Isle. St. John's East, £582 8s.

Towards Constructing, Repairing, and Improving Roads, Streets and Bridges, within the District of Harbour Grace, Three Hundred and Sixty-eight pounds Eighteen shillings ; to be expended as follows :— District of Harbour Grace, £368 18s.

One Hundred and Eighty pounds in and about, to and from, the Town of Harbour Grace, River-head, South-side, and Bear's Cove, including Ten pounds for a Road from Dahany's to Doyle's, and the like sum for the Road from the Main Street to Stowe's and Horwood's, at Ship's Head.

Fifty-seven pounds for Bay Roberts' Main Road, the Road on the North-side, Delaney's Road, and other necessary Roads and Bridges.

Twenty-five pounds for Coley's Point Roads; viz., Six pounds to open the Road between Bishop's and Tippet's, from the South Road to the Church; Three pounds to repair the Road from the North Road to the Church; Five pounds Eight shillings to Samuel Spencer, Robert Parsons, and others, for making Fifty-six perches of Road on South-side (to be paid when completed) and the remainder on other necessary Roads.

Thirty Pounds in and about, to and from, Spaniard's Bay, (including Ten pounds to be expended on Vockey's Road).

Fifty-one pounds Eighteen shillings for Island Cove and Bishop's Cove; Twenty pounds of which to be expended in continuing Crane's Road; Ten pounds for opening a Road at Jacob Smith's Brook, to run towards the small farms to the table land to the Westward; and the remainder on other necessary Roads and Bridges.

Twenty-five pounds to be expended in and about, to and from, Bryant's Cove.

Carbonear District,

Towards constructing, repairing, and improving Roads, Streets, and Bridges, within the District of Carbonear, Two Hundred and Thirty-five pounds; to be left under the management and direction of the Carbonear Road Commissioners; provided the Sum of Forty pounds be expended on the repairs of Roads and Bridges in and about Mosquito.

Harbour Main District,
1781.

Towards constructing, repairing, and improving Roads, Streets and Bridges in the District of Harbour Main, say from Horse Cove to Turk's Gut, One Hundred and Seventy-eight pounds; out of which Sum Fifteen pounds Twelve shillings is to be paid to John Murphy for compensation for land; the remainder to be expended under the Board of Works.

The sums of money hereby appropriated to and for the several Outport Electoral Districts of this Island, shall be applied and expended for the purposes of this Act by the respective Boards of Road Commissioners appointed, or to be appointed, under an Act of the Legislature of this Colony, passed in the Nineteenth Year of the Reign of Her Majesty, entitled "An Act for the Establishment of a Board of Works;" and the sums of money hereby appropriated to and for the Electoral Districts of St. John's, shall be applied and expended therein, for the purposes of this Act, by the said "Board of Works:" Provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to authorise the expenditure of any Road appropriation in the employment of daily or time labour, if the same should be deemed advisable.

Boards to expend Monies under this Act and the 19Vic. Cap. 3.

III. The said respective Boards shall apply and expend the said several Sums of Money so appropriated as aforesaid, according to this Act, and the unrepealed Clauses and Provisions mentioned and contained in an Act of the Legislature of this Colony, passed in the Nineteenth Year of the Reign of Her Majesty, entitled "An Act for Granting to Her Majesty a Sum of Money for Constructing and Repairing Roads, Streets, and Bridges, within this Colony;" which said Clauses and Provisions of the said recited Act, (except the first, second, tenth and twelfth Sections thereof) are hereby continued, and shall be construed as part of this Act.

Repeal of the 1st, 2d, 10th and 12th sections of the 19 Vic. Cap. 3.

IV. The said First, Second, Tenth and Twelfth Sections of the said last recited Act are hereby respectively repealed.

Chairman of Board of Works to be the Supervisor General of Roads.

V. The Chairman of the Board of Works of this Island shall be Supervisor General of all Roads, Streets and Bridges therein: that all orders for the payment of Monies from the said respective Boards

shall be certified by the Financial Secretary of this Colony, before payment, so as to confine the expenditure within the respective appropriations; and that the Chairman of each Board in the respective Districts shall, on or before the First day of December, and oftener if required, transmit to the said Financial Secretary correct Statements of all Work done and Monies paid on such Roads, Streets, and Bridges, as may be within his said District, together with an Estimate of the probable amount which may be necessary to complete the same; and such returns shall be digested and reduced into order by the said Financial Secretary, and an abstract thereof laid before the Legislature within one month after the commencement of each Session thereof.

Financial Secretary to certify and keep accounts of Road service

VI. Out of the amount of Ten Thousand Five Hundred and Seventy-five pounds hereinbefore granted, the Sum of One Thousand and Fifty-seven pounds Ten shillings, being Ten per centum thereon, shall be appropriated to the defrayal of all charges and expenses attendant upon the expenditure of the Monies aforesaid, in the Constructing, Repairing, and Improving of all Roads, Streets, and Bridges, within the several Districts aforesaid, including all expenses of Surveying, Inspecting, Overseeing, the remuneration of Chairmen, Secretaries, and all other necessary Officers, Printing, Stationery and Postage.

Ten per cent. out of Road Grant to defray incidental expenses.

VII. It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to encrease the number of Members on any Road Board, to Seven, where it may be deemed necessary.

Number of Members of any Road Board may be increased to Seven.

CAP. VI.

AN ACT for the Encouragement of Education.

[Passed 17th March, 1857.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the Encouragement of Education in this Colony; and for that purpose to continue certain parts of an Act passed by the Legislature of this Colony, in the Sixteenth Year of the Reign of Her Majesty, entitled "An Act for the Encouragement of Education":—

Preamble.

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, in Legislative Session convened:—

I. From and out of such Monies, as may remain in the hands of the Receiver General, unappropriated, there be granted to Her Majesty, the Sum of Eight Thousand and Eighty Pounds; which Sum of Money shall be distributed in Support of Schools established or to be established for the Instruction of Children of Members of the respective Protestant Churches and of the Roman Catholic Church, in this Colony, for the period of One Year from the Thirtieth day of June, in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-seven; in the proportion and according to the Clauses and Provisions mentioned and contained in the said in part recited Act, passed in the Sixteenth Year of the Reign of Her Majesty, entitled "An Act for the Encouragement of Education," and by the authority of the respective Boards of Education appointed thereunder; which said Clauses and Provisions of the said in part recited Act, except the first and last sections thereof, are hereby continued in force during the continuance of this Act, and shall be construed as part thereof.

Appropriation of £8080 for Denominational Education.

To be expended under the 16th Vic.

The third section of
16th Vic. amended.

II. That the Third Section of the said in part recited Act be, and the same is, hereby amended in that part thereof which defines the extent of the District of Bonavista North; which shall consist of and include all that part of the Electoral District of Bonavista, lying between Great Black Island, including Flat Islands and Cape Freels, and including all Islands within the said limits, and the Settlements of Cat Harbor and Muddy Hole, in Green Bay; and that the present District of Burgeo and LaPoile shall be divided into two Districts, namely, the District of Burgeo, extending from Bonne Bay to Wreck Island, inclusive, and the District of LaPoile, extending from Wreck Island to Cape Ray; and the amount heretofore voted for the District of Burgeo and LaPoile shall be divided as follows, namely, Eighty Pounds to the District of Burgeo, and Seventy-eight Pounds to the District of LaPoile.

Further appropriation
of £200 for School
Houses, &c.

III. In addition to the Sum appropriated in and by the Eighteenth Section of the said in part recited Act for the Erection and Repair of School Houses, and for other School purposes, it shall and may be lawful for the Governor in Council to expend, out of the Public Revenue, a further Sum of Two Hundred Pounds, to be equally divided between the Protestant and Catholic Schools, for the purposes mentioned in the said Eighteenth Section of the said in part recited Act.

Further appropriation
of £375 for support
of Commercial
and other Schools.

IV. That a further Sum of Three Hundred and Seventy-five Pounds be appropriated and divided as follows, viz :—

Fifty Pounds for the support of a Commercial School in Bonavista;

Fifty Pounds for the support of a Commercial School at Twillingate or Fogo;

Twenty Pounds for the support of a School at Seldom-Come-Bye;

Twenty Pounds for the support of a School at Shoal Point;

Ten Pounds for the support of a School at the River-head of Harbour Grace;

Thirty Pounds for the support of a School at Oderin;

Fifty Pounds for the support of a Commercial School at King's Cove;

Twenty Pounds for the support of Catholic Schools in the District of Burin;

Fifteen Pounds for the support of a Catholic School in Tilton Harbour;

Ten Pounds for the support of a Protestant School in Muddy Hole;

Ten Pounds for the support of a School at Shoe Cove, in the District of Twillingate and Fogo;

Fifty Pounds for the support of a Commercial School in Harbour Main;

Ten Pounds for the support of the Protestant Board School in Carbonear;

Ten Pounds for the support of a Wesleyan School at Cupids;

And Twenty Pounds for the support of Catholic Schools at Kellegrews and Topsail.

V. That the Monies provided by the Thirteenth Section of the said recited Act to be paid Quarterly to the Superintendent of the Newfoundland School Society, in St. John's, shall be paid, under this Act, to the Superintendent or the Chairman of the Corresponding Committee of the said School Society in St. John's, for the time being—subject to the Provisions of this and the said recited Act.

Monies voted to Newfoundland School Society—how paid.

VI. This Act shall come into operation on the Thirtieth day of June, in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-seven, and not before; and shall continue and be in force until the Thirtieth day of June, which will be in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-eight.

Commencement and continuance of this Act.

CAP. VII.

*AN ACT for Ascertaining the Population of
this Colony and other Statistical Information.*

[Passed 17th March, 1857.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to make provision for Ascertaining the Population of this Island, and other Statistical Information: Preamble.

Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, in Legislative Session convened :—

I. That for the purposes of this Act, it shall be lawful for the Governor and Council to subdivide this Colony and its Dependencies into so many Divisions as may be deemed expedient, and to appoint so many competent persons to take the Census and other Statistical Information by this Act required, within the said Divisions and the said Dependencies, respectively, as may in that behalf be necessary; and every person so appointed shall discharge the duties required of him in such division to which he shall be appointed, as may be prescribed by the Governor in Council, and shall, before entering on the duties of his office, be sworn before one of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace to the true and faithful discharge of the same, and shall, while engaged therein, conform in all respects to the orders and directions of the Governor and Council to be made in conformity with the provisions of this Act.

Governor and Council to subdivide Electoral Districts of the Colony and for the purposes of this Act, and appoint persons to take the Census.

Duties of persons appointed as aforesaid.

II. Every person so appointed as aforesaid, shall make a return, with respect to the division or place to which he may have been appointed, of the information particularized in the Schedule to this Act annexed, and such returns shall be compiled within the times in the present year, and at such other periods, as are hereinafter provided; and that for the purpose of such compilation and return, it shall and may be lawful for every person so appointed as aforesaid, and he is hereby required, within his division, to visit every House, and enter into and upon any Lands, Tenements, or otherwise, as he shall judge expedient, for the execution of this Act, and then and there to ask all such questions of the persons within the division for which he may be appointed, as aforesaid, respecting themselves, the number and the quality of the persons constituting their respective families, and all other matters as shall be necessary for stating the particulars required to be stated concerning them in the said answers and returns; and every adult person refusing to answer such questions, or any of them, shall for such refusal or false answer, forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty Shillings, to be recovered with costs, in a summary manner, before any one of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace within the district in which the offence shall be committed, and in default of payment thereof it shall be lawful for such Justice to commit the Offender to gaol for any period not exceeding Two Days.

Stipendiary Magistrate in each District to revise returns.

III. It shall and may be lawful for the Governor to appoint one or more Stipendiary or Honorary Magistrates in each of the several divisions aforesaid, to examine and review the returns of the persons so to be appointed as aforesaid, in the said divisions respectively; and in any portions of this Colony or its Dependencies, where there is no resident Magistrate, to appoint some other fit and proper person for that purpose; and persons shall, on such examination and review, answer upon oath all such questions as may be put to them by the said Stipendiary or other Magistrate, or other person as aforesaid, and that if, upon such examination and review, it shall appear to the said Magistrate, or other person as aforesaid, that any such returns are imperfect, defective or erroneous, it shall and may be lawful for the examining Magistrate or other person as aforesaid, to examine witnesses, and to direct the person or persons presenting the same to amend such defect, error or imperfection, previous to such returns being certified as hereinafter mentioned.

And cause them to be amended, if found defective.

A copy of the Schedule, as filled up, to be furnished to the resident Senior Clergyman of every denomination of each division.

IV. Every person so to be appointed to take the Census in any division of the respective places of the Island and its Dependencies, shall, at least Ten Days preceding the Day on which such Court of Revision shall be holden, furnish to the Senior Clergyman or Minister of each Religious Denomination who shall reside within such division, a copy of the Schedule, as filled up by him, for such division, and also a notice of the time and place of holding such Court of Revision: Provided always, that in any division or place where there shall not be any resident Clergyman or Minister aforesaid, a copy of the Schedule, so filled up, shall be furnished, at least Ten Days preceding the Day on which such Court of Revision shall be holden, to such person or persons as shall be appointed by the Bishop or Principal of such Religious Denomination to receive the same.

Provide.

V. On being satisfied of the general correctness and sufficiency of any such return as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the examining Magistrate, or other person appointed as aforesaid, to certify, under his hand, that such return is, to the best of his knowledge and belief, sufficient and correct; and such certificate shall, together with the said return, be filed in the Office of the Colonial Secretary, by the person who shall have compiled such return, by a day in that behalf to be appointed by the Governor, in such directions as aforesaid; and such returns shall be digested and reduced into order under the direction and superintendence of the Colonial Secretary, or by some other Officer or Officers in his Department, and an abstract thereof shall be laid before the Legislature at its next Session.

Returns on being certified to be filed in Colonial Secretary's Office.

VI. If any person so appointed as aforesaid shall wilfully compile or make a return false in any of the particulars aforesaid, such person shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Fifty Pounds, to be recovered in any Court of Record; and in default of payment shall be subject to Imprisonment for any period not exceeding Six Calendar Months, and shall further forfeit all compensation for his service.

Penalty for false return, &c.

VII. That the sum of Two Thousand Pounds, granted for the purposes of this Act, be appropriated towards the remuneration of the several persons to be appointed as aforesaid, and for other purposes, in carrying into effect the provisions of this Act, in this present year, in such manner as the Governor and Council may direct, and shall be paid by warrant, under the hand and seal of the Governor, upon the Receiver General, in favour of any person or persons, to be applied to the purposes of this Act.

Grant for carrying Act into effect.

VIII. The first General Census and Returns shall be taken between the months of June and December in this present year, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-seven, and, so far as may be practicable, the same shall be taken simultaneously; and a like General Census and Returns shall be taken between the same months, and in like manner, in every Tenth year hereafter. The Tables to be issued by the Governor and Council, first to be taken, shall be in the forms contained in the Schedule of Questions annexed hereto, with such additional enquiries as to the Governor and Council shall seem expedient.

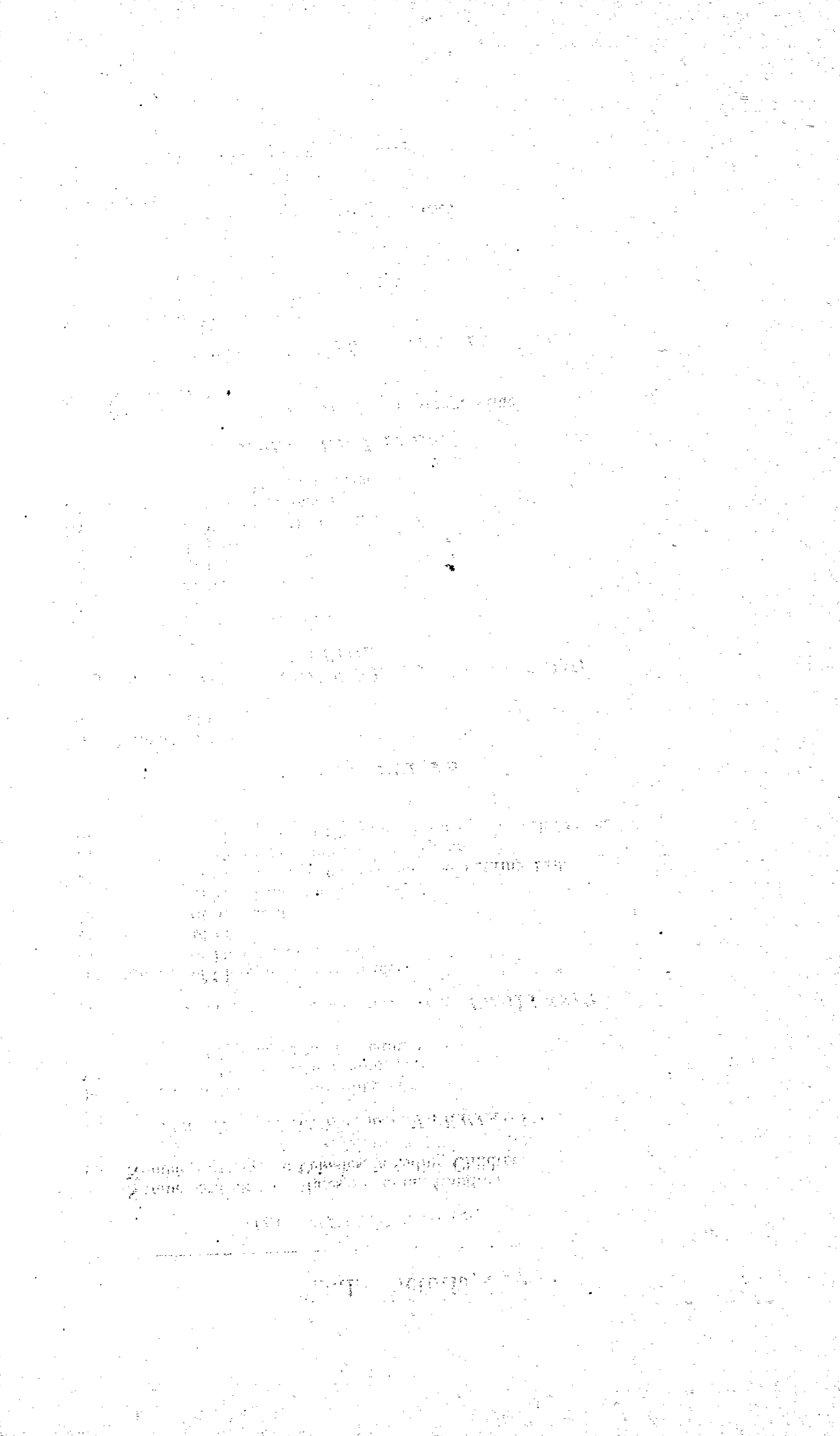

CAP. VIII.

AN ACT to Repeal the Act for the Naturalization of Aliens, and to make other Provisions in lieu thereof.

[Passed 17th March, 1857.]

BE it enacted by the Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, in Legislative Session convened :—

I. That the Act passed in the Nineteenth Year of the Reign of Her Majesty, entitled “An Act for the Naturalization of Aliens,” be and the same is hereby repealed : Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall in any way affect any proceeding, matter, or thing, heretofore done or performed by virtue of the said Act, and that such proceeding, matter, or thing, is hereby confirmed.

The 19 of Vic. Cap. 23 repealed.

Proviso.

II. It shall be lawful for the Governor, on the application of any Alien, resident in this Colony, to issue Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of this Island, Naturalizing such Alien ; and thereupon such Alien, upon compliance with the Provisions of this Act, shall become and be entitled to all the Rights, Privileges and Immunities, and subject to all the Liabilities, of a Natural-born Subject of Her Majesty, within the limits of this Colony.

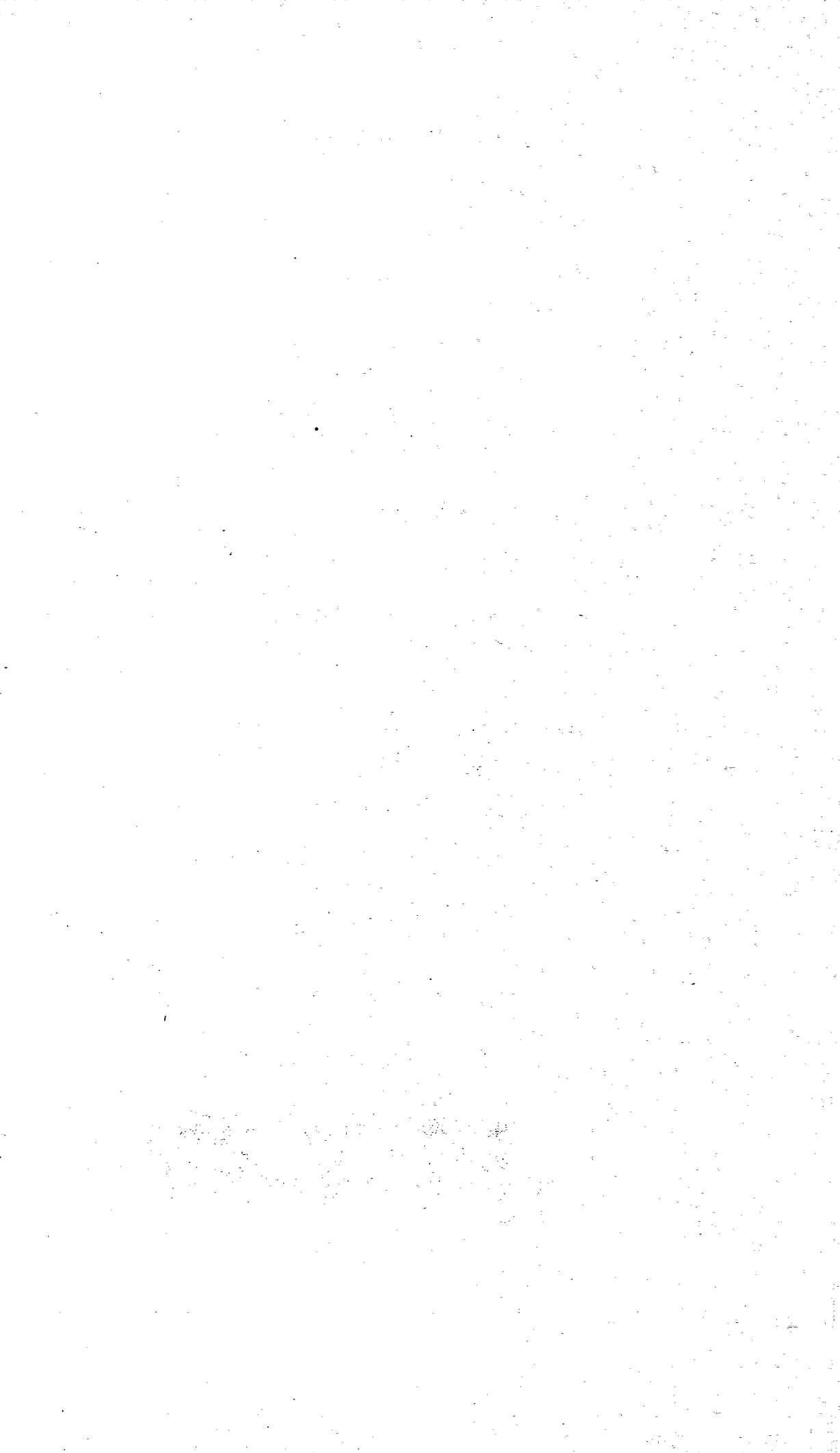

III. Every Alien receiving Letters of Naturalization, shall, within Ten Days thereafter, take and subscribe, in Duplicate, before a Judge of the Supreme Court, the Oath of Allegiance, One Copy of which Oath shall be filed in the Secretary's Office, and the other in the Registry of the Supreme Court.

IV. The Judge administering such Oath shall, if required, attest and certify the same under his Hand, on such Letters of Naturalization, which certificate shall be evidence of its contents.

CAP. IX.

AN ACT for granting to Her Majesty a Sum of Money for Defraying the Expenses of the Civil Government of this Colony for the Year ending on the 31st day of December; One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty Seven, and for other purposes.

[Passed 17th March, 1857.]

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY :—

WE, Your Majesty's Dutiful and Loyal Subjects, the Commons of Newfoundland, having freely and voluntarily resolved to give Preamble. and grant unto Your Majesty a Supply to Defray certain Charges for the support of the Civil Government, for the Administration of Justice, and the General Improvement of this Colony, do hereby beseech Your Majesty that it may be Enacted, and—

Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, in Legislative Session Convened, That from and out of such Monies as shall from time to time remain in the hands of the Receiver General, and unappropriated, there be granted to Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, the Sum of *Forty Thousand Seven Hundred and Fifty Three Pounds Eighteen Shillings and One Penny*, which said Sum £40,753 48s. 1d. of Money shall be applied in payment of the following Charges for the Year commencing on the First Day of January, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty Seven, and ending on the Thirty-First Day of December in the same Year; that is to say :

CAP. X.

AN ACT to Provide for the Contingent Expenses of the Legislature.

[Passed 17th March, 1857.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the Contingent Expenses of the Legislature of this Colony during the present Session :—
